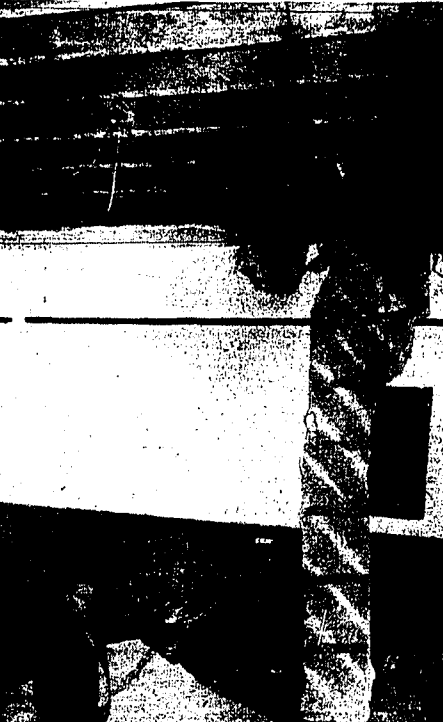

Clusters of  
Stars Hurtle  
Across Sky

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (A)—Great  
clusters of stars, similar to our  
Milky Way, are hurtling through  
space—but away from the earth—  
at speeds up to at least 37,000 miles  
a second.  
The Carnegie Institution of Wash-  
ington reported Friday this new  
detail on the velocities involved in  
the "expanding universe."  
"The institution's annual report  
described findings made at Mt. Wil-  
son and Palomar observatories,  
which are operated by Carnegie and  
the California Institute of Tech-  
nology.

With the aid of the giant 200-inch  
telescope at Palomar and also a 100-  
inch telescope, the report said, "re-  
cession velocities" of a total of 620  
galaxies have now been measured.  
These include velocities up to ap-  
proximately one-fifth the speed of  
light, which is some 186,000 miles a  
second.  
Among other highlights of the  
report:  
Studies of rock magnetism sug-  
gest the possibility that the cre-  
taceous axis of the earth, two hun-  
dred million years ago, was about  
45 degrees away from its present  
position.  
"On the basis of this planet,"  
says the report, "it can be said that  
about 200 million years ago the  
equator crossed lower California,  
Wash. Terr., Massachusetts, Gibral-  
tar, Kenya and Tasmania."

### Treasure Trove of Antiquities Being Uncovered by Italian Archaeologists

PAESTUM, Italy, Dec. 10 (AP)—A treasure trove of antiquities, possibly spanning 100 centuries, is being uncovered here by Italian archaeologists.

On a grassy meadow a mile from the Gulf of Salerno, a panorama of history is unfolding that ranges from Roman times back to the Greek culture of 2,500 years ago and perhaps as far as prehistoric times. Flint weapons, believed to have been brought into Europe 100,000 years ago by invaders from the East, have been found in a necropolis—an ancient cemetery uncovered by an American builder's crew building an airfield during World War II.

Excavators have been at work off and on since then. Prof. P. Claudio Bealzi, 40-year-old superintendent of Salerno and Potenza, tells about the most important recent finds.

"It was a temple buried in the ground, 10 feet partly hewn into rock at ground level. The temple was dedicated to Hera, the Greek goddess of marriage and fertility.

"The zee-shaped roof was covered with tiles, and it had no openings. We went through the roof to have a look inside and found eight beautiful vases containing honey, which was in a perfect state of preservation."

The bodies, says Prof. Bealzi, were buried in "a curled-up position," in some 200 tombs, with flint daggers and arrows.

Three majestic Greek temples, patterned after the beautiful Parthenon on Athens' Acropolis, rise from the meadow against a background of snow-capped mountains.

Two of the three temples, plus 11 minor pieces of worship, were dedicated to Hera. The third, the so-called Temple of Ceres, first named after the Roman goddess of agriculture, has been uncovered by digging to be dedicated to Athena, the Greek goddess of intellect and beauty.

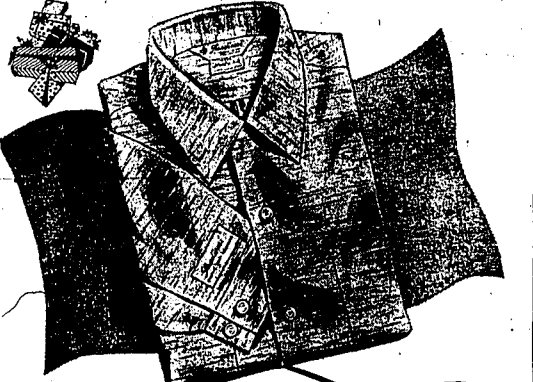

### Don't Get Trimmed With Tree

Do all Christmas trees look alike to you? Here are some tips on buying them from Henry Free, nationally-noted horticultural expert of Cleveland, O. "Beware when you see the needles turning brown," he says. It indicates the tree is not fresh and probably will start dropping its needles a few minutes after it is placed in a warm room. Don't buy it. Also pass up any tree, regardless of species, that doesn't have a full-on and symmetrical shape, good green foliage and branches pliable, but strong enough to hold lights and decorations. To keep a tree fresh in the home, saw off the butt end at least one inch above the original cut and stand the tree in a container of water as soon as possible. Since the tree absorbs the water, container should be refilled daily.

BOISE, Dec. 10 — Warden E. K. Clapp of the Idaho State penitentiary has said that prison is not the best place to handle the problem of sex deviates, and if he is put in a cell with the homosexual offender, he will beat him or do everything possible to get rid of him as a cell mate.

The warden said that in this way segregation aside from the possible contact with the fresh, youthful first offender, is taken care of. At night, since the construction of a new cell block at the prison, it is possible to keep the sex offenders by themselves in separate cells.

He said possibly "hard, sweat-producing work" is an answer to treatment of the sex offender. Most of those who are in the institution are individuals, and exhausting labor might control them.

In any event, said the warden, confinement in prison will not cure the abnormal offender. But, he said, neither will psychiatric treatment, and "don't kid yourself that it will." He said that psychiatric treatment is doubtful, and that the only way who has been corrupted by a fellow prisoner "if the boy is caught soon enough."

The arrests have involved such people as an attorney, a former bank vice president, a hospital orderly, two high school employees, and a calculating machine company official.

The warden has received two of these recently arrested persons, one for a term of life, and another for 15 years. Other commitments will occur next week. There are three men who have pleaded guilty awaiting disposition of their cases in Ada county district court.

The warden noted that two of the arrested men were brothers, and had served a previous term for the same offense. One of these men has been returned to the penitentiary; the other will be sentenced by Judge M. Oliver Koolack.

Clapp said prison wouldn't do these men any good, but there appeared to him to be no other course of treatment that would, either. The only way to separate them, he said, would be to build a separate institution.

The warden said that 50 out of the 500 prisoners in the penitentiary are abnormal sex offenders. He said there is no problem of screening them from the so-called hardened, or experienced, ordinary criminal.

"They are shunned in prison worse than they are on the outside," he said. "Society will have nothing to do with them."

### Agency Buys Canned Pork

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 — The agriculture department has purchased 8,000,000 pounds of canned pork products under its \$5 million dollar program to bolster live hog prices.

This was the largest purchase since the program went into effect Oct. 24. Since then the price of good butcher hogs on the Chicago market has slumped from \$12.90 to a low of \$10.40 reported Wednesday.

The purchase consisted of 1,732,000 pounds of canned lunch meat, 2,877,500 pounds of canned pork and gravy, and 3,390,500 pounds of canned ham.

The price range for the lunch meat was 41.77 to 41.80 cents a pound; for pork and gravy, 63.82 to 64.50 cents a pound; and for canned ham, 84.70 to 85.35 cents a pound. The new purchases brought the total bought to date under the program to 25,100,000 pounds of pork products, including 14,575,000 pounds of lard.

### Lincoln FHA Farmer Loans Record Given

SHOSHONE, Dec. 10.—In the last fiscal year, the Shoshone farmers home administration office has loaned 85 farmers \$122,010 to purchase livestock, machinery and for farm operating expenses, according to Oakley Barnard, supervisor for Cassia, Blaine, Gooding and Lincoln counties.

Also loaned through the local office was \$57,885 to five persons to purchase farms; \$37,370 of the amount being borrowed from other loaning agencies and insured by the government. One loan was made in the Teton area in the amount of \$8,275 for water development, specifically for a well and sprinkler system.

The local office collected \$223,621.18 within the fiscal year, Barnard reports.

**Aid to Irrigation**  
On a national basis, a recent report shows 78 per cent of the funds borrowed were used for irrigation, including the purchase of pumps and motors, drilling wells and construction and repair of irrigation ditches and laterals. Irrigation systems were developed and improved for about 280,000 acres.

The remainder of the funds was used for soil conservation measures such as terracing and pasture improvement, developing water projects, household use and farm livestock and for drainage.

**Upsetting Expected**  
Barnard and officials of his department expect during the coming months farmers will use a large portion of the funds they borrow to finance soil conservation measures. A number of meetings have been held in cooperation with other agriculture agencies to make certain that all farmers know that funds are available for soil conservation.

Private lenders provide most of the funds from which loans are made. The farmers home administration has and secured the loans and insured the repayment of the funds advanced. The loans also are made from funds appropriated by congress.

Farmers pay 4 1/2 per cent in interest or in interest and insurance charges. The loans are scheduled for repayment within the shortest period of time consistent with the ability of the borrower to repay. The maximum repayment period of the loans to individuals is 20 years.

To be eligible for a soil and water conservation loan, a farmer must have reasonable prospects of conducting successful farming operations. He must also be able to obtain the necessary credit on reasonable terms from private and cooperative sources.

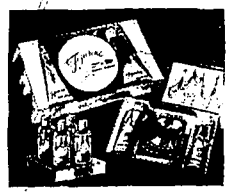

### China Envoy Stands Firm Against Reds

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Dec. 10—A shrill, slow-talking Chinese Embassy spokesman stood firm all week against the Communists' even though he knew it might cost him friends and popularity in the Nationalist China's big-power seat in the United Nations.

Ambassador Tingfu F. Tsiang, 68, stirred up a diplomatic storm because he opposed the admission of Outer Mongolia and their impromptu scheme endorsed by 53 of the 60 U. N. members to admit 13 new members to the international organization.

Tsiang knew the temper of the delegates was running against him. But he told friends that the delegates really should be angry at the Russians for their threat to veto 13 western candidates if he vetoed Outer Mongolia in the security council.

For eight years Tsiang has sat in the U. N. and watched a steady state after assault on his position here. He has seen the communist march forward through his homeland. He has heard and shrugged off scolding red comments here that he represents "robber-baronism."

He remained unmoved and firm on the membership issue although many delegates who have voted to keep him here pleaded for him to admit Outer Mongolia so countries like Spain, Italy and Japan could enter the U. N.

Tsiang's associates said he could not stand aside on Outer Mongolia and retain face—an all important element to a Chinese—with the millions of Chinese who look to the Peking government as their champion against the Chinese Reds.

### Law Revision Eyed as Auto Probe Ending

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (AP)—Senator O'Mahoney, D. Wyo., said today congress may be asked to revise federal laws as a result of the General Motors investigation.

The chairman of a senate anti-trust and monopoly subcommittee declined to say what law changes he thinks are needed; however, he is committing to a new man on the first phase of the committee's study of the world's largest corporation.

Shortly before the month-long hearings came to a temporary halt 11 a. m. night, Committee Counsel James W. Burns suggested by questions that GM has grown so big and powerful it might need dismembering.

"Why is it necessary for General Motors to be as large as it is?" Burns asked.

"It is necessary," replied GM President Harold St. Clair, because any of the corporation's divisions cut off alone would face a "staggering task" of developing its own help now centrally provided.

He referred to engineering, technical, styling and many other aids.

Fredrick J. Bell, president of the National Automobile Dealer association, entered a final plea for the car dealers as the hearings drew to a close. The association claims to speak of 30,000 retail car dealers including 12,000 GM franchise holders.

Bell said GM officials still refuse to sit down with their dealers in a group to revise their sales agreements. "It was terrible," he said, that dealers had to bring their troubles to congress. Several have told the committee GM used threats and coercion to promote bigger sales, which GM has denied.

TOKYO, Dec. 10 (AP)—The former allied powers today granted Japan permission to free three more major World War II criminals from Tokyo's Sugamo prison, the foreign office announced.

The releases, to be completed by Dec. 15, will have no effect on the major war criminal still serving a sentence there.

Many top ranking Japanese military and political figures were convicted after the war by the international military tribunal of the Far East.

The three to be freed are Naoki Hoshino, 63, chief secretary of the Tojo cabinet; the former Marquis Koichi Kido, 66, wartime lord keeper of the privy seal, and Hiroshi Oshima, 60, wartime ambassador to Nazi Germany. They had been imprisoned for life.

Only former Lieut.-Gen. Kenryo Sato, director of the military affairs bureau of the war ministry, remains. His release is expected next spring.

### Five Men Get Cash and Gold Medal Honors

STOCKHOLM, Sweden, Dec. 10 (AP)—Three Americans, a Swede and an Icelandic writer tonight received four of the world's loftiest academic prizes—the 1950 Nobel awards.

King Gustaf V handed the prizes during a ceremony in Concert hall. The prizes totaled \$150,000, 10 pounds of pure gold in medals and diplomas.

Each of the prizes was worth \$38,750. At another ceremony, in Oslo, the 1954 Nobel Peace Prize—a check for \$25,000, medal and diploma—was presented to Dr. C. J. van Heuven Goedhart, chief of the U. N. health commission for refugees.

**Others Named**  
Dr. Vincent du Vigneaud, 54, a tall biochemist from Cornell University, who won the chemistry award for his work on two hormones that help in childbirth and regulate such vital organs as the kidneys.

**Seeds a Reclinal**  
Dr. A. Hugo Thibault, 52, a tall, blond biologist from the University of California, who won the physiology prize. Lamb teaches at Columbia university and Kusch at Columbia university. The prize committee said the two had contributed to the world's knowledge of what goes on inside the brain. Their findings enabled scientists to calculate correctly some of the atom's component parts.

The Tennessee senator said supporters of Adlai Stevenson had asked him, Kefauver, not to enter California's presidential primaries next June.

### Demos Argue On Issues of China in U.N.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (AP)—Rep. Michael A. Frighan, D. O., said Rep. James Roosevelt, D. Calif., spoke "only for himself" when he allegedly said Red China eventually should be admitted to the United Nations.

Frighan said in a statement yesterday that "Roosevelt does not speak for the Democratic party, but only for himself."

Roosevelt, son of the late President Roosevelt, is now in California. An aide told a reporter the congressman has said a number of times in the past that Red China should be admitted to the United Nations "if and when it meets the membership qualifications."

Frighan said he wanted to make clear his own "unwavering opposition to the admission of Red China to the United Nations under any circumstances."

Frighan based his criticism on newspaper reports that Roosevelt, in a speech at Cleveland last Wednesday, "stated that the ultimate recognition of Red China by the United States is a factor in world peace and that he considered it unrealistic for the United States to refuse to recognize Red China."

"The kind of grace Congressman Roosevelt advocated by admission of Red China into the U. N.," Frighan said, "is no grace at all because it would violate every rule of justice and decency and do nothing more than hasten the day of all-out World War III."

# Federated Sportsmen Laud Leonard With Resolution Praising His "Fine Work"

Delegates to fourth district convention of the Idaho Federated Sportsmen passed a resolution Saturday commending Ross Leonard, director of the state fish and game department, for his "fine work" during the past year. The resolution also praised the work of department personnel for the excellence of their duties in the field and for their cooperation with sportsmen.

Last week the Jerome Rod and Gun club passed a resolution urging Leonard to resign, charging that changes have been made, resulting in a rift between the department management and the sportsmen of the state.

It was thought that the Federated Sportsmen, at their district convention in Twin Falls Saturday, might be asked to adopt a similar resolution, but Leonard was met with a confidence without a dissenting ballot.

Nearly 100 persons, representing the Cassia, Gooding, Jerome, Ketchikan, Blaine, Shoshone and Butte Idaho sportsmen clubs attended the sessions at Legion hall.

The morning session was devoted to routine reports and brief talks by fish and game department officials. George Rooster, Shoshone district president, was chairman of both the morning and afternoon sessions.

Among the speakers at the morning session were Art Johnson, Boise, member of the state fish and game commission from the third district and Ray J. Holmer, Twin Falls, fourth district commissioner. Department director Leonard also spoke to the group. Fish and game department personnel, and officials from the U. S. Forest service and Bureau of Land management were introduced.

A chief topic at the morning session was the proposed change in the Castle deer herd. It was generally agreed that more deer must be harvested, but several sportsmen objected to the increase in permits issued to the job.

A. P. Nelson, chairman of the Twin Falls city commission, welcomed the group at the afternoon session.

Committees met during the afternoon before the delegates went back to their general session to act on reports and resolutions.

Among the resolutions adopted was one asking that the state game commission consider ineligibility in requirements for resident hunting and fishing licenses. It was also passed that persons coming to the state to make their homes must pay taxes and license fees during the time they are here, but are exempt from the recreational benefits of resident residence requirement.

The delegates also asked that the name of the Carey ridge game management area be changed to the R. E. Adamson management area, in honor of the late R. E. Adamson who was once a game reservation circles for many years.

Another resolution, which was adopted, was to have all hunting permits designated uniformly, with hunts open to different bearing numbers and hunts open to archery bearing letters.

A resolution by the fish commission, asking that the fish caught on the Big Wood river be opened only after June 15 to protect spawning beds also was adopted.

Resolutions by the bird commission on magpie control came under discussion, but the group approved a resolution asking that conservation officers be placed on magpie eradication work from Jan. 1 to Jan. 15.

A resolution calling for a state-wide bounty on magpies was defeated, but another resolution, asking the department to build magpie traps in cooperation with sportsmen and farmers was approved.

In other action, the delegates approved a resolution urging that the watershed game be made "as late and as long" as possible.

Before concluding the convention, new officers and directors were elected. Don G. Strickland, Boise, was elected to succeed Rooster as president and Garnett Kild, Burley, was chosen as vice president.

The officer of secretary-treasurer is appointed. The post was held for the past year by Jack Rembold, above.

Directors in the past have served one-year terms, but change in by-laws has approved making the term three years in length, with two directors being chosen from each year.

In order to implement the staggered terms provisions, two directors were named for one year; two were named to fill three-year terms.

George Rooster and A. P. Pinckney, Hazelton, were named to the one-year directorships. Adrain Burley, Cassia, and A. P. Pinckney, Ketchikan, were elected for two-year terms, and Paul Thomas, Twin Falls, and Paul Anderson, Blaine, were chosen for three-year terms.

The Southern Idaho Fish and Game club was dissolved. George Scholer serving as general chairman.

Robinson's manager, George Gelfand, scarcely stopped talking—in the telephone, to writers, to Robinson and to anybody who would listen.

"No, it was the left hook, not the right uppercut," George would say. "What do you mean Moe (Arlberg) outscored Olson? Ray did that when he knocked out Olson the first time."

The confusion, Gelfand's remarks included, extended to Robinson's future plans. Sugar Ray and Gelfand both agreed Robinson's next step in all was up to Olson, who had a 90-day rematch clause in his contract.

"I'll meet my obligation to Olson," was all Robinson said about the man he now has defeated three times.

The zoo keeper found the pipes that drain the pool were clogged with money.

Cecil is the only camel in the Crandon Park zoo and he gets mighty lonesome. He paws the ground, bites his knees, pears up and down and, in general exhibits all the characteristics, zoo officials say, of a camel that wants a wife.

But the zoo couldn't afford to buy another camel. The Miami Herald started an unofficial drive to collect funds. It designed Junior the official treasurer.

Visitors pitch coins into the alligator's pool—so many that they filled up the drain pipe and chased Junior out of his bed. The zoo keeper found \$32.47 when he cleaned out the pipe.

And that brought the grand total of the doozy to \$1,238.19, raising Cecil's hopes he may get a wife for Christmas present. It is estimated a female camel will cost from \$1,500 to \$2,000.

### AEC Reports Reactor Plan

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (Special)—The atomic energy commission is "looking for a contractor" to build a new 15 million dollar research reactor in Idaho.

The machine is technically called the "experimental breeder reactor No. 2." It's predecessor, "breeder No. 1," has been operating in Idaho Falls for the past couple of years. The new machine will be located at the station.

An AEC spokesman says that the agency is "very hopeful" of learning important new lessons from the machines on how to "economize" in the burning nuclear fuel.

"We had hoped to complete the new breeder in 1954," he said, "but it looks now as though it will not be operating until 1957."

Congress earlier this year provided funds for the new machine.

### Election Is Slated For Soil District

SHOESHONE, Dec. 10.—The annual supervisors' election for Wood River soil conservation district will be held from 1 to 5 p. m. Monday at the soil conservation office. All holders of the district are eligible to vote.

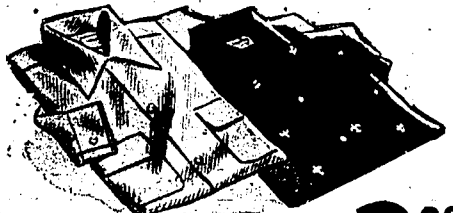

### Auto Buyers On Hunt for Top Bargain

DETROIT, Dec. 10 (AP)—The nation's new car buyers continue to seek bargain prices.

This is one of the things disclosed in the most recent car market survey. The surveys indicate a somewhat improved demand during the latter part of November, compared with the first 10 days of that month. The earlier part of the month was marked with the 1956 model introductory period for many makes.

The start was somewhat slow for many of them. Some industry analysts blame this on the fact dealers, in the process of cleaning up their stocks of 1955 models, had to sell them at a discount.

Now that outgoing models have been thoroughly eliminated from the stocks of most new car retailers, the promotion of 1956 cars is being stepped up. Most experts are surveying the larger marketing areas and say this promotion will be reflected in increased new model sales between now and the year-end. They disagree with the view that Christmas buying generally will cut into the new car market volume.

A scorching production pace is building up dealer stocks again. Retail sales, despite an indicated upturn, are not heavy enough to match the output volume.

This undoubtedly means another round of price discounting at the dealer level. Some retailers report new car prospects have become so accustomed to price discounting that they will not buy again unless they can be shown they are getting the car for something less than the factory suggested price.

**Tuberculosis Is Not Dead, Experts Note**

NEW YORK, Dec. 10 (AP)—Tuberculosis is not dead, according to the "false assumption" of health leaders on the way out.

In a rare-edges as Miller has been blinding thanks to new drugs and surgery. The death rate from tuberculosis is way down.

But TB still is causing nearly as much new sickness each year as ever—with 100,000 new cases expected in 1957. There still are reports of family tragedies and disruption of homes.

The death rate from TB in the United States has been cut 37 percent in the last five years, reports the National Tuberculosis Association. But it is still killing 17,000 Americans annually, and still ranks as the first cause of death among infectious diseases.

Last year, 100,000 persons fell victim to tuberculosis, with 10,000 being new cases. The rest were inactivated cases not reported before. The same amount of new sickness is expected this year, said the N.T.A.

The declining death rate is one reason for the public impression that TB is no longer serious, said Dr. Robert E. Fliedner, head of the New York state health department's division of tuberculosis control.

Leaders in the class of some sanatoriums also created optimistic impressions.

The national organization estimates that 1,200,000 Americans now have TB, including 400,000 active and 800,000 with inactive TB. Of active cases, about 350,000 are cases not yet reported to public health authorities. Many of these are persons who are not yet aware that they are sick.

**Group Urging Full Check of Timber Lands**

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 10 (AP)—A U. S. forest service inventory of timber in Oregon and Washington should be carried forward as rapidly as possible, the Western Forestry and Conservation Association urged today in a resolution at an annual meeting here.

The resolution pointed out that information on acreage, volume, growth, use and loss of the nation's timber was needed for orderly planning and best use and management of forest resources. The association also urged a detailed inventory of timber during the next three-year period, which was recommended earlier by Assistant Agriculture Secretary Edwin L. Peterson.

The group, in other resolutions, urged full allowable cut of timber be made on forest service and O and C lands, development of access roads, siting of adequate personnel to administer timber sales and the orderly stocking of cutover and burned-over areas.

The association reaffirmed its position that state water rights should remain supreme over federal rights.

**Crackdown Set on Juvenile Smoking**

PROVO, Dec. 10 (AP)—Police Chief Mel M. Snow said his officers have begun an intensive drive to pick up all juveniles found smoking in public places.

A city ordinance bans smoking by juveniles in such places.

"We've had a lot of complaints recently," said Snow. "And we have decided to bring them in, refer them to the juvenile authorities, and if cafe owners who have cigarette vending machines don't keep them back of the counter, out of a customer's reach, we will take action there, too."

### Navahos Plan Fund to Lure New Industry

**WINDY ROCK, Ariz., Dec. 10 (AP)**—The Navahos Indians are hoping to attract industry to their reservation in four states and have voted a \$300,000 appropriation to finance the campaign.

The tribal council approved the plan to spend on construction of industrial sites, training of workers and publicizing the development.

Tribal chairman Paul Jones said the industrial development program would provide the Navahos with "something lasting in contrast to a handout which lasts a few days."

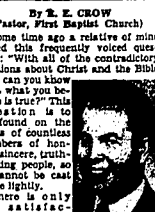
The industrial program first had been touched several months ago at an earlier tribal meeting. Since that time Jones and other Navaho leaders have discussed the suggestion with businessmen and others in Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and Utah.

The council named an 18-member advisory committee to approve or disapprove any suggested methods Jones might have for spending the funds.

The council resolution specified the funds could be used to help either government or private industry in such industrial operations in any part of the huge reservation lying in parts of the four states provided that "industry employ a sizeable number of Navahos."

A spokesman said the traditional sheepherding existence of the Navahos is longer in equate. He said the council was seeking a "new economic basis" for the tribe.

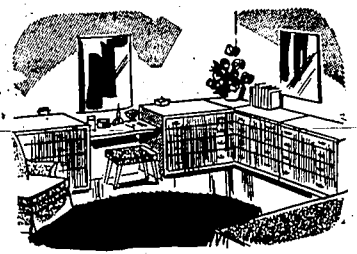

**Prelate Seeks Surplus Food For Yule Gift**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (AP)—A leading Catholic prelate appealed to the government to make a Christmas gift of surplus grain to hungry people in other lands.

"Our country should manifest especially at this holy season of the year its traditional spirit of charity, learned from our savior, toward all those who hunger," said Archbishop Patrick A. O'Boyle of Washington.

The archbishop's statement was the latest in a series of urgent pleas from church leaders for release of some of the government's vast hoard of surplus wheat, rice and corn to be distributed to needy families overseas by voluntary relief agencies.

Public Law 480, passed by congress last year, gives Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson broad discretionary authority to release all types of farm surpluses to relief agencies for free shipment abroad.

So far, however, the agriculture department has made available to relief agencies only products which were in danger of spoiling in storage, mainly dairy products and cottonseed oil.

A delegation of religious leaders, representing Catholic, Protestant and Jewish relief agencies, asked Benson at a meeting here Nov. 18 to release about 200,000 tons of wheat, 100,000 tons of corn products and 80,000 tons of rice to fight the threat of "acute starvation" in many countries.

### Population in Rupert to Get Increase Soon

RUPERT, Dec. 10.—W. A. Boles, office manager for the Midwestern Constructors, Tulsa, Okla., reports temporary housing will be provided in Rupert for approximately 100 families. The firm has the contract for 90 miles of national gas pipelines from Lava Hot Springs to east of Burley.
