The police are of the opinion that the most common cause of accidents is excessive speed. In fact, they say, 65 per cent of all accidents are caused by speeding.

At such velocities the driver is a new world where his reflexes aren't good enough to cope with an emergency—a slick spot, a hazard in the mist ahead, a dog on the road. From time to time the AAA issues a report on "major causes of traffic accidents," such as:

- Driver's errors—Too much speed, following too closely, failure to watch what's happening out ahead, missing where it shouldn't be done, driving while angry, worried, nervous, depressed, ill, or drunk, and, many 100-mile-an-hour engines late

 Laughing I thought the visitor who put that in his radio script would be a chuckle. What was clear through this bit of corn was that the American husband is becoming a butt for humor in Britain.  
 The British male and female think he's funny. Americans living here often fail to get the joke, but most of them are tolerant. Life is not so funny in Britain this winter and if it will make the burden a bit lighter, let them laugh.  
 The average gag-writer knows a feeling of superiority is one of the basic comedy techniques. You feel superior when you see someone slip on the ice. So you laugh. But how does the British husband fit in with this? The British husband is a contemporary across the Atlantic.  
 The husband is at work, the British wife usually doesn't know how much money he makes. He wouldn't tell her if she asked. He doesn't help prepare meals and he doesn't help wash clothes afterwards.  
 Goes to Pub  
 Most likely he drops down to the pub for a bit of beer while his wife clears away the dinner debris. Then the place is nice and tidy when he comes home late to which wife visits.  
 The average Briton is reading the news and about the wife-dominated American husband. "God, Chalmersdale, the Americans even joke about the heart attacks they have trying to save enough to pay the insurance premiums so their wives can continue to live happily after they're gone!"  
 The chaffing is good-natured, for there is a kinship among husbands that transcends national boundaries. British men realize it could happen here—and probably will some day.  
 There but for the grace of the surplus of women go we," a British husband might say, noting with dread that the surplus is dwindling.

 Among the recent news items warning the hearts of Britons during the first cold wave was that dispatch from the states by a writer who said she had just seen "one of the wonders of 1945" in action:

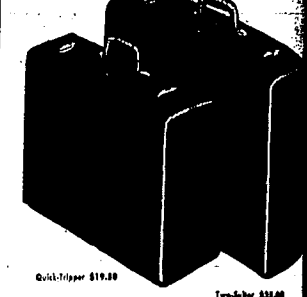

### Motels Come To Fore for New Industry

CHICAGO, Nov. 25.—The "tour-in-court" has come to its end. It is moving into town. Several cities now have motels within their corporate limits, and more are being built.

Already you can stop at one of more motels within the city limits of Chicago, San Francisco, Cleveland, Columbus, O., and New Orleans.

According to industry sources, motels in recent years have given hotels increasingly stiff competition.

Most hotel men have vigorously opposed motels. Now, some are going into the motel business.

Dr. Robert S. Levy, who heads a group controlling 12 hotels in various cities, is building a luxury motel on Chicago's Lake Front, 10 minutes from the heart of the city.

The Shore Drive motel as it will be known will have 155 rooms, including four two-room suites. The three-story structure will have an underground garage and part of the ground level will be devoted to under-roof parking space.

Features Listed

The motel will feature a drive-in registration desk, enabling guests to check in without getting out of their cars. Guests will load their own luggage and clothing into mobile wardrobe closets and will take them up to their rooms in self-service elevators without benefit of bell-hop.

There will be a restaurant and cocktail lounge, central air conditioning, in-a-door heating, heads in each room, ice machines on every floor, whiteboard telephone service and free television.

Albert Pick, head of the nation's third largest hotel chain, is another hotel magnate who has gone into the motel business.

Pick recently negotiated a four-million-dollar leasing arrangement with Holiday Inns, Memphis, Tenn., under which the Pick chain will operate 10 motels.

Two already are in operation at Natchez, Miss., and Colorado Springs, Colo., and eight others will be built.

Called U. S. Institution

Pick said the motel is a "typically American institution" growing out of the tremendous increase in automobile travel.

"Motels like the informality, the lack of tipping and the saving in parking fees," he said.

Pick said big city hotels have prospered because of the convention trade and the advantages of central location. But he said some smaller hotels "have had a tough time."

Motels are cheaper to build and operate, he said, even on a luxury basis complete with swimming pool.

Nyman, a marine engineer on an army tug in Kushima bay, Japan, saw a Japanese boy fall from a pier. Fully clothed, he jumped into the water and rescued the boy.
