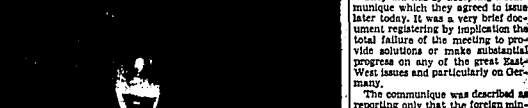

Winter's Night Brings Boost In Power Use

Spokane, Nov. 18 (UP)—The 11 million kilowatts of Northwest power carried a record-breaking 8,600,000 kilowatts of power between the hours of 8 to 9 p. m. on the night of Nov. 14, it was disclosed yesterday.

Marshall Blair, a member of the power commission said that all electric generators were producing at capacity and that the load was 10 per cent more than the peak time last winter.

The steam boilers were fired up Sunday night so that we would be ready for Monday's cold spell. Blair said. Also in full production were steam generators in Utah.

The energy load in the pool Monday night was by far the highest on record. It was 100,000 kilowatts of power higher than the average load carried by the pool in 1935.

The Bonneville power administration had to call on a capacity of 4,000,000 kilowatts to meet demands during the 6-p. m. period. Some 185,000 kilowatts were switched into the system during the peak of the morning.

Public Report On Air Crash Will Be Given

DENVER, Nov. 18 (UP)—The civil aeronautics board has promised a public report within two months on the cause of the crash of a biplane in a field near the city on Oct. 8.

The board conducted a two-day hearing yesterday. Left unexplained was why two United Air lines' top executives flew over the crash site Oct. 8 to witness the crash.

Witnesses testified the plane was flying 20 miles south of its prescribed course from Denver to Salt Lake City and 200 feet below the minimum safe altitude for the region.

U. A. L. official said the company had considered and discarded sabotage as a possible cause. Another said the only explanation could offer was that the pilot and copilot of the DC-3 were incapacitated.

George A. Van Epps, chairman of the CAB's structure group, testified the board had no indication of a mechanical failure before the crash.

This sudden move came as nearly two-thirds of the 60 U. N. members lined up behind a Canadian resolution that would limit all 16 applications. Diplomats said 35 members were committed and they expected more than the two-thirds needed to pass the assembly.

6 Servicemen Are Drowned In Maneuver

Two bodies were recovered and marine and naval air-sea rescue units were searching for the others.

The deaths were part of an assault on the beaches of Camp Pendleton by 15,000 members of the 1st Marine Division.

Marines identified the dead as Maj. Ralph H. Pratt, 37, commander of the third amphibious landing company.

Youth Killed in Hunting Mishap

BONNERS PERKY, Nov. 18 (UP)—David Bolt, 17, was killed yesterday while hunting about seven miles north of his home.

The death could be laid indirectly to the cold weather since Bolt and two other youths were hunting when classes were dismissed after pipes had broken in the school building.

Darkness Balks Rescue of 9 Hunters Stranded in Hills

By The Associated Press. Rescue operations for nine stranded Utah hunters were suspended by darkness Tuesday night, but officials in eastern Idaho said they had found three hunters missing there since Sunday.

Another trio of Idaho hunters was found earlier Tuesday. Sub-zero temperatures followed a sudden snow storm which blotted the mountains.

In the latest group found were Wallace Kneib, his son Calvin, 17, and another youth, Gary Wardell, Plinger, near Blackfoot. They were found in an abandoned ranch house by a pair of cowboys who were driving cattle through the Cellular Creek area, about 21 miles southeast of Idaho Falls.

Chairman of ICC Quizzed on Role In Rail Contract

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (UP)—The senate investigations subcommittee today quizzed the chairman of the Interstate Commerce Commission on his role in negotiating a disputed heavy contract in Chicago.

Chairman McClellan, D. Ark., said he expects the inquiry "into the conduct of a federal official as related to his official duties may mark the end of the era."

Ike Plans for First Session With Cabinet

OTTISBURG, Pa., Nov. 18 (UP)—President Eisenhower plans to hold early next week his first meetings with the national security council and cabinet in more than three months.

The chief executive also will confer tomorrow and Friday with Secretary of State Dulles, who is flying back from the Geneva foreign ministers conference.

The setting up of the series of meetings was part of the official business Eisenhower carried out as he combined a little work with some leisurely physical exercise.

In the role of country squire, Eisenhower walked around his farm yesterday morning for about an hour and a half, and in the afternoon he cut in a few points on a newly installed green near his country home.

The chief executive hasn't met with the national security council since he left for Denver for a work and rest vacation interrupted by his Sept. 24 breast ailment.

Next week's sessions will be held at Camp David, the presidential retreat in the Catskill mountains near Thurmont, Md. The President will attend the 25th to Camp David and Presidential Secretary J. Edgar Hoover will probably will spend the night there.

The exact days haven't been selected yet. But Eisenhower for non-meetings will be over by Wednesday—in advance of Thanksgiving day.

Indian Group Plays Policy On Land Use

KLAMATH FALLS, Nov. 10.—Indians of the Klamath tribe criticized federal Indian policies at yesterday's congressional hearings on Pacific Northwest timber policies. Senator Neuberger, D. Ore., who was presiding at the joint House-Senate subcommittee hearing, was unable to attend because of illness.

Laurence Will, a tribal leader, told the committee that the tribe's economic specialists approved by Secretary of the Interior McKay to aid in termination of federal control over the Klamath reservation had no practical knowledge of timber, the tribe's main resource.

Three Named He described the three—Tom B. Walters, Klamath Falls; W. L. Phillips, Gilmer; and Eugene Fox, Lakeview—as "friends of Secretary McKay."

Will suggested that the congressional investigators should look into private business activities of the tribe.

Boyd Jackson, another tribal leader, said that the deadline for termination of federal control over 1958, should be extended another 1958. He said that many Indians are in financial straits as an attempt to avoid treaty obligations to the Indians and a means of using tribal funds to pay reversion liquidation costs.

Describes Cost "Favell, speaking for the three management specialists, described the termination law. Under questioning by Chandler, Favell said he would recommend changes in the law that he was not prepared at this time to make public the recommendations. He said the three specialists were paid an annual salary of \$12,000 each and also received mileage and per diem allowances which come from tribal funds, he said.

Earl R. Wilcox, forest manager of the Klamath reservation, said that forests of the reservation can "contribute forever an annual cut of approximately 40 million board feet per year to a stabilized lumber industry in the Klamath basin" providing there is good forest management.

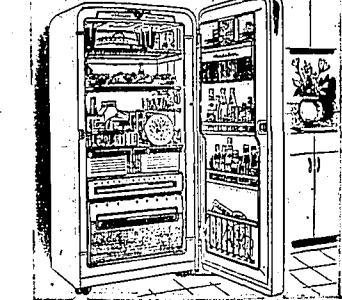

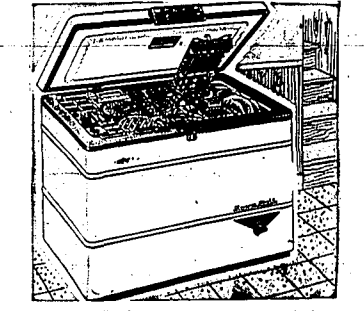

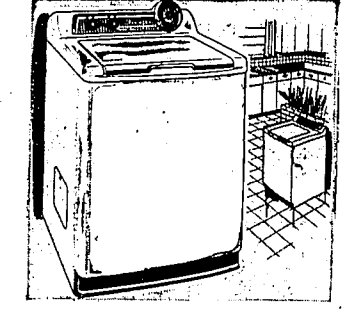

Adlai Facing Big Grind in Battle Ahead

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16 (AP)—It's Adlai E. Stevenson against the field now in a long, hard race.

The several Democratic who also aspire to the presidential nomination next year must either fold or stand firm. The man whom President Eisenhower liked in 1952 by a score of 442 electoral votes to 89 is the acknowledged front-runner among Democrats at this moment.

Eight full months of political maneuvering lie ahead before the month of the major party nomination conventions. There are politicians who will concede readily that Stevenson has a long lead today but who predict trouble in the months to come if the other hopefuls join to stop him.

Stevenson's announcement in Chicago yesterday that he would seek next year's democratic presidential nomination long had been expected. Chief interest centered on the public reaction of key party figures to his open candidacy.

There was a remarkable lot of them who heard the news with friendly interest but without committing themselves to Stevenson's nomination. Former President Truman had 20 comment.

Stevenson's overall strategy is as evident as in his greatest problem. The strategy is to build up a quick, fire-ball pre-convention campaign calculated to bluff all others out of the contest. His greatest problem is that of all who reach the top of a great peak—which is to stay there.

Stockholders Begin to Get Extra Money

NEW YORK, Nov. 16 (AP)—The stockholder now is beginning to get his share of the bumper crop of corporate earnings. Many wage earners already have been cut in through increased pay scales. Later Uncle Sam will get more than half of the gross profits.

But at the moment the stockholders are in the cheering section.

Dividends Declared
In just three days, boards of directors of America's prospering corporations have declared 15 increases in dividends, 21 extra dividend payments as an early Christmas present, and 15 dividend payments in the form of additional stock distribution. At the same time regular dividend payment declarations poured in by the scores.

Many more such forms of year-end bounty are expected as directors meet between now and Christmas. Still other boosts in dividends may be made payable after New Year—under the expectation that individual income tax rates may be eased next year, and increased dividends will be even more welcome if subject to lower taxation.

Even if you're not among the lucky ones getting increased returns from investments, some of this extra money may brush off on you.
Seen as Means
Merchants point out that stockholders—at least the winners—often regard increased dividend payments as means from heaven.

Leads in Wrecks

TAIPEI, Formosa, Nov. 16 (AP)—Nationalist China's provisional capital is leading all other cities in the world in traffic accidents, the newspaper China Post said today.

There were 16,133 vehicles and 2,511 traffic accidents during 1954, the newspaper said, an average of 1,400 accidents for every 10,000 vehicles. It said this was 500 times higher than in American cities such as San Francisco.

Rough Winter Weather Does Not Deter Pipe-Laying for Natural Gas Supplies

BALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 16 (AP)—The first major 337-mile segment of a \$110 million natural gas pipeline stretching 200 miles from New Mexico to Canada will be under way in the ground by next week-end.

When the huge project is finished next fall it will bring natural gas to the first line for 100,000 persons along its route to the power-hungry Pacific Northwest.

When it is finished the line will be turned over to the Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation. But right now the rough weather and the pipe-smoking Ricketts and his job is to get more than 300,000 tons of steel pipe strung across some of the roughest terrain in the country by next fall. Crews are working right through the mountain winter.

Ricketts said 850 miles of the line will be underground by the end of the year. Of the total length, 1,400 miles will be mainline pipe 26 or 28 inches in diameter. The remainder is branch pipe varying from 20 to 24 inches thick.

The line's southernmost point is in New Mexico's San Juan basin. Winding north through Colorado it picks up the old Oregon trail at Kemmerer, Wyo., cuts across a corner of Utah, traverses southern Idaho and heads for the rugged Blue Mountains of Oregon.

Both the Portland, Ore., and Seattle, Wash., areas—as well as all points en route—will be served before the northern terminals are reached. One branch will end at Sumner, Wash. Just this side of the Canadian border. The other will be at Boundary, B. C., just across the border from Idaho.

Right now some 4,000 men have as their primary job the task of getting the pipe in ditches cut through what is in many cases some of the wildest country in the United States. Some 3,200 men work on 11 subcontracting "gangs" along the route.

Ricketts said the toughest spot on the line are in the Blue mountains of eastern Oregon, the Cascades, the Douglas pass area of Colorado, and the high Uintas of Utah.

Each length of manganese carbon steel pipe—which has a minimum tensile strength of 72,000 pounds per square inch—is wrapped in spun glass before being lowered into a trench and covered with dirt.

to a depth of at least 30 inches. The largest for each day's work per acre is one mile of welded pipe laid but Ricketts said up to 16,000 feet have been put down during the week.

The original project certified by the Federal power commission calls for a line costing 100 million dollars and carrying 343 million cubic feet of natural gas a day. The gas would come from the San Juan basin, Piceance creek field in Colorado and Big Piney field in Wyoming.

However, a new certificate is awaited now which would allow an increase in cost to 215 million dollars and raise the capacity to 630 million cubic feet a day. Of this 350 million cubic feet would still come from the United States sources but

300 million cubic feet would be used from the Peace river field in Ft. St. John area of northern British Columbia and Alberta. Hearings have already been held on the controversial proposal to use Canadian imports and a decision is expected in the next few days.

The contract would thus be the only line in the world to be fed from both ends. Canadian gas will serve northern points and United States gas the southern areas. Fifteen compressor stations and 100 miles of field booster stations will keep the gas moving. The line will also be the only pipeline traversing the range of the Rocky mountains and the only 26-inch line with a capacity of 650 million cubic feet.

Although Ricketts said progress on the line has been "excellent," he admits steel-stricter "hard" on the work and may have cost the project a time record. Half of the steel for pipe comes from the Greys works of U. S. Steel corporation and the other half comes from the Fontana, Calif., plant of Kaiser Steel corporation. The Fontana plant was recently closed for 24 days by a walkout. The Utah plant closed for a shorter period over a maintenance walkout but Ricketts said the net effect as far as pipe was concerned was about a month's production loss.

Soviets Look To Future in U. N. Action

By United Press
Soviet Russia probably is thinking of the future in installing that outer Mongolia be admitted to the United Nations.

There is no good reason why this ill-defined area of grazing lands in eastern Asia should be given U. N. membership.
But Russia is obviously eager to see the "People's Republic of Mongolia" recognized by the world as a sovereign nation.

One reason is that Outer Mongolia one day may be the cause of a clash of interests between Russia and Communist China.

Really Part of China
For Outer Mongolia really is a part of China, even though Chinese rule over it always was loose.
Outer Mongolia is closely tied to the Soviet Union now, as a member of the U. N. it would, of course, vote with the Soviet bloc.

But the Chinese communists have shown increasing determination to extend their rule, in time, to all the lands once ruled by the old Chinese emperors.
The Chinese Reds invaded Tibet, over which China claimed sovereignty, in 1950.

It has been reported recently since then that the Peking government was looking forward to the day when it also would claim outer Mongolia.
Red China's desire to increase its influence in Outer Mongolia has been made plain.
As soon as the communists got their power in 1949, they insisted that they be permitted to station an ambassador in Ulan Bator, the Outer Mongolian capital. Russia has refused previously to admit a Chinese nationalist diplomatic representative.

Linked by Railroad
Now China has been connected with Ulan Bator by a railroad. The line was built on the Mongolian side, by Russia. But it is unlikely that Russia was enthusiastic in co-operating in the construction of this communication line.

Outer Mongolia has an area of about 600,000 square miles, loosely defined that reference books disagree on its exact size. It has a population of about 1,000,000, almost entirely nomadic herders. It has the distinction of possessing the most livestock per capita of any country in the world.

Russia Ousted Chinese
Russia got a foothold in Outer Mongolia in 1921, troops of the Chinese republics had been ousted in 1919. It was a re-assertion of sovereignty. The Russians sided Mongolian revolutionaries in throwing the Chinese out.

Then a so-called people's government was formed. Nominal it was a limited monarchy, ruled by the living Buddha of Ulan Bator. In 1924, the "Mongolian People's Republic" was proclaimed as the first "People's Republic" on the Soviet pattern.

Since then, it has been a Russian satellite—but it may not be always.

Dean Acheson Supreme Court Reversal Is Not New; Stirs Southerners

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10 (AP)—The supreme court angered a lot of Southerners when it ordered an end to racial segregation in public schools. The decision overturned an opposite ruling on segregation laid down by the court 50 years ago.
A special Virginia commission, trying to find a way to get around the new ruling, expressed indignation that the "law of the land is whatever the court may determine it to be by the process of judicial legislation."
But this agency—called the Gray Commission—must have known it wasn't the first time the court has done an about-face on a decision handed down by the justices a few long ago or in the recent past.

Research at the Library of Congress shows the court has reversed itself 65 times in American history, 29 times between 1789 and 1932 and 36 times since.

The court in 1896 said it was constitutional for a state to pass laws segregating Negroes from whites—in railroad travel—facilities given Negroes were equal to those of the whites.

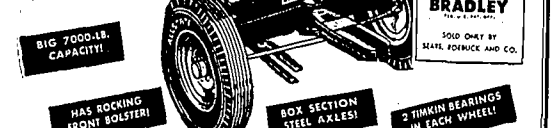

Sound Advice, Experience for Hostess Helps

This fall, when the committee in charge of committees asks you to play hostess to the club, will you accept joyfully? Or will you wrack your brain for a good semi-plausible excuse?

For those of us who are something less than seasoned in the art of entertaining a large group of clubwomen, the prospect is akin to that of the prosaic housewife who thought: We wonder how well we'll live through it.

Miss Living has been the anchor of sound advice and planning while were acquiring the experience that produces confidence. And one person I talked to who is loaded with practical advice is Russell Wright. He's not only a famous industrial designer, he's the author of a fact-filled, recently-revised "Guide to Entertaining."

If the meeting will be lunch followed by business and the group will number 20-25, the problem is to feed the guests comfortably, swiftly and with a minimum of confusion. The greatest asset at the business meeting, (I'm assuming we'll polish up the house a day in advance of the gathering.)

Line up four or five of your best member-friends to help. Delegate to the menu and the method of serving. Wright points out that the easiest menu is of the picnic type with one hot lunch, complete except for beverage, per guest. This requires few utensils or plates and the little cleanup work afterwards. Next easiest, he thinks, is the cold buffet. A whole ham and buttered bread, buttered bread to make sandwiches and relishes and seasoning is all you'll need to plan for. The only silverware needed will be servers and paper plates. Just as good as and less expensive to serve as the main dish are tongue, corned beef or spiced pork, all of which can be cooked in advance.

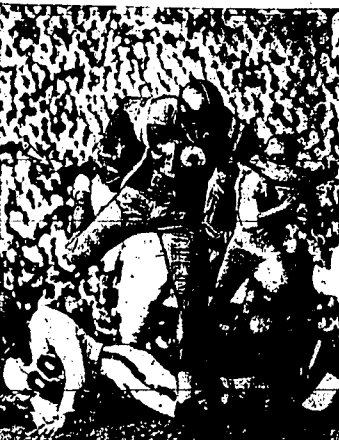

New Breeding Plan Can Aid Oat's Contents

NEW YORK, Nov. 16 (AP)—The main reason that your eyes are blue or brown, the oats in your oatmeal are high or low in their content of protein and vitamins. That has been proven at Iowa State college in Ames, Ia. Coupled with recent experiments elsewhere, it means there now is a theoretical possibility of selectively breeding super-nutritional vegetables.

Say, for example, a carrot which would be many times more nourishing than any carrot grown now. It's done regularly with animals. Selective breeding produces cows that give more milk, steers that are heavier with lean, juicy meat, hens that lay more eggs.

Follow Hereditarily

Dr. K. P. Frey of Iowa and his associates demonstrated that oats are rich or poor in protein and vitamins because of the kind of structure they have. Human beings are blue-eyed or brown-eyed or short or tall or lean or heavy for that reason, too.

Oats and other vegetables pass their characteristics along to their children the way humans do—through the genes in the chromosomes of the germ cells. But it is a comparatively new discovery that the level of protein and vitamins is determined by genes in some vegetables.

There are two kinds of these genes, one kind which make for low protein content, another kind which makes for high protein content. Frey's very important contribution was the demonstration that the genes making for high content can be "dominant," at least in oats.

Gene Differs

In corn, the gene for low protein content seems to be "dominant." That means a newly-sprouted corn baby hasn't much chance of a high-protein content, if its parent is even if he gets a high protein gene from one of them, since the high protein gene seems to be "recessive."

But in oats, Frey demonstrated that whether these genes were dominant or recessive depended upon ancestral background of the breeding oats.

Thus by selecting one oat parent with the high protein level gene, oat breeders may produce oat offspring which are like the high protein parent. The present drawback is that he was unable to determine whether the high protein gene was going to be dominant or recessive "until the cross had been tried."

Calls It Practical

But regarding the vitamins, riboflavin and niacin, his experiments indicated that the genes controlling their level in oats are dominant. He considered this "one of the most interesting and practical aspects" of his report to a technical journal of the American Chemical Society.

"It seems possible that oat varieties can be selected with a much higher niacin and riboflavin content than those now being grown," he said.

Tire Retread Is Hailed for Its Economy

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16 (AP)—Retreading of tires saves you money, says a man who rereads tires, even if it costs you \$4,200 a retread.

That fantastic price is for each tire of "earth-moving" vehicles. These huge tires cost spinning new something like \$12,000 apiece.

Thing is, according to Bill Carter, general manager of the Tire-Retread Institute, that you can save money if you know when to go after a retread, which Bill firmly believed gives you "good as a new tire."

Don't Wait
"A smart person, even with a car which travels only between town and country," he said, "doesn't tarry until the cord on the tire shows it's too late then."

"To be sure, very few people have to get up \$4,200 for a retread. You can get a regular auto tire done over for a few bucks.

The business of retreading isn't exactly new, but late the idea has been catching on.

"Airlines," Carter told me, "are going in for the retread thing, but they went at it slowly. Safety tests were made for a long time before the airplane folks would trust them. Now, those big tires that often lose a lot of rubber on a single landing can be retreaded from eight to 11 times."

Millions Retreaded
Last year alone in America and in the military overseas, some 77 million tires got the retread treatment.

The big commercial outfits and the government keep a careful watch on tires that wear thin," Carter said. "They look at the problem on a safety first basis. But sometimes the private car-owner gets a little careless, and often when he does, he hits the skids, and when he hits the skids he runs into trouble. Sometimes with fatal results."

Carter says retreaded tires, thanks to a lot of research and testing, "can be trusted."

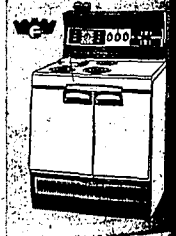

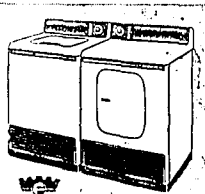

"Operation Feeding Bottle" Aids Mothers and Students

PARIS (NEA)—"Operation Feeding-Bottle" is proving a two-way boon to Paris mothers and medical students.

The mothers were looking for baby-sitters, a problem that is pretty universal. The medical students were looking for some francs to put in their pockets. So they set up their "feeding-bottle" organization, and today on 24-hour notice they'll provide a baby-sitter with more than average experience, plus some medical know-how in the boot.

More than 400 names are already on file at the headquarters of the Medical Students' association, housed in a building donated by the American Friends of France. Most of them are third year students who have already taken their course in pediatrics.

All a mother has to do is state the number and age of her children and any other relevant particulars. Mme. Jennie Sacheron, social secretary, who is the wife of a fourth year student and mother of a baby of two, then contacts the student she thinks best suited for the job.

For older children she usually sends a second year student, a fourth year man for infants. Paris is assured of every guarantee—student baby-sitters must be enrolled at the faculty of medicine, all are insured and the association keeps a detailed file which checks on the capabilities and records.

The fee is 45 cents an hour, plus fares to and from the assignment. Employers take the student home after midnight. The fee is the same for Sundays and holidays as on weekdays.

Recently a mother called for a student who could take care of seven children whose ages ranged from 3 to 12 while the adults held a family gathering. Another subscriber always calls for the same student!

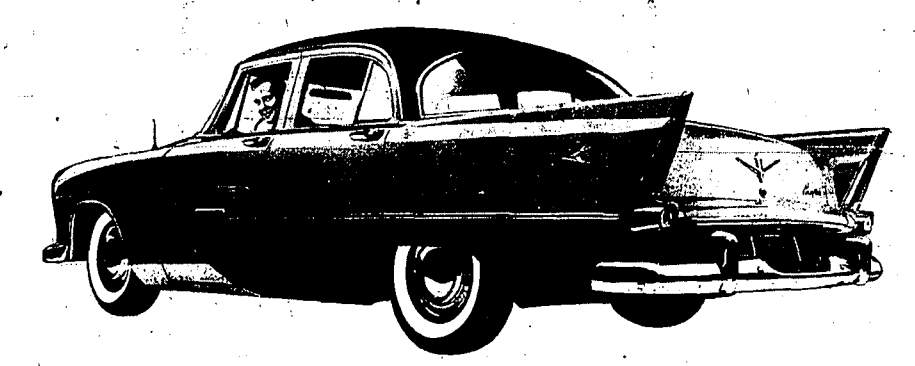

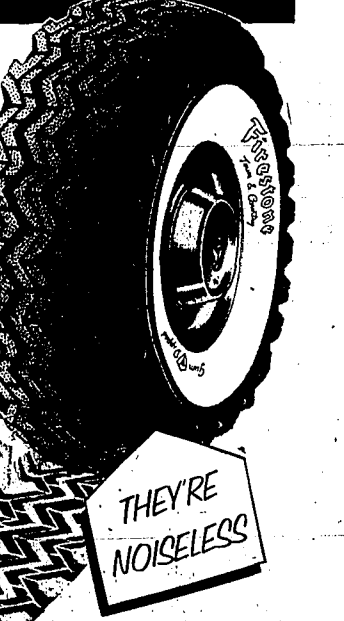

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10—President Eisenhower, more the pity, isn't wearing any kind of hat these days except occasionally a soft cap to shade his eyes. But when our leader was up and around, he was a mighty spruce dresser, too, and the boost he gave to the Homburg rates him second spot on a new list of the "best-hatted men in the world."

The "best-hatted" selections have been made annually for the past decade or so by Harry Holnick, Grand, Tex., who has a necessary interest in these matters because he is a maker and peddler of male headgear.

Leading the list for 1955 is the Duke of Edinburgh, royalty's leader in men's fashioning.

Not too Homburg According to Harry, the duke is not as strongly a pro-Homburg man as Mr. Eisenhower. But the latter is the anti-Homburg. He wears them when the occasion demands. He also wears numbers to the top of the brim and on formal occasions, naturally, goes for the silk topers that look like saved-out stove pipes.

Harry says the Duke's choice of headgear reflects his royal position combined with a debonair quality which makes him the best-hatted man anywhere.

Mr. Eisenhower is in second place because "his keen style sense reflects an appreciation of the right headgear for the right occasion. He wears his hats with dignity and authority."

New Policy for Airlines Is Set

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10—The civil aeronautics board has announced a new policy under which non-scheduled airlines for the first time may operate a limited number of scheduled flights in direct competition with regularly-scheduled airlines.

Labor Strife In Argentina Ends Quickly

BUENOS AIRES, Nov. 10—Provincial President Pedro Aramburu "set tough" policy with Argentine labor has shaken the foundations of the once all-powerful General Confederation of Labor and stopped a threatened nationwide strike dead in its tracks.

The CGT's Peronista bosses rallied thousands of workers for walk-outs in major meat packing, glass-works, rubber, tire and shoe manufacturing industries but tens of thousands of anti-Peronista laborers boycotted the strike.

An atmosphere of business as usual prevailed in downtown Buenos Aires and other major cities. Public transportation rolled uninterupted, public utilities functioned normally, newspapers continued to publish and shops and restaurants remained open.

The CGT's top command—which seized power under ousted dictator Juan D. Peron—ordered an indefinite general strike to begin Monday midnight in a show of force against Aramburu's fledgling government.

But—at least at the outset—their orders were rebuffed by a huge majority of their six million members. Aramburu's two-day-old government proclaimed over the nation's radio at noon that the CGT strike "is failing."
