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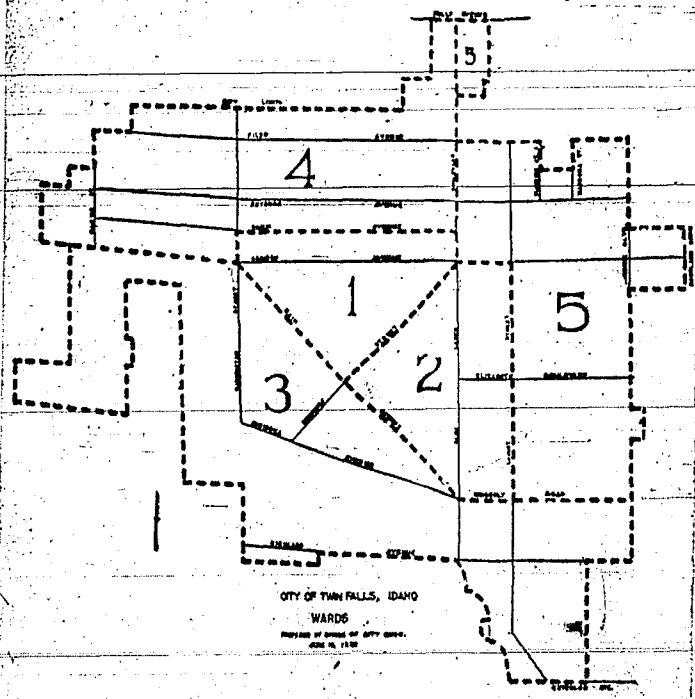
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Where to Vote in City Election Tuesday

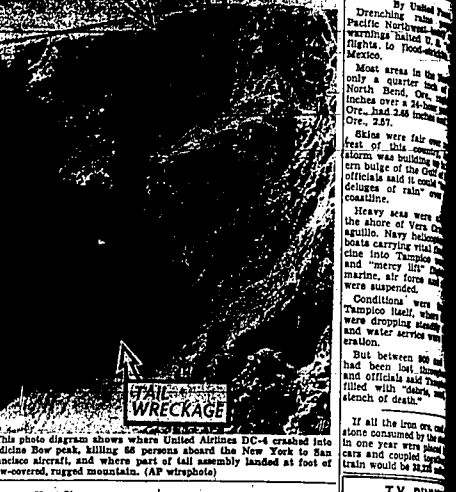

Help Needed To Care for Mentally Sick

BALT LAKE CITY, Oct. 10 (AP)—There are serious shortages of both personnel and facilities for treatment of the mentally ill throughout the western states, according to a survey group.

The group also said its studies show some of the problems might be solved through interstate collaboration. The report on initial tabulations of some 24,000 questionnaires was issued by the mental health training and research survey of the western interstate commission for higher education. The questionnaires have gone to health officials, educators, legislators, governors and other leaders in Hawaii and Alaska and the 11 western states—Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

Besides showing there are shortages of facilities and personnel, "it is widespread belief interstate collaboration may be useful in strengthening training programs and providing better outlets for trainees," said Dr. C. H. Hardin Branch of the University of Utah.

He said the findings show solution of mental health problems in the western states may differ in character from those in more heavily populated regions.

In some instances, he said, many western states don't have enough behavior problems in young adults to justify special institutions, with the result they are now cared for either in prisons or regular state hospitals.

Crude-Built Bomb Explodes in Show

NEW YORK, Oct. 10 (AP)—A crude, home-made bomb exploded last night in Times Square, apparently the latest creation by the New York mad bomb maker.

The small bomb exploded in the orchestra section of the Paramount theater while an estimated 1,000 persons watched a movie. A flying fragment struck the head of one patron, cutting the leather, but he declared himself unhurt.
