romantic legend that women weaker sex was shattered last Monday when Mrs. Mes-Annie Wilkins, 64, came riding on a Tennessee Walker "Bee," which was presented when she passed through Maine. Mrs. Wilkins has, since then, ridden more than 4,400 miles on her trek half-donkey, half spaniel French name, "Depeches et Tarzon," the half-Moritz-Standard trotting horse she uses as a pack horse. By this time, Mrs. Wilkins had remarried, but, like the first marriage, it lasted for only a couple of years.

Until January, 1954, Mrs. Wilkins worked the farm by herself.

On Jan. 21 Mrs. Wilkins came down with pneumonia. It was then that she decided to quit farming and see the country.

Evidently, though Mrs. Wilkins sleeps in a shed each night, the current trip has improved her health. After her bout with pneumonia, she says, she had "splinters" in her chest, but she lost them somewhere in Kansas.

Mrs. Wilkins covers about 15 miles a day, she says, starting out from West Minot, she went from Maine to New Hampshire; thence to Massa-

Hke's Team Is Planning Job On 3 Reports

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.—The administration team is making its second big adjustment in a fortnight to accommodate government business to the new fact of President Eisenhower's probable absence from Washington for another three months.

It is nearly two months since the President took off on Aug. 15 for his Colorado vacation. He was casting the next day in his favorite mountain trout stream, Mr. Eisenhower's immediate aides began scattering for vacations. The Summer White House was sparsely staffed for the minimum business to be permitted to distract the President from golf and fishing.

The vacation season was almost over and the big job of planning legislative and administrative strategy for next year was in sight when Mr. Eisenhower was stricken on Sept. 26.

Now the word from Denver is that it may be three months instead of two more before the President is sufficiently recovered to return to the White House. October, November and December are the hard months of administration preparation. The spring training for a new Congress will be back on Jan. 3.

Mr. Eisenhower's annual message on the state of the union will be due a day or so thereafter. Policy decisions will must be the President's responsibility. His circumstances may require others to take

Three Americans Killed by Smash

VIENNA, Austria, Oct. 11.—An American was reported in critical condition today from injuries suffered in the crash of a Yugoslav airplane which took the lives of three other Americans.

The three Americans killed when the plane crashed yesterday were identified as Sgt. Frank Allen, attached to the American military advisory group in Belgrade; his wife, Melita, and James Ray Absher, who was attached to the office of the naval attache in the U. S. embassy in Belgrade.

Their home towns were withheld pending notice to their families.

A fourth American, 33-year-old Frank P. Irwin, Pleasant Point, Ill., was critically injured. He suffered burns and injuries to his pelvis and bladder. He was a state department courier carrying diplomatic mail from Belgrade to Vienna. His next of kin live in Ill., Ill.

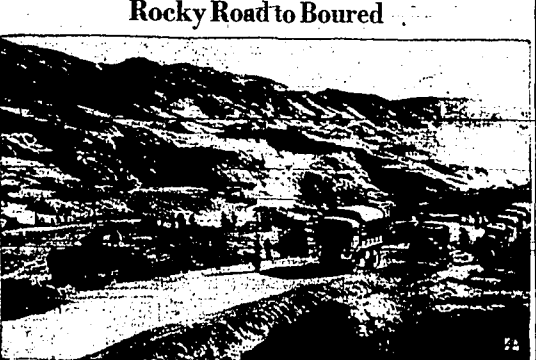

Disarm—Pacts To 'Minimum' Asked in Talk

MARGATE, England, Oct. 11 (AP)—Labor party leader Clement Attlee called today for a world-wide disarmament pact to cut arms down to the absolute required for preservation of law and order.

Attlee told a cheering Labor party convention that banning the hydrogen bomb and all super scientific weapons was no solution to the problem of world security.

"What the world needs today is a general agreement for disarmament down to the point of the absolute minimum required for the preservation of law and order," he said.

Attlee, looking fit despite his recent illness, spoke immediately after former Chancellor of the Exchequer Hugh Gaitskell had been confirmed in office as party treasurer. Gaitskell is regarded by many as a good possibility to succeed Attlee.

Gaitskell beat out maverick left-winger Aneurin Bevan by a whipping 420,000 votes for the treasury post.

Attlee did not mention his retirement in his speech. But he launched a bitter attack on Prime Minister Anthony Eden's government for refusing to cut Britain's draft term from two years to 18 months.

Gaitskell, 49, was re-elected to the Labor party annual convention with 5,475,000 votes against only 1,325,000 for Bevan.

Review Is Slated On Navaho Claim

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11 (AP)—The U. S. supreme court has agreed to review a 10th U. S. circuit court of appeals decision concerning a judgment awarded a group of Navaho Indians.

The Navahos were awarded \$100,000 in 1954 by U. S. Dist. Judge Willis W. Ritter in Salt Lake City for government destruction of 160 Indian ponies and burros in southern Utah.

But the appeals court in Denver set the award aside, supporting government contention that the livestock had been abandoned on government land and legally could be destroyed by the bureau of land management.

Ritter had held the BLM action constituted "unlawful seizure and destruction" and ordered the agency to reimburse the Indians.

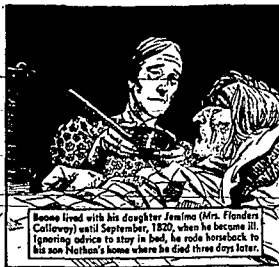

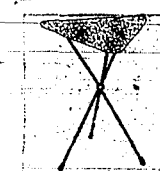

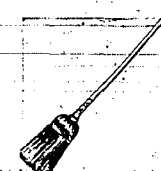
