Top Report Stops Fear of Bad Turn In Ike's Condition

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3 (AP)—President Eisenhower was reported by his physician to have "restored an excellent level of vigor" in a bulletin last night that he was suffering from a "flu-like" condition. The attending doctors at Fitzsimons hospital in Denver, where Ike is a patient, were alert to changes in his condition, but their mid-morning report, they said, showed the White House staff that the President may have taken 48 hours of rest. He was examined again after 7:10 a.m. In the light of that any word on Eisenhower's condition will have a merciful effect on the world's news makers in releasing the news of President's mid-morning condition.

Mr. Eisenhower suffered a heavy thrombosis here in September, which was treated by medical specialists from his native New York.

Many thoughtful people do. They can't stand the "frantic, mad, mad, mad" hysteria that grips the American people every year during these periods of general lunacy.

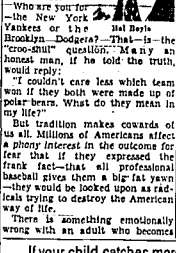
