Harold West, state agriculture commissioner, told 400 members of the Bean Growers Warehouse Association Wednesday that "farmers must be conscious of selling as well as producing."

West, speaking at the association's annual meeting in the Turf club, charged the various branches of agriculture are "slowly beating each other in the quest for the consumer dollar."

As an example, West asserted the sale of an extra pound of rice by rice producers "probably would cancel the sale of a pound of beans."

West urged farmers to cooperate to maintain large volume.

### Union Okays Wage Boosts; Strike Looms

SPOKANE, Dec. 8.—AFL drivers and mechanics have accepted a wage offer by the Spokane City Lines by a "narrow margin," but authorized a strike for Jan. 1 if part of the pay boost falls through.

The union members voted on a wage offer by the Spokane City Lines for a 3-4-5 increase retroactive to April 1 and another 10 cents Jan. 1. If the company is able to effectively curtail some routes.

Union Business Agent James E. Mark said the members approved the offer by a close vote, but gave no ballot breakdown, and had voted 100-113 to authorize a strike if the major portion of the proposed increase were not forthcoming.

The union had asked a 21-cent hourly increase and was working on a day-to-day basis. Negotiations were resumed late last month when voters turned down a proposal for public purchase and operation of the bus system.

State Mediator William Samlaid said the company had also offered to pay an additional \$5 monthly for each worker's pension fund.

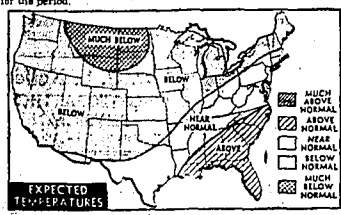

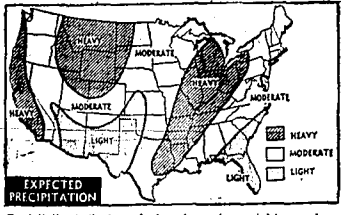

### Health, Age and Artery Facts Are Problems in Ike's Plans

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—President Eisenhower is 65. The Republicans hope he will run again. He has a record of winning in 1954. But can he run?  
Even if his doctors said he could run—and they've said nothing of the kind yet—there is one factor he would have to consider:  
The average life expectancy in this country for white men is 64. Eisenhower, if reelected, would be 66 when he took office in 1957.  
Then, if he ran true to statistics, he'd have only two years to live and could not finish out his four-year term. But some men live longer, some a shorter time to make up that average. And Eisenhower might serve out a second term and live till he's 74.  
There is something else involved before he could consider undertaking another four-year term in the White House.  
The word of his doctors on whether he could run, and what they'll think, depends on the condition of his heart.  
That one of the most vital things they could tell him about is all in the condition of his arteries.  
There was nothing wrong with Eisenhower when the news before he suffered the attack. The trouble was in one of the blood vessels to the heart.  
His walls had thickened. Finally blood through that vessel was shut off. This took off just how badly was the heart damaged? That would take time to show. How could the damage be fixed? The heart could get enlarged.  
The doctors have been making constant checks. So far they've reported Eisenhower has been doing all right.  
They are going to wait, perhaps a couple of months during which they will constantly check him, before telling whether his heart came through this ordeal all right—all risks enough to permit his running again.  
The question arises:  
If one blood vessel was in bad shape, isn't it reasonable to assume the other vessels to the heart are just about as bad and that it's only a matter of a short time before another closes and he has another attack?  
It isn't reasonable to assume that, and this is said on advice of one of the best heart doctors in the country. Why? Because only one section of one artery may have been thickened it would close.  
This was the specialist's explanation. Doctors say that one vessel was badly diseased. The closing of it was proof. But they don't know whether the other vessels are in that shape. Eisenhower might never have another heart attack.

### Mail Destroyed

BRUNNENHAVEN, Germany, Dec. 8.—Thousands of Christmas packages and cards sent by American troops in Germany to their families at home were destroyed by fire yesterday.  
Army officials said about one-third of the mail which filled a railway mail car was destroyed in the fire. The mail had been collected from army postoffices throughout Germany and was to have been loaded on a ship here.

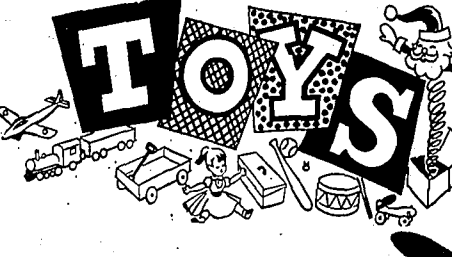

### Spruce Tree Is Sent Chief For Yuletide

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8 (AP)—A 65-foot black hills spruce, which began its life in South Dakota the same year Dwight D. Eisenhower was born in Texas, arrived yesterday to take over as the White House Christmas tree.

Forecasters figure the tree began as a seedling in 1890, and during the 63 years grew until it weighed 33 tons on a spread of 26 feet.

**The Does All Right**  
During the same period, of course, Eisenhower has done all right, too. The tree will stand in the park south of the White House, and will be a main attraction at the "Pageant of Peace" on Dec. 16. President Eisenhower, from his Gettysburg, Pa. farm, will push the button that lights the tree and starts the 16-day pageant in which 53 nations will take part.

**Custom Started**  
The White House has had a big community tree since President Coolidge began the custom in 1922. By now, the whole thing has become pretty involved. Richard McArdle, chief of the U. S. forest service, was around to look at the spruce, and fell to talking about how the life span of a single tree shows the importance of a conservation program.

**History Recounted**  
When the tree, and Eisenhower, were born, Benjamin Harrison was in the White House. South Dakota had been a state but for a year and this country had only 8,000,000 people or around 100 million fewer than it has now.

**History Recounted**  
The Black Hills national forest, where the tree was first planted, was established until it was 7 years old. McArdle said, "to grow a good tree."

### Newsmen Are Freed by Bid Of High Court

MANILA, P. I., Dec. 8 (AP)—The Philippines supreme court today ordered the release under \$100 bail each of five Philippine newsmen yesterday for refusing to reveal the source of a news story.

The supreme court justices, beset by lawyers, congressmen and senators, issued the unprecedented order only minutes after a petition for a writ of habeas corpus was filed on behalf of the newsmen.

The high court also directed Judge Zenilo Filloza of suburban Pasay city to answer the petition by Dec. 16.

Filloza yesterday sentenced the newsmen to 30 days in jail when they refused to disclose the source of stories they wrote about an alleged extortion attempt involving former Defense-Justice Secretary Oscar Gestoso.

At the time the stories were printed Gestoso's case was under consideration by Filloza. A few days afterward the judge found Gestoso and seven co-defendants guilty of murder and sentenced them to death.

The story the newsmen printed told of a Philippines constabulary investigation of an alleged offer made by third parties to arrange a "rot gully" verdict for a price.

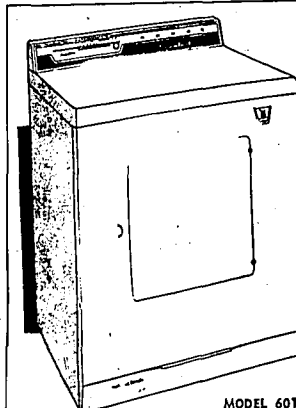

### Eyewitness to Plane Mishap States Details

Five people have the unusual and absorbing experience of observing a plane explode in the air and crash. But D. H. Bues, 11-year-old boy of Twin Falls, had a control tower, had his brothers inside the plane's new multiple observation post yesterday when it plummeted into Chesapeake Bay. This is the story.

PATUXENT, Md., Dec. 8 (U.P.)—I had my binoculars trained on the big Seamaster as it flew near the base. I saw lots of planes in my job. But this was a new one to me so I watched closely.

She was streaking along about 5,000 feet up. All of a sudden there was a flash and then flames, sort of in combination and right behind the two starboard engines. They had exploded.

Then, almost right after the engines on the other side blew up. There it goes. That's it I thought. Then the whole works just nosed over and went straight down. It didn't slide down. Just went straight down. A column of black smoke was left behind.

I watched the plane go down in flames. It looked like it all held together. It just looked a few seconds together. I don't see how anybody could have gotten out in time.

I figured they were gone. I reached for the alien and blew it on the base. Then I got on the microphone and passed the word to all hands. Our crash boat roared off to try to find survivors.

But they didn't find any. When they got back, they told me that most of the plane had sunk with only a few pieces left on the surface. I was a little bit nervous and a little bit scared when all this happened so quick like. But I wasn't too shaken up. I just got busy and started reporting the accident. That's my job.

After his return he worked as a dispatch and distributing clerk and as a register clerk. He took over the parcel post window in 1929 and held the job down until 1953.







### Resistance to Adoptions of Asians Noted

CRESWELL, Ore., Dec. 8.—Harry Holt, the Oregon farmer who spent his heart and home to eight mixed-blood Korean war orphans, said yesterday there was a core of resistance to non-Caucasian adoptions by Americans, particularly on the part of some private social agencies on the west coast.

Holt said the resistance, which he said was based on racial prejudice, was based on the part of several prominent and never was mentioned in published adoption plans. An act of congress enabled Holt to adopt his eight Korean orphans, offspring of American GI fathers and Korean mothers. He personally handled the adoption details in Korean orphanages.

Returns to Agency  
Referring to opposition to adoptions of Asians, Holt said he "had to stick my neck out" but he referred to one private agency which he said was active in the foreign adoption field and which appeared to be placing roadblocks in the way of Americans who tried to adopt, any but European orphans. He declined to identify the agency name.

Other agencies, he said, had placed an age limit of 35 on parents seeking adoptive children overseas. Holt and his wife are in their early 50's and he said he personally knew of hundreds of other couples in that age group willing and anxious to provide homes for alien orphans.

Many Are Dying  
Holt pointed out that orphans in Korea were dying daily while many Americans stood ready to help if channels were open to them.

United States Federal agencies, Holt reported, were cooperating fully with Americans trying to adopt Koreans. He said that in his own case, unprecedented in the history of American philanthropy, the United States immigration service had cooperated 100 per cent in expediting admission of his eight young wards to this country.

### Farm Chief Admits Possibility of High Supports for "Top Quality Products"

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—Secretary of Agriculture Ezra C. Benson has said there is a possibility the administration will restore 90 per cent price supports on "top quality products" only.

Benson emphasized, in reply to a United Press questionnaire that he is not abandoning the administration's flexible support program which has been under heavy fire from Democrats.

But he said "we are exploring" a limited 90 per cent support plan "especially as it concerns next year's wheat crop." He does not regard this as a "compromise" with high support advocates.

"I think we must recognize and will recognize differentials for quality," he said, "therefore, I think that there may be some possibilities for 90 per cent parity supports on these top-quality products only."

The general idea of restoring 90 per cent supports for top-grade basic farm crops already has attracted backing from several leading farm belt senators, including chairman Allen J. Ellender, D., La., of the Senate agriculture committee.

Ellender described the proposal as a possible compromise between Benson's flexible program and the high price guarantees in effect under previous Democratic administrations.

Under the former program, originally drafted to spur wartime production of scarce food and fibers, the government supported six basic crops at 90 per cent of the so-called "fair" parity price. Under present law, supports may range from 75 to 80 per cent.

The "basics" are wheat, corn, cotton, peanuts, rice and tobacco. Tobacco still is supported at 90 per cent under a special law.

Benson was not commenting directly on Ellender's proposal. He said the secretary merely was dealing with the general idea of a price support differential based on quality.

In his reply to the questionnaire, Benson stoutly defended flexible supports as an over-all farm program.

"It does not mean we can get anywhere by raising prices above the levels where commodities will sell," he said. "... We must market what the public wants and at price levels that will clear the market."

In a letter to farm organization leaders on Nov. 21, Ellender asked for consideration of "the feasibility of, say, rigid price supports to encourage production of desirable and saleable basic commodities" and flexible supports on poorer grades.

What, mentioned specifically by Benson as a crop on which the plan might be tried, was selling at an average of 78 per cent of parity on Nov. 15, the date of the government's last official farm price survey. The support level is 82 1/2 per cent of parity.

### Soviet Palace Plan Get OK From Rulers

MOSEBOW, Dec. 8.—The Russian government was reported today to have approved the plan for the construction of the "palace of the Soviets," designed to become the world's tallest building before it was abandoned at the beginning of World War II.

The country's leading architects, sculptors and builders have long been meeting to discuss plans for a new building to replace the old one destroyed in the war.

The "palace" itself will be more than 100 stories high and its status will be taller than New York's Empire State building.

The foundation of the building was laid in 1927 and the steel framework had risen several floors by 1941.

When the Germans approached Moscow the steelwork was removed.

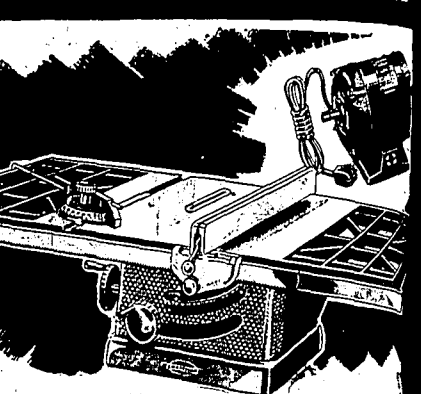

### Story of Torture Is Thought Hoax

CLEVELAND, Dec. 8 (AP)—Police said yesterday they think a 17-year-old boy burned himself at the stomach in a dramatic suicide attempt and then invented a fantastic story of kidnapping.

Earl R. Fryman, a parochial high school student who wants to be a priest, was near death in Fairview Park hospital with burns over 80 per cent of his body.

Screaming with pain from his burns, nude and loosely chained to an 11-foot branch, he appeared at the rear door of the hospital Tuesday night. He gasped out a story that he had been kidnaped by three strange youths who had stripped him, chained him to a tree, poured turpentine over his body and set it aflame.

"His story is fantastic," said Capt. David E. Kerr, head of the Police homicide bureau. "On the basis of information we now have I have no doubt that it is a hoax."

### Soldier Says U. S. Schools Fail Purpose

DENVER, Dec. 8 (AP)—Col. Thomas Crystal, head of the philosophy department at the air force academy, says "American schools do not educate for democracy."

Crystal said he was speaking for the air force when he declared in an address at Kent School for Oiling that he had been kidnaped by three "do not teach people what we are fighting and working for." Otherwise, he said, he was expressing his own opinions.

Recently a Yale professor in a magazine article criticized the courses of study at the new academy, charging these were little better than those for "an excellent high school."

"Why is most important—and it's what the country's schools have failed to teach."

Crystal stated what he said are three marks of a truly educated person: The ability to entertain oneself, to entertain others and to entertain a new idea.

### Russia Plane Might Grow, Display Cited

**LONDON, Dec. 8.**—Soviet Russia will soon have a "formidable bomber striking force" to challenge western superiority in the air, an authoritative aircraft survey said today.

The latest edition of "Jane's All the World's Aircraft" said a red air display in Moscow last July had done more than any previous one to shatter any remaining complacency in responsible circles in the West.

Jane's said the newest red warplanes were being produced in 300 factories from the Polish border to the Far East.

It mentioned especially the latest "type 27" four-jet heavy bomber believed capable of carrying an atom bomb and "type 30" medium twin-jet bomber.

The Russians briefly unveiled formations of these in July, Jane's said, as well as an "even more advanced" development of the MIG-17 fighter, successor to the MIG-9 used by the communists in Korea.

It estimated the MIG-17 maximum speed at 345 miles an hour.

"The capacity for production on the large scale of medium and heavy jet bombers may not yet be so great as for fighters," the annual said. "But... the type 29 has been shown off publicly in a formation of 54, and though the production figures probably reached nothing like those for the American Boeing B-29, it is felt in the West that Russia has very shortly passed a formidable bomber striking force."

"No that up-to-date designs are available, the production lines have been laid down, Russian air power may well depend for some years on these advanced aircraft which have lately been displayed," Jane's predicted.

At the same time, Jane's said the American aircraft industry "has probably reached its greatest production peak in peacetime."
