The Russian seamen took their cue from Valleria Mirkulov, 24, a cadet officer aboard the Soviet cruiser Sverdlov, and went on a wild shopping spree for presents for their wives and girl friends back home.

"I think the English girls dress much more brightly than those in Russia," Mirkulov said.

A special store equipped with Russian translators reported nylons were going at the rate of five pairs a minute. The Russians also bought brightly colored scarves and frilly underthings.

The Russian sailors got a big reception when they came ashore for the first time yesterday. But one English girl said they are rather shy.

"They are very nice but I'm afraid of an American Wave."

### Doctors Spat On Results of Lack of Love

NEW YORK, Oct. 14 (AP)—A fur-  
tural argument is raging in the science of  
psychology over what happens to  
an infant psychologically when he  
has little or no contact with his  
mother or with a "mother substi-  
tute."

What happens is psychologically  
devastating to the infant, accord-  
ing to Dr. René A. Spitz, a special-  
ist in the medical branch of psychol-  
ogy, who is conducting a study on  
"how-to" baby books quotes Dr.  
Spitz.

But his studies of infants both  
with and without contact with their  
mothers, upon which his views are  
based, have been subjected to broad-  
side attack by Dr. Samuel H. Pin-  
neau.

Scientifically, said Dr. Pinneau,  
Dr. Spitz can't know one way or  
the other because his studies were  
made more or less worthless by  
scientific errors and scientific in-  
adequacies.

These he enumerated in a special  
article that they cannot be repeated  
in this limited space. They were  
concentrated, in the main, on  
statistical considerations which, he  
said, demonstrated that Dr. Spitz  
had added nothing to man's scientifi-  
cally knowledge of the infant mind.

He did not "doubt" the potential  
significance for an infant having  
contact with his mother over the  
infant spending the first year of  
life in an institution such as a  
foundling home.

But as yet, he added, "we do  
not have convincing evidence, based  
on scientifically controlled investi-  
gations, as to any of the major  
problems in this area."

In reply, Dr. Spitz said Dr. Pin-  
neau's attack was "built on inference  
and speculation . . . and has  
nothing to do with the 'how-to' books  
of the 'how-to' issue," he said. It  
"holds up necessarily the progress  
of science."

Dr. Pinneau is a member of the  
faculty of the University of Cali-  
fornia. His charges and reply were  
published by the American Psycho-  
logical association.

### Barbiturate Uses Increase in U. S.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14 (AP)—Two  
public health service officials testi-  
fied yesterday that addiction to bar-  
biturates is increasing in the United  
States and that it is worse than  
opium addiction.

Dr. G. Hubert Hunt, assistant  
surgeon general, told a house com-  
mittee he could not estimate the  
number of barbiturate addicts, but  
there is evidence of an increase. On  
the other hand, he said, estimates  
are that the number of narcotics  
decreased in the past 20 years.

Dr. Kenneth Chapman, chief of  
the service's neuro-psychiatric  
branch, division of hospitals, said  
"it is dangerous for people who are  
taking barbiturates to drive any  
means of transportation or auto-  
mobiles."

### AEC Ponders Newsroom for Story Outlets

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14 (AP)—The  
atomic energy commission is talking  
about setting up a newsroom.

If it ever does, it will be a radical  
departure from news policies the  
agency has followed since its birth.

Just talking about a newsroom  
strikes some observers as a sign that  
the AEC is getting a bit mellow in  
the ninth year of its secrecy-  
ridden life.

In its early years the AEC was  
inclined to resist calls for informa-  
tion. One member in those days  
said the commission did not feel its  
duties should include education of  
the public on matters atomic.

Another member stated publicly  
that the AEC would not put out in-  
formation just to satisfy the "mer-  
curiousity" of the taxpaying public.

Those attitudes have been modi-  
fied considerably of late.

One reason, of course, is that con-  
gress last year rewrote the atomic  
energy act to make it possible for  
the agency to give out vastly more  
information than before to private  
industry and friendly foreign nations  
on peacetime use of the atom.

Another is that the public is  
inclined to believe the AEC itself  
is entitled to more information than  
it used to get, even on sensitive  
aspects of the atomic project.

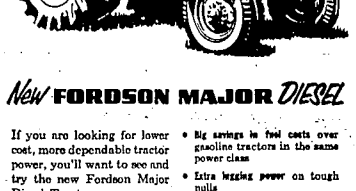

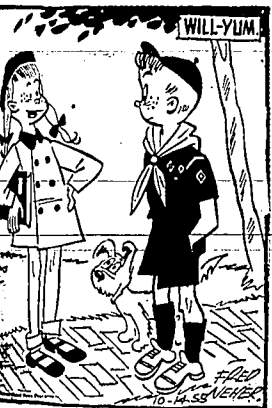

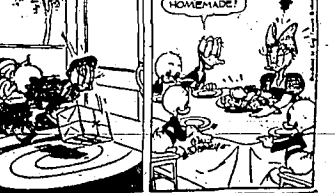

Simpson said all but four letters prated Lee's statement; he will not reply to the rest, saying he is up to this tax-despotic government of ours and its paid press, and for being right" (last two words underlined).

Santa Ana, Colo.—"When a man of your stature comes out as you have on such a vital issue it rekindles the hopes of the American people that all is not lost and that there is still a chance."

Utah Democrats have blasted Lee's proposal. They asked the governor to retract or resign. Lee refused to do either. State Republicans have said "no comment."

Lee's assistant said 90 per cent of the letters came from outside Utah. Of the four opposing Lee's stand, Simpson challenged two. He said they appeared to come from the same typewriter.

One congratulatory message came from Vivien Kellems, a Stonington, Conn., manufacturer who in 1948 stopped withholding income taxes from employees of her cable grip firm. She contended the government couldn't make her serve as an unpaid tax collector.

The government seized \$7,019 in penalties from her firm's bank accounts, but Miss Kellems and her brother, David, sued and got most of that amount back.
