Hall contended that "it is a mistake to read a national trend into these local elections. They are, in fact, the opposite of what we have seen in the past. It is traditional for the party out of power to make some gains in off-year elections."

But Butler said: "After making full allowance for local factors, there is no doubt that this was a national significance. It springs from the injection of a new factor into the political scene and from many Democratic victories in traditionally wavering areas."

Nash Line for '56 to Be Seen Here Nov. 17

New "speed-line" styling and 1956 highlights in the Nash line of Ambassador and Statesman models which will go on display Nov. 17 at Magic Valley agencies.

Nash will offer four horsepower ratings on its 1956 models, the 200, 245, 285 and 320. The new styling treatment begins at the front where new parking-running lights set off the front fenders. Sixty-two headlights are mounted in the grille to provide maximum illumination and safety.

From the side of the Ambassador's front fender, a color spear outline in chrome trim sweeps back to the rear fender, widening to a modified "V" and then sweeping up and over the rear deck. The "speed-line" allows three different combinations to be used on the new cars.

Back-up lights, standard on Custom models, are housed in the new tail-light assembly.

The new Ambassador Jetfire V-8 engine with twin carburetors, developing 225 horsepower, compared with 208 last year. The V-8 also has a higher torque rating, a lower compression ratio and more piston displacement.

A new Statesman Typhoon overhead-valve engine, developing 195 horsepower with a single carburetor, 110 with dual carburetors. The Ambassador Super Jetfire 8 now has 123 horsepower and the optional LeMay Dual Jetfire 8 is increased to 145 horsepower.

Other features of the new Nash include double-seat, single-unit body construction, drop-coil ride, AirLine reclining seats and twin travel bars, all-season air conditioning, air intake below the windshield and body-erased black enamel finishes. The Nash reclining seats can be adjusted to five different positions and be made into a bed.

Five models will be offered in the 1956 Nash line, including the Statesman V-8 Custom Country Club hardtop, Ambassador V-8 Custom four-door sedan, Ambassador V-8 Super four-door sedan and Statesman Super four-door sedan.

Reclining interiors, including the instrument panel, steering wheel, foot pedals, floor mats and head linings, are available. Blue-gray or tan interior harmonize with exteriors and special custom trim is standard on Custom models and optional on the Ambassador 8 Super four-door.

The 1956 Nash has six three-tone, 15 two-tone and 14 solid color combinations. Eleven of the 14 colors are new.

The new V-8 engine develops 320 foot-pounds of torque at 2,200 to 2,500 revolutions per minute. The compression ratio is 10 to 1 and displacement totals 352 cubic inches. The V-8, a completely counter-balanced engine, has larger intake valves and is equipped with an oil filter and oil bath air cleaner as standard equipment.

The new Statesman six-cylinder engine has a torque rating of 175 foot-pounds at 1,800 revolutions per minute and a compression ratio of 7.44 to 1. Premium fuel is not required.

The Ambassador has a wheelbase of 121 1/2 inches; overall length is 209 1/2 inches without the continental tire mount and 219 1/2 inches with it; overall height is 62 1/2 inches and overall width is 78 inches.

The Statesman has a wheelbase of 114 1/2 inches; overall length without the tire is 202 1/2 inches; with it, 212 1/2 inches. Overall height is 61 1/2 inches and overall width is 78 inches.

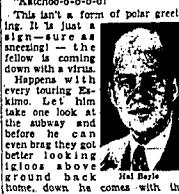

This isn't a form of polar greeting. It is just a word of greeting. It is just a sign—sure as a fellow coming down with a virus. Happens with every touring Eskimo. Let him take one look at the subway and before he can even brag they get better looking Eskimo, down he goes, down he goes with the sniffles.

The people who come here to admire the skyscrapers in our town remain to enjoy our viruses. As a matter of fact the residents here no longer boast about the skyscrapers. That is taken as rather ancient history.

Your real Eskimo New Yorker, full of civic pride, would rather dwell on less well known virtues of our spreading cosmopolitan community.

We particularly excel in civilized diseases and uncivilized weather. In the size of ulcers we don't claim we outmatch Hollywood. All we say is that we got more of them. And we can prove statistically that for every two-ulcer man you see in Hollywood and Vine we can produce four three-ulcer men along Broadway. We have fellows who even die themselves but continue to feed their wives three square meals a day.

Other cities now and then call attention to an epidemic. But we've got so many viruses we name them after the month. A showoff might now be a fellow who claims he's got an April virus in November.

"Take virus away from a New Yorker this time of year and what have you got left? Only a guy with a 'bionomie' feeling. A virus is more than a form of social prestige here, it's a social necessity.

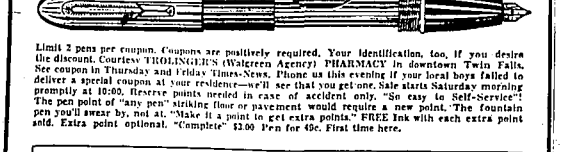

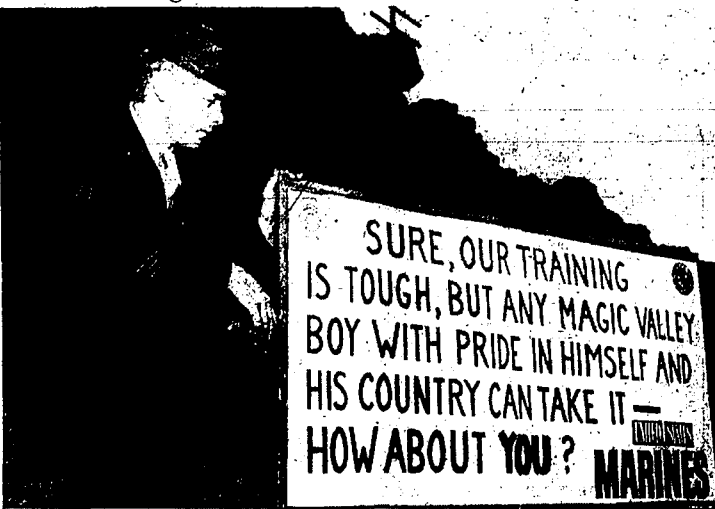

Labor Seeks Demo Power, Claims Solon

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Nov. 9 (AP)—William F. Knowland, California senator who is expected to be a Republican presidential aspirant if President Eisenhower doesn't run, said yesterday some labor leaders hope to capture the Democratic party and gain control of the government.

This was a part of a speech in which Knowland ranted over many domestic and international subjects including U. S. foreign policy.

Addressing the U. S. Savings and Loan annual convention, Knowland urged that U. S. foreign policy not be "left in the colonial policies of France and Great Britain," and that there be no European security pact with the Soviet Union until Soviet forces are withdrawn from satellite states in eastern Europe.

Knowland said the people and congress are going to watch how the leaders of the combined AFL and CIO attempt to wield political power.

"There are some in the ranks of the new labor combine who visualize taking control of the Democratic party as they have in the state of Michigan and making it into the equivalent of the British Labor party," said Knowland.

Voting Sweep Sticks Demos In Top Spots

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 9 (AP)—Richardson Dilworth, a veteran of the political wars, led a Democratic sweep of the city yesterday when he gained a smashing majority victory over W. Thacher Longstreth, Republican newcomer running under the mantle of President Eisenhower.

The race highlighted an off-year election throughout Pennsylvania, devoid of statewide battles but replete with local skirmishes.

Dilworth's whopping 132,687-vote triumph filtered from the top of the ticket down through the contests for district attorney, sheriff, clerk of quarter sessions court, city council—with one exception—and the magistrate's courts.

Complete unofficial returns from the city's 1,512 precincts gave Dilworth 430,140; Longstreth 287,653.

Democrats were successful in Pittsburgh also with a sweep in the rankings. Pittsburgh and Philadelphia, the state's two biggest population centers, have been strongholds in the recent successes of the Democrats, both on a local and state level including Democratic Gov. George M. Leader's decisive victory one year ago.

The majority contest between the 37-year-old Dilworth and the 29-year-old Longstreth, an advertising company executive, was regarded as a straw in a wind blowing toward the 1956 presidential elections.

Conclave of News Groups Lists Agenda

CHICAGO, Nov. 9.—More than 300 leaders of the newspaper, radio, television and public relations professions met today for the 10th annual convention of Sigma Delta Chi, national journalistic fraternity.

They are scheduled to discuss the problem of impartial coverage in next year's presidential campaign and to attend panel discussions on television news and freedom of the press on university campuses during the four-day meeting.

The featured speaker at Saturday's winding session will be Attorney General Herbert Brownell. He was expected to give the Eisenhower administration's answer to charges of news censorship.

Dr. Alberto Gaiuzza Paz, former owner and publisher of La Prensa in Argentina, will speak tomorrow on the recent revolution in his country, and Ambassador Felix von Eckardt, West German observer to the United Nations, will report on the big four-Geneva negotiations.

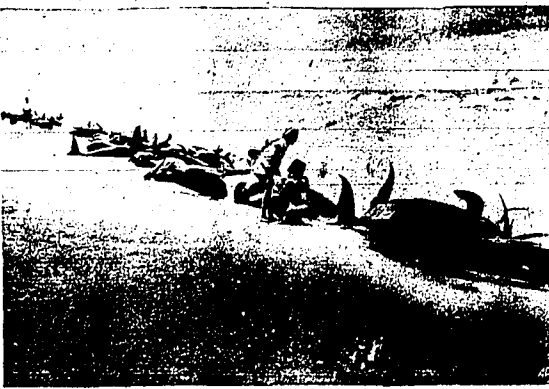

Bonn Leader Does Not Like Russ Delegate

The West German government is putting out its "welcome" mat for Russia's prospective new ambassador. In fact, it has made it clear that it would prefer to see the uncolored tennis of Valentin Alex androvich Zorin exerted elsewhere.

It was announced in Moscow one week ago today that Zorin had been named as the Kremlin's first envoy to the Bonn republic.

On the surface, it appeared that the Soviet government was paying chancellor Konrad Adenauer quite an honor. For Zorin is a deputy foreign minister and one of Russia's first rank diplomats.

But the West German government registered both shock and resentment at the news.

First, the Russians did not bother to conform to the usual diplomatic niceties by withholding their announcement until the West German government had approved their nominee.

Secondly, Zorin is one of the most notorious hatchet men in the Soviet foreign service.

The agreement to exchange ambassador was made during Adenauer's visit to Moscow in September. Adenauer consented only reluctantly, because he failed to get the concession he wanted as the price of establishing relations.

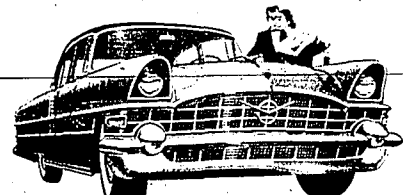

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Theory Given On Causes of Moon Craters

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—What caused the numerous craters of the moon, thus creating the "face" of the man in the moon? Was it bubbling of molten magma in a bombardment of meteorites landing into the soft surface of the moon? There are advocates of both theories.

But another theory, that the mountains and craters came from a bubble of gas in the molten magma, is advanced by a Norwegian astronomer, Ingolf Rudd, writing in the astronomy magazine Sky and Telescope.

Man Intrigued
The features of the moon—rising here, setting there—have intrigued ordinary men and scientists for centuries.

Basically, his idea is that the crust, as it cooled, contracted and lightened around the hotter interior.

The moon's crust is complicated, probably consisting of two layers which intrude into each other, Rudd says. The lower layer is thicker.

Cities Theory
According to Rudd's theory, as the lower layer cooled, it contracted and cracked.

As the upper layer cooled off, it tended to be deformed in circular areas where there were cracks.

At the same time, the outer layer was displaced and pushed down to form ring-shaped swellings around the circular areas.

This action, Rudd says, could give rise to the rings of mountains visible around depressions or craters on the moon.

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Court Blocks Payment for Death Claim

BOISE, Nov. 9. (AP)—The state supreme court Tuesday reversed the award of \$2,995 in life insurance benefits to the estate of a McCann man who was slain last year in a shooting incident in his home.

Chief Justice C. J. Taylor ruled in an unanimous opinion the evidence failed to support a jury verdict that Cecil James Gray was not committing a crime when he died.

Gray was shot to death by his wife Astes in February, 1952. She claimed he came home drunk one night, threatened to beat her, then attacked her while she defended herself with a shotgun.

The verdict went to his former wife Lucy, who held an insurance policy for \$1,025 and a supplemental policy paying \$1,408 in the event of accidental death.

Affix asked for a pro-rated share of the benefits, claiming she had helped pay some of the premiums, but she did not attend the jury's verdict.

After the shooting, Ames was charged with second degree murder and found innocent by a jury.
