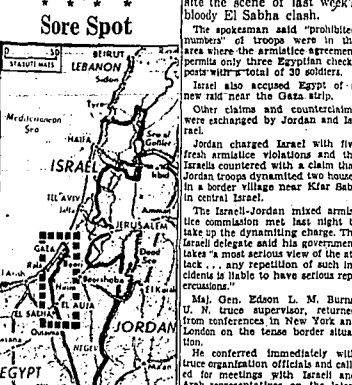

Liberty Loss Danger Seen By Newsmen

TWIN FALLS, Nov. 7 (AP)—The chairman of the subcommittee of the House of Representatives on the Society of Newspaper Editors "there is a danger that we are destroying our own liberties in a frantic scramble for national security."

The president and executive of the Washington Post, James H. Bevel, said recent defense restrictions on reporting constitute "excessive" and "unjustified" curbs on the press. He said the defense establishment is "oversteering the national security."

More than 100 newspaper editors in a House subcommittee today called for freedom of information, the subcommittee, headed by Rep. John E. Rarab, is investigating alleged suppression of government news.

Prepared statement Higgins said that "requirements of national security are not overdone." He said that "we are quite aware of the necessities of defense in a hostile world. There is no doubt that we need to have a hard choice between our safety and our liberties."

He said we can have both liberty and national security. "Unless both objectives are constantly in mind, we are in danger that in our frantic search for absolute secrecy and safety we may destroy our liberties."

Reasons Told To Believe in Virgin Births

LONDON, Nov. 7 (AP)—The British medical journal Lancet reported yesterday there are "sound reasons for believing that virgin births are possible among human beings. It said they are extremely rare if they do exist."

"Possibly some of the unmarried mothers whose obstinacy is condemned in old books on forensic medicine, or cited as a curiosity by their contemporaries, may have been telling the truth," the Lancet said.

The journal noted that parthenogenesis—reproduction without contact with another organism—is well known among lower animals and has been observed also in such vertebrates as fish.

"It is extremely rare," said the Lancet. "It is suggested that it might be as rare as the birth of sextuplets, something that happens in only one out of 2,212,800,000 pregnancies."

Dr. Helen Spurway, lecturer in biology and genetics at University college, London, said that in the event of a virgin birth the child would be female, since no male germ cells would be present.

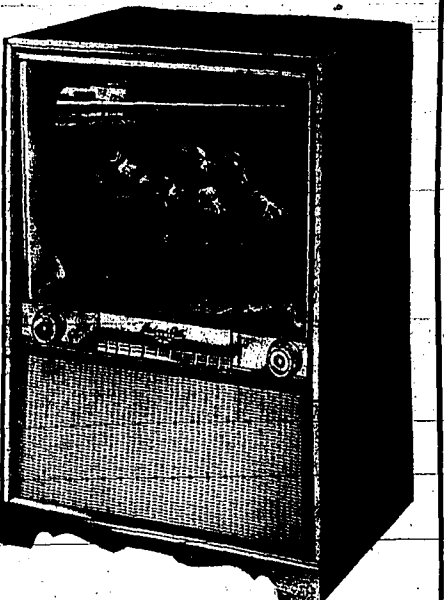

The aim is to create a new residential area right in the heart of the city. For more than 20 years businessmen and property owners have seen the St. Louis business district go downhill. The city seemed to be suffering from its own growth. St. Louis, with a population of 2,500,000, is a radius of 20 miles, a straggled by city limits imported more than 75 years ago.

There is no vacant land within the city to put up a new building, and one has to be built on a site. The first major attempt to do this was in 1910, when the city acquired some of the old buildings in the downtown area. The city wanted to keep purchasing power in the city, to hold its property values and to check the decay of the heart of St. Louis.

Behind the project, demolition of the old buildings began last April. The city is now demolishing all except two churches was torn down. About seven million dollars was expended by federal and state agencies to acquire and clear the land, but the apartments will be built by private investors at a cost of more than 20 million dollars.

Although St. Louis has been endeavoring to stimulate the city since the war and has built with federal funds more than 7200 housing units for low income families in the heart of the downtown area, this is the first privately financed redevelopment in the city.

The plaza project has raised the hopes of St. Louis businessmen that the city will be able to bring back to life. Two other projects to be started are the plan to build a shopping center and industrial building in the downtown area. The city is also planning to build a new public housing project in the downtown section. Three more public housing projects are in the planning stage.

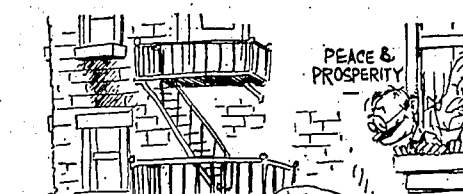

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—Rep. Metcalf said today that he believes it would be a mistake to press during the next congressional session for authorization of the Glacier View dam, a key project in the Columbia river plan.

His fears centered against invasion of the national park system by dam-builders would defeat the Montana project as it kills the upper Colorado storage plan at the Dinwoadie national monument in Colorado.

Moon's Other Face May Be Viewed Soon

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—U. S. astronomers are itching for a look at the moon's other face.

They have made the necessary calculations. They know what it would look like and an unmanned rocket 240,000 miles into space and make it photograph the side which the moon keeps constantly veered from earth.

Eye Development. Some of them believe a moon probe would be a logical follow-up to the current U. S. program to send up 10 earth satellites during the next 58 international orbital year.

But knowing theoretically that something is there is not enough from designing and manufacturing the practical hardware that will do it.

Norman V. Peterson, guided missiles company and president of the American Rocket Society, believes a space-bridging moon rocket is feasible now.

He believes two rockets equipped to explore space as far as the moon and even beyond could be built and successfully launched within the 10 million dollar budget of the "low orbit" earth satellite program.

A moon rocket is not, however, being officially planned as part of the satellite project. Some of the key moon rocket men, however, are too optimistic in point of time.

One of them, Dr. Homer G. Newell, Jr. of the naval research laboratory here, believes rockets will reach the moon "some time in the 1950's."

Writes Report. Peterson, writing his company's prospectus, said an unmanned "minimum earth-moon vehicle" could be launched by 1958. It would certainly appeal to man's age-old hunger to touch the moon, he said.

"Or," he added, "instead of landing, we might choose to circle the moon and obtain the first photos in history of its far opposite side—a sight mankind has never seen."

Actually, Peterson said, "we could choose within the same budget to place a non-returnable rocket on almost any one of the planets within our solar system."

Simple Tax Form Asked by Official

Future of United States May One Day Depend Upon Intricate Alarm System

BATTLE CREEK, Mich., Nov. 19.—A mild-mannered electrical engineer is spending almost every waking hour fashioning an intricate alarm system he hopes never will be used.

That means Roderick and the men who work under him. Logically, Roderick and his crew of hand-picked attack warning officers work in close cooperation and consultation with the air force.

Roderick's men are stationed at each of the 12-300 to be 18-air defense divisions and three air defense force headquarters in the United States. His officers have their fingers on telephone circuits that lead them directly to some 200 key-points throughout the nation.

These key-points are located in such places as state police and sheriff headquarters — offices that have communications personnel on duty around the clock.

From there the system fans out to 3,700 sub-keypoints at such locations as local police stations and state police posts. It is from these points that a warning would be spread to local residents.

"There isn't a typical day for Roderick. When he goes to work he may have to delve into the question of whether to place an attack warning officer in Alaska, discuss mutual attack warning measures with Canadian officials, locate an identification car for one of his officers in the field, approve the relocation of communications equipment—or operate the F22A headquarters warning net in a "yellow alert."

"Or," duty, he leads a quiet life, seldom attending social functions and is always checking in with headquarters when away from home.

His wife and three children have accustomed themselves to his always-on-call habits. He's just an average American to his neighbors. He paints his house, fixes the screens when they need it, reads a little, sometimes plays with the kids.

But a ring on the two telephone lines in his home can send him into instant action. Some day this action and that of Roderick's fellow "men" Paul Reeves may hold the key to the nation's survival.

American Prisoners in Japan Jails Receive Good Treatment

TOKYO, Nov. 19.—Fifty-two American prisoners who are serving time in Japan's model prison seem to be getting a pretty good break. They get special food and many privileges denied the Japanese prisoner.

Though Fuchi prison, where they are housed like in Japan's best, the Japanese are now renovating a new prison for them in Yokohama. The prisoners complained of cold last winter, and the new one is being equipped with central heating.

The "American" are serving sentences of from two months to 15 years for crimes including murder, rape, assault and robbery. Most of them were drunk when they committed the offenses for which they were convicted.

They wear blue denim prison uniforms like the 3,700 other prisoners in Fuchi. But they get better treatment under an agreement made when the United States gave Japan jurisdiction in October, 1953, over crimes committed on non-territorial territory.

The daily routine is: 6:30 a.m. rise, breakfast, then work until 11 with a 15-minute break at 8:15. Then lunch and work until 4 p.m. with a 15-minute break at 2:15. After that, there is supper and relaxation until lights out at 9.

Most of the Americans live in separate cells, about 4' by 8 feet, equipped with a tiny desk, a flush toilet and wash basin. They can choose whether to sleep on an iron cot, with mattress, or on the floor on a Japanese quilt-like mattress.

Eighteen of the Americans, at their own request, live in community cells. These contain chairs, tables, bookcases, with books and magazines, cards, checkers and personal pictures of loved ones.

The prisoners work in various of the prison's 23 workshops. All cells and workshops contain flowers, which the prisoners grow in the prison flower beds.

There is an ambitious sports program—tennis, softball, volleyball, basketball, wrestling.

Each cell has a radio loudspeaker for programs from 5 to 9 p.m.

The Americans get army-standard food—250 calories a day including stew, roast pork, roast beef, eggs, potatoes, bacon and other items. They may order such things as soap, shaving cream, toothbrushes, etc.

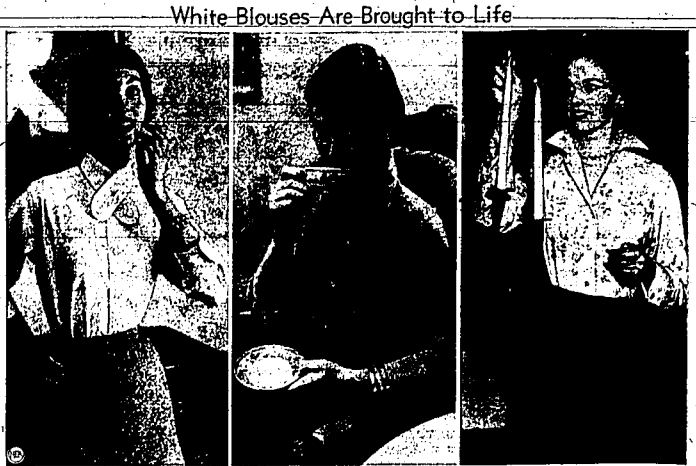

The education and training of the nation's children must be a matter of cooperation, broad and deep. It cannot be left to any one individual, no matter how able, no matter how well he may be equipped. It is a task that requires the cooperation of all who are concerned with the future of our country.

What can we do as parents? We can help our children to become good citizens, to become acquainted with the things that go on in their lives, to become interested in the things that go on in the world. We can help them to become self-reliant, to become responsible, to become honest, to become kind, to become brave, to become true.

We are going to need teachers, well-trained ones, not only for the new schools but for the present ones. Why are so few willing to prepare for teaching? I assume there are good reasons and if you are one of them, you should be able to explain them.

Does your child get along well with his school? Is he happy and interested? Has he any special talents? If so, how can you help him to develop them? If not, how can you help him to overcome his weaknesses?

We are faced by the need for tremendous expansion of schools from the elementary grades on up to the college level.

Keeping Weight Off Is Hardest Part of Dieting

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—The complete smile isn't follows a few weeks of successful dieting for the discomfort of many a would-be dieter.

We smile too soon, one authority said the other day. Then we all back and start eating our regular food again and get right back to our original shape.

"Treatment of overweight is in a very unsatisfactory stage," Dr. Frederick J. Stare, chairman of Harvard university's department of nutrition, stated frankly in a recent visit here to address a medical meeting.

"Practically anybody can lose weight for the first few weeks or months. But if you go back and examine these same people two or three years later, you are very embarrassed about the results of your diet."

Dr. Stare explained in an interview that the new theories of weight losing are based on realistic, common sense rules.

"The hardest part of dieting is keeping the weight off once you lose it," he continued. "So far that reason the best diets are those planned around foods people normally would eat as they will stick to the diets for years."

The nutrition expert advocates a family-awareness program that will make even children conscious of sensible eating. He says parents should eat the example by the size of the food portions on their own plates.

Election Test Faces Friend Of U.S. Aims

One of the best friends the United States has will face a test of his strength tomorrow. He is the hearty, corruption-hating President Ramon Magasaysay of the Philippines.

In a mid-term election, Filipinos will be voting for nine of their country's 24 senators and for thousands of provincial governors, mayors and city councilors.

One-Time Aides
The two men who were mainly responsible for Magasaysay's election in November, 1953, are among those who are campaigning against him.

Though few of the election contests are of national importance, Magasaysay's opponents are looking forward to the next presidential election, to be held in November, 1957.

Magasaysay's enemies have been able to find but one big accusation to make against him—that he is too pro-American.

Opponents Named
His two most bitter opponents are Senators Claro M. Recto and Jose P. Laurel. They are Nationalist party leaders, picked Magasaysay as the man who might defeat liberal President Quirino for reelection in 1953.

Magasaysay had served brilliantly as Quirino's defense minister. But he resigned from the cabinet, and from the Liberal party, because he said the administration was ridden by corruption.

Recto is running for reelection as senator. Though he says he is still a Nationalist, he is running as a "guest" candidate of the Liberty Party. Laurel, also still in the Nationalist party officially, is backing him.

Break Noted
Magasaysay broke with Recto last July when Recto said, in a senate speech, that he was an American puppet.

Recto announced he planned to run for the presidency in 1957 in order to keep Magasaysay from getting a second term.

"Let him run," Magasaysay said. "He can run as a candidate of the Philippine Communists. I will run as an enemy of communism and a friend of the United States."

Italian Immigrant Has Lowly Job but Loves Adopted Land

NEW YORK, Nov. 7 (AP)—Today's success story:

In the humming world of Rockefeller Center, one of America's busiest cities is a man, Louis Palella, is a more familiar figure than John D. Rockefeller, Jr., or his five sons.

"L o u i s" "L a i g h" as many of his clients call him—came to the United States 50 years ago as a boy of 15. Since then he has achieved an average of 50 pairs of shoes a day, or about 450,000 shoes.

His most memorable customer was President Harry Truman, who took his high standing up during a morning walk, paid 25 cents and said, "Thank you."

"He was a very good man—I always admired him," recalled Louis, who doesn't go into politics but puts an equal glow on Democrats and Republicans alike.

Louis, who says "with me business is always looking up," has raised two children.

At the age of 18 Louis' father took him back to Italy.

"They paid me 15 cents a day to carry rocks for a building," Louis said, "and I told them if I could only see America again I would never see Italy again."

After four months Louis did come back to the United States, became a citizen and never has returned to Italy.

"I still don't want to go back," he said. "I have nobody there any more—only my three nephews and my sister-in-law."

"When I saw the statue of liberty when I came back I said this was God's country, and I'll say all the time God bless America. I don't say this because it is the thing to say, but because it is the best country to live in."

Of his sons Louis is proud. One is a salesman, one works for a steel company.

"I don't mind shining shoes," he said, "but I don't want my sons to have to."

Graham Speaks Cambridge, England, Nov. 7 (AP)—Some 2,000 undergraduates of Cambridge university flocked to hear Evangelist Billy Graham last night and 150 of them stayed afterwards to talk about making decisions for Christ.
