Store Operators Warned on Candy

Dr. Cecil Reinstein, medical director, southern district health department, warned many store owners displaying Christmas candies are in direct violation of state laws.

Reinstein noted many grocery stores, particularly supermarkets, are displaying candies in the open where they are subject to contamination by air or dust borne bacteria.

The state law demands these displays be protected by cellophane coverings or in glass display cases, he said.

Pointing out it is not the desire of the health department to inconvenience grocery store operators, Reinstein said consumers should realize the health hazards involved in the possible gross contamination of such foodstuffs.

U. S. to Seek Boost in Aid Fund in '56

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26.—The administration plans to continue foreign aid spending next year at about the four billion dollar level now expected this year, while asking for about five billion dollars in additional funds.

This was learned from an authoritative source yesterday as administration officials sought to unscramble what they termed a mix-up over their spending and appropriations plans for foreign aid for the 1957 fiscal year which begins next July.

It was explained that the proposed increase in requests to Congress for more spending authority while spending plans remain unchanged — results from a decision that the backlog of foreign aid appropriations should be built up in cold war pressures for some time.

The decision appeared also to point toward a possible increase in the amount of foreign aid to be made available in the next year in the event the Russian leaders have again turned truculent.

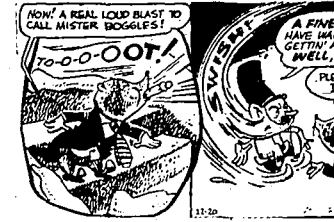

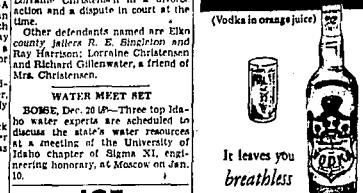

Crops Report By U. S. Tops Early Figure

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20 (AP)—The agriculture department today issued a final report for the year, yesterday estimated this year's corn crop at 3,184,820,000 bushels and the wheat crop at 2,238,150,000 bushels.

The corn estimate is 1,990,000 bushels more than the department's November forecast of 3,182,870,000 bushels and compares with the government's production goal of 3,000,000 bushels.

A revised crop estimate put last year's corn crop at 3,044,284,000 bushels and the 10-year average at 3,080,115,000 bushels.

The wheat estimate is 22,631,000 bushels more than last month's forecast of 2,215,220,000 bushels and compares with the government's goal of about 2,100,000,000 bushels.

A revised estimate put last year's wheat crop at 2,244,000,000 bushels and the 10-year average at 2,154,013,000 bushels.

The latest estimate included 705,312,000 bushels of winter wheat compared with 804,240,000 last year and 810,000,000 for the 10-year average.

And 232,784,000 bushels of spring wheat compared with 180,407,000 last year and 255,553,000 for the 10-year average.

The production of other crops this year compares with last month's estimate, last year's revised estimate and the 10-year average, respectively, included:

Oats 1,575,730,000 bushels for final report; 1,556,020,000 last month; 1,497,045,000 last year and 1,527,370,000 for the 10-year average.
