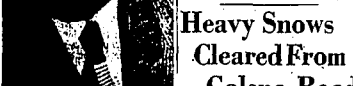

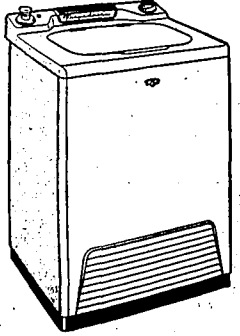

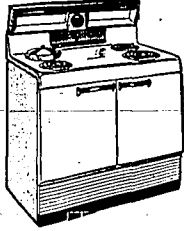

Marie Dionne

Critical From Loss of Blood

MONTREAL, Nov. 21.—Marie Dionne, the frailest of the four survivors of the crash, is reported today to be in "very precarious" condition with pneumonia and a high fever.

Marie Dionne reports said the 21-year-old girl who left the clotters of a Quebec city convent Wednesday for the second time in 16 months entered the Notre Dame de L'Assomption hospital Saturday.

It was believed Marie's family ordered a new blood transfusion for her condition and runs at the hospital where Cecile and Yvonne, two of her sisters, are training to be nurses, agreed to withhold news of her admission there. A switchboard operator refused to put through calls to Cecile or Yvonne.

It became known over the weekend that Marie had been named the name of Sister Marie-Rachel when she became a novice in the convent of the Holy Name of the Immaculate Conception in St. Laurent, a Montreal suburb.

Marie originally entered the order in 1924 but was expelled in 1928 because of "poor health, loss of appetite and extreme homesickness" and returned to the family home in Oshington.

Sister Died A sister of Marie, Emilie, died of an epileptic attack at the Laurentian town of Ste. Agathe des Monts, 60 miles from Montreal, last week. Emilie died harder than any of her sisters.

Marie stayed at home with her parents until she was 16 years old, and re-entered the convent last fall. She had three other sisters who came into \$100,000 as their share of the estate.

Marie's other sisters have adjusted themselves more easily in search of a new life. Marie is now studying at the Marquette-Bourgeois college intending to become a nun.

Marie's father, who died in 1914, was a wealthy industrialist. She is now studying at the hospital.

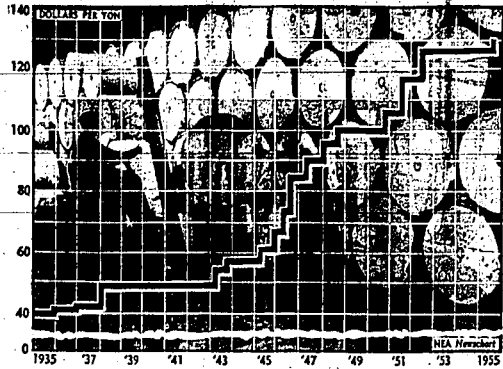

Big Increase Reported for Idaho Births

September figures released by the state health department showed a large increase of births and two more deaths than in August.

Of the 1,228 births recorded in the Magic Valley counties reported 297. By counties the number of births were Blaine 71; Camas, 52; Cassia, 45; Jerome, 20, with one born at home; Gooding, 17; Jerome, 20; Lincoln 10; Minidoka 43, including one born at home, and the Twin Falls 22 with one born at home.

Twin Falls and Gooding counties reported the death of an infant under a month old. Cassia and Gooding both reported deaths less than a year old, and Gooding had one death resulting from prematurity.

The state reported no maternal deaths.

With heart disease again the leading killer, the total number of deaths rose to 416 during September.

Blaine county reported two deaths from heart disease and one from cancer. Cassia reported one death from unrelated causes; Cassia recorded two from heart disease, one from cancer, one from cerebral hemorrhage, and one from other causes.

Elmore had three deaths from unrelated causes; Jerome reported one death, two from heart disease, one from cancer, one from cerebral hemorrhage, and six from causes unrelated.

Jerome had 17 deaths, eight from heart disease, four from cancer, two from cerebral hemorrhage, two from hypertensive disease and one other.

Lincoln had three deaths, one from hypertensive disease, and two from causes unrelated. Minidoka had four deaths, two from cancer, one from cerebral hemorrhage and one from other causes.

Twin Falls listed 23 deaths, 11 from heart disease, one from cancer, one from diabetes, one from cerebral hemorrhage, one from hypertensive disease and seven from other causes.

The number of marriages in Idaho for September was 591 against 227 divorces.

Blaine had four marriages and one divorce; Camas had two marriages and one divorce; Elmore had nine marriages and four divorces; Jerome reported three marriages and eight divorces; Jerome listed 11 weddings and three divorces; Lincoln had two marriages and one divorce; Minidoka listed 10 marriages, and Twin Falls recorded 22 marriages against 10 divorces.

A total of 45 deaths resulted from accidents with auto wrecks again in Twin Falls.

Cassia had one death from an auto accident; Elmore reported one fatality from car wrecks and one occupational death; Gooding had three deaths, one from auto wrecks, one from occupational accident and one fatality in the home; Minidoka, a home death and Twin Falls listed one traffic death and one from other causes.

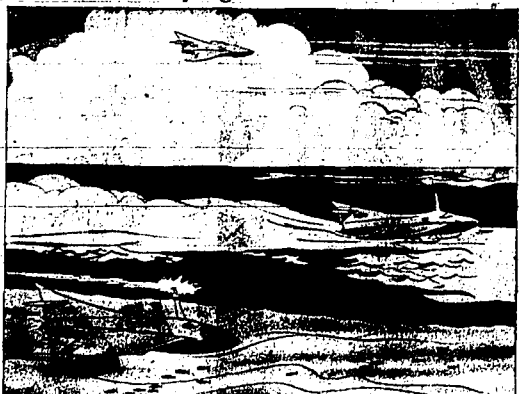
Blaine, Cassia and Jerome had no accidental deaths for one month.

By age groups, accidents killed six from ages 0 to 4; three between 5 and 14 years old; eight 15 to 24 years old; 18 between 25 and 44; eight from ages 45 to 64, and 10 between 65 or older.

The department listed 344 cases of notifiable disease in September. Blaine reported one case of cancer; Camas had none; Cassia had two cases of gonorrhea; Elmore reported one case of polio, one tuberculous, one cancer, one gonorrhea and one syphilis.

Gooding had two cases of polio, one of cancer and one unrelated; Jerome reported two cases of polio, two of cancer and two of gonorrhea; Lincoln had one case of cancer; Minidoka listed three cases of cancer, three of gonorrhea, four chicken pox and two others, and

Stevenson Prepares Team; Reaction Heard From Talk

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21 (AP)—Adlai Stevenson himself, without saying how, put his finger on the No. 1 problem facing the Democrats in trying to persuade the voters to throw the Republicans out in 1958.

"America," he said in a speech Saturday night, "is well and strong above all nations in all times. We are the luckiest people in the world and we know it."

If that's the case, the voters should ask why should they take a chance on changing administration in next November's election? Stevenson's reasons seemed to add up to this: "We can do everything better."

He was very vague on how. That can't be held against him at this time. This was his first speech after announcing he wanted to be President. It was just a general outline of what he'd say later.

It also was pretty much the outline of what the Democratic party will be saying. There were no surprises. It was pretty much along the lines on which the Democrats already have indicated they will attack the Republicans.

It was just enough of an outline to show there are no fundamental differences between the two parties and that the differences which do exist are matters of degree more than of kind.

Stevenson attacked the Eisenhower administration's farm program.

hardly make himself unpopular following the same line, which also happens to be his natural one anyway.

On this subject, he seems unusually hazy and, if he has a solution, he has kept it to himself.

He was critical of the administration's foreign policy but did not indicate specifically what was wrong with it except to complain there was too much tough talk and backing away from it.

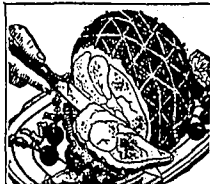

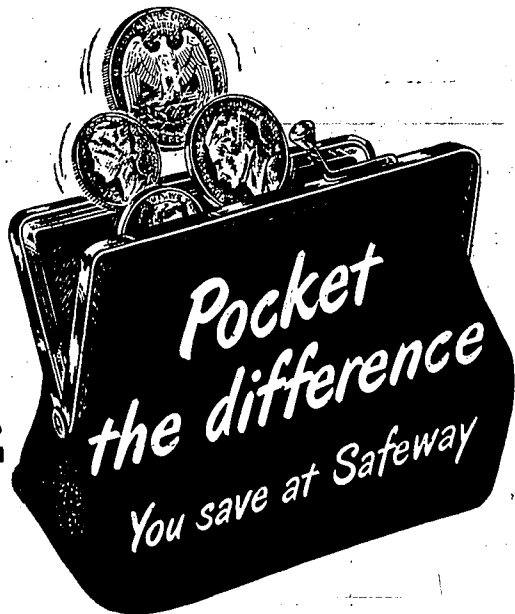

Chest X-Rays Do Not Show Heart Ailment

CHICAGO, Nov. 21 (AP)—The American College of Radiology said Saturday that results have been discouraging in attempts to detect lung cancer and heart disease through mass chest X-ray programs aimed at subclinical detection.

"X-ray screening is not at the present time recommended by the college as a practical method for the detection of lung cancer," the college said.

It added that the number of such controllable cancers found was "rather small." The statement added:

"The most effective method for the detection of heart disease is believed to be regular clinical examination by a personal physician.

"X-ray surveys have aided in the detection of occasional cases, but the number so discovered early does not warrant continuation of the X-ray survey as a primary method for the detection of cardiac disorders."

Political Revolt Is Stilled in South—Was Hot Back in '51

NAHVILLE, Nov. 21 (AP)—The spirit of political revolt in the South hasn't been snuffed out—but it's flickering only feebly these days in comparison with the fiery passions which were mounting four years ago.

At this time in 1951, rebellious Dixie leaders were waving rebel banners and gathering legions of followers for a "beat Truman" drive.

Harry S. Truman, then president, hadn't even said he would run again.

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower didn't even know he would be elected until he was in the western defense command post outside Paris listening to pleas that he run for ship president.

But one was certain whether the general was a Democrat or a Republican at that point.

But rebellion was stirring. Some southern political leaders were predicting darkly that Eisenhower might be able to split the "solid south" even if he should run for the presidency as a Republican. All of the "beat Truman" boom already was developing.

And then the uprising that started as a "beat Truman" campaign became a drive for Eisenhower which carried Texas, Virginia, Florida and Tennessee into the Republican camp.

Compared with 1951, the South today is calm and passions are not being flaunted openly. No southern leader with any real stature has emerged to call for revolt within the Democratic party. There is at this time no tide running even comparable to the anti-Truman tide. There is at this time no "anti" feeling that has mounted to red-faced anger.

In short, the South's political blood pressure is fairly normal.

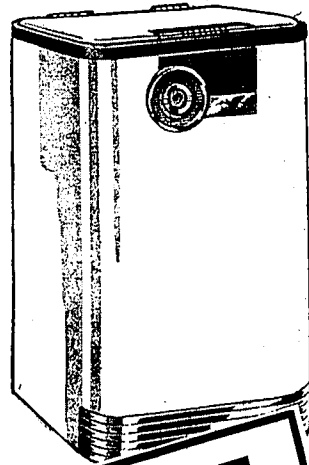
