## Health Secretary Reaffirms Ban on Salk Polio Serum

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (AP)—L. J. Peterson, secretary of the state health board, said today the board has "no plans for immediate use of the Salk polio vaccine."

Peterson said for comment on a request by Surgeon General Leonard Scheele in Washington that health officers and public health physicians cooperate in using supplies of the vaccine as soon as possible.

Peterson said Idaho health officers would make no use of the serum until they study the results of a vaccination-testing program tentatively scheduled for next month.

Some 600 children will be vaccinated with the Salk vaccine, Peterson said, "we believe to be safe."

The board has applied to the U. S. public health service for funds with which to conduct the program and await the results.

Salk vaccine vaccinations were indefinitely suspended in Idaho last summer at the start of a polio epidemic that soon broke out in the state with the vaccine. There have been 258 cases in Idaho this year, compared with 1,000 in 1952.

Peterson said that private physicians in Idaho have used some 3,000 cubic centimeters of Salk serum in the last 10 months, at a cost of the amount allocated to the state. He said this is believed to be about the lowest usage of any state.

## Cuts Are Ordered for Railroad Freight Rates In 11 Far West States

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (AP)—The interstate commerce commission today ordered a major slash in railroad rates on transcontinental shipments of manufactured goods moving to and from the Far West. It also directed a general revision of freight charges within that territory.

The charges, which must be made effective by next June 1, are estimated to involve a 10 to 15 percent a year reduction in freight billings on the Far Western business.

The agency's action is described as an interim rate adjustment. It marked a further step in a 16-year-old ICC proceedings designed to bring about some degree of uniformity in railroad charges on "class rate" freight—principally processed articles—in all parts of the country.

The railroad class rates were made uniform from the eastern seaboard to the Rocky mountains in May, 1937. The commission then proceeded to deal separately with the rates in the Mountain-Pacific area. This includes Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, Idaho, Utah, Arizona, Montana, Wyoming, New Mexico and West Virginia.

With the interim adjustments, the class rates within those states will be revised both up and down, with reductions predominating.

Some within-territory rates will remain the same, principally those situations where the railroads have previously lowered rates to meet higher than the class rates at all levels, however, will remain slightly higher than the class rates for the remainder of the country in 1953.

## Eisenhower Denies Russian Charges of U.S. 'Interference'

KEY WEST, Fla., Dec. 30 (AP)—President Eisenhower today hurled back at the leaders of Communist Russia a flat denial that he is an exponent of interference in middle Eastern affairs, the Soviet Communist leader Nikita Khrushchev was wrong in his analysis of American foreign policy.

In the face of new blasts from the Russian political high command, the President refused to change position and took a distinctly dim view of what the Russians had been saying in recent days.

Mr. Eisenhower said this country would not retreat from its foreign policy program of encouraging European peoples to defect from Soviet control.

The peaceful liberation of the captive peoples has been, and will continue to be, a major goal of the United States foreign policy until success is achieved, the President said in a statement released by press secretary James C. Haverly.

Khrushchev, the bullet-headed leader of the international operations of the Communist Party in an impassioned speech yesterday to the Soviet parliament, said the President and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles had committed "grave interference" in the affairs of the European people by their Christmas broadcast to European people.

The Soviet White House at first refused to comment. But after Haverly talked with Dulles this morning and the President's press secretary went over the latest dispatches from Moscow, the White House issued this statement:

"Mr. Khrushchev is reported to have said that the Christmas message of the Nationalist and Communist Secretary of State Dulles to the people of Europe were in no way in violation of the principles of the United States to achieve freedom and justice for the oppressed peoples of the world.

"The Christmas message at Geneva, the Soviet ruler said, was a clear and unequivocal statement of the United States' policy of respecting the right of peoples to choose their own form of government, which they will live, and of assisting any people who desire to do so."

## Flood Region People Begin Cleaning Job

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 30 (AP)—California's flood victims began their chilly winter weather today to begin the monumental job of re-claiming their homes, lands and possessions from desolation.

The toll of dead from the Christmas week storms and floods rose to 64 in California and 15 in Oregon for a total of 79. Damage estimates reached \$1.6 billion dollars today.

As the flood waters began receding in most areas, they left a thick layer of sludge over everything they touched. Residents of 20 northern California counties had to wash it off everything they owned.

Many refugees returned to their homes to find that muddy waters had covered their shoes, appliances, furniture and clothing. Others found their businesses washed away, their merchandise destroyed, still others lost their homes and buildings.

"It was the job of the Red Cross, small business administration and other federal and local agencies to help the flood victims get back on their feet again. Weekly paychecks of \$10 million dollars were sent to get an idea of the job ahead."

Meanwhile, scattered showers fell throughout the state, but the fall was light and not enough to cause further flooding. A cold snap brought more snow to the Sierra Nevada, slowing the mud flow to a trickle.

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## Yalta Papers Reveal World War II Rift

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (AP)—Fresh evidence came to light last night that the World War II partnership between Russia and the United States began to fall apart even before the guns stopped booming. This was made clear by the publication of several dozen previously accreted notes and messages related to the controversial Yalta conference in early 1945. Among those documents is a "secret and personal" message from the late Marshal Stalin to Russia to the late President Roosevelt indicating plainly that Stalin intended to have his own way about organizing a government for war-ravaged Poland which would be under Russia's thumb.

A dispute between Russia and the western powers—the United States and Britain—over the future of Poland was in fact probably the first major conflict of the long struggle that in the past 10 years has become known as the cold war.

Another message from Joseph Harriman, then ambassador in Moscow to Roosevelt on April 2, 1945, reported that Stalin had returned home for a week-end leave from the Yalta summit at St. Yalta, Georgia.

## Chinese Reds Shell Islands; Fight Feared

TAIPEI, Formosa, Dec. 30 (AP)—The Chinese Communists were reported today to be bombarding both the Nationalist and Communist garrisons of the main island chain in an apparent prelude to an invasion of Matsau, Quemoy or both.

Heavy Nationalist Chinese air and naval patrols were reported in the area where several naval skirmishes have taken place in the past week. Nationalist sources believe the Reds are more likely against Matsau or its satellite island of Keelung.

Sporadic Communist shelling was directed against Keelung in the Matsau island group 100 miles up the coast. Keelung is a live, naval base from the nearest Communist position and serves as an outpost for the main island.

No Naval Action

Up until late today there were no reports of naval action between Nationalist and Communist forces. There were widespread predictions that the Communists were ready to retake the island.

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## Legality Issue Is Raised for School Patrol

GRANGEVILLE, Dec. 30 (AP)—A meeting of parents and education officials was held today to discuss the legality of school traffic patrols in the whole state.

Dorey S. Riggs, superintendent of school district 241, told the group he had advised that school boards and school districts have no legal jurisdiction over streets and roads. He said such responsibility lies with the police.

He added that teachers who assist school patrol members could be liable for any injuries that might happen to the patrol member or pupils injured under patrol direction.

Because there is no Idaho law authorizing school patrols, Riggs said the responsibility might be shifted to the state.

## Anchorage Is Paralyzed by Snow Depths

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Dec. 30 (AP)—Residents of this city battled blizzards today as Anchorage lay paralyzed under a snow removal snowdrifts over to hit the city.

Mayor Ken Hitchcock declared a state of semi-emergency and asked that nobody except snow removal crews be allowed into the downtown area.

Businesses declared a "snow holiday" and employees were asked to remain at home. No traffic except snow plows and snow removal trucks moved in the city.

It was all snowing lightly as 15 pieces of equipment manned by 100 men began the job of clearing streets in downtown Anchorage.

In a 24-hour period ending at 5 p. m. (EST) yesterday, 17.2 inches of snow fell, plus the 27.7 inches more than had fallen at this time last in 1929 and 16.8 inches more than had fallen in 1928 as of this time.

Meanwhile, a stretch of Alaska coastline stretching 800 miles southeast from here was getting much the same kind of weather.

## Solon Claims Russia Beats U. S. Missiles

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Dec. 30 (AP)—Sen. Clinton P. Anderson, D-N.M., warned today that Russia is outstripping the United States in the development of guided missiles.

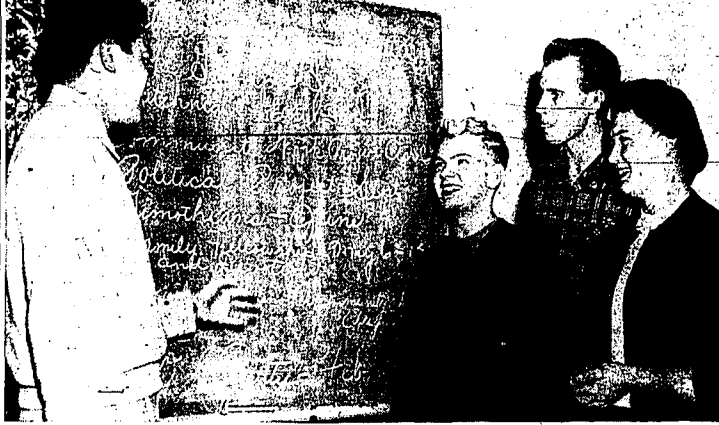

### New Goal Is Offered to U.N. To Help Aid Human Welfare

NEW YORK, Dec. 30 (AP)—Cutting down the number of wars in the world has been a peppy problem to the United Nations for 10 troubled years.

Now it faces a new crisis—how to cut down on the number of its own cocktail parties.

Here really bold action is called for. Why doesn't the U.N. forget about abolishing war for one session?

It is a real positive step toward peace, universal brotherhood and the long-term improvement of human welfare.

The growing nuisance of too many cocktail parties at the U.N. was pointed out by Joe Mazza of Chile. As president of the tenth general assembly, he had to attend as many as three or four in a day. Every fresh international session seems to produce a torrent of cocktail parties, which in diplomatic parlance are known as "receptions."

"You have to drink the same Scotch or the same manhattans and eat the same shrimp and talk to the self-same people," said President Mazza. His description of this type of social function may well go down as the greatest understatement in the history of diplomacy.

The average cocktail party isn't a party at all. It is an exercise in group self-punishment. It is a social wasteland of where men and women drink from a poisoned well while they build verbal towers of hubris and wisdom, and drink out of never forget the sinking feeling in his arches the popping out of new varicose veins, the slow numbness as of death creeping over.

The total impact of this form of torture on mankind has never been studied, but it must be spelled "Cocktail party stomach" and "cocktail party fatigue" are well known medical conditions now, and claim more victims than virus "X." 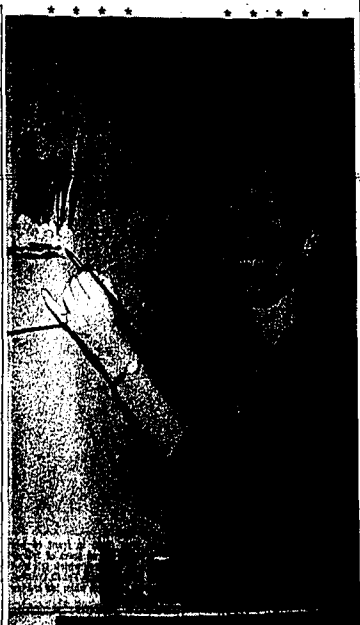

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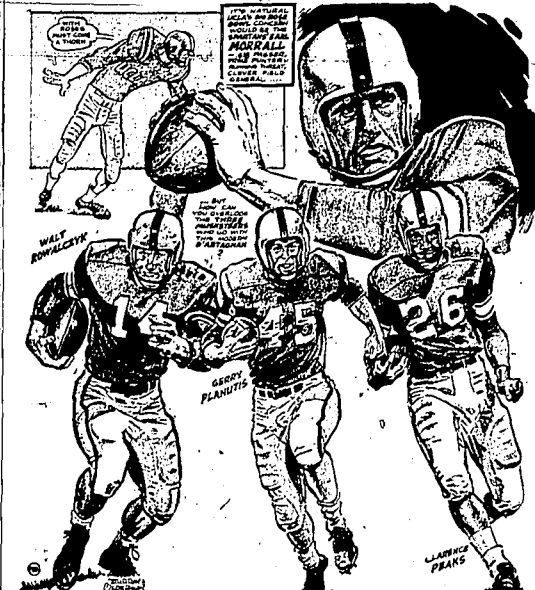

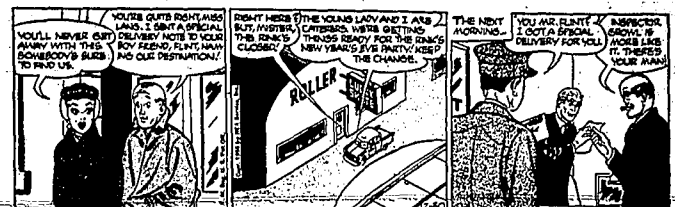

In the record home-building year of 1950, the 1,500,000 dwelling units started were only 32 per cent of the total housing inventory. In a more normal year, 1954, the 1,215,500 starts were only 24 per cent of housing stock. Moral: We Must Conserve and Rehabilitate the housing we have.

**8. FHA, OTHER LOANS, CASH... MONEY'S AVAILABLE**  
This amount no one knows, but repayments and interest on loans outstanding amount to over seven billion annually, plus premium payments on billions of insurances in force, plus any part of the peoples' personal incomes—today running at the annual rate of 303 billion dollars—plus any amount of the 188 billion dollars cash and savings that people have on hand NOW that they choose to spend.

**9.**  
There is only ONE cloud on the economic horizon today and that is the price squeeze being endured by the Farmers and Producers. With farm prices declining 30 per cent in the last few years, at prices they have to pay continually rising, the situation is bad. With every other class of people enjoying unprecedented prosperity, those of us in business in a strictly agricultural area wonder if the "Powers That Be" insist on crucifying our good farmer friends. If they insist on nailing them to the cross, why do they place the thieves and robbers on either side?

**10. IT'S AND ENDLESS PROCESS**  
America, rich as she is, can't afford to completely rehouse the nation in new buildings every generation. Yet with our technological advance, a building care become outdated is discarded.  
Even if a building did not need repairs and maintenance, homeowner and his family would need to make changes as materials, new equipment, new concepts of living come to the scene. Each generation, our homes will need regeneration. Like you, there's no end to the job. When you get to the end of the line, or the top of the building, it's time to start all over again. So it is with home building and modernization. It's big, growing and it's destined to be with us for a long time to come.
