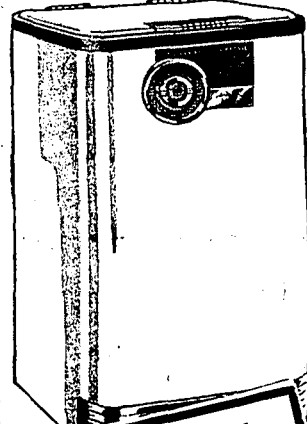

SAN QUENTIN, Calif., Dec. 9.—Convict-author Carl Chessman, back in San Quentin prison's "hot room" today, feels more confident of winning a new trial than now.

Chessman left death row for the first time in three and one-half years to appear at a new trial in San Francisco federal court. There he heard Louis E. Goodman set Jan. 9 for a hearing on his writ of habeas corpus.

On that date, attorney George T. Davis will demand a new trial on the ground that the transcript of Chessman's 1949 trial was faulty.

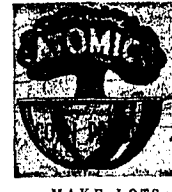

Benson Says Farmers Will Remain Calm

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9 (AP)—Secretary of Agriculture Benson said last night that he does not believe the farmers of America will be "easily stampeded" by unground theories and propaganda which "their votes can be purchased."

In an address to the Vegetable Canners Association, Benson said he prefers to believe that farmers would rather produce for market than for government. He said he believes that a planned and subsidized economy tends to weaken initiative, destroy character and demoralize the people.

Benson said he thinks farmers are entitled to reasonable help but that they want freedom and a minimum of government regulation and control. He said he would do all possible to see that such a program be provided and strengthened.

"We will give people a right to expect sound and constructive help from their department of agriculture and from their political leaders," Benson said.

"In that respect that there will be loyal bipartisan support in the interest of our farmers."

Benson said specific proposals to aid the farm situation will be laid before congress next month.

"We fully expect that there will be aid before congress next month."

"We will build soundly for the future in a manner that respects the freedom of action in the hands of the individual farmer. Or, we will go the other way—which is to encroach more and more upon the farmer's traditional control of his own business, and end only with a fully socialized agriculture."

Court Agrees In Ruling for Vehicle Laws

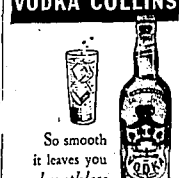
