Bacteria Get Immunity for Noted Drugs

NEW YORK, Oct. 31 (AP)—Sad news from the health front is that penicillin and other antibiotics have lost some more of their magic against bacteria which sicken and sometimes kill us.

Evidence of this has cropped up in the treatment of complicating bacterial diseases which commonly accompany measles. It appears to justify the belief of some scientists that the day will come when antibiotics have no magic left.

Measles is a disease caused by a virus, and antibiotics have no effect on viruses. But the measles viruses make human beings susceptible and prevent any bacteria infection by giving the patient an antibiotic here and now.

The day of reckoning is at hand, it was learned from the evidence gathered by Louis Weinstein, a doctor of bacteriology as well as a medical school professor.

He studied the records of 428 patients admitted to a Boston hospital for measles. Of these 130 had been given antibiotics in a prevent secondary bacterial infections, but 35 developed the infections anyway.

Out of the remaining 298 patients, those who had not been given antibiotics developed bacterial infections—only 42 prevented the infections.

What has been happening over the years is that bacteria, which can be killed by antibiotics, have been replacing the bacteria which could not and do die.

Weinstein's evidence, commented on by that his findings "re-emphasize the need for critical review of the routine prophylactic prevention of antibiotic use in simple non-bacterial infections."

Notably, the common cold—and influenza, and other respiratory infections in which such prophylaxis is frequently advocated.

More than once DeVault has been awakened in the middle of the night to handle a case thousands of miles away. But probably no other living man is more familiar with the medical facilities that exist throughout the world.

Up to now, he has flown over 300,000 miles and personally visited hundreds of foreign doctors in every branch of medicine. He has been to every U. S. foreign service post in the world.

Thus when a Cambodian doctor called with a diagnosis of an ailing American in Phnom Penh, DeVault knew the man's professional capabilities and was able to act accordingly.

GOP Plan to Oust Ike Told by Demo

MUSKOGEE, Mich., Oct. 31 (AP)—Senator Kefauver, D. Tenn., said Saturday a "reagan of right-wing" Republicans is "scheming to set before his term expires."

Ike Decision Is Sought by Senate Chief

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31 (AP)—Senate Republican leader William F. Knowland suggested today that President Eisenhower should make an early announcement of his 1956 political plans.

If the President decides against seeking reelection because of his health, Knowland believes that the GOP should be given plenty of time to look over available candidates before the San Francisco convention next August.

The California Senator, who is regarded as a possible contender if Mr. Eisenhower bows out, said he declined to discuss whether he might seek the nomination.

"Until the President gets out of the hospital and declares his plans," he told reporters, "I consider any discussion of individual candidacies premature."

Knowland did make clear that he thinks any retirement announcement from Mr. Eisenhower should come by late fall or early winter. The deadlines for candidates to enter the primary in some of the states come early in February.

CHICAGO, Oct. 31 (AP)—Harry S. Truman and Adlai Stevenson conferred here Saturday and the former President said afterward he had "revised" Stevenson to announce his candidacy for the presidential nomination.

Stevenson, the 1952 Democratic nominee, brushed aside newsmen's questions regarding his political intentions in 1956.

He left Truman's hotel suite after a short visit, telling reporters he had dropped in "to pay my respects."

He added they had a "pleasant chat" during which politics had entered the conversation "once or twice."

Stevenson said Truman posed for photographers before Eisenhower left for Duluth, Minn., to address a party rally.

No Blood Change Effects Are Seen

TOKYO, Oct. 31 (AP)—Dr. Wataru Truax, a member of the atomic bomb casualty commission at Hiroshima, said today "there have been no really significant changes in blood composition of the Japanese exposed to radiation of atomic bombs dropped on Nagasaki and Hiroshima."

Truax was one of five doctors from the commission who are presenting papers at the third semi-annual East Asia forces medical conference which opened today in Nagoya, Japan. His statement was released in Tokyo by the far east air force.

Pope May Call 1956 Consistor

VATICAN CITY, Oct. 31 (AP)—An official Vatican source said today Pope Pius XII might call a consistory next year to fill eight vacancies in the sacred college of cardinals.

Atomic Subs May Get Odd Wartime Job

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31 (U)—That dramatic and deadly fighting ship, the atomic submarine, may find itself with still another important but mundane mission in wartime—an underwater tugboat.

It may be used to tow a string of submersible hulls, each carrying several hundred troops or tons of cargo. For invasion operations or to ship high priority supplies through enemy-menaced seas.

This possibility is pointed up by two developments:

1. Disclosure a few days ago by Rear Adm. H. G. Rickover, nuclear propulsion expert, that the current building program includes a huge submarine to be powered by two atomic reactors.

2. Navy experiments, with conventionally-powered submarines, in underwater towing operations. The experiments, started some years ago, have progressed to the point they now are part of standard training work.

Rickover was terse in his reference to the big boat in an address at San Francisco, Oct. 28, that it would be the largest and "the first one powered by two reactors."

More power, smart styling and improved automatic transmission efficiency are outstanding features of the 1956 Oldsmobile, according to Robert F. Youres, owner of the Youres Motor Company. The new car goes on display in Magic Valley dealer showrooms Thursday.

The new Oldsmobile front end includes an airfoil type grille patterned after the experimental Starliner and Delta and recessed in a oval between the massive upper and lower bumper bars. Rectangular parking lights are incorporated in the outer extremities of the lower bumper bar and are protected by the overhang of the upper bar.

The low silhouette and panoramic windshield are retained in the new Oldsmobile. New is an advanced version of the sweep-cut fenders introduced by Oldsmobile in earlier Holiday models. The re-styled projectile-type taillights and the upward sweep of the rear bumper continue above the recess for the license plate lend a distinct note to Oldsmobile's rear end styling.

The new sweeping chrome side moulding provides the two-tone color separation in Oldsmobile styling. The new modified treatment on the "88" series is different from the "88" and Super models. Nine new color and 155 recommended two-tone combinations provide the greatest variety in the division's 68-year history.

Oldsmobile horsepower has been increased 240 in the modified 77-80 designation indicates 350 pounds-feet of torque at an engine speed of 2600 revolutions per minute. Compression ratio is 9.25 to 1 in all 1956 "Rocket" engines. The 170 series "88" Holiday has a larger dual carburetor and develops 230 horsepower.

Service Tests Air Factors, Battles Smog

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 17 (AP)—A series of polluted air are being tested by scientists at the Franklin Institute in Philadelphia. The tests are being made to determine the most effective way to eliminate smog.

A laboratory research team has developed an instrument which enables them to fingerprint various elements in the air we breathe.

The scientists have found that smog changes exhaust fumes from cars, factory and rubbish smoke and other man-made wastes into various elements which in turn could be harmful.

Some of these elements are irritating to man, some are not, but the researchers agree these elements do make up smog. The scientists feel once the identification of these elements are established the next step is to determine which ones are harmful and then work out methods to either remove them or control their source.

So far the instrument has not been used in field work. The research group has prepared synthetic polluted atmospheres in their machine, submitted it to carbon-arc "sunlight" and then measured the results.

The tests have given conclusive proof that ozone is formed by the reaction of sunlight on the polluted air. Ozone is always present in the air in minute quantities but the tests have shown that it is the cause of the chemicals in smog ridden Los Angeles at concentrations ten times higher than normal. The tests also explain a disappearance of ozone when the sun goes down.

The machine, a 10-foot long stainless steel tube 18 inches in diameter, is termed an "ultra-turbid" and is used to measure the reaction of various chemicals in the air. It will be used to measure additional reactions of ozone and other elements with various chemicals to form compounds which may contribute to the objectional features of smog.

Eventually the researchers, headed by Dr. Edgar J. Stephens, senior research project engineer, hope to take the machine into various cities when they will test the air.

Once the spectrometer has fingerprinted the elements in polluted atmosphere, the next step will be developing tests to eliminate the harmful ones.

Felene Group Praising Cats As Fine Pets

NEW YORK, Oct. 17 (AP)—If a black cat crosses your path tonight, it may have nothing to do with Halloween. It may be a publicity stunt.

Next to dogs, cats are probably the most popular pets in the world. They are pretty smart at publicizing themselves. They've been it for 33 centuries.

Most generally, people show no middle ground in their feeling about cats. They are either "cat men." This has been true since the ancient Egyptians domesticated cats about 3,500 B. C. and started to worship them.

They had a cat-headed goddess named Bast; they embalmed cats as mummies at death; they decorated the city of Bubastis to cat-worship, and 100,000 pilgrims a year went there.

By 800 A. D., cats were being accused of witchcraft and of being the devil's servants. In the Middle Ages Europeans flung them from towers, or burned them on certain days in Lent.

Right now, there are 21 million of more cats in the United States, according to the American Feline Association, which sponsors the annual cat event. That's roughly one cat to every 1 1/2 persons. About 10 per cent of all American families keep cats as pets. Yet half of those 21 million cats are strays, the society says.

Body of Child Seen in Ditch; Check Begins

POWERS LAKE, N. D., Oct. 17 (AP)—The discovery of a 4-year-old boy's body one year after he had wandered from his ranch home raised among investigators today that he had been murdered.

An examination of young Lavern Engsted's body was scheduled and authorities planned to drain off the sludge where the discovery was made yesterday.

Sheriff Martin S. Ryan said it was "inconceivable" that Lavern's body had been overlooked in a shoulder-to-shoulder search by thousands of men last October. Ryan also couldn't figure out how the little boy could have got so far out into the pond, located about a mile from his parents' ranch home.

Tells Stupor
He said "I still haven't given up the possibility of foul play" and indicated someone may have placed Lavern's body in the sludge last fall.

"If the pathologist's report reveals anything, I want to check on some builders who were in the area," the sheriff said.

Lavern wandered into the fields on Oct. 17, 1935, to meet his father and disappeared into the North Dakota dust. Thousands of men combed around Powers lake to aid in the biggest hunt in North Dakota's history. They joined hands and walked in mile-long human chains across the rugged country. Airplanes, helicopters and bloodhounds were called in to help.

No Trace Found
In all, the search covered 100 square miles. But no trace of Lavern was found.

Then, last week, Williston, N. D., newspaper Dan Hilligan organized "final" searches to "ease the last doubts" in the minds of the parents.

About 75 men gathered in Powers lake and pushed into the muddy sludge. They burned away the tall, tough grass and began draining away the water. Lavern's body decomposed body was found lying in about a foot of water.
