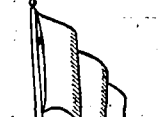

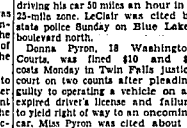

### Navy, Marine Corps Report College Plans

A plan whereby youths between 17 and 21 may receive free tuition for college and receive commissions in the navy or marine corps is being studied by the navy recruiting office here.

Under provisions of public law 729, the navy is offering financial assistance for the education of selected candidates desiring to become officers in the navy or marine corps.

Under the law's provision, the naval reserve officers trainees corps offers not more than four years of navy-subsidized education in one of 12 designated colleges and universities.

Upon enrollment, students are appointed navy midshipmen and receive retention pay of \$50 per month for board and room. The navy will pay tuition and the cost of textbooks.

During drill periods and summer cruises, the midshipmen wear government-issued uniforms.

Upon graduation, newly commissioned officers will be assigned to active duty. Those who qualify will receive immediate assignment to a ship or station in the navy or marine corps.

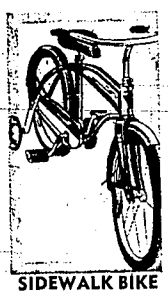

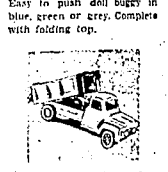
