Big Explosion Rips Building; 25 Are Killed

FRANKFURT, Germany, Dec. 7 (AP)—A mysterious explosion destroyed the head Harbor attack house in the center of Frankfurt in today, killing 25 of the 25 people in the building.
Police said last possibilities were that a dud aerial bomb from the Luftwaffe had exploded, or that a tank had accidentally tried to tap the nearby gas main.

It is the worst disaster in West Germany's postwar rebuilding program.

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Plans Slated To Claim Gas Distribution

BOISE, Dec. 7 (AP)—Intermountain Gas company today rushed plans to line up local natural gas distribution franchises in southern Idaho following action by the state public utilities commission granting a certificate of convenience to the firm.
The certificate, which covers distribution rights in 30 counties, was issued by the PUC yesterday. The award climaxed a 13-month legal hassle that saw the permit first go to the Idaho Natural Gas company only to have the supreme court reverse the PUC.
George Carpenter, Idaho Natural president, said his firm had decided whether the case would be appealed. He said the matter would have to be moved as fast as possible because of the time element. He will file its natural gas from a main being built through the state by Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corp. The main is scheduled for completion early this summer and Pacific Northwest has said it will lease a share of the gas elsewhere if the state is not prepared to receive it.

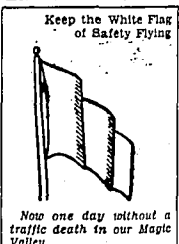

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

MIAMI, Fla.—Adlai E. Stevenson's current quest for southern friends, delegates and votes has not been a howling success. Although given a friendly welcome at his club-nation reception here, political leaders stayed away from his presence.

Stevenson's agents for his absenteeism apply to Democratic bigwigs in almost every other southern state. At least three other commonwealths voted for Stevenson in 1932, and he has been running up a losing record which he did not carry. Governors, senators, congressmen and local officials seeking reelection next year are not antagonizing the hundreds of thousands who "fill the Ike" in Florida, for instance, Edward Holland, the senior senator, openly opposed Stevenson. Sen. George A. Smathers, the junior member, faces reelection next year, and is so worried over his chances that he is stalling the state a year in advance. Although Stevenson is making a name for himself at the University of Florida state, Smathers did not appear.

SENATOR'S PREDICAMENT—Smathers' predicament applies to southern politicians generally. Besides the 100,000 votes he needs to carry, he must win the support of the 285,000 citizens who voted for Sen. Estes Kefauver in Florida's 1932 presidential primary. Kefauver has a reputation as a "Mr. Smathers" and also wants the nomination next year.

Stevenson was met at various places only by local and county Democrats. He drew chuckles and laughter with a characteristically witty speech to the county leaders. He was not invited to speak to the audience before the American Municipal congress at Miami, and was not invited to the audience there from non southern areas.

STEVENSON'S CHANCES IN FLORIDA—The identification of this chilly attitude toward Stevenson is a sure sign of the opposition he is meeting. He has more than any other Democrat now mentioned for the nomination. Although still suspicious of him, he is being courted by the Florida State Farm on its farm program in 1932, the South prefers his counsel of "moderation" in the extreme and critical utterances of "moderation" in the extreme and critical utterances of Gov. C. G. McQueen Williams of Michigan.

His question is whether Stevenson will read more into the present situation than he did three years ago. The Republican gains in Dixie in 1932 were due as much to resentment of the Missouri plan as to any other factor. Stevenson's next to Truman as a national ticket is a southern interest as far as the South is concerned. Stevenson, however, in the opinion of his more practical advisers, must reiterate strength in the South by making a speech at the Chicago convention as a pro-southern rather than a national figure, and it would be to his advantage to make this demonstration, possible, in a state that is tipped to Stevenson, such as Florida.

GOP HOTCH JOB—The Democrats, nevertheless, have one consolation with respect to the South's failure to elect Stevenson. In 1932, the GOP was hotch job of converting Dixie to Republicanism. The administration has neglected its basic problems in many respects. Local leaders have shown themselves unable to bring about a change in the status quo, to the general disgust of the citizenry. They have made no serious attempt to build up a party, but have relied on the slogan of "New Deal" which the people will repeat and rally.

The South ever does become a genuine two-party system, it will be the result of the economic forces and sociological changes rather than through the operations of selfish, office-seeking politicians.

VIEWS OF OTHERS

ON NEWLY SO IMPROVEMENT—Opportunities politicians seizing upon the American farm problem as a vehicle on which to ride into office have been zealous in promoting the impression that the farmer is the only one who can help the nation have no ideas about how the situation may be improved other than by "flexible" price supports and various other schemes for raising up the "farm bank."

It is true, just isn't true. It is a falsehood as are the "quick remedies" and "disaster" nostrums that are now being proposed by such exponents of the phibizzas as Adlai Stevenson and Averell Harriman.

It is not to be overlooked that Secretary Benson has been for some time holding out a wide open invitation for words while suggesting to solve the farm problem. He is the present responsibility for the present agricultural economy upon a solid foundation, while, as he puts it, "pulling out the fire and cleaning up the debris." The third is to create a national credit bank to solve the farm problem. This is the present responsibility for the present agricultural economy upon a solid foundation, while, as he puts it, "pulling out the fire and cleaning up the debris." 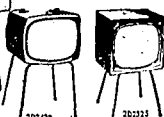

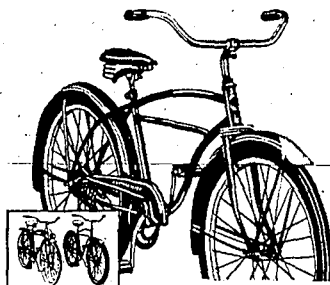

Jordan Areas Used as Base, Israeli Claims

JERUSALEM, Dec. 7 (AP)—A reliable Israeli source said today Maj. Gen. John Bagot Glubb promised the United Nations to take necessary measures to prevent Egyptian forces from using Jordan as a base for raids on Israel.

The informant said Glubb Pasha, British commander of the famed Arab Legion of Jordan, gave the pledge to Maj. Gen. E. L. M. Burns of Canada, chief of the U. N. Palestine truce commission. Israel complained to the U. N. Mission troops are against raids carried out by the Jordan, Arab Legion troops trained in Egypt, according to the source.

Glubb requested Burns to relay his assurances to the Tel Aviv government, the informant said, and the Arab Legion as well as British troops in Jordan have been alerted against the raids.

U. N. truce observers continued to investigate the scene of the latest clash between Israeli and Egyptian forces in the bloody Gaza strip. Both Israel and Egypt accused the other of provoking the two-hour exchange of automatic weapons and mortar fire in the Df. of Gaza area and firing rifle probes with the U. N. mixed armistice commission.

An Egyptian general headquarters communiqué broadcast in Cairo, said four Israelis were killed and two others wounded in the clash. The Egyptian forces suffered four wounded, the broadcast said.

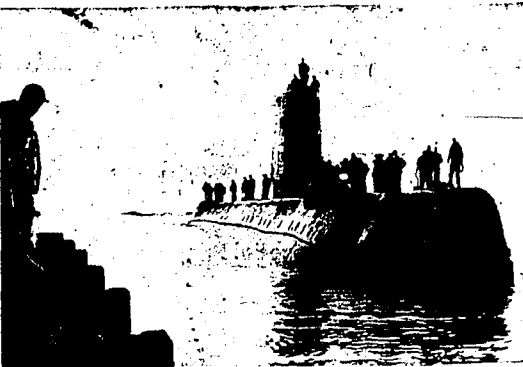

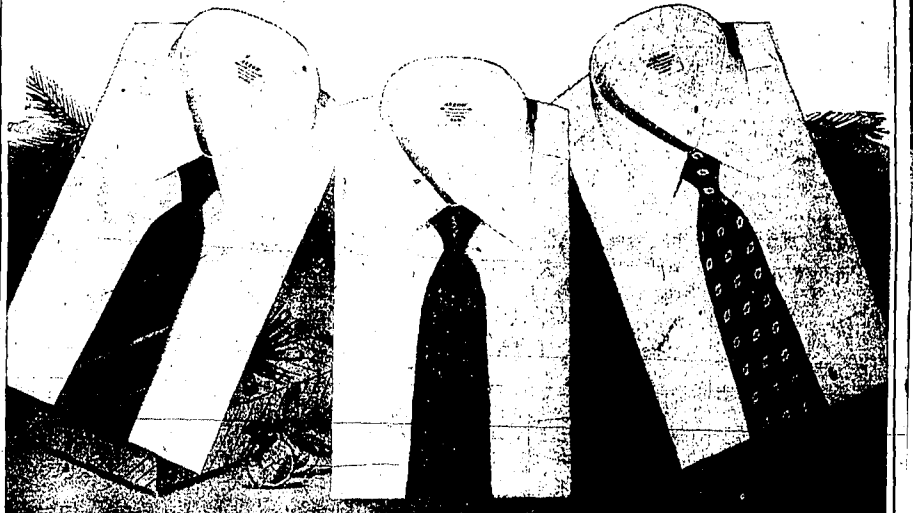

Experts Cite Reasons Not To Cut Tax

NEW YORK, Dec. 14 (AP)—A study issued by the Treasury department today to bring up unpopular measures. But a few hardy souls are doing this—and borrowing the very phrase, are insisting they are doing it only for their own good.

Fiscal Mide

The plea to let taxes stay high is being heard by a house-senate economic committee studying the effect of taxes on the economy.

"We want our people to be informed on all issues facing the electorate," he said. And he left no doubt the AFL-CIO would take sides. He said "our members have a right and duty to oppose those who oppose them," a pretty blunt reminder to politicians to play ball or else.

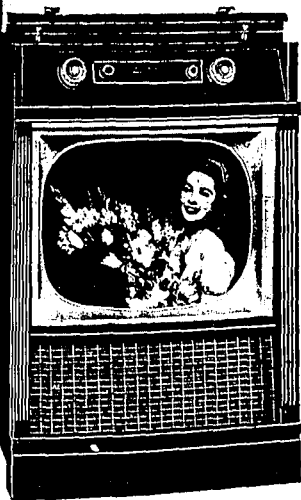

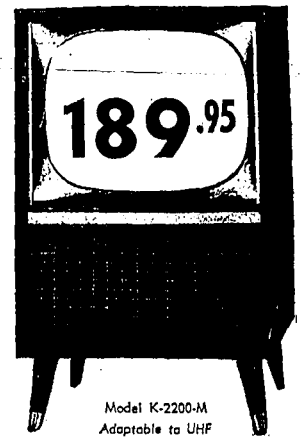

Tax Cuts Are Argued; Main Snags Shown

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—An income tax reduction next year is almost a foregone conclusion, but it remains to be shown which taxpayers will get the most benefit and which will bear the burden.

The election year tax cut was bagged yesterday at Gettysburg where President Eisenhower agreed on defense spending with the appropriate officials. The target figure for the fiscal year ending in June next June 30 was fixed at \$34,500,000,000.

That is about \$17,250,000,000 in pre-war dollars, the dollar having shrunk since 1930 to the equivalent of four bits under the political and wartime squeeze. If the dollar remains relatively stable in the next 18 months as it has now, but it is a couple of years, there is a fair chance that the Pentagon spending officers will meet in response to an installment of the cold war—or the Geneva disarmament.

Defense spending is fairly even level, the logical keys to tax reduction seem to lie in three other areas: (1) Personal income tax cuts; (2) Agriculture and how much subsidy will be voted for farm products; (3) Foreign aid and what will be done to meet the stepped-up Soviet challenge in that field.

Those are the hot areas for further determining whether the treasury will be able next year to sustain the income tax reduction. They will be factors in the final deal. But a fourth factor is presidential year politics.

Both parties urgently desire to win friends among voters next year. There are few better ways of doing so than by reducing taxes. With both parties, barring a few dissenters such as Sen. Harry F. Byrd, D., Va., viewing the election partly in terms of tax reduction, it is reasonable to believe that there will be cut.

Unofficial reports recently credited the treasury with estimating now for a budget surplus in fiscal 1957 ranging from two billion dollars to four billion dollars. This assumes that congress, the administration, the farm bloc and others are willing to hold the spending line.

There's a school bloc, too, a big one. And a lot of persons in and out of congress are asking big sums for roads. All of these will have their impact on spending.

The most favorable factor is booming national production which increases treasury income. Increased revenues are so much needed to pay for an election year. Defense secretary Charles E. Wilson remarked recently that the value of the great national product goes up, the percentage of defense spending will go down and, of course, treasury revenue will increase.

Senate Democratic leader Lyndon B. Johnson, Tex., recently proposed a "tax revision to benefit the low-income groups." That would be by increasing exemptions which would remove some millions of persons from the tax rolls altogether.

Something along those lines is likely, perhaps accompanied with some added relief for higher bracket taxpayers. There is considerable public support for the latter, but probably not enough to prevent an exemption hike which would confine substantial relief to the lowest income groups.

That's where the votes are.

Boost in Road Building Fund May Be Asked

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—The U. S. chamber of commerce may change its position on national highway legislation and ask the federal government to assume more than a 60 per cent financial responsibility in construction of the interstate system, the western businessmen's highway conference was told yesterday.

J. H. Carmichael, president of the U. S. chamber and president of Capital Airlines, Inc., told the 100 delegates from 11 western states organization is considering a change in light of recent highway developments before congress.

He said a referendum is being circulated among 3,000 member chambers and trade organizations asking their opinion on a revised policy that would call on the government to assume "primary responsibility" on the 40,000-mile interstate network.

Other officials of the U. S. chamber told reporters this could mean 700 per cent financing by the federal government. "Primary responsibility" in contrast to 60 per cent participation requested by the chamber during the last session of congress.

Students, Officers Battle on Campus

ATHENS, Ga., Dec. 7.—Police and troops used tear gas to break up a selling throng of more than 1,500 University of Georgia male students during a campus demonstration early today.

State highway patrolmen arrested 400 students and discharged tear gas among the swirling hordes of demonstrators who blocked traffic, threw rocks at patrol cars and hung effigies of a university dean.

This was a fifth campus demonstration to be staged by the state since Gov. Marvin Griffin proposed that Georgia Tech be forbidden to play in the Sugar bowl game Jan. 2 because of rival Pittsburgh's Negro football.

Prober Asks New Pact for Auto Dealers

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney demanded today that the big three auto manufacturers liberate franchise agreements to guarantee that dealers can be "independent businessmen."

The Wyoming Democrat praised the General Motors corporation for extending the period of its dealer franchises from one to five years. The action was announced yesterday by GM President Harlow H. Curtis.

But O'Mahoney said his was only a "short step" which "does not deal with fundamentals, as exemplified by the fact that the termination of the contract can be made in exactly the same manner as before."

GM dealers still will be "told by the factory exactly what they must do," he said, "and they must do it." He said the same monopoly subcommittee, of which he is chairman, had not received any concrete proposals from dealers of the three smaller auto makers.

The subcommittee, which is investigating General Motors' impact on the nation's economy, called top GM executives for questioning about monopolizing advertising and "loading cars with extras."

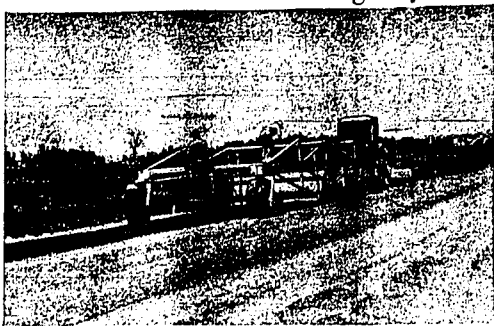

Land Plane Used for Highway

Huge Land Plane Is Used for Smoother Highway Surfacing

BOISE, Dec. 7.—The Idaho department of highways has come up with another "first" in highway construction.

A 60-foot land plane was used as an experiment on the surfacing of a 9.8 mile section of highway between Beeches Corner and Ririe. The land leveler was used by the contractor on the job as a result of several conferences with the contractor and the engineers.

Slate Highway Engineer E. V. Miller said: "The increased width of our highways and the greater amount of surface gravel needed to carry the heavier loads has presented quite a smooth surface."

He pointed out that present construction equipment, even when operated by the most skilled men, sometimes leaves an irregular riding surface.

Miller said that two sections of the U. S. 26 project were not land leveled. "Those which were leveled with the plane showed a marked improvement over those not leveled," Miller said.

Attlee Leaves Post; Retires From Politics

LONDON, Dec. 7 (AP)—Quiet little Clement Attlee, the first of the British political leaders to announce his resignation today as leader of the British Labor party.

Attlee, who whipped Winston Churchill into action in the 1945 elections, followed Churchill into retirement by only eight months. He had served 20 years as party leader, six of them as postwar prime minister. For five war years he was Churchill's understudy.

Attlee announced his retirement quietly and without drama at the opening of a meeting of labor members of parliament. Then, looking old and very sad, he sought the privacy of his own office in the house where he could conceal his feelings.

As soon as Attlee left the meeting room, an official announcement was issued saying:

"At the commencement of the meeting of the parliamentary Labor party held this morning, the right honorable C. R. Attlee, O. M. C. II, M. P., announced that he was retiring immediately from the leadership of the Labor party."

Attlee's resignation signaled the jump-off of a crucial three-way hunt for his job as Labor party leader—a post that makes his holder prime minister when the Laborites win an election.

The new struggle for power is one of world importance. It pits the Socialist right and left, the old guard versus the young Turks, the trade unionists against the intellectuals. Attlee's successor must forge an alliance from these various groups.

Hugh Gaitskell, the staunchly pro-American exponent who is a leader of the party's right-wing, was favored today to win the party leadership in balloting expected within a week.

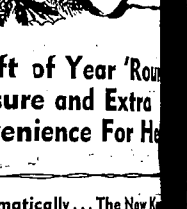

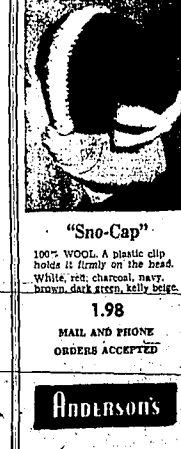

Wildlife Group Hits Engineer Corps Policy

LEWISTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—The Lewis-Clark Wildlife club, in a sharply-worded resolution, Tuesday urged abolition of all civil functions of the Army Corps of Engineers. The club accused the corps of pursuing a river development program detrimental to wildlife interests while bypassing existing conservation agencies.

The club will try to line up backing for its resolution at the Idaho Wildlife federation meeting in Boise next month.

The club asked congress to "abolish all civil functions of the Corps of Engineers and transfer whatever part of its duties which need to be continued to a civilian agency."

The resolution contained three charges against the Corps: "The Corps has announced plans for dams that will exterminate steelhead and salmon from the Clearwater and its tributaries."

"The Corps has on two occasions destroyed spawning of huckaback on Lake Pend Oreille with possible disastrous results."

"The Corps has caused loss of migration routes for deer in connection with Lucky Peak dam and its reservoir."

"The Corps has advocated dam projects which would wipe out a considerable portion of the elk and deer of Idaho and cut run for all time the Lewis and Clark highway along the Lochsa River and the middle fork of the Clearwater."

"The Corps has stacked hearings bypassed all federal and state agencies concerned with conservation, carried on wholesale lobbying and flooded the country with political propaganda in violation of the public interest."

Another veteran conservation officer, O. R. Christensen, was honored as a similar dinner Monday evening.

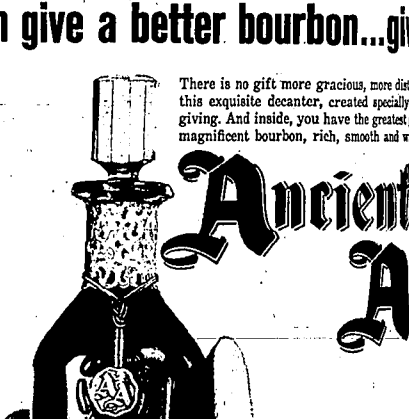

One and 1/2 teaspoons (1/2 envelope) unflavored gelatin, three teaspoons cool water, one well-seasoned turkey stock, 1/2 cup vinegar or lemon juice, dash of cayenne, one cup of sliced celery, one pint milk, finely chopped, 1/2 cup heavy cream.

Soluble gelatin in cold water. Heat stock to boiling. Add softened gelatin. Stir and dissolve. Add vinegar, salt and cayenne. Cool. Stir in turkey stock, celery, pimiento. Continue for remaining. Chill until firm. Add 1/2 cup heavy cream. Whip cream. Fold in turkey mixture. Pour into a mold. Chill. Garnish with sliced green onions on platter.

This concoction will serve six.

Salad Offered
 And did you ever hear of turkey salad? Well, all you have to do is take two cups of churned up leftover turkey, 1/2 cup of green pepper, 1/2 cup of sliced almonds, mayonnaise to mix, 1/2 cup chopped celery, 1/2 cup white seedless grapes cut, with chopped parsley for topping.

Combine ingredients, season if necessary with salt and pepper. This is a good time for the old man to come in for a taste of chili and serve on lettuce.

Chili is Listed
 The UNW food editor would have us men folks know what every household knows—that nothing is better than turkey hash with chili. Get the bones and get a good rich stock.

"Scalloped turkey" is a somewhat tempting dish the UNW called "scalloped turkey." It is a turkey left-over dressing, flavored with a bit of egg and celery, salt, and has a sauce of a mustard-like consistency.

And then there are things like "turkey and noodle soup," "turkey coll-turkey casserole," "turkey stew with dumplings," and plain old "turkey soup."

Illustrated below are some of the more common rackets which spring up to mar the holidays. Study them so you won't be caught with your guard down. If you are suspicious of any "bargain" offers, consult the Better Business Bureau.

MAIL SCHEME



Unwanted Christmas cards or merchandise arrive in the mail. You keep them. You're later billed, at an exorbitant price. Legal action is threatened if you don't pay. Best bet: Notify advertiser by registered letter that you don't want goods.

MAIL ORDER



"Brilliant" Christmas tree ornaments are advertised at a low price. Tempted, the sucker sends a check and later receives ornamental—cardboard cutouts colored with luminous paint. This also works with bargain "brains" circus animals' toys.

STREET SALES



"Banks" set up shop on downtown sidewalk, selling cute toys that ship and "chirp." But when you get the toy home you find the chirping breaks after one ship, and the darn thing doesn't chirp. "Banks" was a ventriloquist, besides being a cheat.

BARGAIN PERFUMES



An "exotic" imported-from-France perfume is advertised as a "special Christmas offer—\$15 bottle for \$1, if you buy a dozen or more." When the perfume arrives, you discover it is cheap perfume made in the U.S.A. It just has a pretty label.

COLLECTIONS



Christmas puts the giving spirit in all of us. But beware to whom you give. Many solicitors represent phony organizations. Their uniforms are usually unidentifiable. Reliable groups gladly supply information about themselves, their purpose.

BAD CHECKS



Beware the holiday check cashier. Check crooks operate when stores are crowded and clerks are too rushed to examine checks. As a result, check artists' haul reaches \$15 million by New Year's. Don't be rushed. Check these checks.

Utah Farmers Get Less for Produce

SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 7 (AP)—Utah farmers get less, generally, for their produce on Nov. 15 than they did a month earlier, with greatest declines on livestock, the U. S. Department of Agriculture has said.

The department said average prices received for hogs dropped during the month from \$18.80 to \$17.40. Best cattle were down from \$12.40 to \$11.80; veal calves down from \$16.50 to \$16; sheep, down from \$4.50 to \$4.20, and lamb down from \$17.90 to \$17.70. Increases were listed for poultry, corn, barley, milk and hay but prices of virtually all other crops were down.

Indian Press Slaps Dulles, Russ Leader

NEW DELHI, India, Dec. 7 (AP)—The Indian press has renewed its attack on U. S. Secretary of State John A. Dulles and some secretaries for their "intemperate behavior." The editorial barrage against Dulles evolved around the use of the term "Portuguese colony" in a joint statement with Portugal in reference to Goa, a Portuguese possession on India's west coast. India contends Goa is being held by Portugal against the wishes of its residents.

The influential Hindustan Times roundly criticized Communist party boss Nikita S. Khrushchev for his bitter outburst against the west and against western correspondents during the recent tour of India and Burma.

"Rubbish" as a poor substitute for sound advocacy as the Soviet dictator should know," the Times said. "We cannot too strongly deplore his intemperate behavior which naturally had wide publicity."

The Times added, "most realize they are being strongly criticized even in friendly circles for their misuse of force for blatant attacks upon their opponents of the West."

The Times said that the purpose of the Soviet leaders' tour should be "improvement of international relations in general and not to line up forces for intensification of the ideological conflict."

Columnist Wonders Why Red Leaders Got Into Fine Outfit

By HENRY McLEMORE

The news that the Messrs. Bulgann and Khrushchev during their trip to India set me wondering whether or not the Russians were qualified to receive a fine outfit.

To check, I went to the attic and dug out my faded, dog-eared Boy Scout handbook, and read it for the first time in many a long year.

I must say that if the Indian Boy Scouts are governed by the same rules as our Scouts, then Bulgann and Khrushchev should never be allowed to describe the Scout movement as being one of the finest organizations in the world.

The Russians should never be allowed to start qualifying for advancement to the first class Scout. If they are—and a reading of the regulations for promotion makes me believe that they will—establish a new record for speedy advancement.

For example, knot-tying is an important part of becoming a tenderfoot Scout. Most novices have a hard time with this, and have to practice hours and hours before coming proficient.

It would be duck soup for Bulgann and Khrushchev. They have been tying knots to piece behind the ears of men condemned to hang since they were boys, and any thief will tell you that a hangman's knot is the toughest of all.

To become a second-class Scout, a boy must be able to skill at all kinds of knots. He must be able to tie a game, such as rabbits and deer. That would be the child's play for Nikolai and Nikita. They have been slinking the biggest game of all—men—for four decades or more. They could tell of how they stalked Count von Beria, for one, for years and years. And how they stalked so well that Beria hardly knew what was happening until a bullet crashed into the back of his skull in a deep, dark underground passageway.

Bulgann and Khrushchev would find that the best for becoming a first-class Scout might simply be to try to get a hold of a few of the high speed jet planes.

Wing Commander H. P. Ruffell Smith, a senior RAF medical officer, said many pilots crash because their brains cannot cope simultaneously with a huge array of instruments and their flight controls.

They know all about that from watching their tragic victims try to keep alive in the concentration camps. They must have seen enough starved men, women and children forage for just such food to be enough to sustain a few of the most famous of the world's leaders.

As for their qualifications for scouting, a reading of the handbook will show they hardly measure up.

Take the Scout slogan, for example. "Do a Good Turn Daily." I have my doubts that they could ever live up to this unless helped by an old lady across the railroad tracks and into a freezing boxcar bound for Siberia in classified as a good turn in the land of the Soviets. Then there's the Scout oath, part of which reads "To help others." How often do you see Bulgann and Khrushchev when they're treating Malenkov, and what they had planned to do with him a little later on, but I wouldn't bet on that.

The Scout law sort of lets the Russians out, too. Among other things, it says something about "wonderful, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, and reverent."

Seeing that Bulgann and Khrushchev are any of these things, I am slightly puzzled as to why I find it hard to saddle the Boy Scouts of all organizations, with the likes of Nikolai and Nikita.

U. N. Group OK's Israeli Proposals
