FORD SUCCESS STORY

The name Ford has been a part of the American industrial scene for half a century. to it can hardly be rated a surprise to learn, officially, that it is among the five leading corporations in this country.

The nation's largest family-held company whose financial history has been a tightly kept secret during the firm's whole life, is now revealed to be a giant outdone in assets mly by American Telephone and Telegraph, Standard Oil of New Jersey, General Motors and United States Steel. In terms of sales volume, it ranks fourth.

But what is most fascinating to ordinary eltizens about Ford's financial disclosures is the story they tell of how a great company grows, suffers its ups and downs, takes a new are on life and grows speciacularly again.

In the days of the "tin lizzie," Henry Ford was almost alone as a mass producer of cheap. cars. He carried off one major change of size and style successfully, but in the 1930's ran into competitive and other troubles. The record shows Ford had a "complative loss" for the 1931-1941 decade, through the Great Depression and up to our entry into World war

The first year after the war Ford lost a bit more than eight million dollars. But by 1948, riding on what we all thought then was a coboom, its sales had bounded up from 894 million to 1.9 billion, and profits were 96 million.

The truly astounding fact about this report is that this 25-billion-dollar corporation has now doubled its sales since 1948 and this year nay well show a profit of 400 million or more (312 million for nine months).

We all know the country and its general conomy have expanded tremendously in this period. But some companies keep pace and mme do not.

How did Ford manage it? In the postwar rears up to now, it has spent 1.3 billion dolars modernizing, expanding and replacing its production facilities to make this growth possible. It has also improved its manufacturing processes, plant and other organization methods.

These outlays have not only spelled larger earnings for the stockholders and more cars for the consumers. They have created thousands of additional jobs at good pay,

This kind of performance is the answer to those in the labor movement who think that any particular company has a pic just so hig. and it is labor's job to get a bigger and bigger slice of it. The truth is that the enterprising company, for the good of the worker and everybody else, must constantly be devising ways to make bigger and bigger pies.

The Ford story, told fully for the first time. ought to hearten all those who want to see the private enterprise system flourish and prosper in a world where too much soil already is in the iron grip of hostile systems that would freeze and finally wither the free purposes of men.

THERE'S NO SALE YET

There is no question that India, Burma and Afganistan have exhibited considerable triendliness toward the Soviet union. But Comrades Khrushchev and Bulganin are not therefore warranted in claiming that these countries are now their virtual allies.

On arriving back in Moscow from their South Asia, the two Kremlin leaders went overboard in reporting the results for home consumption. They indicated they had India and its two flanking nations in their back pockets. The fact is that Russia's traveling salesmen

were reminded while they were still on the road that their hosts had no intention of ying up with the Goviet union India particularly was at pains to reassert

its neutrality, a policy which often has been annoying to us on the other side of the cold rar line-un.

Of course Russian politicians are like any ther variety in that they like to put the best assible face on things for the home folks. Chrushchev and Bulganin don't have to stand for reelection, but they do have to show some meern for public attitudes even in their tightly ruled land

Possibly, too, they may figure that if they spread this word around that they won new allies in South Asia—some peoples of the earth will not see the Asian denials and will think it true. 


