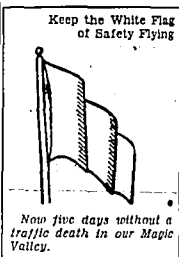

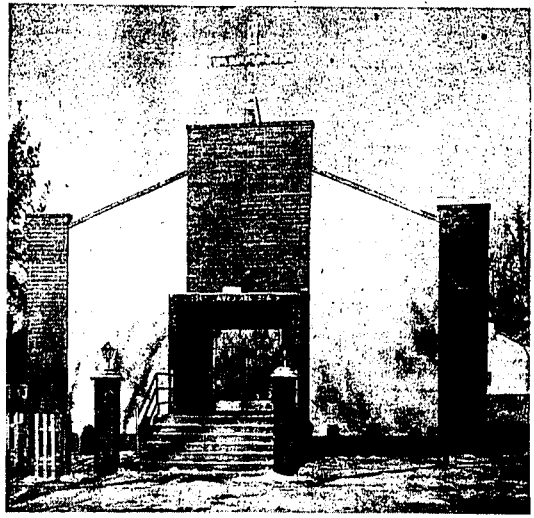

The fact that the court did not comprehend the complex problem involved in the compilation and interpretation of the fact contained in the record.

Both the attorney-general and Idaho Natural supported their petitions with accompanying briefs. Briefs of Idaho Natural was voluminous.
Smith said in his petition that he had personally read the record in the case before the PUC in which Idaho Natural and Intermountain competed for a certificate to distribute natural gas in southern Idaho. He said that "while different persons really reach different conclusions as to whether applicant or respondent should be granted a certificate to distribute natural gas, it cannot be disputed by anyone who reads the entire record that applicant and respondent each submitted a complete, sound and practical plan for making available to the people of Idaho the advantages of Idaho's natural gas."

In his opinion, the supreme court held the plan of Idaho Natural firm was sound while that of Intermountain was "demonstrated to be sound."

Smith said in his petition that the court has "continually" held that cannot "divulge" any information made by the Public Utilities Commission if that determination is based upon substantial competent evidence.

He added that the only basis on which the court could have reached its decision in the Idaho Natural-Intermountain case was complete absence of substantial competent evidence. Smith said there was no such absence.

Anti-Inflation Curbs Placed By U. S. Banks

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (AP)—A strong resurgence of business activity, bringing with it large new demands for credit, resulted yesterday in new moves by the federal reserve board to guard against inflation.

The board announced it had approved a hike in the interest rate at which federal reserve banks lend to their commercial member banks from 2 1/2 to 2 3/4 per cent in six districts. These are New York, Philadelphia, Atlanta, Chicago, Cleveland, and San Francisco.

This lets the discount rate still at the 2 1/2 per cent level in Richmond, St. Louis, Kansas City, Minneapolis, Dallas and Boston reserve districts. They too will likely raise their rates soon, on the basis of previous practice.

Additionally, the reserve board disclosed that in the past week it had been selling government securities on the open market. It was the first week in eight weeks that the reserve system had used its powers in this way to reduce the amount of lendable funds in the economic system.

The boost in the discount rates together with a return to credit absorbing sales of government securities reversed a period of neutrality by the reserve board which lasted from the last week in September through the week which ended Nov. 10.

Jazz and Blue Notes Eyed on Foreign Slate

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (AP)—The great state department is taking off the white tie from its cultural exchange program. Instead of symphony orchestras, it now will be sending abroad big-band Dixieland bands and maybe, Frank Sinatra.

The cool news was reported today by Rep. Adam C. Powell, Jr., D., N. C., who is moderating the hearing.

He got the word straight from the fair of the long hair—the state department.

Idea Accepted

Powell said the department advised him yesterday it is buying his proposal to slow down on ballets and symphonies and put new emphasis on what he called "real American."

As a starter, this country will send bands of John (Dizzy) Gillespie, father of the "bebop" Count Basie of the "modern" jazz school, and Louis Armstrong on tours that probably will include the Far East, Middle East, Asia and Africa, Powell said.

Congress put up five million dollars for such cultural exchange in 1937. Little of this money has been spent, Powell said.

"Blues is 'in'"

From here on in, Powell said, some of the money's allotment is to be spent to blow more blue notes.

"We are not going to dump the ball and the symphony on the white tie old-fashioned. 'Not are we going to abandon Europe. But the major emphasis is going to be on Americans. And we will shift the program away from Europe and to the Near East, Far East, Africa."

Folk music, Negro spirituals, the mambo, and the Hawaiian "dance" will get state department attention along with jazz, Powell said.

Subzero Cold Brings Woe to Yule Industry

BUREAU, Mont., Nov. 18 (AP)—Montana's million-dollar Christmas tree industry is approaching a crisis due to the state's worst November cold wave in history.

Tree producers have plenty of trees on hand but subzero temperatures prevent them from baling them for shipment out of the state.

The weather bureau in the capital city, Helena, said last night that there was little indication of better weather conditions in the next five days. Temperatures here dropped to as low as 35 degrees below zero the past week.

Montana produces about one-seventh of the nation's Christmas trees annually.

Eric White, district ranger of the Helena national forest, said frozen trees cannot be baled. He said the sap freezes in the trees, making them so brittle that any pressure would knock the twigs off, rendering the trees useless.

Officials said this could mean a shortage of the yuletide trees for Americans this year and an increase in the state's Christmas tree industry.

Thousands of trees have been cut and piled in lumber yards. But they can not be baled due to the cold.

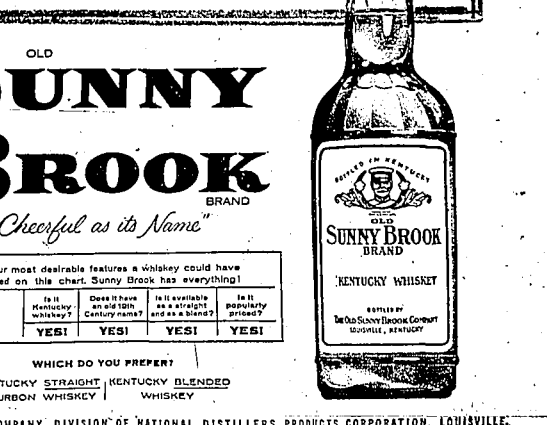
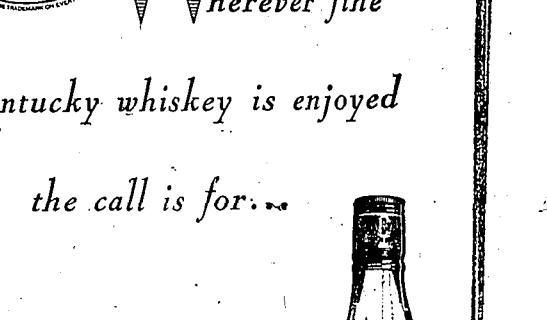

Mixed with this melody is the sound of muffled grumbling from drivers who are slow, and engine knocking from batteries with their early-morning grind.

The battery, more than likely, can be blamed for most hard winter starts. When the temperature drops to zero, a battery in good condition will deliver only 40 per cent of its normal power.

All the more reason, then, to have us check your battery, remove the corrosive deposits around it and make sure you have large enough electrical cables. (Smaller cables put up more resistance to the flow of current.)

Loose, frayed or corroded cables that you may not be able to see with a quick look under the hood can suddenly make a car just as hard to start in winter when it has been acting perfectly all summer. All these things rob the electrical system of voltage—and in winter the battery voltage may drop to 4 or less, instead of 6 or slightly more than most cars.

Under these circumstances, your engine may be turning over when you press the starter, but there's not enough voltage left to produce a spark.

Search Held For Banker, Missing Sum

DETROIT, Nov. 18 (AP)—Police and FBI agents intensified a search for a missing Minnesota bank cashier today who was believed to have been kidnaped with nearly \$10,000 in bank funds.

Kenneth Lindbergh, 44-year-old cashier at the Chief River Falls Northern State bank, disappeared last Saturday. Police said he took with him \$14,000 in blank traveler's checks and \$1,850 in silver dollars which weighed more than 100 pounds.

Give Reasons
Police said they believed Lindbergh was kidnaped because he had access to the bank vault and would not have taken the bulky load of silver dollars with him by choice.

FBI agents said a man who was not Lindbergh deposited \$1,000 worth of the checks in the Detroit bank last Monday and later tried to cash a \$275 check at a downtown department store. Suspicious bank officials stopped payment on all checks drawn on the account.

Police here said Minnesota authorities told them a man went to the bank Saturday to see Lindbergh on a real estate transaction and was seen talking with the cashier after the bank closed.

Warrant Issued
The FBI said it has issued a warrant for a man identified as Charles B. Kenwell. They said Kenwell, believed to be from Philadelphia, was seen driving a car with Minnesota license plates here similar to the car owned by Lindbergh.

Officials of the Minnesota bank told police Lindbergh had been in their employ for 10 years and was completely trustworthy. They said he is married and has four children.

Lindbergh may have been kidnaped by a bandit who tried to take more money from the bank but may have been followed by a time-clock mechanism on the main safe, police said.
