INFORMALITY TREND
The accent is on informality in American living, as on the ground. For the most part this is all to the good. But there is a trap or two we have to be on guard that informality does not lead to total gracelessness.

These days the casual note dominates in our wearing apparel—sport shirts, slacks, sweaters and skirts, soft, comfortable, low-heeled shoes, and so on.

It's the dress that counts. Lots of the new fashions feature large, open areas without partitions. A family can arrange its living within the area any way it wishes, with activities flowing easily from one part to another.

Just as easily, the family pattern expands to take in the outdoors. This is the age of the terrace, the canvas chair and the charcoal brazier.

Our cars reflect the trend. Station wagons, the all-purpose vehicles, used to be virtually unknown. Today many manufacturers offer them in several different models, and even their high price isn't discouraging buyers who want flexibility in their transportation arrangements. The so-called hardtop convertibles are another sign of the informal approach.

People with a sense-wants-to-interrupt or reverse this trend. Life can be trying enough without placing it in the strait-jacket of stiff formality. The days of the starched collar, the drawing room nobody sat in, and the car that looked like a hearse are gone forever.

But "informality" as a term can be used to cloak a lot of habits and attitudes that come pretty close to being crude.

The line between acceptable informality and demure sloppiness is not always well maintained these days in the attire some of us wear. One can be casual without forgetting that clothes should be neat, clean, and at least bearable to the eye.

Rising costs have, of course, squeezed some of the informality out of the house. In countless homes there's too little of it for growing families whose possessions crowd every unattended square inch.

But we still have to fight the battle to keep our places neat and orderly. A home that is a mess of clutter, outside and in, is a small patch of chaos in a teeming world where the deuces can only be kept at the family level.

It's wonderful to live casually. It's also wonderful to live graciously. For that reason, informality in human behavior, the two things aren't antagonistic but can go together very well.

"PEOPLE'S CAPITALISM"
A campaign to use "People's Capitalism" as a new name for the American economic system in its fight against communism has been launched here.

Trying to call modern capitalism the "profit system," an ultrast economics or consumerism has not done the trick.

"The Commie line is still that 'decadent Wall Street capitalism' is the enemy and will ultimately be defeated.

Stuart Peabody, vice president of the Borden company and chairman of the Advertising Council, is given credit by Repplier with first suggesting the name, "People's Capitalism."

His thought was simply to liberate a word which the communists themselves had captured and misread.

"Every time the Soviet propaganda machine thunders against capitalism," said Repplier in presenting his "People's Capitalism" idea to the business-paper editors, "our obvious cue is to thunder back that a completely new system of capitalism has come about which is neither communism nor capitalism."

Salk Vaccine Wins Praise From Scheele

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Surgeon General Leonard Scheele said yesterday that results of a "siva" trial indicate that children who receive one dose were substantially protected against polio.

"Preliminary data show," he added, "that paralytic attacks have been reduced to 90 per cent in unvaccinated children of the same age."

He gave the "siva" an address prepared for the 62nd annual convention of the Association of Military Surgeons of the United States.

He predicted the eventual elimination of paralytic polio through the use of "siva" and other vaccines and public health "which he said have made progress also against other diseases."

"It would seem," he added, "that in another generation or two the polio epidemic of the United States could be as free of general danger as the epidemic of typhoid, diphtheria, tetanus, typhus and cholera, which have been eliminated."

He said that "siva" is a "live" vaccine, that is, it contains the virus which causes the disease, but it is so weakened that it cannot cause the disease.

Job List for Nation Is at Record Top

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Nearly 65 million jobs are available in the nation, the highest level of employment ever reached for that number, the government reported yesterday.

However, the report said, a big increase in unemployment among job seekers—brought into the labor market by the availability of jobs in the present boom—has held the level of unemployment nearly unchanged at 4.5 per cent.

The report said that the number of job seekers in October dropped from 2,800,000 in September and contracted with the usual October dip of approximately 10 per cent.

The monthly report, by the commission on unemployment, said overtime work at factories went up and average factory payroll increased 1.7 per cent.

This was a new peak nearly \$5.50 more than the average factory pay envelope contained in the report.

Meanwhile, the commerce department in its monthly report on stocks of unused goods in the country said that the level of unused goods in the country was \$2,700,000,000, more than the value of stocks a year earlier.

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Court Ruling End on Race Segregations

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—The supreme court yesterday formally ended the death knell for racial segregation in all places supported by public funds.

In separate, unanimous actions the court affirmed a decision holding that racial segregation in public parks and playgrounds, and ordered Negroes admitted to public schools.

This, in effect, swept away what remained of the historic "separate but equal" doctrine as applied to tax-supported facilities.

The major blow to that doctrine, of course, came in the court's unanimous decision in May 1954 holding that racial segregation in public schools unconstitutional.

Until then, the "separate but equal" doctrine, originally laid down in 1896, had largely governed the legality of segregation in public parks and playgrounds. It meant that segregation was permissible when separate but equal facilities, such as schools, were provided for different races.

Under only 11 words, the high court affirmed a decision by the U. S. court of appeals in Richmond, Va., that racial segregation in public parks and playgrounds is illegal. All the court said was: "The motion to affirm is granted and the judgment is affirmed."

The Richmond tribunal had said that the "separate but equal" doctrine, originally laid down in 1896, had largely governed the legality of segregation in public parks and playgrounds. 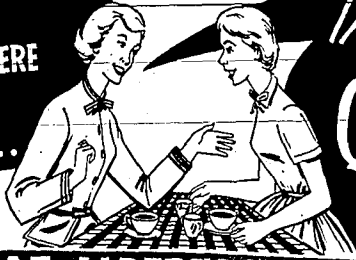

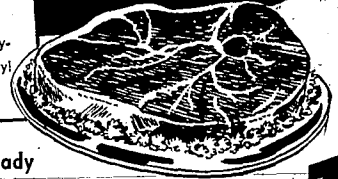

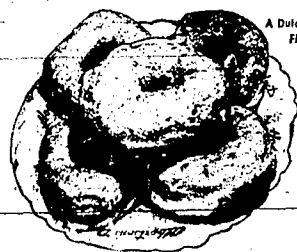

Fred Citizen Wants to See Screen Show

MANILA, Nov. 8 (AP)—An American businessman, Fred Citizen, of Communist China last week after seven years said today the first thing he wants to do is see a movie picture in a cinema.

The businessman, Ralph Boyd, 64, of Seattle, Wash., arrived here today aboard the royal Intercean lines freighter Americk from Shanghai en route to Hong Kong. He has a wife and two children. He was accompanied by his Chinese wife, Lynn Wong, 37, Shanghai.

He said they were married in Shanghai in 1949.

"Lynn and I have heard so much about those wide screen movies that we decided to give them top priority in our list of activities," Boyd said.

Boyd was a foreign trader in Shanghai before the war. In October, 1948, he returned to Shanghai to liquidate his investments and sell his holdings. But with the war coming closer to Shanghai, nobody wanted to buy or invest. While he waited for the Communists to take over, the Boyds finally left Shanghai.

The Boyds landed in Hong Kong on the freighter stopped over in Cebu City, central Philippines, and then came to Manila in 1950.

The couple all arrived on the same boat next Friday for Davao City, southern Philippines and then Hong Kong.

Boyd said he wanted to see his show papers in Hong Kong (he is not an American citizen) and renew his business connections.

Ike Has Plea For Help on School Plans

DENVER, Nov. 8 (AP)—President Eisenhower yesterday issued a new appeal for effective local, state and federal action to eliminate the nation's school classroom shortage.

The President did so through Secretary of Welfare Fulbright after he and the cabinet officer had conferred in the Chief Executive's room at Philadelphia army hospital.

After the session, Fulbright put out a prepared statement saying:

"The President continues to feel strongly that sound and effective local, state and federal action is needed to eliminate the nation's school classroom shortage."

Fulbright also reported that he discussed with the administration's broad program for better health care, a program—along with the school classroom program—that was shelved at the last session of congress.

Fulbright said he and the President took a "fresh look at the whole situation with respect to the classroom program, and that they also talked over the possible improvement and expansion" in connection with the health program.

As for the classroom construction situation, the cabinet officer said:

"The President and I discussed a number of possible improvements and relations which we are considering in the administration's proposals for federal assistance. The President expressed hope we will find wide agreement in congress, and among educators and citizens generally, on this broad action program involving the welfare of so many children."

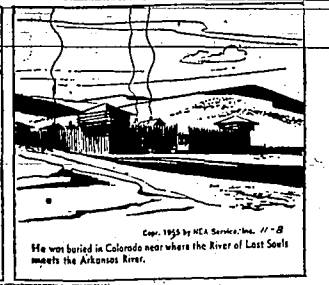

Israel Is Seen Preparing for Bitter Life or Death Battle

TEL AVIV, Nov. 8 (AP)—The world, but Gans is less than tiny Jewish state squeezed between two hords by highway or just a the mountains of ancient Judah and quick burst of throttle of a Czech Mediterranean, is preparing itself necessary to fight a life or death battle.

But the Israelis, while hoping for peace, believe that Czech arm shipments to Egypt have altered the middle east balance of power so Israel is gradually that an Arab coalition may launch a war of annihilation against the seven-year-old Jewish state.

An Israeli government spokesman said, "and remember, this war if it comes won't be like World War II or Korea. There will be no quarter for us and the objective will be to drive us into the sea."

"Look at the map and see how narrow that margin is," he said. "At one point north, the Arab-Israeli border with the Arab states the country is only seven miles wide. Its maximum width is 41 miles.

Official Defies Threats, Will Start Hunting

ALBUQUERQUE, Nov. 9—A federal official, Gen. P. W. Rutledge of Ft. Bliss, Tex., has now sided with plans for military hunting on the "happy hunting ground" of southern New Mexico.

He has been selected to hunt on the 400,000-acre federal hunting range in southern New Mexico which is surrounded by New Mexico land and is separated from Texas by a strip 12 miles long and six miles wide.

The shimmering spot over which he and his "hunt" team will operate in the area practically boiled over as New Mexico officials continued their warnings. Sen. Dennis Chavez, D., N. M., warned against using military cars in the hunt, and U. S. Atty. Paul Larrazolo lined up behind the state.

Rutledge has contended that he has no jurisdiction over the hunting range as commanding general of Ft. Bliss and that he is empowered by law to issue licenses on the military reservation.

New Mexico contends that soldiers hunting on the reservation must have a \$50 non-resident hunting license. The closest move toward a compromise came from Rutledge who offered to allow New Mexico to collect a \$5 fee. New Mexico officials turned down the offer with strong words.

Rutledge reportedly has thought of filing or conveying a writ from the area to avoid New Mexico game department checkpoints on the six-mile strip. "The game department says it will 'very definitely' establish road blocks."

The splendid manner where all those rich people live in the movies is being eroded by America's newer crop of millionaires. A trip through the finer neighborhoods around the country tells the story.

Homes Cited
A Boston shoe manufacturer spent \$100,000 on his home and not an eight-room ranch house. The millionaire vice president of a major food store chain lives in a \$70,000 ranch house in Philadelphia.

Texas oil millionaire G. A. G. Vaughn, Jr., built a million-dollar home in his new house in Dallas but it is a one and a half story rambling affair having no resemblance to the Palace of Versailles.

When millionaire builder Henry Dodge of San Francisco erected his "dream house" it turned out to have five bedrooms, just enough for his family and the maid.

Of course the Dodge home has a swimming pool in the living room. This, according to real estate brokers who cater to the very rich, sort of typifies what is going on.

Informally Bought
Another factor is the tone of informality which pervades American life today. You can't be very informal in a house with a drawing room, dining room, study, dumb-waiters and as many bedrooms as a small hotel.

The old millionaires would never have recognized a kitchen. Nowadays they are likely to help with the cooking and even eat in the kitchen. The kitchen and the play-room are the two important rooms now.

B. A. Banker, a broker in expensive properties in San Francisco, says 75 per cent of the wealthy people buying homes today buy for location, chiefly. Their homes are smaller and aren't built to house servants.

Writer Flays Common Use Of Big Word

SINGAPORE, Nov. 8 (AP)—An American author, who claims he coined the word "brainwashing," said today that his word is being used too loosely.

Edward Hunter, author of "Brainwashing in Red China," expressed dismay that the word was used to describe reported pressure on Princess Margaret, to reject Group Captain Peter Townsend.

He said he read in a newspaper that the British princess was "brainwashed."

"Brainwashing has a specific meaning," Hunter said, "and refers to a combination of elements based on experiments made with dogs by a Russian physiologist named Pavlov. The elements include either mild or intensive degrees of hunger, fatigue, threats, violence and sometimes drugs and hypnosis."
