Makers Hike Buying Price Of New Cars

DETROIT, Nov. 11.—Buyers last on 1955 model passenger cars are up \$10.90 to as much as \$350 but whether the customer will pay the full amount is yet to be determined.

It has been suggested in some quarters that price discounting at the dealer level will have to continue if current high sales volume is to be maintained. The manufacturers are talking about another record-smashing output in the year ahead.

Some recent big "In the broader picture, lower price brackets the increases were not as large as had been expected. Chevrolet advanced its price \$49.25 to \$8425; Ford advanced them \$45 to \$59, and Plymouth \$62 to \$104.

The increases were generally more in the higher price field of such makes as Cadillac, Chrysler, and Lincoln.

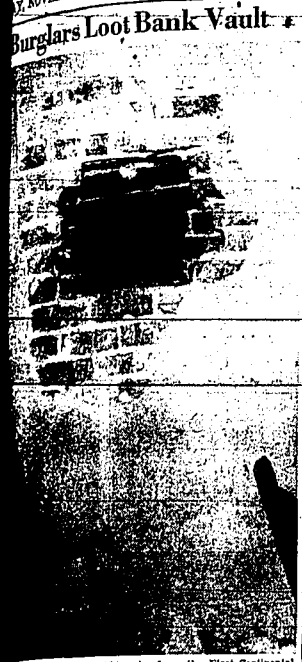

Group States U. S. Policies Harm Mining

BOISE, Nov. 11 (U.P.)—In a letter to Sen. Herman Welker, R. Ida., Harry W. Marsh, secretary of the Idaho Mining association, yesterday asserted that federal government policies have resulted in drastic reduction of mineral consumption in Idaho.

He also told the senator the policies have squeezed the silver producer against a fixed ceiling price.

Marsh said between 1951 and 1954 the number of active lode mines in Idaho decreased 35 per cent, the number of silver mines dropped 66 per cent and the tons of ore mined dropped 49 per cent.

"The value of lead produced in Idaho decreased 28 per cent," Marsh said, "and the value of zinc produced decreased 33 per cent, the value of all metals produced decreased 30 per cent."

"When such a situation develops during a period of unparalleled growth in the national economy, it is a fair inference that something is wrong."

He described "caving" of the price structure.

He added that although domestic industrial consumption of silver is in excess of the production, a "healthy price structure" is not obtained because the industrial consumer can buy silver from the federal treasury for 91 cents an ounce.

Marsh said this places an "effective ceiling" on the price.

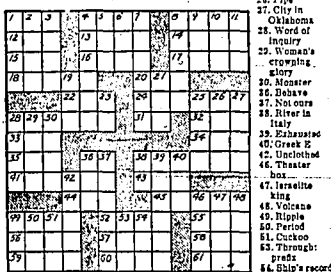

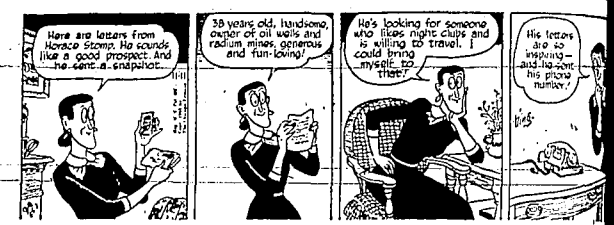

6 Youths Die In Crackup of Auto, Engine

PLATO, Minn., Nov. 11 (AP)—Six teen-agers were killed last night when a speeding Milwaukee steamroller, streaking through the rain, smashed into their car at a crossing.

The auto was demolished and debris was scattered 100 feet along the track.

Four of the dead were boys and two were girls. State police identified the victims as Maurice Olson, 14, his sister, Carrie, 16, Milton Dreif, and Margaret Fuller, 16, all Plato, and Robert Traudt, 17, and Roger Traudt, 17, both New Auburn.

Train crewmen said they first saw the car when the locomotive was 20 yards from the crossing. Dr. M. Howell, deputy coroner of McLeod county, said the crossing has no warning signals, but despite the rain, "the view was clear."

The steamroller No. 5, travelling about 10 miles an hour, was en route from Minneapolis to Aberdeen, S. D., when it crashed into the car at a crossing on crossing on the north end of Plato.

Officials said the bodies were being handled and the car was broken into six pieces.

State Auditor To Distribute Forest Funds

Honors Are Given to Fading Soldiers of First World War

NEW YORK (AP)—Nov. 11—If on this Veterans' day some aging gaffer starts reminiscing about the war, or Chateau Thierry, don't offend by asking: "What in the world are you talking about?"

Those words are carved deep in his heart—as are other words like "Bellevue Wood" and the "Argonne Forest"—and he finds it astounding that a younger generation remembers so little of names that once stirred all America.

For it was in places like these he had part of his youth. This Alamo-Marne looms larger in his memory than the Mason-Dixon line and in his mind the poppies are still glowing in meadows Florida.

He is a survivor of the 20th century's first great conflict, and he feels that in his own lifetime his own sacrifices are now largely overlooked. And he is not without considerable justification for this viewpoint.

In every war many soldiers feel they are fighting on a forgotten front. The troops in the Pacific islands felt that way in the second World war. So did the troops in Italy.

"Do people back home think the whole war is being fought in Normandy?" was the popular complaint. "Don't they know there's a war going on here, too?"

Time has a way of dimming most wars, but they rarely are forgotten while the men who fought them are still alive. Many veterans of the first world war, however, are gloomily convinced that their war has been forgotten pretty much by everyone except themselves.

The "retreads"—first world war veterans who also served in the second world war—look a heavy mental bearing from their younger comrades, who often told them mockingly:

"Pop never mind telling us about your little war. If you'd done the right kind of a job in your War to End All Wars, we wouldn't be fighting this one. That's why we're over here—to finish the job you started."

And poor middle-aged Pop had to take it and laugh. The kids had him outnumbered. They still do.

As of a year ago, America's veterans numbered 20 million. Of these 80 per cent, or 15,424,000, were veterans of the second world war, and 3,023,000 had served since the start of the "Korean" campaign in June, 1950.

Pop is slowly being swallowed amid the masses of newer and younger veterans.

Yet it was in no such league war that Pop won both his scars and his medals.

It was a titanic conflict involving 77 nations and 65,038,810 troops. The total casualties were 21,508,668, of whom 8,532,815 were killed in combat or died.

The American nation put 4,253,000 men under arms. It suffered 391,800 casualties, including 126,000 deaths. Some 17 nations still owe the United States more than 17 billion dollars from that war.

It was a war in which the submarine, airplane and tank—three decisive weapons of the second world war—first saw widespread tactical use. Three weapons it lacked: "G" nations, the jeep, the atom bomb.

Time is steadily whitening down Pop and his doughboy buddies of the past. A man drafted at 25 in 1917 at 63 years old—only two years short of his pension age. An American Legion friend of mine estimated several years ago that first world war veterans were dying at the rate of 85 a day.

Pop can be forgiven if he now and then he grumbles. "The only guy in our crowd that hasn't been forgotten is the unknown soldier."

So now on Veterans' day, let's lift

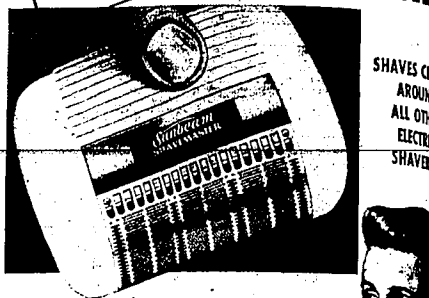
