Reds Courted By Enemy for Greek Ballots

ATHENS, Greece, Jan. 30 (AP)—Outlawed Communists lined up their once-bitter enemies today in an election battle to oust premier Constantine Karastathis. The Reds hold a commanding position for the Feb. 19 balloting, the first time since World War II they were courted by the parties who want Communist influence in getting rid of the young premier.

Large segments of the population are said to be dissatisfied with the government.

The Communist party was outlawed in 1947. Now the reds are resented by the Union of Democratic Leftists-EDA, an outgrowth of the wartime National Liberation Front (ELAM) in which the Communists tried to overthrow the government in 1944-45. The EDA reported the rebel guerrillas to be 1949-49 civil war.

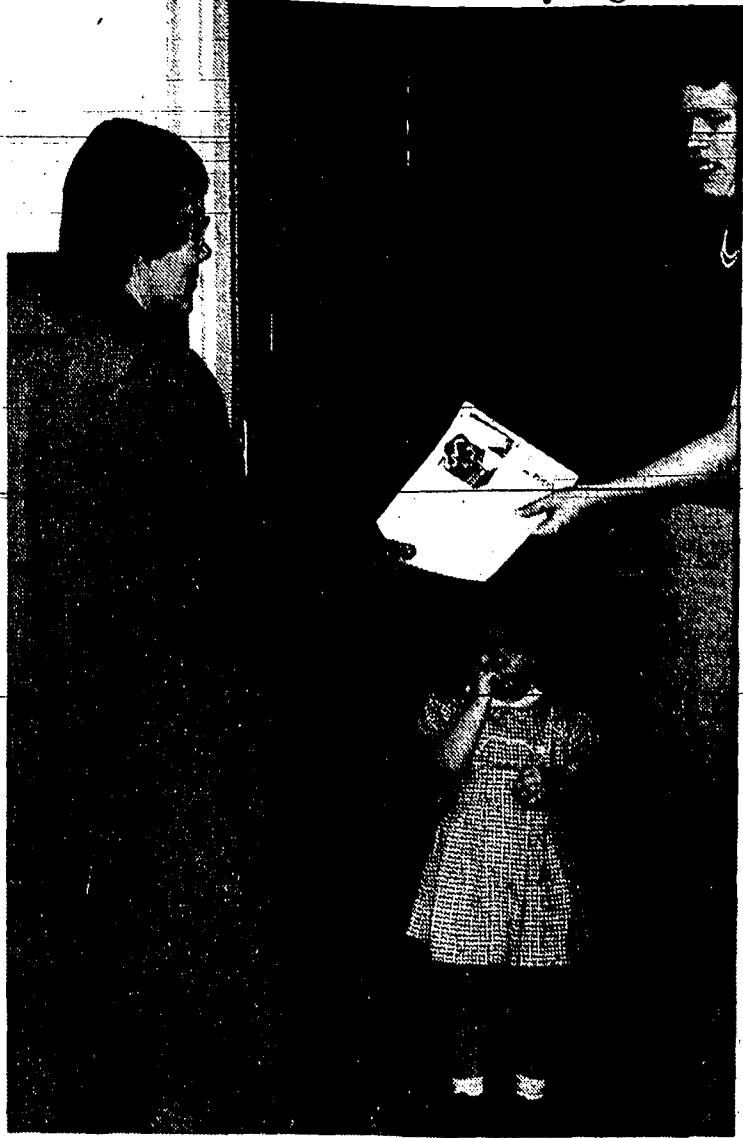

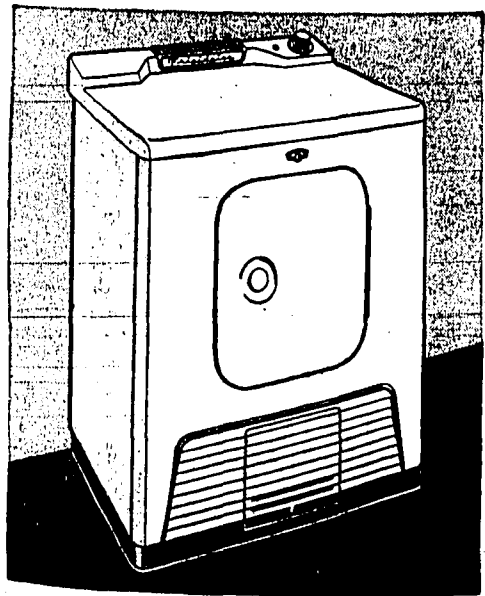

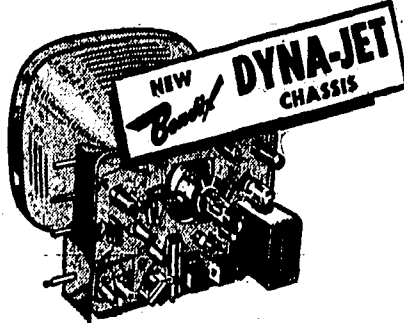

But unless he had good moral cause to refuse to help a friend in a very tight with competitors who were out to get him for ulterior reasons, Kennedy owed McCarthy this vote.

It was a case that called for courage of the kind that he admires in his book.

Jack knows how this vicious thing operates, for his own father came back from London voting to stake his life, his fortune and his sacred honor to keep the United States out of war.

The next day he went silent and he never uttered another sound, but he has spent the last ten years combing the internal revenue out of his hair and the coat to him in worry and money for accountants, lawyers and office space has been enormous.

At the time he made his threat, Jack Kennedy's father was plainly warned that if he kept on the Roosevelt machine would do its worst to smash him and even send him to prison on tax technicalities.

The gaudiest exploit of the cabal to date had been the clumsy campaign to make it appear that legitimate religious bodies were indignant at truthful charges written by J. B. Matthews, the original fellow-traveler and published in the American Mercury. Matthews was about to start work as chief investigator for McCarthy's committee and the object of the cabal was to discredit him, throw him out and thus reflect on McCarthy.

Matthews had written that many of the clergy were either communists or dupes and he was absolutely right. The protesting groups were truly political and were religious only in their titles.

Jack and Joe Kennedy both knew the inner story of this frame-up and Jack might fairly have included McCarthy among the heroes of his book, for he owes his seat in the Senate to a definite but negative decision of Joe McCarthy.

The Republican party in Massachusetts begged McCarthy to go into the "Irish" districts and exhorted these people, traditional Democrats, to vote for Lodge. Being "Irish" and Catholic, McCarthy could have helped Henry Cabot Lodge keep his seat by lauding Lodge and reminding the voters of the red-herring policy of Jack Kennedy's Democratic ticket.

McCarthy went as far as Connecticut. He told a friend he was under pressure to help Lodge.

The friend said, "Let the bum get knocked off. Go on out to Indiana and help Bill Jenner. He is a real Republican and he needs your help."

McCarthy spoke for William Purtell of Connecticut in Bridgeport and Danbury and gave Purtell the impetus that put him over, again the "Irish" vote. Then he turned his back on New England and Jack Kennedy was elected in Massachusetts.

Stevenson to Lose Backing Of Governor

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30 (AP)—Democratic presidential candidate Adlai E. Stevenson today appeared to have lost the support of Gov. G. Mennen Williams of Michigan unless the former Illinois governor proposes a "hard-hitting" program for the Democrats.

Williams said in a television interview yesterday he could not support Stevenson for the Democratic nomination on the basis of Stevenson's record so far. However, he said, how Stevenson's program shapes up within the next few months will determine whether he gets Williams' support.

Other Developments

Other political developments: Sen. William F. Knowland, R., Calif., said at a Manchester, N. H., news conference he would not enter New Hampshire's first-in-the-nation presidential primary March 13. He said he was passing the primary because it was too early and he would not have a chance to withdraw if President Eisenhower discloses before that time whether he will be a candidate for re-election.

Democratic leaders, headed by House Leader John W. McCormack, accused the Eisenhower administration of "fumbling the ball" and "creating confusion in Washington." But House GOP leader Joseph W. Martin, Jr., said the administration is "1,000 per cent more efficient, able and decisive" than the Democratic Truman administration.

Democratic National Chairman Paul M. Butler called for a "complete airing of the gigantic mess in grain storage which has been created by the Eisenhower administration." He said there is evidence of "gross mismanagement" of the program.

Editorial Noted

The New York Herald Tribune said in a front page editorial nothing but "the most commanding reasons" should keep President Eisenhower from seeking a second term. It said "the blunt and objective truth is that the Republican party faces the very real danger of defeat this fall unless President Eisenhower remains at its head."

Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey, D., Minn., said the administration has asked congress to get rid of the national farm surplus without earmarking a reserve for national emergencies.

Radio Studio Raid Jails Farm Helper

ELK POINT, S. D., Jan. 30 (AP)—A man who shot up a radio and television station in Sioux Falls, S. D., because he said he wanted to "do away with all radio stations" was in jail here today.

Ardell Reub, 40, a farm laborer near White Lake, S. D., was arrested near Beresford last night after exchanging gunfire with a village marshal.

Owners of radio and TV station KELO in Sioux Falls said Reub did \$2,000 damage with his shotgun fire. Shooting from his car, Reub knocked out one window in the studio proper and the weatherball atop the studio. South of town, he knocked out between six and eight windows at the transmitter as well as some of the flashing red lights on the TV tower.

BIG SPRINGS, Tex., Jan. 30 (AP)—Lieut. Jefferson F. Vanderwork and Lieut. Robert S. Kan were shaken up when they crash-landed their disabled T28 training plane in a plowed field.

But an unidentified farmer plowing the field was not disturbed. He plowed past the damaged plane twice without speaking.

Lieutenant Vanderwork finally was able to hail him. "Having trouble?" the farmer asked.

Gambler Is Eyed As Theft 'Banker'

BOSTON, Jan. 30 (AP)—A Boston gambler, now dead, was named today as "banker" for part of the \$1,210,000 Brink's loot and police said he may have parlayed the money and his knowledge of the crime into death.

The gambler, Joseph N. Venuti, 45, committed suicide four days after FBI officials rounded up the alleged robbery gang and announced that the case was solved.

District Attorney Garret H. Byrne said he had information that Venuti was "banker" for at least \$100,000 of Brink's cash. Byrne said the money was turned over to Venuti by alleged Brink's ring leader Joseph P. McGinnis.

Officials said Venuti was entrusted with the money because of the danger of it being found on the men now held as suspects during the investigation which followed the holdup. Venuti was described as a close friend of McGinnis. Because he was a gambler, officials said, little suspicion would have been aroused by his possession of a large sum of money.

TOKYO, Jan. 30 (AP)—Radioactive snow fell on Matsuyama city on the southwest coast of Honshu Thursday through Saturday. Kyodo news service reported. No reason for the radioactivity was suggested.

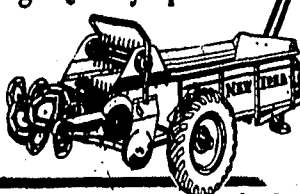
