

2 Women, Man Are Sentenced To Jail Terms

Two women, who admitted living together in a local motel with a 17-year-old woman in disguise as a woman, were sentenced to 10 days in the Twin Falls city jail Thursday when they pleaded guilty in justice court to charges of vagrancy.

Clarence Bailey Allen, 21, Wendell and Lucille Sparks Anastasi, 21, who gave her address as 2100 Virginia, told police Thursday morning they had lived at the motel for a week with Richard LeRoy Martin, 19, Wendell, thinking he was a woman.

Martin was sentenced to seven days in the city jail Thursday after he pleaded guilty in Twin Falls police court to charges of vagrancy as a beer tavern. He appeared in court in women's clothes but was sentenced to jail in men's clothes after running down an alley attempting to escape.

Martin wears his hair long and out to resemble a woman's wind blown hair. He was arrested for Martin is pending, police said.

Police arrested the trio early Thursday morning. They were called to a rooming house where the woman became suspicious of his "owner" because she was dancing with some men.

Police asked Martin to come outside as they wished to question him. He refused and tried to run away. Another man entering the bar and begged him to tell the police what he was doing.

When police turned to the man Martin broke away and ran down the street. He later arrested Martin and the two women while they were sitting in a car.

Nixon Is Put On 'Spot' for Second Time

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7 (AP)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon's invitation to Denver that he would visit the city in the near future is being questioned, but for the moment Nixon seems to qualify easily for the uneasy position of being the most conservative political figure in the United States. Nixon files was so far.

The invitation to Denver could considerably alter that situation because it came from President Eisenhower himself. The immediate controversy involving Nixon relates to public charges that he sought to make political hay from Mr. Eisenhower's illness. There are no facts evident to support such charges although they have been widely circulated and discussed.

Nixon is going through the political wringer now for the second time, a painful process. The first was midway in the 1952 presidential campaign when Nixon was charged with receiving and using in his own behalf a political slush fund.

"The Republican presidential campaign was stopped dead from Sept. 18, when the charges were made until Sept. 23. On the evening of that day, Nixon, supported by Mrs. Nixon and their cocker spaniel, 'Checkers' made a TV-radio financial accounting. Candidate Eisenhower applauded, pronounced Nixon a "vindicated" man and the campaign proceeded.

Nixon has been going through the wringer again about the day almost a fortnight ago when he was told of Mr. Eisenhower's heart attack. That put the vice president on the spot. He had some defined and undefined responsibilities under the circumstances.

The other political significance in Mr. Eisenhower's summons to Nixon lies in California. The friendly summons came less than 24 hours after Republican Gov. Goodwin J. Knight of California declared open political war on Nixon. He accused Nixon of putting self above party. Knight is committed now to opposing the nomination of Nixon for president in the event Mr. Eisenhower withdraws.

Draft Denounced

SOMERVILLE, N. J., Oct. 7 (AP)—State Sen. Malcolm Forbes, who personally made a trip to Europe to induce Dwight Eisenhower to run for president, said last night "judging on circumstances means any attempt to make a draft President Eisenhower for a second term."

Forbes, editor and publisher of Forbes Magazine of Business, sent a telegram last night to GOP National Chairman Leonard Hall outlining this view.

The villa, surrounded by a large garden and near a private airfield, was bought last July by an Argentine businessman for \$187,000. It is located near Lake Lemano.

Paraguay Is Told to Oust Exiled Peron

BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 7 (AP)—Paraguay's government advised Argentine yesterday to get rid of Juan D. Peron and send him out of South America altogether.

In a cable note, the Argentine ministry said Peron's continued exile in neighboring Paraguay could "awaken in him dreams of returning to power, which would be dangerous even though unrealistic."

Argentina chief of mission reported quoting a Peron statement that he still considers himself constitutional president of Argentina.

The note said the new government headed by Eduardo Lonardi is "not to be considered as a danger either to the previous state of affairs."

But, it said, "there is no doubt the ex-President Peron's presence in the country of the continent can give rise to existing complications."

Argentine government considers that General Peron's withdrawal to any other country outside this continent will "renew to the benefit of internal Argentine tranquility."

A dispatch from Asuncion said there was no immediate reaction from the Paraguayan government.
