SEN. SCOTT'S FARM PLAN

U. S. department of agriculture experts to day cast a somewhat gloomy eye on Sen. W. Kerr Scott's farm plan.

North Carolina senator and dairy farmer operator unveiled his brain child at a Democratic rally in Council Bluffs, Ia.—the very heart of the Republican farm belt.

Senator Scott would combine this with new annual or pound limitations for all the major crops produced, except tobacco.

Senator Scott gives two examples of how it would work: Wheat—A farmer marketing 1,000 bushels would get 100 per cent of parity price support.

Some of the big farmers claim this would be unfair. Ever since the old agricultural adjustment administration days, the government has been making payments for DOING something.

Overquota production could easily be controlled. Surplus might be diverted to a black market.

What the Scott plan would do to price levels no one can foresee. The free market price might be driven down to the 80 per cent of parity.

Big farmers would be producing for the market. Small farmers would produce for the government. And the surplus might become even bigger.

Car Industry Goes Toward New Records

DETROIT, Dec. 6 (AP)—The auto industry's bigger producers are roaring along at close to record levels, heading for a year's car total that will top the combined output of any two years prior to 1948.
Through last Saturday nearly 7,347,000 cars had been assembled since Jan. 1. In addition truck factories had turned out more than 1,640,000 units.
For the industry's leading car builders the tabulations for 1955 to date show: Chevrolet 1,691,596; cars assembled; Ford division 1,629,282; Buick 730,077; Plymouth 682,873; Oldsmobile 668,350 and Pontiac 547,115.
In the same period last year Chevrolet reported 1,577,371 car assemblies; Ford division 1,528,232; Buick 484,146; Plymouth 335,270; Oldsmobile 395,758 and Pontiac 328,250.
Last week's domestic output consisted of 160,127 cars and 27,570 trucks. This compared with 151,729 cars and 21,515 in the previous Thanksgiving day week. In the same 1954 week 149,925 cars and 21,661 trucks were built.

Frost Causes Crop Damage For Farmers

OLYMPIA, Dec. 8 (AP)—Last month's four-day freeze caused more than 11 million dollars' worth of damage to Washington crops, Governor Hinkle reported.

Hinkle said it was the greatest frost damage ever recorded for the western part of the state.

The chief estimate which he has asked President Eisenhower to declare western Washington a disaster area is making it possible for federal loans to aid stricken farmers.

This was the coldest weather for four consecutive days on record in this state, Langille stated.

Damage to all other agricultural crops cannot at this time be determined.

Hard hat men were the berry growers, the governor said. Damage to berry crops was estimated at \$485,000.

Damage to other crops in the state will have to be estimated. The governor said 4,000 persons depend on berry growing for their livelihood.

Horse-Bitten Columnist Has Advice for Others of Like ilk

Never visit people who own a horse. They will insist that you ride with them.

If you refuse they will be mortally offended, never ask you to come again, and finally you will be blacklisted, and a bad influence on their children.

I am now visiting a friend who has a horse, and so far, I have managed to keep off it. But I am a big, strong, muscular, unpopu-

lar blade. Five or six times a day they ask me when I am going to take Tom and go for a ride through the woods.

Millions of people love to ride horses. I know, but then horses don't bite millions of people—but they do bite me. I have ever ridden a horse that has bitten me. I was a youngster, and my growing, appetizing hands made one bit of difference.

The last horse I rode bit me. That was in Las Vegas. Mary and I went over to the Las Frontier from the Desert Inn. I believe it was, and rented a couple of those horses that hundreds of men, women and children ride every day. You know—the kind of horse that stays saddled from morning 'til night, legs along a worn trail, and is as patient as Job.

Mary and I climbed on and started off across the Desert. My horse's head hung down and he looked tired enough to lie down and curl up. But he hadn't gone a quarter of a mile before he suddenly twisted his neck to the left, bared what seemed to be two or three hundred teeth, and bit me a good one on the shin.

I am always getting into arguments about horses, ally as it seems. I don't believe all the good things people say about horses. How sweet-tempered they are, and how, if you fall off and hurt yourself, they'll gallop home with an empty saddle to give warning, or how they'll cal- sargur from your hand and not try to get more than that, or how, if they think their rider is hurting they will nudge him over with their muzzle to fit his heart is still beating. You wouldn't know, if they bit you all the time the way they do me.

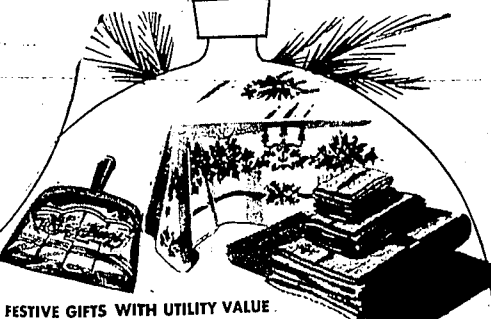

CHICAGO, Dec. 8 (AP)—Senator McCarthy, R., Wis., said last night the American Communist party has been helped by the "spirits of Geneva" and the Fund for the Republic, a non-profit foundation.

McCarthy said the Communist party is emerging from underground because of what they regard as a better public attitude resulting from the big four summit conference and the Fund for the Republic's "vicious anti-Communist propaganda machine."

The Fund for the Republic is an offshoot of the Ford Foundation which has conducted research about civil rights. McCarthy and others have accused it of aiding the communists. Dr. Robert M. Hutchins, the fund's president, denies this.

McCarthy also said in a speech at a club dinner that the senate subcommittee on constitutional rights is working with the Fund for the Republic to try to persuade congress to "zip the suit out of the government security program."

Earlier yesterday in Washington, McCarthy wrote to Adlai Stevenson and two other Democrats who have been mentioned as possible 1956 presidential candidates asking them to "repudiate" the subcommittee's activities.

5 Teen-Age Girls Face Grand Jury
AKRON, O., Dec. 8 (AP)—Five teen-age girls charged with the death of a man in their escape from the summit County Detention home were held to the grand jury yesterday by juvenile Judge Russell W. Thomas.

Judge Thomas ruled the girls should be tried as adults on first-degree murder charges filed last Tuesday.

Police say the girls overpowered the matron, Mrs. Zula Bonham, 55, strangled her with an ammonia-soaked washing and escaped from the home Sunday night, Nov. 27. Three of them surrendered and the other two were captured within 24 hours after their escape.

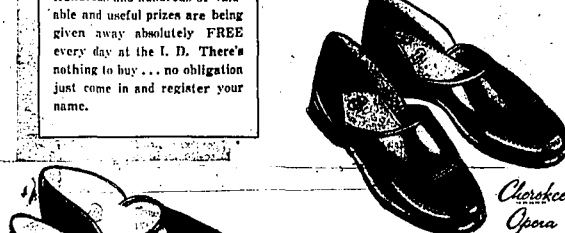

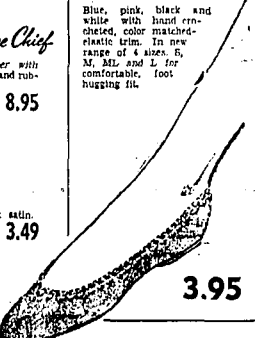

The plane was delayed at Calcutta airport because of bad engine and when it finally took off Saturday night it was forced to return there at night.

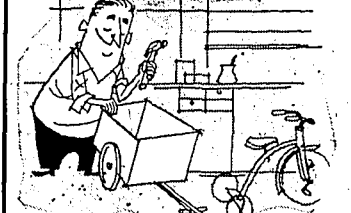
The passengers could not leave without undergoing complicated Indian customs procedure which probably started the rumors that he had disappeared over the bay, Hitchcock explained.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6 (AP)—The Nixon—would themselves in the Republicans because of Philip Young and the Democrats may find it a little embarrassing to go around in the 1956 campaign talking about the number of security risks they fired from the government.

The answer to the question—what is a security risk—seemed clear enough until Young testified before a senate subcommittee last week. A security risk was generally understood to be a person whose continued employment in the government would be a risk to the nation's security.

Young is chairman of the civil service commission which collects and makes public statistics on the number of people bounced from the government under President Eisenhower's security program.

In that capacity, he is of all people might have been expected to know the meaning of the term security risk. But he testified he didn't know the definition of the term, and didn't use it.

If the impression got around in the 1953 campaign that the government under the Democrats was loaded with communists, the Republicans did their best to foster it. They pleaded for a chance to take over the reins of the state.

In April 1953, three months after becoming President, Eisenhower laid down a security program for getting out of the government anyone whose employment was not "consistent with national security."

It provided for firing not only communists and fellow travelers but also anyone who drank or talked too much, or had other undesirable characteristics, if their agency head decided they were in a position to endanger security.

Loyalty and security cases had been handled under separate programs in the Truman administration.

From time to time thereafter the new administration gave out figures on the number of people fired under this security program. The figures increased by leaps and the Democrats said they were padded.

Solon Attacks Power Plans Of Committee

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 6 (AP)—Sen. Alton Saxon, D., Ore., yesterday attacked the recommendations of the Hoover commission on power and water resources as "rehearsal of a discredited past."

He told a house subcommittee hearing investigating the Hoover report that the recommendations sought to persuade congress to repudiate 50 years of the time-tested policies and substitute a combination of do-nothingism, partnership giveaway, and abandonment of the fair deal federal yardstick program.

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, Dec. 6 (AP)—La Prensa was freed today of the last shackles of Peronism preparatory to its resumption of publication as a free and independent newspaper under its legitimate name, the PAX family.

A labor ministry decree wrote the end to La Prensa's episode as an organ of the deposed regime of dictator Juan D. Peron at midnight. It implemented the decree-law issued by President Pedro E. Aramburu No. 28, denouncing as unconstitutional the seizure of La Prensa and ordering its return to the PAX family.

The ministry decree ordered all publication in the newspaper plant to cease for eight days pending a complete inventory of La Prensa's properties before they are turned over to Dr. Alberto Gaitanar, PAX's former editor and publisher of La Prensa until it was seized in 1951 by the Peron dictatorship. He returned here from exile last week to resume control.

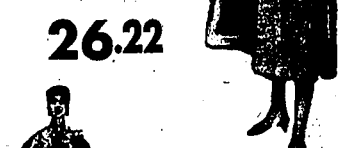

U. S. Farm Slump Affects Ike's Farm Affects His Neighbors More, However

GETTYSBURG, Pa., Dec. 6 (AP)—The farm problem now agitating politicians and farmers is about the same on President Eisenhower's tightly-policed Pennsylvania acres as elsewhere, but with a difference. Several differences, perhaps. The main difference probably is that Mr. Eisenhower isn't a farmer. Everyone knows that, of course. But perhaps everyone doesn't know that the President's 162 acres actually are leased for operation to a couple of friends who have other neighboring acres. The whole, including the President's patch runs up to about 400 acres and is operated by a partnership.

The partners are P. O. Byars, a Tyler, Tex., oil man, and George E. Allen, one-time southern football star at Cumberland university and author of a book, "Presidents Who Have Known Me."

The partners do not exactly farm the property, either. Brig. Gen. Arthur Nevins is in charge of over-all operations, with special attention to the beautification of the Eisenhower acres. Nevins is a long time Eisenhower intimate. And, then, there are the actual farmers who tend the stock and crops.

Allen is a small town boy, himself, but no farmer. This week when the President's own Brown Swiss was having trouble calving, Allen tried the same although the President stood by with considerable interest. Mother and calf both are doing well.

Most of the stock on the four farms making up the 600 acres belongs to the partnership. But the several hogs, beef cattle and such presented personally to the President are his although they are tended and marketed, if for sale, by the partnership.

The partners—and the President with respect to his few hogs—have something in common this year with the corn-hog farmers who are raising considerable cash with the Republican party about prices. The partners and the President are not going to make any money on their hogs. Chances are they will sell at a loss if they sell at all. They probably won't get back the cost of the feed.

One reason for that, however, is that the partnership and Eisenhower hogs are being fed a special scientific diet. There is a solid report here that Mr. Eisenhower is convinced that his hogs could be fed for a darn slight less and, maybe, bring a profit. But they are getting the special diet. Just the same.

The Aberdeen Angus beef cattle which have had the most publicity among the livestock on the Eisenhower and associated acres should show a profit this year. The President and the partners will keep one or two good bulls, keep the best heifers, and market the steers and any heifers which might be less than tops.

If Mr. Eisenhower were able to get out and circulate among his Adams county neighbors, he would find that things were not going quite as well for them as on the financially-battered 600 acres famous which he lives and which his partners operate.

The Adams county farm agent reports the area now to be suffering from a general agricultural slump. Adams county farmers are reported generally dissatisfied. The county marketed 20,000 hogs in 1954 for a year.

Adams county cherries are down in a year from 11 to seven cents a pound; apples from \$5 per hundred pounds to about \$2.50. The country's United States and Canada. The two dairy industry is doing the best of the lot, though off a bit from last year.
