**TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG POT SHOTS**

WASHINGTON—The prosperity forecast for 1954 by labor-management circles, despite suppressed and uncorroborated news reports from the newly organized AFL-CIO union. The boxes in the shop and in the front office are closer together than ever they have been.

George L. Meany, president of the union, is not radical enough to get his organization off on the wrong foot by sponsoring a war of attrition. Any war between wages, employment and working conditions is his business.

Nor does he mean to disparage the business which he represents, although he was glib in making such a suggestion. He knows that to lose would be hopelessly avoided, and lose the good will of both Democrats and Republicans.

MEANY'S DOCTRINE—Meany has proclaimed his admiration of the profit system, his recognition of the merit of the business system and his dislike of the Roosevelt-Truman type of federal interference, and his detestation of communism.

Moreover, Meany never went out on strike in his 15 years as a plumber. As a union organizer, he is known as a man who has been successful in a factory. He has achieved success and climbed to his present position through cooperation and negotiation.

The nation's great industries, which set the pattern in this field—steel, automobile, coal, railroad, rubber, etc.—are not in a position to give up their profits. They rack up their most profitable year in 1953, and they would appreciate more of the same in 1954. They are not in a position to give up their profits on cost of living increases. The modified guaranteed wage movement is spreading. In past years, industry has had a hard time adjusting to the needs of the worker's needs and security. They have found it to be good business.

Sept. 30, 1957, Deadline Date Is Set  
To Launch First of Earth's Satellites

### Solon Thinks Demos' High Plan Doomed

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 (AP)—Rep. Harold D. Cooley, D. N. C., concedes that Democratic efforts to restore rigid high farm price supports next year will fail. But he says the move might bring a "clear-cut" farm bill for next year's elections. Cooley, chairman of the house agriculture committee, predicted today that the senate will approve a house-passed bill to junk the administration's flexible support program in favor of high rigid price props.

### Adlai's Stand Is Laundered by Solon

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 (AP)—Sen. A. S. (Mike) Monroney, D., Okla., said today that Adlai E. Stevenson stands for "moderation" won him support in 46 states even if it hurt him among Democrats in the other two. Monroney, who is backing Stevenson for the Democratic presidential nomination, described the former Illinois governor's call for a moderate Democratic program in 1952 as "a master stroke." He said criticism of the "moderation" plea by Govs. Averell Harriman of New York and G. Mennen Williams of Michigan did not damage Stevenson's standing. "I feel sure that the other 46 states would certainly prefer the Stevenson position rather than to select a candidate standing as an immoderate," Monroney said in an interview.

Veto Almost Certain However, he said President Eisenhower is almost certain to veto it and congress would fail to override. Cooley said the final version of the farm bill sent to the White House would include any new farm program recommended by Mr. Eisenhower and Agriculture Secretary Ezra T. Benson which congress might consider "needed and worthwhile." Changes Eyed "If this bill is vetoed, Cooley said, congress would then pass a bill stripped of the controversial price support provisions to which the President objects. Republican house whip Leslie C. Arens III agreed with Cooley that Mr. Eisenhower would veto a rigid support bill if it reached the White House. But he disputed Cooley's forecast that the measure would win senate approval.

### Profit Is Shown By Big Crusade

GLASGOW, Scotland, Dec. 19 (AP)—Billy Graham's all Scotland crusade last year yielded a total of \$29,749,439 in collections and hymnbook sales, the organizers said today. Church officials who staged the North Carolina evangelist's six-week stand here said they donated \$53,000 to the Graham organization for expenses. The total surplus after all expenses was \$74,821.50, the organizers said.

### Art Collection Is Touring Country

NEW YORK, Dec. 19 (AP)—Walter P. Chrysler, Jr., one of America's most voracious art collectors, sent the cream of his collection on the road today and still has 2,000 masterpieces left for home enjoyment. Chrysler is lending 100 paintings, valued at five million dollars, to eight American museums for successive showings. "We are certainly circulating them around the country so as to benefit as many people as possible," Chrysler said. "The rest is in our New York house and some at our Virginia estate, but many of them are in warehouses."
