A speeding 1950 Chevrolet crashed into railroad tracks at the end of Fourth street south after leaving the road around 12:40 a. m. Thursday, seriously injuring the driver and a woman passenger.

Patricia Ann McCall, 31, Rupert, received a broken right ankle and deep lacerations about the forehead and face when she was thrown into the windshield. The driver, Lewis G. Doane, 20-year-old Rupert sailor, sustained a broken nose, cuts and bruises. He was thrown onto the steering wheel bending it out of position.

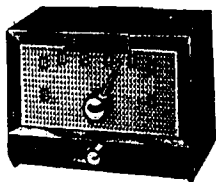

DRAMATICS IN U. N. Sedom in its short life has the United Nations experienced so dramatic a change as occurred when, by a single stroke, the general assembly admitted 16 new members to raise its family total to 76.

Not since 1950 had the U. N. opened its doors to any new member. Admission of many countries was long overdue. Only the characteristic stubbornness of the Soviet Union had barred their way.

Ineed, a little more than 24 hours before the 16 newcomers were accepted, Russia had slammed the door 13 times against proposed entry of four others already tentatively approved.

Russia's action was in retaliation for Nationalist China's veto of membership for Outer Mongolia, a Soviet puppet state carved out on the northern fringe of mainland China.

In the sense that the U. N. is now a more complete world organization, the addition of 16 members represents an advance. It does not, however, modify U. N. weaknesses inherent in its charter, nor alter the fact of big power control.

Excluded were two countries contained in the original package deal—Japan and Outer Mongolia. In the end, the Russians made it an eye for an eye, instead of 13 eyes for one.

It is most regrettable that Japan, a nation of paramount importance in Asia and the Pacific, should have been the principal victim of East-West strategic maneuvering within the U. N.

Japan's friends in the West can only hope that it will be properly admitted in due time. The foreign affairs experts may argue for a good while over how much blame will finally attach to Chiang Kai-shek for the veto that dumped the original 16-nation package.

There is also more than a little feeling that for all its high-handedness the Soviet Union in the end came off better than the United States. Some observers say that Japan took a clear initiative, that we shifted our ground frequently, that our very great influence was never wisely brought to bear.

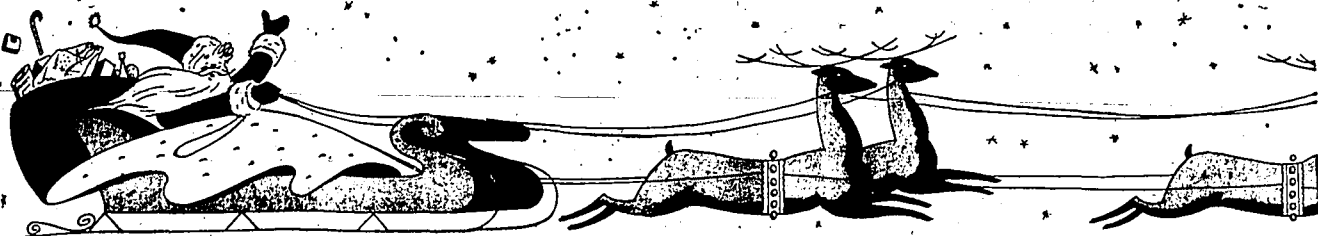

He was too busy ordering the mint in Philadelphia to goose up production to a combined 8,000,000 pennies a day.

The men were charged with contempt for refusing to answer questions of congressional committees about their Communist connections. There was no connection between the two indictments.

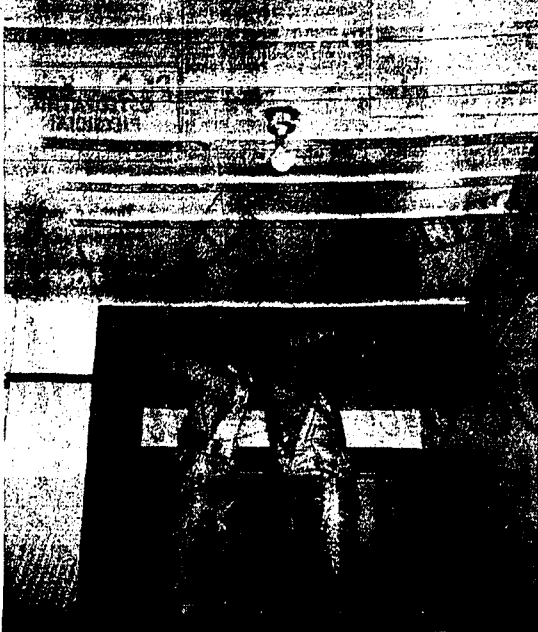

Ledner is proud of the room he designed for the Kessler hotel in Rochester, Minn. It's called the "Hemisphere room," and caters to persons from throughout the western hemisphere who come to the Mayo clinic.

No Murals Asked
The specifications called for no painted murals, so Ledner told the history of the hemisphere in six wire murals and 48 illuminated portraits.

"It's the world's most educational cocktail lounge," he said.

"But seriously, when the place was opened to the public, the first patrons stood and applauded."

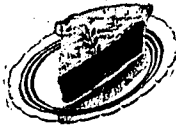

United Fruit's Settlement Is Eyed by U. S.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22 (AP)—The Justice department is considering settling out of court its monopoly and price-fixing suit against United Fruit company, informed sources said today.

United Fruit is one of the largest U. S. corporations operating abroad. It has extensive holdings in Central America and produces 85 per cent of the world's supply of bananas.

The Justice department accused the firm in a suit filed July 2, 1954 of monopolizing and restraining interstate and foreign trade in the sale and distribution of bananas.

Decree Hinted

But authoritative sources disclosed today that Asst. Atty. Gen. Stanley M. Barris, the government's antitrust chief, has been negotiating with United Fruit attorneys over a proposed consent decree.

Under such a decree a defendant agrees out of court to stop certain practices but admits no guilt. There was no elaboration as to what practices United Fruit proposes to change or what the consent decree contemplated out-of-court deal involves a company promise to sell a small part of its holdings.

Disposals Asked

Originally the government had asked that United Fruit be made to dispose of certain property, facilities and affiliates in such a way as to reduce its alleged control of the banana-growing industry and permit more competition.

Throughout the consent decree negotiations it was understood, the Justice department has kept in close contact with the state department and the national security council. It has done so in the belief that the outcome of the United Fruit case would have "cool international impact."

Employers 80,000

United Fruit employs some 80,000 persons in Central America. It operates about 1,500 miles of railway in Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Guatemala, Honduras, the Dominican Republic, Jamaica and Panama.

It was pointed out that the company has incurred some hostility in past years in some Latin American newspapers. But much of this, it was said, was inspired by Communist workers who attacked the company as an example of American capitalism.

Oregon Clash Is Nearing for 2 Top Demos

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22 (AP)—Sen. Wayne Morse, D. Ore., presumes today that Oregon's presidential primary will provide a test of strength between Adlai Stevenson and Sen. Estes Kefauver in their contest for the Democratic presidential nomination.

Neither Stevenson nor the Tennessee senator have announced plans to enter the May 18 primary in Oregon. But, under the state's primary law their names could be entered easily without their permission. Morse said he understood both would be entered.

So far, Stevenson and Kefauver are scheduled to clash only in the California primary June 5. Kefauver also was understood to be considering entering the Florida primary May 25 which Stevenson already has announced he will enter.

But the placing of their names on the Oregon ballot might make that state the scene of their first clash.

Morse said he understood both men would be entered in the Oregon primary whether they liked it or not. A petition signed by 1,000 Oregon voters is all that is needed to enter a candidate.

Two Cats Cause Feud for Family

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Dec. 22 (AP)—Two cats and an empty kitty can't light in municipal court after Mrs. R. E. Shepherd was charged with leaving a worthless check.

Mrs. Shepherd, Bedford, Ky., was determined to buy two Persian cats for her husband and was equally determined she wouldn't buy them. Mrs. Shepherd wrote a \$25 check for the cats—her husband rushed to the bank and withdrew their funds. The check bounced and the warrant was issued.

Judge Peter B. Malt amended the charge to a securely warrant and Mrs. Shepherd was placed on her own bond for six months.

10-Year-Old Joke Isn't Funny Now

NEW YORK, Dec. 22 (AP)—"Merrill and I" prevailed 10 years ago Christmas day when Albert B. Zink, a Philadelphia lawyer, made a \$15,000 check to his wife and dated it Dec. 25, 1955.

Mrs. Zink didn't think it was a joke at all. Zink now is a sold Manhattan supreme court justice. She saved the check and now she wants to cash it.

Zink, who didn't have anything like \$15,000 10 years ago, but has done better since, asked the court to restrain his wife from cashing Jan. 3.

Fire Chief Warns of Hazards Caused From Yule Decoration

Fire Chief L. Z. Bartlett Thursday warned storekeepers of the illegality of placing combustible decorations in show windows unless they have been fireproofed.

He pointed out it was in violation of the city ordinance to keep combustible material on the premises overnight unless enclosed in metal containers.

December always brings an increase in fires and most of them are caused by inflammable Christmas decorations and trees, he said.

He said it is highly dangerous to decorate on or about light bulbs and this should be done only with guaranteed fireproof materials.

He added the fire department must be notified of the storage and handling of pyroxylin plastic ornaments because they are highly combustible.

Warning homeowners, Bartlett stressed a Christmas tree should never be left lighted while no one is home.

He urged householders to check frequently around light bulbs on trees to see if needles are turning brown, and when needles start to fall the tree should be discarded outdoors.

A check of the electrical decorations should be made for frayed or ungrounded wires and when buying new cords, Bartlett asked people to buy only those with the Underwriters' laboratory seal of approval.

Trees should never be placed where they will block an exit.

He urged extreme care in lighting trees noting the tinsel and pich-filled pine are ignited easily and burn furiously.

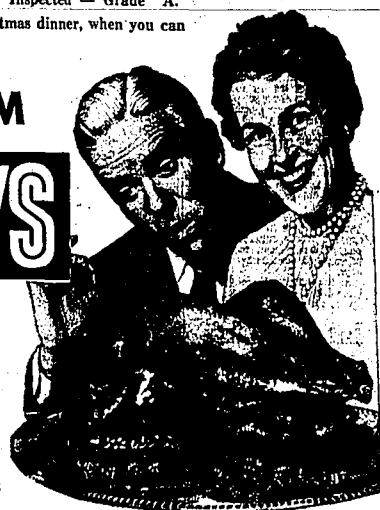

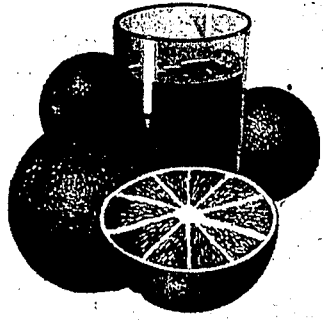

Wide Variety For Meat Cost Eyed in Mart

Housewife buying meat for this week-end's holiday meals will find a mixture of "ups" and "downs" in prices.

Pork and veal, which had been heading lower in recent weeks, reversed their trend in many cities as the onslaught of frigid temperatures lightened the wholesale market.

One of the big food chains is marking up center cut pork chops by four to 10 cents a pound, and is raising veal chops around four cents.

Turkeys are in excellent supply and generally are priced at the same or lower levels than at Thanksgiving time.

Some food stores also are featuring holiday hams and rib roasts.

Eggs are generally higher this week.

There's a wide assortment of bargains this week in produce. The department of agriculture has singled out potatoes, onions, turnips and parsnips as outstanding vegetable buys.

At the fruit stand, good buys include oranges, grapefruit, langrines, apples and emperor grapes.

Interest Hikes For Purchase Of Ford Stock

NEW YORK, Dec. 22 (AP)—Interest in Ford Motor company stock flared higher today with the revelation that the huge auto firm is within striking distance of General Motors in a fight for supremacy in the United States industrial field.

Information made public for the first time yesterday showed Ford ranked third in the nation in sales so far this year, third in earnings, and fifth in total assets.

The only companies with sales and earnings greater than Ford are the giant firms of General Motors and Standard Oil company of New Jersey.

Report Is Good

The report on the company's position third with the securities and exchange commission was better than some of the rosiest predictions made when sales, earnings, and growth figures were still a secret.

One major brokerage firm said Ford's fine earnings report would light another fire under an already torrid demand for Ford stock.

The president of one of the largest banks in New York said the record of the company since 1948 was "little short of spectacular."

Orders Expected

Brokers expected a deluge of orders for the stock which could not even be promised until the Ford reports were filed with the SEC. They said their biggest job would be picking out tiny packages of the stock on a ration basis and attempting to keep as many prospective buyers happy as possible.

Some 100,000 persons were expected to become owners of the 10,000,000 shares of Ford stock which will become available about Jan. 18. Most buyers were expected to be limited to 100 shares or less of the premium issue.

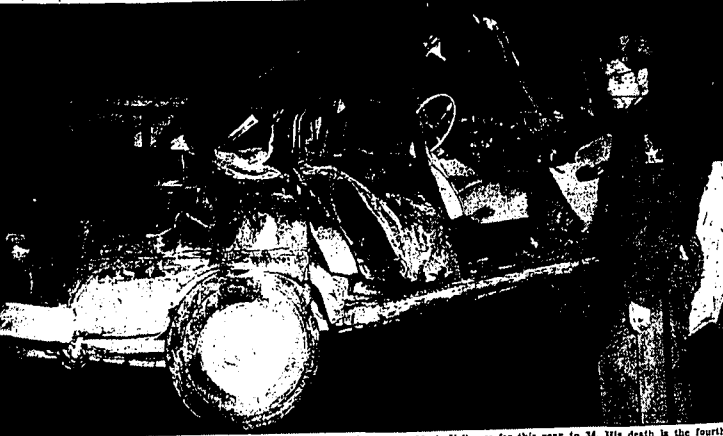

Red Leaders' British Visits Plans Played

LONDON, Dec. 22 (AP)—Prime Minister Anthony Eden is seriously considering reneging on his invitation to the Soviet Union's top two leaders to visit Britain next Spring, informed sources said today.

Britain began cooling off on the invitation when Soviet premier Nikita Khrushchev and Communist Party boss Nikita Khrushchev made a series of vitriolic and western-appealing speeches during their southeast Asia tour.

Hit "Colonialism"

Throughout the month-long visit the Soviet leaders spoke long and often of "west colonialism" and told the British and Indians that Britain was the worst offender. Both Burma and India were once controlled by Britain but were granted independence.

The two visiting Russians returned to Moscow yesterday from the tour and began repeating the harsh accusations the moment they stepped off the plane. The attacks were anti-American too but chiefly directed against "British colonialism."

Many British newspapers have demanded openly that the government cancel the Khrushchev-Bulgarian visit, and an official government spokesman accused both the Soviet leaders of "hypocrisy" during their frequent anti-western blasts.

Visit Stands
Lord Redding, minister of state for foreign affairs, told the house of lords yesterday the invitation to the Russians still stands, but informed sources said Eden was seeking some diplomatic way of calling it off.

Even if the Russians arrive there were increasing signs they would receive a heavily watered-down welcome. The Daily Telegraph today said Britain was committed to the visit, and an official government spokesman expressed the fear it would be "pointless and squallid."
