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Nippon Scientist Claims Russ Exploded Test in Gobi Desert

TOKYO, Nov. 29 (AP)—A Japanese scientist said today Soviet Russia exploded its latest hydrogen bomb in the vast Gobi desert of Outer Mongolia... Prof. Tadao Kiyokawa of Tokyo university estimated from scientific instruments placed at three points in Japan that the Russian test explosion occurred at about 12:30 a.m. EST on Nov. 22... He based his report on atmospheric shock waves... Outer Mongolia is a communist state lying between Red China and Soviet Russia in central Asia... The Gobi desert is mostly devoid of trees and supports only grass, thorn and scrub. It is about 600 miles from north to south and 1,000 miles from east to west... Kiyokawa estimated the time and

SUMMING UP GENOVA

Both President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles have wisely determined to sound a fresh note of hope for peace in the wake of the Tullie Geneva foreign ministers' conference.

They understand that the United States, the acknowledged leader of the Western coalition of free nations, cannot go to the mood of defeatism and resignation for peace. Her mission in the world demands that it reaffirm—as the President has quickly done—the earnestness of our continuing search.

In that spirit, Dulles sought in his report to the nation on Geneva to salvage what hope he could from that dismal meeting.

He said he did not see the Geneva setback as the danger of a hot war. He voiced doubt that Russia would resume the harsher tactics of the cold war. And he said he believes the Kremlin wishes now to maintain "at least the appearance of cooperative relations" with the West.

Dulles noted Mr. Eisenhower's statement that the earlier "summit" meeting at Geneva had reduced the chances of general war. The secretary said that nothing which occurred at the foreign ministers' gathering compels a change in the President's estimate.

Dulles made clear that the case of peace did not get the forward push the West hoped for at the conference.

Moscow simply is not ready to pay the price which must be created by the basic circumstances for a stable peace.

WILL AFFECT 1938 ELECTIONS—There will be an effect on 1938 politics, however, in view of the Democratic-Republican line, and there will be a realignment of the Republican organization on the part of the party.

THE MULTIPLE ELECTIONS probably dealt a final blow to the hopes of a coalition of the Democratic and Republican parties for the 1938 election.

### New Plan Can End Pollution By Beet Waste

and Great Western will be disposed of Oct. 25-28.

The daily waste load as applied to the plant contained 18,500 pounds of biochemical oxygen demand, BOD is a measure of the oxygen-consuming power of a waste.

The health service explained that one pound of BOD requires one pound of oxygen.

BOD exceeds the oxygen supply, a stream becomes anoxic and fish and other forms die.

The findings were reported to have shown that the residual waste of the plant contained 6,421 pounds of BOD per day. That meant the daily waste method removed 12,079 pounds or 87 per cent of the original 18,500 pounds.

Other sources of nitrogen and phosphate in the material also were drastically reduced before they reached the river.

In the sugar manufacturing process, soil is washed from beets and quantities of lime are used. The soil and lime later become silt. On the west area the silt amounted to 10 tons per day and in the disposal method 99.9 per cent of this suspended matter was removed.

### Arctic Icebox Wave Covers Wide Regions

The biggest cold wave of the season sprang across three quarters of the globe and above low level weather deep into the southland.

There was no stopping the Arctic front as it moved into the gulf and Atlantic states. Temperatures were below 20 degrees along the mid-Atlantic coast and in the field 20's in some gulf states.

It was much earlier in the Midwest and West. Temperatures were predicted to hit zero in northern Michigan today and be under the zero-degree mark in much of Ohio.

At Glasgow, Mont., it was 25 below zero early today and the mercury didn't get above eight below at Milton, N. D., yesterday.

Snow and ice added to the wintry blife in many areas from the Rockies to the Atlantic.

Northern Michigan's Copper country measured nine degrees of snow since Sunday. BOISE, Nov. 22—The state public utilities commission yesterday began a final study of the application of the Cascade Natural Gas company to raise more money for its distribution system in Washington, Oregon and northern Idaho.

Company officials told a commission hearing that revenue is needed for general improvements in the system and for conversion from propylene to natural gas in the Lewiston area.

The company has applied for a permit to issue first mortgage bonds convertible interim notes and common stock.

A PUC spokesman said an order could be expected early in December. The company hopes to begin the financing program early in December.

The natural gas for Lewiston would come from the Pacific Northwest Pipeline corporation which recently obtained a permit from the federal power commission to import more than 300 million cubic feet per day from Canada.

### Idaho-U.S. to Join in Fight On Pin Games

BOISE, Nov. 22—U.S. Commissioner of Law Enforcement Earle E. Keither said yesterday he is working with federal authorities in a state-wide crackdown on pinball machines being used for gambling purposes.

Keither reported that several hundred machines are believed to have been taken from the state since February. He said the machines are being used for gambling purposes.

Keither conferred with U.S. Attorney Sherman Purvis, Jr., and officials of the U.S. Attorney's office after telling newsmen his drive would be limited to machines which may be used for gambling purposes.

He had said Friday he would issue orders to pinball machines from Idaho because "substantial evidence" has been received frequently by law enforcement officials.

But yesterday he explained that there is no law under which operators can be prosecuted if the machines are not being used for gambling purposes.

He has issued orders for a crackdown on the heels of a ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court that pinball machines which pay off in free games are illegal in the state, subject to the destruction of the machines.

Keither said he told Purvis that information on pinball operators in Idaho is being turned over to federal authorities for whatever action they might wish to take.

He said that operators who use their machines for gambling must purchase a 650 federal gambling stamp.

### Nation's Farmers Seen Facing Tighter Economic "Squeeze" During Year Ahead

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22—An agriculture department economist said yesterday the current economic outlook for the nation's farmer is likely to get a little tighter next year.

In a report to the department's advisory committee on farm policy, Frederick W. Waugh, department director of economics, made this forecast.

"Looking ahead to 1956, we again expect business conditions to be very tight. We again expect agricultural prices and income to lag behind other parts of the economy. The result will be a reduction in net income—the amount left from a peak of \$171,000,000 in 1947 to an estimated \$10,000,000,000 this year."

Waugh's forecast was given at the opening session of the outlook conference attended by more than 400 extension service economists from various states and by department officials.

The conference is designed to acquaint the nation's farm leaders with the department's view on economic trends affecting farmers.

Waugh said that in making his forecast of somewhat harder times for farmers he took into consideration the possibility that congress may modify present farm programs.

Secretary of Agriculture Benson and members of congress—Democrats as well as Republicans—have promised "improvements." Democratic critics of the Eisenhower administration's farm programs expect agricultural programs to be a major issue in next year's national election.

Waugh said he doubted that any legislation passed by congress at the 1955 coming session would affect the outlook very greatly.

But he said legislation could affect the long-term outlook very substantially.

"No adjustments in the farm programs are likely to make a large, immediate change in the basic economic facts confronting the farmer," he said. "We look for several years for American agriculture to get into its present troubles. Economic and farm program changes will have to wait until it is too late to do it."

In opening the conference, which lasts through Thursday, Benson made only one reference to current farm programs. He said farmers are caught "in a serious farm program squeeze" growing out of post-war adjustments.

But he said the hardships farmers are undergoing now are less severe than in any previous post-war period.

The secretary stressed the need for making adequate and reliable economic information available to farmers so that they may forecast production and marketing programs.

### Republican Wants To Help Benson

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22—Sen. Arthur W. Watkins, R. Utah, yesterday called on his fellow Republicans to get out and help the Eisenhower administration's farm program.

Watkins said that the secretary of Agriculture Ezra Taft Benson "is too much alone" in defending the flexible price support program from attacks by the Democrats.

"Mostly Benson is making the fight," he said. "Congressmen and Republicans should be selling the program."

Watkins said the GOP should "take the offensive" and explain the flexible support program to the farmers.

### Japan Claims Soviet Tested 2 Big Bombs

TOKYO, Nov. 20 (AP)—The central meteorological observatory said today two wars of radioactivity have swept over Japan from two separate nuclear explosions presumably originating in the Soviet Union.

The observatory said radioactive rain pelted Japan beginning Nov. 18. Japanese scientists reason that radioactivity hit the islands anywhere from four to five days after a nuclear explosion. The record and by far the strongest recordings of radioactivity were made after Nov. 20.

Shook Reported  
On Nov. 22, earthquake instruments at Tohoku, Kyoto, Kanazawa, and Mishima all registered a sharp shock.

Although the meteorological observatory blamed the radioactive rain on the release of nuclear energy, the implication was clear that the two wars came from nuclear explosions.

The U. S. atomic energy commission announced last week that the Soviet Union had set off the largest nuclear blast in its history, presumably a hydrogen weapon.

Announces One—Soviet Communist party chief Nikita S. Khrushchev announced last Saturday at Bonaparte, Ind., that Russia had exploded a nuclear weapon with a power equivalent one million tons of TNT.

The meteorological observatory announcement increased fears in atom-happy Japan that radioactive fallout might damage future generations.

Dr. Dalene Moriwaki of Tokyo Municipal university claimed today that radioactive dust and rain falling on Japan over a long period of time "may bring hereditary effects."

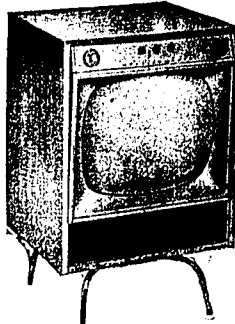

Shoulder room has been increased more than five inches in both front and back and the rear seat legroom increased two and one-half inches. The trunk capacity will hold 25 per cent more than other models.

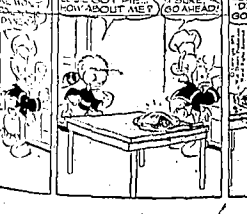

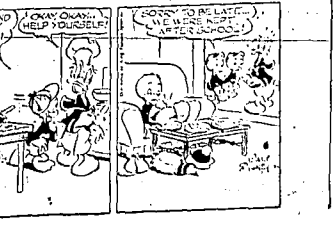

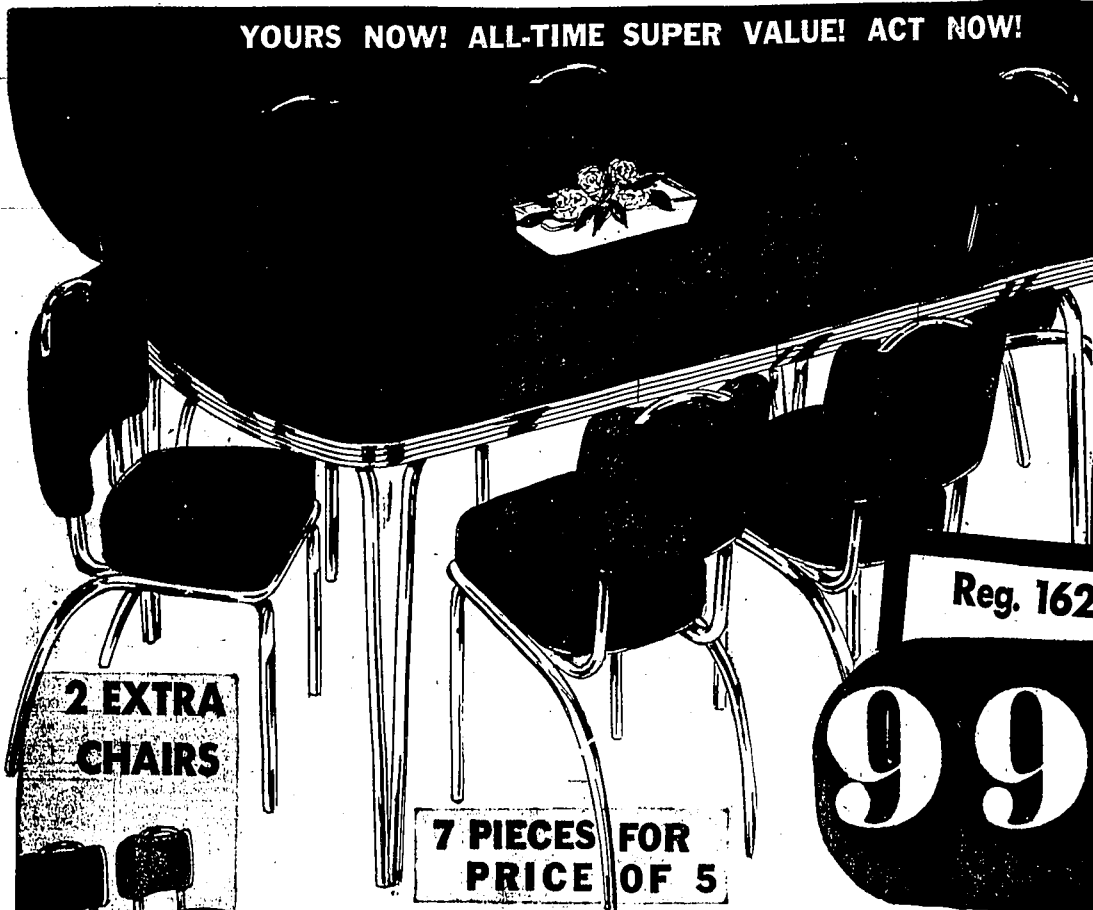
