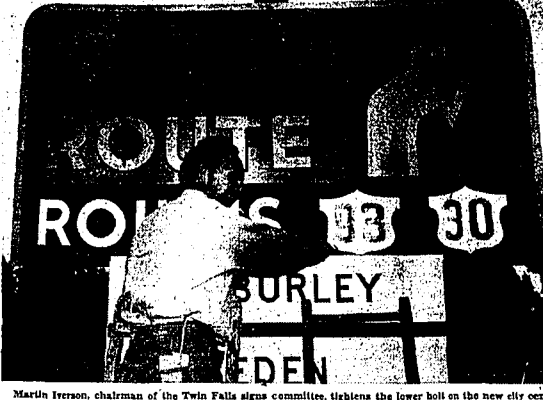

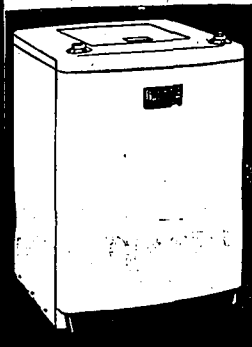

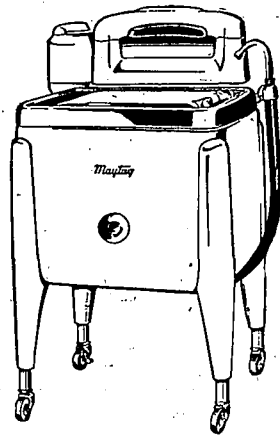

Two Queries Answered by Aide for Ike

DENVER, Sept. 28 (AP)—President Eisenhower was allowed to sleep last night after the influence of morphine, according to a White House aide. The first showed symptoms of an attack, until about 11 a.m. when he was awakened by a doctor. The aide said that the President was "impaired and exhausted" last night.

The aide made the statement in answer to two questions raised by Washington physicians asking if President Eisenhower's heart attack came at 2 a.m. as was being attended by a physician, then why was it almost 11 a.m. before a cardiogram was taken? 2. After the first was taken and the heart attack confirmed, why was the President permitted, even with assistance, to walk downstairs from a second bedroom, to a bathroom, and down another five steps to an automobile waiting to take him to the hospital, and then into the hospital?

Regarding the first question, the aide had this to say: "Howard M. Snyder was here about 2 a.m. Saturday. He advised me that the President was unable to sleep and sleep soundly until about 11 a.m. The aide added that when the President was taken to the hospital, he was in the residence of the President's physician in law, Mrs. John S. Doud, where the Eisenhower's were always known to bring along a cardiogram equipment.

The aide said the cardiograph diagnosis confirmed that Eisenhower had suffered a coronary thrombosis and that arrangements were made to hospitalize him. As for the second question raised, the aide said that the President had this to say: "I was permitted to walk, because I thought I had already passed that attack."

The aide said, as he did today, that the President's physician would be "let alone" by Eisenhower to walk with assistance to his car than it would be to be carried on a stretcher.

Heart Attack of President Highlights Job Done to Aid, Prevent Occurrences

NEW YORK, Sept. 28 (AP)—President Eisenhower's heart attack comes just at the time medical science is scoring its first dramatic victories against the nation's leading killer.

Just 20 years ago, heart attacks like his killed 90 per cent of the men they struck. Today 80 to 90 per cent survive the first attack.

And best of all, many go back to normal lives and normal or nearly normal work. Most can live happily many years.

This radical change was born of new knowledge, new drugs to combat high blood pressure, new heart surgery to repair defective hearts, heart-lung machines putting your own heart on a holiday and new tips on how to live with your heart and avoid trouble.

Consider first, this instrument of life's vitality, an organ the size of two fists. It beats and pulses 3 million times a year. Daily it pumps 120 million of blood through 60,000 miles of blood vessels—a distance 2 1/2 times the earth's equator.

It rarely complains. It adjusts blood flow to the demands of your body. But your heart has a secret—it rests between strokes.

Slightly less than half the time it is working. Better than half the time, it relaxes.

Why is it vulnerable to the heart attack, the coronary thrombosis which the President suffered?

Your heart is a muscle. It also must have nourishment, brought to it by the blood. So your heart sends some of its refreshed, oxygen-carrying blood through its own private system of arteries and veins.

These arteries, along with others in the body, are susceptible to a clogging and narrowing process. Deposits of fatty material can form inside the artery wall, narrowing and impeding the blood flow, much like rust collected inside iron pipes. This process is called atherosclerosis, and is a form of hardening of arteries.

The clogging sometimes gradually cuts off the blood flow. Much more often, blood clots begin to form as the blood flows past the roughened

area. The clot then can suddenly shut off the blood flow. This is the coronary thrombosis.

The shutdown prevents oxygen and food from reaching part of the heart muscle. Cells in the area starved—die—the blocked artery dies.

But the heart is tough and sturdy. It can recover, if not too large an area of muscle has been hit.

Other coronary arteries can expand and stretch to begin taking blood in the affected area, or new blood vessels grow into it. Normal repair processes form scar tissue in the deadened area. Scar tissue is not as good as normal healthy muscle tissue, but the heart can make a comeback to resume its pumping duties.

Complete rest gives the heart time to make repairs. Blood-thinning drugs can't dissolve the clot blocking an artery, but they can prevent it from spreading, or prevent complications such as clots forming in arteries of the legs during the long period of rest. Drugs help relieve the pain.

Judicious use of blood-thinning or anti-coagulant drugs, such as heparin and dicoumarin, is credited with a large role in boosting survival from heart attacks. Strict rest for a time, oxygen, digitalis, or other drugs as indicated, and other improvements in medical care have contributed a heavy share.

Another aid is the electrocardiogram—a map of the electrical action or conductivity of the heart. It can pretty well locate for physicians where the clot occurred, what areas of the heart were blocked, hence how serious the damage is, how treatment should be tailored.

Ministers Set 3-Week Limit On Top Meet

NEW YORK, Sept. 28 (AP)—The four foreign ministers agreed last night that their conference in Geneva starting Oct. 27 will probably last three weeks, a top state department spokesman announced.

Secretary of State Dulles was host at a dinner for Foreign Ministers Macmillan of Britain, Pinxten of France and Molotov of Russia in Dulles' suite at the Waldorf Towers.

After a two-hour dinner, the big four foreign ministers talked for an hour and 20 minutes about a round of questions concerning the Geneva conference which will seek to carry out the directives of the recent summit conference in the Swiss city.

The state department spokesman gave this additional information: At the post-dinner meeting, which moved along briskly, Molotov agreed with the western representatives on procedural matters.

It was agreed that the Soviet Union would provide the secretary-general and the secretaries for the ministers' Geneva conference.

The four ministers agreed that if their conference were limited to three weeks they might turn over to a group of experts from each of their nations the over-all problem of east-west relations.

The secondary team would meet on the third item on the ministers' agenda—the west exchanges to ease tensions—at the same time the ministers negotiate on the first two items of the agenda—German unification and European security.

Italy Makes Bid For Seat in U. N.

ROME, Sept. 28 (AP)—Italy, pledging now its solidarity with the west, today sought the aid of its western allies in gaining admission to the United Nations.

Foreign Minister Gaetano Martino said his government was counting on its friends to support Italy's bid for a U. N. seat and would consider it an "unfriendly act" if any nation were admitted ahead of Italy.

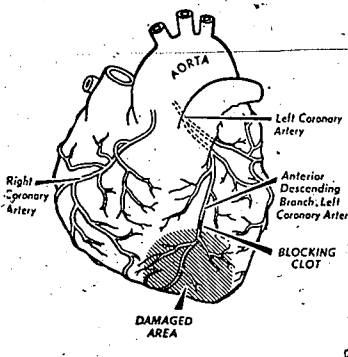

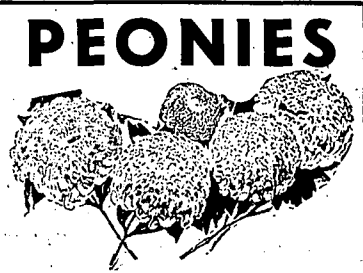

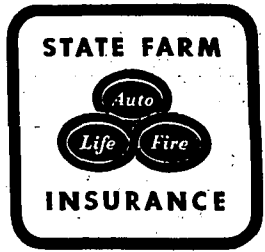

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23 (AP)—Veteran Democratic leaders in congress are the No. 3 and the No. 4 men in succession to the presidency in the event something happens to remove both President Eisenhower and Vice President Nixon from the picture.

The 1947 succession law designates the speaker of the house and the president pro tem of the senate, respectively, to take over the White House post if the president and vice president both are removed by death or other cause.

The present speaker is Sam Rayburn, 73, Texas, while the senate president pro tem is Carl Albert, 67, Georgia, also the chairman of the foreign relations committee.

After these men, the succession lineup runs down through the cabinet in this order: Secretary of State, secretary of the treasury, secretary of defense, attorney general, postmaster general, secretary of agriculture, secretary of commerce, secretary of labor.

In practice, the succession seems unlikely ever to go below the speaker.

If a speaker were to succeed to the presidency, the house could at once elect a new speaker, who then would become next in line to take over the chief executive's post. If the house were not in session, it could be called back for that purpose.

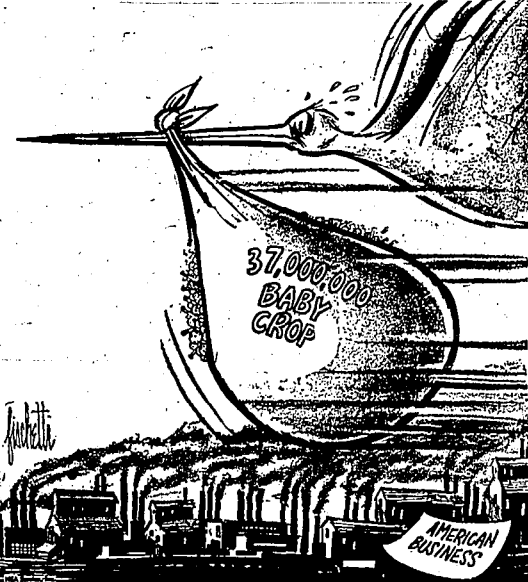

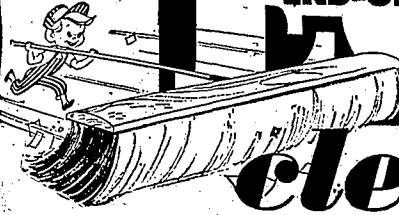

Presidency of S. Is Filled With Hazards

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28 (AP)—On the eve of the past 43 years, the presidency of the United States is as hazardous as any occupation on earth.

Of 10 presidents since the 19th century have died or been stricken in office. William McKinley was assassinated in 1901. Warren G. Harding died of a cerebral hemorrhage. Woodrow Wilson died of a cerebral hemorrhage. Franklin D. Roosevelt died of a cerebral hemorrhage. Dwight D. Eisenhower is still in office.

Woodrow Wilson died in the White House during the last months of his second term. He was unable to discharge the duties of his office. President Wilson was struck down by a stroke late Sunday, but his good recovery progress.

Brain Waves Slowdown Is Seen in Test

NEW YORK, Sept. 27 (AP)—People who are not drunk but who now and then take one drink too many, should keep in mind that their brain waves are slowed for longer than people who are always having many drinks too many and so are drunk.

The scientists who made that discovery thought it might have more to do with automobile accidents happening than with out-and-out drunken driving. Better than a driver's muscular coordination to be disorganized, they reasoned, than for his brain waves to be slowed.

Dr. Gunnar Holmberg and Sien Martens made a simple experiment. They took 10 men who were in their hospital for alcoholism of long standing. And they took 10 hospital attendants who were not alcoholics and had had comparatively little experience with drink-in-excess.

Each man was given an intoxicating portion of alcohol (in the form of drink "equivalents") and required to get it down in six minutes. Thereafter, the scientists measured the brain wave frequency, the blood alcohol concentration, the heart rate, and the state of muscular coordination of each man.

In both groups, the frequency of brain waves shifted downward as the amount of the downward shift was not significantly different between the two. But in alcoholics the low in brain wave frequency coincided with the high in blood alcohol concentration. When the drunkards began to sober, the sobering process permeated at once to their brains.

But with the non-alcoholics, the brain wave frequency was lowered for an average of 46 minutes after the blood alcohol concentration began to go down. The scientists pointed out that this "concerned sensory functions"—the lower the frequency of brain waves, the lower the response of the senses.

"It is suggested that this lag may have something to do with the higher risk factor in traffic," they said. In non-alcoholics, they said, the frequency of brain waves was perhaps most strongly impaired after blood alcohol concentration has already begun to decline.

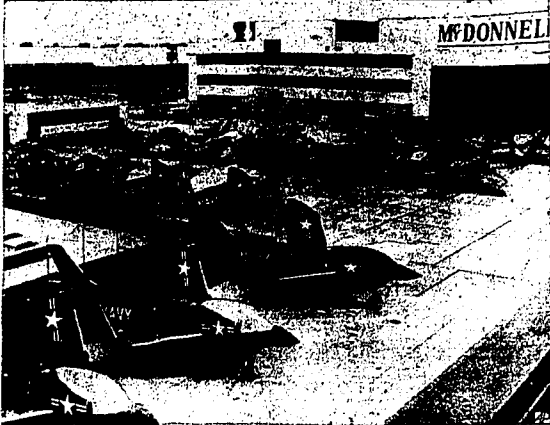

Ike Will Keep Own Controls, Report Claims

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28 (AP)—The center of power in the Eisenhower administration remains firmly rooted in the White House, with no foreseeable likelihood that it will be shifted to Vice President Richard M. Nixon, a check yesterday for a man who showed his upper place, engraved with his name, for identification.

ABERDEEN, Sept. 28 (AP)—A White House source says there is "absolutely no reason" for any delegation of presidential powers to the vice president at this time because President Eisenhower is fully capable of making any major decisions necessary.

There has been a good deal of speculation here that Nixon very likely would take over a large part of the burden of the presidency until such time as Eisenhower is able to return to his desk. But this talk is now diminishing.

Presidential Press Secretary James C. Hargety had announced in Denver that the attorney general's office would be asked to prepare an opinion on the legal problems of Nixon, the extent and means by which presidential authority could be delegated temporarily.

The Constitution says the vice president takes over in case of the president's removal, death, resignation, or "inability to discharge the power and duties of office."
