GIVE SPECIAL THANKS. Americans will surely offer thanks this year that they and the rest of the peoples of the earth seem on a firmer footing...

But beyond these things, the American people may be minded to voice a special Thanksgiving prayer that their President Dwight Eisenhower, has so far come safely through his dangerous illness.

Perhaps it would be very good if more Americans showed a greater spirit of reverence than is evident.

The complexities and bewilderments of this time drive men to look for guidance and help. They cannot thread their way through the daily dilemmas that confront them on every hand.

In other lands and other times, men similarly beset have unwisely chosen tyrants to lead them.

We can all be thankful that Americans searching for guidance have put their trust not in a dictator, nor even in a power-conscious democratic leader...

SECURITY IN GOVERNMENT. Pat Munroe, Washington correspondent for the Times-News, has broken into print a bit himself.

This newshawk who provided the Times-News with outstanding coverage on such key developments as the atomic energy plant at Arco and the recent Helge Canyon hearings in Washington, has made headlines with his talk "Secrecy in the Federal Government," delivered before the school of Journalism at the University of North Carolina.

"Former Democratic Reclamation Commissioner Mike Straus had a far-flung agency working under him. Some 25-30 persons were busy trying to pay the bills—seven books. Straus had his own 'correspondents' at work in the western states, while his 'board of editors' in Washington handled the 'big picture' for him.

"The goal of this team was to glorify public power in an aggressive manner. At the same time, it carefully guarded from public view the unfavorable sides of the bureau's cube. This new service has been cut down to 15 persons. If I have any problem affecting that agency now, I can't get it properly paid with any speed, without having to fight my way through a mob of takers.

"So, some people say the door to information has been slammed shut, bruising news-writers' fingers in the frame. Others, like me, say it's a tight mare's ear. But all agree that things are 'not good.'"

As examples of secrecy in Washington, Monroe referred to a senator who recently was reported to have taken a large party of his aides to Europe. The trip lasted almost seven weeks. But getting the details out of the Pentagon or from the senate committee which authorized the trip would be a little easier than getting the same information from the State Department.

Helicopters Seem Destined To Remain to Haul Officials

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—A fellow who has ridden in the looks as if the helicopter is here to stay as another way to transport governmental bigwigs.
Members of the national security council used the air force's helicopter taxi service Monday to meet with President Eisenhower at Camp David in the Maryland mountains.
Other cabinet members flew up by helicopter Tuesday.
And though a cabinet meeting by helicopter is unprecedented, the big air-borne looking contraptions played an important role in today's governmental leaders to theoretical safety during the mock bombing of the nation's capital last June.
Most of the President's helpers rode to Camp David in a helicopter that is 52½ feet long and leans in the middle so that it looks like a poorly made "V." Because of its shape, it is known unofficially as the "flying banana." Officially it's called "The Workhorse."
And it takes to the air lifted by whirling rotors, with blades 44 feet long, at each end. The air force says it was built for "miscellaneous purposes," which means it can be used for everything from carrying troops to litter cases (it can carry 20).
In an emergency the entire cabinet and the President could climb into one machine and be carried away at a speed of 100 miles an hour.

Sales of U. S. Bonds Listed In Gem State

Idaho citizens purchased \$1,042,783 worth of U. S. bonds during October according to Guy H. Shearer, Twin Falls, district chairman.

Shearer said citizens of Idaho made extra purchases of bonds in December if they are to avoid the state's assigned quota of \$14,300,000. In Magic Valley, Twin Falls county purchased \$29,450 worth of bonds for a total of \$88,291 for the year. It now has 78.4 per cent of its \$115,400 quota to rank 12th in the state.

Jerome bought \$5,701 in bonds for a total of \$17,172. It ranks 37th in sales in the state with 45.6 per cent of its \$314,200 yearly quota. Cassia, with \$13,870 purchased in October, now has \$108,606 of its \$328,500 yearly quota. Cassia ranks 21st with its 64.2 per cent effort. Minidoka ranks 11th with 82.2 per cent of its \$214,500 quota. In Blaine county purchased \$12,748 worth of bonds in October for a total of \$180,610. Gooding's \$185,900 quota is 73.2 per cent completed, giving it a ranking of 14. Gooding citizens bought \$5,750 last month for a total of \$134,992 so far this year.

By purchasing \$9,213 in bonds last month, Blaine thrust 68 over its \$132,000 quota to receive fourth ranking.

The \$9,200 quota of Lincoln county is only 37.2 per cent completed. Last month, Lincoln residents purchased \$1,100 in bonds to total \$29,880 for the year, ranking 39th in the state. Camia county bought \$4,148 of its \$5,463 years total to rank 44th. Its quota is \$28,500 with only 15 per cent completed. Blaine county took over sixth ranking by buying \$4,144 last month. Its total of \$23,873 is only 4.4 per cent completed.

British Plan To Ban Drug Irks Doctors

LONDON, Nov. 24 (AP)—A revolt of British doctors is brewing over a government decision to ban the manufacture and sale of heroin, the pain-killing drug used in the last days of World War II.

Many of the nation's famous hospitals are openly stockpiling enough heroin to last for years. Thousands of physicians have protested that the order condemns countless sufferers to months of unnecessary agony.

The ban takes effect Dec. 31. It was ordered in line with a U. N. campaign to wipe out illegal traffic in the drug. Britain already bans both its import and export.

A spokesman for the British Medical Association declared: "We are determined to fight to the last ditch against the ban, which cuts across the freedom of the doctor to prescribe what he thinks necessary for his patients."

Some doctors have claimed the move is like taking a sledgehammer to crack a nut. The last government count put the number of registered heroin addicts in this country at 62. Doctors say the ban could open a lucrative black market in the drug and lead to more addiction.

Prohibition of the drug in the United States, said the association spokesman, "only does what is understood and made it fashionable for people to carry a shot."

Health Minister Linn MacLeod has said that substitute drugs are available for use as pain killers. Many doctors dispute this.

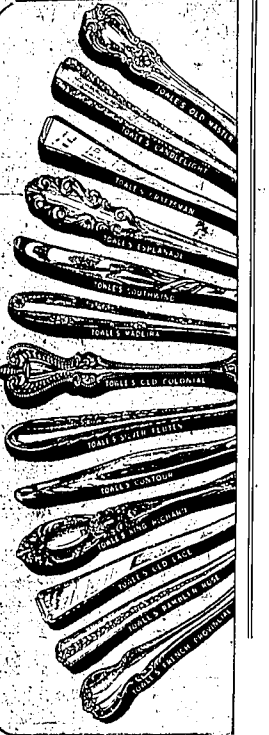

Budge Thinks Federal Agency May Be Price Decline Factor

The department of agriculture may inadvertently be contributing to the decline in farm prices, Rep. Hester Budge said this week.

The Idahoan cited agriculture's crop reporting board as possibly depressing its own output, purporting that of telling the farmer "what he can reasonably expect for what he will produce."

Budge, who recently discussed his observations with Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Taft Benson, described the crop reporting operations and their possible "depressor" role in farm prices.

Under a law now 50 years old the department of agriculture is required to make periodic estimates of what certain crops in certain areas will total at harvest time.

The original intent—in years of up-and-down cycles of production—was to give the farmer an idea of what total crops might be and thereafter the market expect of prices for the crop.

Budge points out, almost each year shows an increase in production for the great majority of crops.

Advance notice of increased production is more than likely to benefit crop buyers and to depress farm prices that it is to help the farmer, Budge suggested.

"I think the whole crop reporting structure should be re-examined, with particular emphasis upon such perishables as potatoes, onions, and fruit," he said.

"I have been making a careful survey of prices in Idaho and other areas, and I note for example that potatoes are selling in east coast markets for about eight cents a pound."

"The Idaho farmer is getting about one and one-quarter cents a pound for his potatoes, and that is just too great a disparity."

Budge is not certain what role the crop reporting system plays in that unbalanced picture, but he points out that the department of agriculture this year predicted four million bushels of Idaho potatoes this year over last.

Open Hearing Is Set for Cain 'Bias' Charges

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—The active activities committee will take no action in a bias and prejudice case against board member Harry F. Cain until the matter is aired in open hearings here, informed sources said yesterday.

But they said the committee's delay is hearing in Seattle, Wash., will be recessed until the matter is re-considered by the committee. Cain has been on the board since Oct. 8 at oral arguments in a case brought by Attorney General Herbert Brownell, Jr., against the Washington Pension Union.

Charges Reconsidered
Brownell asked the Senate late yesterday to reconsider charges of bias and prejudice filed against Cain by three union last February. It was unclear he thought the former Washington senator should be disqualified. Since both the government and the union have done a complete flip-flop the SACB has no choice but to schedule open arguments into the matter officials here said.

The union filed its motion seeking to disqualify Cain in February. The government opposed it at that time. Then Cain was assigned to the VPB case.

Records Quoted
Records on the Seattle proceedings, recently forwarded to the Senate, show that these events have since transpired.

On Oct. 3, Jay G. Eyles, attorney for the union, told Cain and a justice department attorney in a private session that the union is satisfied Cain would give "an impartial hearing."

On Nov. 11 Cain introduced into the record a letter from the justice department questioning his role and Eyles replied, for the record, "I see there is any doubt in the minds of the department we are not now making a new motion to disqualify Cain and we will not make a motion to disqualify him..."

Motion Filed
The pension union here said that if the justice department filed a motion to disqualify Cain it wanted a chance to be heard in February. The union has never made clear the reasons for its turnaround. The justice department contends it is acting in the light of new facts recently brought to light about Cain's background.

The SACB officials said here, probably will give the union about two weeks in which to file an answer to the government's latest move and then decide on a time for the oral hearings.

Spraining of Ankle Leads to New Concept Over Walking

NEW YORK, Nov. 24 (AP)—Because weight resting on it," he said. The professor sprained his ankle, and was causing the pain. When people are walking, the ground comes into play, too. One or the other foot is supporting the entire weight of the body. When the body weight is thrust upward at the start of each new step, the ground is exerting a force on the foot greater than the body's own weight.

These opposing weights result in a compressive force on the shin bone, and Prof. Sutton figured this force is three to four times body weight. It depends on the size and the shape of the individual feet. His own feet, with which he did his figuring, are 10 inches from toe to heel—and that, he said, is "definitely a sub-standard foot."

"Under severe muscular stress," he said, these forces would be greatly multiplied. He took a jumper who is giving his body enough upward velocity to raise the center of body mass four feet "in a mighty, one-legged push lasting about 0.5 seconds." The compression on the shin bone of this hypothetical 175-pound jumper would then be about 150 pounds, or more than half a ton.

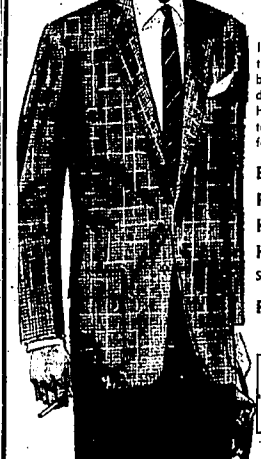

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Spud Harvest Gives Hike to Work Figures

BOISE, Nov. 24 (AP)—The potato harvest boosted Idaho farm employment to 93,600 workers in October, the highest point in the year.

But, the agency noted declines in other fields of work, especially in the construction and lumber industries, because of rain and cold weather.

Italian Newspaper Reports Pius XII Heard 'True, Distinct' Voice of Christ

VATICAN CITY, Nov. 24 (AP)—Italy's leading newspaper, *L'Espresso*, reported that Pope Pius XII heard the "true and distinct" voice of Christ during a vision as he lay near death last December.

The *Corriere Della Sera* of Milan, the nation's influential and largest circulation newspaper, said the pope had told this to a group of 20 "qualified ecclesiastics." The report was signed by its Vatican correspondent, Silvio Negro.

There was no immediate confirmation of the report in authoritative Vatican quarters.

The report brought only terse "no comment" as the Catholic world eagerly sought more details of the supernatural experience reported for the Pope in the past five years.

The *Corriere Della Sera* version was the first which added any purported details to those disclosed in the Italian weekly magazine *Oggi* last Saturday. The Vatican confirmed the *Oggi* version yesterday.

The spokesman of the Vatican press office said the semi-official Vatican newspaper *Osservatore Romano* will not carry any mention of his vision.

But with many feeling that the eventual cause of beatification of the Pope would be speeded by the reported vision, there came a new report today of a "miracle" attributed to the Pope's alleged vision.

The words "true and distinct" from *Osservatore Romano* were excerpted from a letter written before his death by the Italian composer Pirella Maresca. The letter credited the Pope with the miraculous recovery of Maresca's young niece from tuberculosis.

The *Osservatore Romano* version of the report already had increased the likelihood that he will some day be proclaimed a saint of the Roman Catholic church.

The newspaper account said: "When the hippus had lowered the stretcher of Pope Pius XII, he was alone in his room for a few moments. Those attending him had moved into an adjoining room."
"The Pope with closed eyes was thinking the most of Adams Christie. When he reached the words, 'In reality, dreary moments make me only think of a true and distinct' voice which was heard answered: 'Magister adeus et vocas te' (the Master is here and calls you)."

Then the patient was said to have opened his eyes and saw the vision of his bedside and heard the words which announced to him that his hour had not come yet.

The words "true and distinct" describe the voice as apparently the words the Pope used in telling of the supernatural event.

Corriere Della Sera said this version of the vision had been told regularly by the Pope to 20 qualified ecclesiastics. The newspaper said it had reason to believe that the source of the revelation of the vision was Riccardo Lombardi.

Lombardi is a Jesuit priest who has attracted the most attention in Italy where he is known as the "millionaire God."

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—Dizzy Gillespie is a different kind of cat these days. He doesn't talk like some of the jazz greats. He will join as ambassador of bop in Asia under a new state department move to make the cold war real cool.

In fact, Dizzy Gillespie doesn't even act too much like the Dizzy Gillespie of 14 years ago. Those antics got him his nickname and whose horn gave out with a new kind of jazz that won him the title "Father of bop."

The famous cap once copied by Gillespie fans is no more. The real one got it has been replaced by a small fringe of whisker under his lower lip.

And at 38, Gillespie—who says he's getting "old as Methuselah"—he's getting the history of the "native American music" he plays.

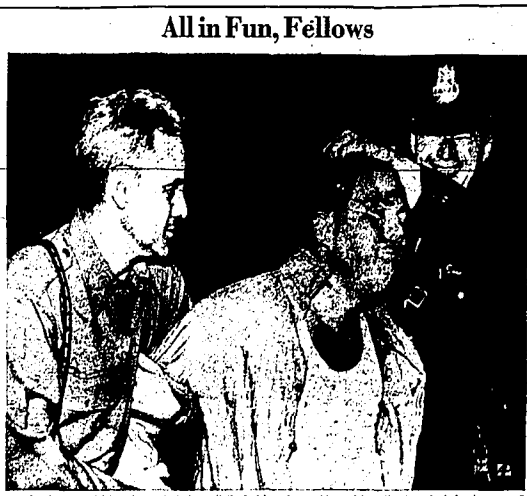

"Actually, success in having all Christmas gifts and greeting cards delivered on time is largely a matter of advance planning and preparation which should be done this week," Postmaster Franz pointed out.

He urges every patron to take the following steps at once: Get out your Christmas card list and carefully check through it. Make sure that each address includes the full name, street and number, city, state and state. Then visit the postoffice, stamp up on stamps (use three-cent stamps if you have plenty of them) and have your gift cards for first-class mail service and ask any questions you may have about mailing regulations.

You can do this in a leisurely way if you will come to the postoffice before 10:30 a.m. or between 1:30 and 3:30 p.m. This missing the rush hours. On your way home pick up a supply of heavy wrapping paper, sturdy empty cartons, string, cord and kraft paper adhesive tape. A modest investment in these necessities will pay its dividends in safe delivery of your cherished Christmas gifts.

He said sponsors of any such plan are extremely wary of launching it so long as they think Mr. Eisenhower possibly might seek a second term.

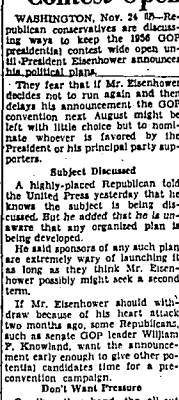

Discussion of ways to keep the contest open, pending an announcement by the President, has centered on the proposed entry of "favorite son" candidates from a number of states. However, the prospective favorite sons are reluctant to step out as long as Mr. Eisenhower's plans are unknown. They would be embarrassed if he later announced he would seek re-election.

Eden Says He Wants to Pay Visits to U.S.

LONDON, Nov. 24 (U.P.)—Prime Minister Eden would like to visit Washington soon to review thoroughly with President Eisenhower all Allied policies in Europe, the Middle East and Asia.

Eden told a group of visiting U.S. congressmen he would be delighted to make the trip if an early opportunity arises.

But an aide stressed that no official step has been taken by either the British or U. S. governments to arrange a trans-Atlantic trip by the prime minister.

The seven American congressmen, led by Sen. Mike Mansfield, D. Mont., had urged Eden to come to Washington for a "talk with the President."

It is assumed by government officials that a meeting would inform the administration in Washington of Eden's reaction to their suggestions.

Any arrangement for a meeting between the President and the prime minister undoubtedly will depend on the state of Eisenhower's health.

Eden said he will be in London at the moment to plan far ahead or to concentrate himself to existing consultations.

Atom's Waste Brings Dims Bright Future

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (U.P.)—The bright future predicted for nuclear power can't come to pass until someone comes up with a safe and cheap way of getting rid of the plutonium atom's deadly by-products.

As of today, nobody has done this. But Arthur J. Gorman, atomic engineer in the atomic energy commission's reactor division, feels "sure the disposal problem will be solved."

AEC laboratories are spending around one million dollars a year on research in proposed ways of storing radioactive wastes. There they can never do any harm.

A number of effective temporary measures have been put into use. Yet no permanent disposal methods have been developed which are certainly safe and at the same time economic.

Nothing so far proposed, Gorman confirms, appears adequate from both cost and safety standpoints to develop in this country by the year 2000. By that time, it has been estimated, there will be some 400 big-scale atomic power stations in the United States.

But many ideas have been developed and out of them, Gorman is certain, a solution will come. Some location projects perhaps can be chemically fixed in the soil so they can never be taken up by plants. Perhaps limestone or salt caves in many parts of the country can be used at least for indefinite storage and containment.

Another proposal has been to pump concrete, confined in steel and concrete, into the deep mud and ooze of the Gulf of Mexico. The drums would sink down through the mud which would provide a permanent cover.

"I sure would help us in our planning for Saturday if some one would tell us who the five are on the Army team who are football players."

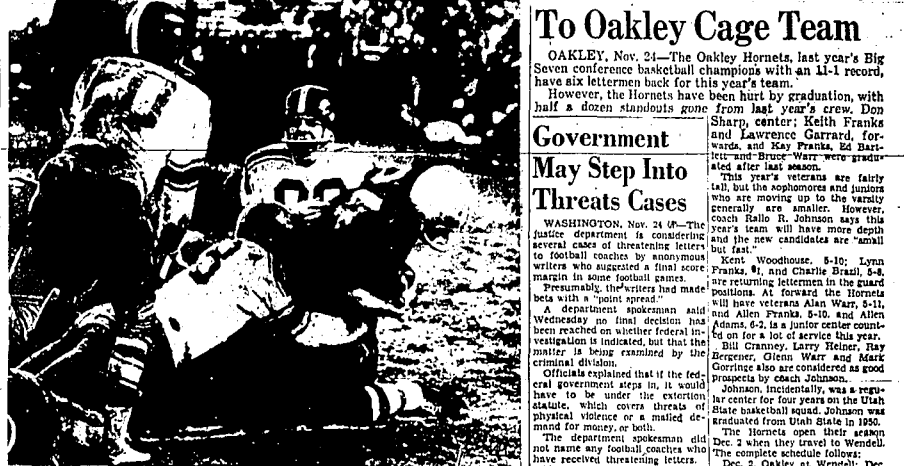

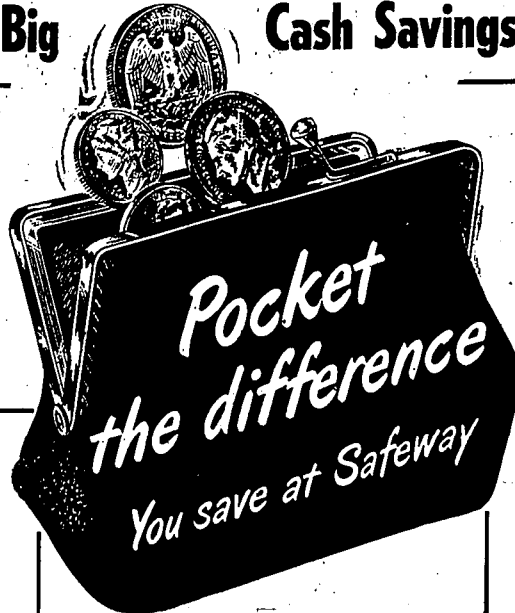

Demo Defends Right to Flay GOP's Policy

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—Hubert H. Humphrey, D. Minn., told protesting Republicans today that "bipartisanship" in foreign policy is not a new subject. He said the Democrats are not responsible for the Republican administration's foreign policy. He said that they have repudiated bipartisanship by their criticism of the Eisenhower administration's foreign policy. Only last Saturday, some Democrats in the House had attacked the administration's foreign policy. Johnson told a Texas audience that he did not expect foreign policy to be a political issue in the 1956 campaign. In varying degree, however, Adlai Stevenson, Sen. Estes Kefauver, E. Stevenson, Sen. Averell Harriman, and Gov. Averell Harriman of New York had some critical remarks about administration foreign policy in week-end speeches. The three are regarded as the chief opponents for the Democratic presidential nomination next year. We need a bipartisan foreign policy and the administration has received bipartisan support on the broad outlines of foreign policy. Humphrey mentioned to reporters: "Bipartisanship does not mean rubber-stampism. It does not mean that you give up your right to talk openly and freely over differences you have on the fulfillment of foreign policy."

Gas Is Refined By Atom Power

Government Typists to Test New Typewriter's Keyboard

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—Government stenographers are testing a new typewriter with a "modified keyboard." It has "A B C D E F G H I J K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z" used to be. The developer, Alstrup Dvorak of the University of Washington, claims that his keyboard will increase the typing speed of the average stenographer by 35 per cent. After six tests used to it, that is. One reason why the present standard typewriter keyboard has been unchanged for the past 60 years is that millions of people have learned touch typing under the old system. Any fiddling around with the location of the keys would confront them with the necessity of

unlearning all their old typing habits and learning new ones. Since the federal government has 800,000 typewriters, and nearly that many stenographers to man them, the general services administration figures that it may be worthwhile to experiment with a speedier keyboard even if it means re-training a lot of typists.

OSA has picked 24 stenographers who will be trained four hours a day for 30 days in the use of the new keyboard. When they're ready, they will engage in a typing race against 24 girls using the old key-

board. The results will then be studied to see if the simplified keyboard boasts output enough to warrant serious consideration of all the problems that would be involved in switching to a new kind of typewriter.

Dvorak's system shifts the letters used most frequently to the positions closest to the fingers which normally do the most work. All the vowels, for example, are on the "home" row of keys, where the fingers normally rest. The bottom row, which now has "Z X C V B N M , . /" becomes

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Influenza May Strike in U. S. During Winter

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—A leading medical authority has said there is a pretty fair chance the nation will have an influenza epidemic this winter.

"No way to tell for sure—but Dr. Dorland J. Davis said the epidemic strike in cycles and this country is about due for another.

If an outbreak occurs, Davis said it probably will be the relatively mild form of influenza which figured in the epidemics of 1951 and 1952. Even so, it could bring a lot of misery to thousands of Americans.

Heads Outfit

Davis heads the laboratory of infectious diseases at the government's national institute of health. He also is in charge of the world health organization's influenza center in the United States.

Influenza is a big trouble-maker. In its milder forms, it produces a general feeling of discomfort—headache, cough, four-to-five-day fever, general aching and a feeling of being "all washed out." In its more serious forms, flu can lead to pneumonia and death—especially among older people.

The symptoms are similar to those found in severe cold, grippe and a dozen other common respiratory infections. But true influenza is caused by its own family of viruses. It usually is spotted when there has been a fairly large outbreak and experts move in to make a laboratory identification.

Two Divisions Noted

The influenza family of viruses falls into two main divisions—type A and type B. The B virus usually causes relatively small, sporadic outbreaks. Type A is the one that produces major outbreaks, occasionally on a world-wide scale, and strikes in two and three-year cycles.

There is a vaccine against influenza. It is considered a good vaccine but it has not been used widely among the general public because: 1. Its effect is limited to a few months, and the viruses mutate or change so that the guarantee against the virus which turns up in a given epidemic is not always 100 per cent.

Tiger May Be Roaming Vast Navaho Area

GALLUP, N. M., Nov. 24 (AP)—A tiger may be roaming the Navaho reservation in western New Mexico and eastern Arizona.

Drivers for the general services administration and Navaho Indians say they have seen large cat tracks. A professional government hunter says the prints are not those of a mountain lion.

One of the drivers says he has seen a large, striped animal jump across the highway.

Indians who have inspected the tracks say they believe the cat may be a tiger. It is the only big cat reported in the Ft. Defiance area.

One cause of the speculation goes back four years ago, when a circus wagon was wrecked about 50 miles north of Gallup. The tiger escaped and never was recaptured. The tiger may have survived, Indians believe.

Auto Industry Is Heading for Peak Outputs

DETROIT, Nov. 24 (AP)—More than seven million passenger cars have been built so far this year. Only a major work stoppage can prevent the industry from reaching the unprecedented eight-million total this year. Such a stoppage is not in prospect.

The Thanksgiving day holiday will cut into car assemblies somewhat this week, but most factories have scheduled nine-hour shifts and Saturday overtime for the remainder of the year. Thus, schedules should bring the heaviest December output in industry history.

Whether the car market needs this record-smashing output at this time may be debatable.

But the industry has just completed the biggest cleanup of outgoing models in its history; the approximately 375,000 new cars currently in dealers' showrooms are not abnormally high.

Of last year's 7,007,536 car assemblies to date General Motors has accounted for 3,520,843. In the same 1954 period it built 2,475,214. Ford has built 1,984,781 cars so far this year. In the same 1954 period it built 1,465,601. Chrysler's 1,192,633 car assemblies to date this year compare with 551,284 in the same 1954 period.

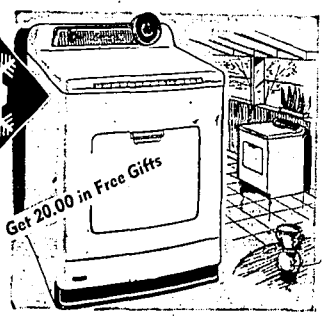

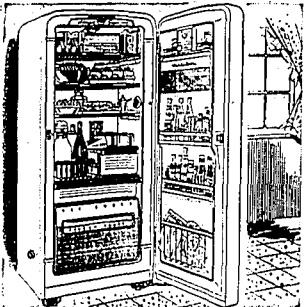

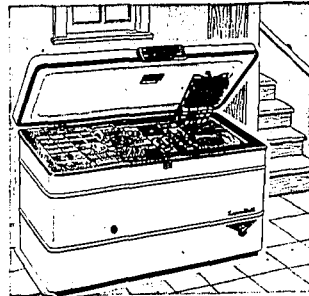

Special Prices Seen on Most Kinds of Meat

When the last piece of your Thanksgiving turkey is gone, you'll find a good range of attractive buys in other meats at your local food store this coming week-end.

That turkey may have cost you four cents a pound more than the bird you bought a year earlier, but most other meats are cheaper, and than that, the meat packers have been telling you, pork is a fun buy and beef has come down a bit, too.

Pork Praised
"The best buy is loin of pork," says meat retailer said. "We'll have loins on sale next week at six or eight cents a pound below prices of a year ago. Smoked hams now are selling at eight cents a pound cheaper than in November, 1952."

The American Meat Institute took a survey in the Chicago area last week and reported that the average of all meat prices in retail stores was down 12 per cent from a year earlier. Beef steaks were down 7 to 15 per cent, smoked picnic 13 per cent, other pork items 14 to 23 per cent, and less of lamb three per cent.

Some of the best buys in shops will find good buys in steaks, prime ribs, chuck roast and legs of lamb. Some stores are offering four cents a pound off the price of fryers.

Eggs Go Higher
Egg prices will be ten to four cents a dozen higher than a week ago in many areas. There's been a big demand for eggs. However, production is rising, so prices may come down soon.

The price of many vegetables went higher at the wholesale level this week, but there still is a good variety available at reasonable prices. Produce men favor potatoes, onions, turnips and green beans as kale, collards and turnip greens. Also recommended: Cabbages, escaroles, beans, peas, and leeks. Lettuce, artichokes, cucumbers, peppers, pascal celery and eggplant.

Other Laid
"Moderately priced" vegetables include carota, broccoli, corn, peas, tomatoes, squash, cauliflower, spinach, Brussels sprouts, green beans, potatoes are cheaper than the yams. Worthwhile buys in fruit include apples, oranges, lemons, limes, grapefruit, avocados and red emperors.

Chestnuts are more reasonable than they have been in the past, but nuts generally are on the high side.

Prank of Two Teen-Age Girls Is Nightmare to Quiet Couple

WINNETKA, Ill., Nov. 24 (AP)—What two young girls "thought was real fun" turned into an extended nightmare for a middle-aged couple in this exclusive suburb of Chicago. For nearly four months, the telephone had been an instrument of torture for Maurice F. Franks, 46, and his wife, Violet, 47.

There were seven to 10 anonymous calls a day. Once there were 30. Sometimes the callers, who sounded like women, would hang up. Other times they would tell Franks or his wife of a delivery being made to their home.

The deliveries came—unpacked and unwelcomed. Once Franks came home to find a load of sand. Another time, a load of gravel. A truck rolled up with 80 folding chairs; another arrived with 350 cement patio slabs.

Franks fought a battle without outside help. He kept sending back the "deliveries" as mistaken orders but declined to inform authorities of the strange happenings.

To add to the family woes, Mrs. Franks was bedridden most of the time with a spinal injury. When her husband and son, Maurice, Jr., 15, were not home, she got up laboriously from bed to answer the calls.

A month ago, the callers threatened. Franks said, that they would "grab the boy." Franks started escorting his son to and from school. Finally he reported the calls to the telephone company. A round-the-clock tap was put on the Franks' phone.

Finally, a call was traced to another Winnetka home. Police took into custody a 12-year-old girl, and said she admitted making the calls and implicated another girl, age 13.

"We did it just as a prank," an officer quoted them as saying. "We didn't have anything against Mr. Franks. We just picked him at random."

"We thought it was real fun."
