Weech was the 26th in Magic Valley and the seventh death in Twin Falls county so far this year. The youth is in Magic Memorial hospital with an left leg, dislocated and a broken arm and face. He was taken to the hospital and his condition is not expected to improve.

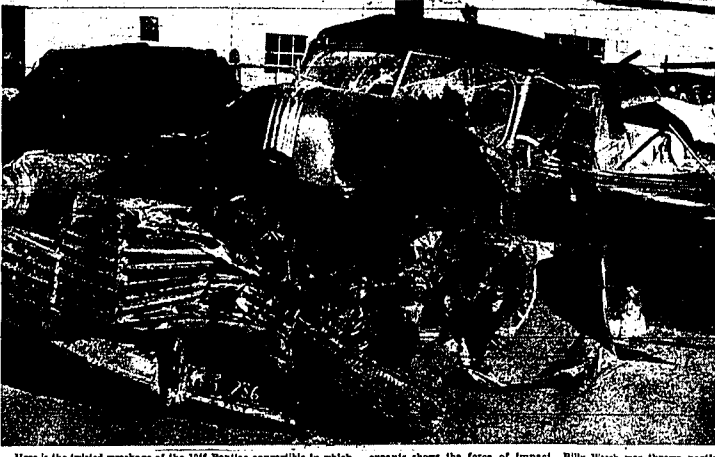

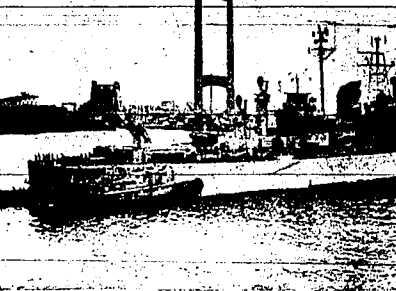

Two Complications Plague GOP Plans To Shift Power Development Interest

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17 (AP)—The Eisenhower administration is blunting the Democratic campaign in these days in its efforts to shift the emphasis of government interest from public to private power development.

The complications are twofold: The law and the Democrats.

For 20 years of Democratic neo-federal deal administration, the emphasis was on developing and expansion of public power resources. The main Tennessee valley electric project was encouraged. And other cooperative spread their own privately owned power projects across the country.

In capsule form, Republicans argue this public power policy has succeeded. Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry S. Truman was socialist and dangerous for the American people. Democratic administration, through the atomic energy commission, contracted with the Dixie-Vates group to feed power into the TVA grid to meet an anticipated shortage. This contract was abandoned when the city of Memphis refused to accept Dixie-Vates power and said it would build its own plant.

Democratic leaders insisted the contract was not valid, and therefore the government should not pay a cent for the power which might amount to several millions of dollars. The AEC, after 10 months of the contract being legally effective, has now abandoned it.

Mr. AEC Chairman Lewis L. Strauss now contends, after an exchange of correspondence with the Dixie-Vates contract.

But the AEC chairman's claim is taking place over an administration proposal—later abandoned—to sell the Dixie-Vates group to a private company for resale to about 17 co-operative, which have no transmission lines connecting with the general grid.

At this point, Mr. Strauss said in an opinion that the law provides the federal power in the Dixie-Vates cooperatives and other public agencies competing for power with private power. Benjamin Franklin Disliked Bald Eagle, Boosted Turkey

By HAL BOYLE
LANCASTER, Pa., Oct. 17 (AP)—When the question of picking the American national bird was brought up, Benjamin Franklin said to those who spoke for the bald eagle:



"They are damn pluckers. I want the turkey!" His peers, as they did on occasion, overruled the wisest scientist-businessman-diplomat — perhaps the most all-around man the world has known.

Franklin preferred the turkey as a symbol because he thought it was more typical of this land. Many civilizations had used other eagles. And old Ben, who had many loves, knew the bald eagle had a habit of preying on a hawk called the osprey. He would wait until the osprey dived and caught a fish, then attack it in mid-air, thus harrying-hawk-to-drop the earned prey—and drive and grab the reward itself in its powerful talons. Such a robber tactics, Franklin felt, shouldn't symbolize the young American nation.

Perhaps through tradition, perhaps because the bald eagle is one of the world's most magnificent looking birds, perhaps because the founding fathers were weary of Franklin's perfection and the fact that he looked like a honky-tonk grown turkey himself, they turned him down and made the bald eagle the emblem of our land.

The bald eagle isn't bald at all. It got the name because of the white feathers on its head, and it could just as well be called the "bald-tailed eagle" too, because it roosts on white feathers.

The news I have today would interest bird-loving Benjamin Franklin to whom America was a lifelong "notebook" of discovery.

The news: White bald-headed men in the United States are increasing mightily, the bald eagle is dying out rapidly. Says Herbert H. Beck, retired head of the chemistry department of Franklin and Marshall college: "At the present rate of decline of the bald eagle, I feel that by the year 205 the greatest seal of the United States in Washington, D. C. will represent a bird that lives only in memory. It will be as gone as the dodo."

This is not an hysterical judgment.

Professor Beck who will be 80 next month, for 50 years has been a member of the student of ornithology, specializing in eagles and has kept a diary of bird movements all that while.

He speaks with whole-hearted admiration of Charles Broley, a retired Canadian banker who lives in Trampa, Fla., and is known widely as "the eagle man."

They have set up a small network of checks on the habits of eagles and their movements. In cooperation with other bird lovers, the only way that has been figured out to do this is to put a metal identifying band on the leg. For obvious reasons this is done only to young, nesting eagles, and eagles don't nest in subways.

"You know Broley is only about 65," said the professor, who is a mile hard of hearing but built like a quarter-back, "and he can still climb up and band the eaglets himself."

Into his boy-blue eyes came the glint of an older, knightly watching a young knight reach out for the Holy Grail he himself had hunted for—a look utterly amazing and without envy.
