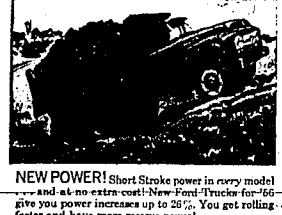

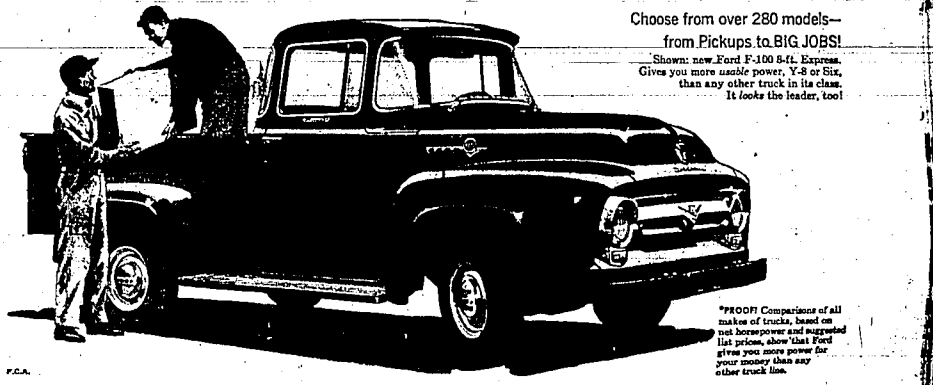

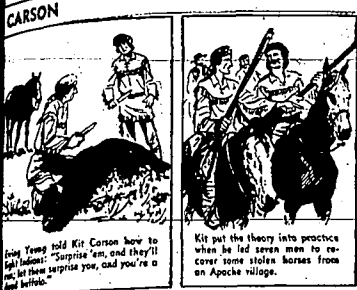

Saar Citizens Ballot Sunday On Big Issue

SAARBRUECKEN, Saar, Oct. 14.—The voters of this area will cast their ballots Sunday whether they will be put under international status.

The experts are predicting they will reject the proposition. If so, will mean a new period of conflict between France and Western Germany.

About 400,000 of the Saar's 900,000 people are eligible to vote.
