The absence of the superintendent came in light following a report an 8-year-old deaf pupil at the school had been beaten by a house mother. Through information obtained at the school, Governor Smylie learned Driggs was in California, and wired him at two different points, requesting his immediate return.

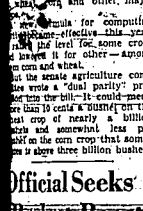

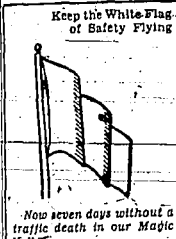

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—Prime Minister John A. Costello of Ireland, who describes himself as "the very unimportant junior minister of a very important country," receives the full diplomatic treatment from Washington today.

His busy day of sight-seeing and speeches will end tonight at the senate and the house and a discussion of his country's role in world affairs at a National Press club lunch.

Costello, first Irish prime minister to visit the United States, received a warm welcome from President Eisenhower and other officials when he arrived yesterday for a three-day visit in Washington.

After a White House lunch, he discussed Ireland's role as a selected member of the United Nations with Acting Secretary of State Herbert Hoover.

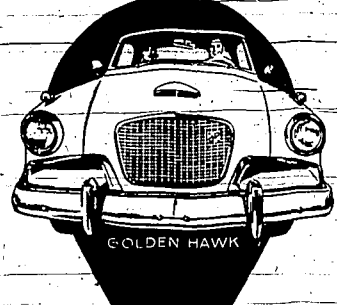

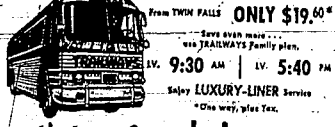

One theory says the great pyramid originally 22 feet high, was built by refugees from the lost continent of Atlantis, another calls it a gigantic boat of prophetic calling to the Christian faith.

**Expert's Conclusions**

Drs. Hassan, Daboul, and others in a recent article titled "The Truth About the Great Pyramid of Giza" said that the Giza pyramid was a tomb for the Pharaoh Khufu, and was nothing but a tomb.

After the collapse of the ancient Egyptian civilization, the secret of the pharaoh's dragon—the golden serpent—was hidden away in a valley to entertain tourists. ### Two Missiles Hit Target in Test of Navy

**ABOARD OUIDED MISSILE CRUISER BOSTON IN THE GARDEN CITY, N.Y.,** a pair of guided missiles, testing and turning into the air as they rode a road the beach of target plane into fragments six miles out and 35,000 feet in the air Tuesday.

With this spectacular demonstration, the navy showed its new anti-aircraft weapons.

# Irish Legend Is Played by Bold Expert

**NEW YORK, March 15**—The American Museum of Natural History risked the wrath of all good Irishmen yesterday by tampering with the legend that St. Patrick rid Ireland of snakes.

Patrick, and the legend just isn't so, said Dr. Richard Zweifel, the museum's snake specialist who admitted he wears the green sash.

Zweifel boldly offers a few facts to back up his proposition: snakes just in case there's a wee bit of an argument, come St. Patrick's day.

No Snakes Present

St. Patrick, he notes, was active in Ireland in the fifth century A.D. Snakes, on the other hand, haven't been active in the country for perhaps one million years—ever.

The only reptile that ever could have caught St. Patrick's eye is the jacara vivipara, said Zweifel, who is as full of Latin as a hot tray of blintzes.

"Jacara vivipara is an attractive little lizard, and it is the only reptilian resident of Ireland since the last Ice Age," Zweifel said.

Lizards are friendly, live close to man and rid him of a number of insect pests.

Still in Ireland

The jacara vivipara, Zweifel says, won't even budge from its rocky refuge. It is so shy it is rarely seen, and it is so small it is easily overlooked in the fields and swamps of the Irish.

Scientists believe lizards came to Ireland, probably by floating on a log, and they probably broke up the soon for the lizard snakes to slither into Ireland, according to Zweifel.

England has only three types of snakes, a short shift compared to the two dozen varieties of snakes in New England's grassy meadows. The snakes of the earth are no snakes, as Zweifel says, haven't made a legend of it.

# Colored Association Leads Vanguard Of Fight for Equal Race Opportunities

**GREENVILLE, Miss., March 15**—The letters NAACP have become a symbol to the White House of the worst of its woes in the race problem.

The letters stand for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, Organized in New York 43 years ago. It is now in the forefront of the Negro battle for equality.

Most sincere southerners are convinced that the NAACP has communist leanings.

Conservatives hate it passionately. Many moderates, while sympathetic with some of its aims, argue that the NAACP is carrying the banner of racial integration so fast and recklessly that bloodshed may result.

Whites who join or endorse the NAACP do so at the risk of community abuse. Negro leaders at the organization find themselves subjected to all sorts of pressures, usually economic ones.

Nevertheless, the NAACP is growing steadily in the South. Practically all the large cities and towns have organized offices. Even in this sparsely settled country, with great expanses of flat plantation land separating Negro settlement houses, the NAACP has its members.

The organization's aim is to crum-

ple segregation barriers wherever they exist. It has scored some notable victories, its greatest being the part it played in the supreme court ruling on desegregating the public schools.

But its task in the South has been tough and will get tougher. Right now race relations are at a low ebb in the care of the Deep South—Georgia, South Carolina, Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana.

Louisiana has filed suit to outlaw the NAACP on the grounds that it failed to file membership lists in compliance with a 1955 law aimed at the old Ku Klux Klan.

Georgia Attorney General Eugene Cook says the white citizens council—an effective propaganda weapon—a research project that Cook claims proves a communist front in the NAACP.

The organization calls Cook's findings a smear.

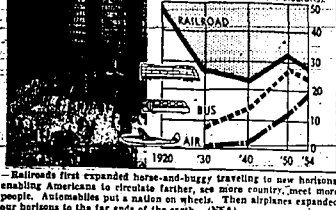

### Cyprus Chief Asks Year to Settle Angers

LONDON, March 15 (AP)—Field Marshal Sir John Harding, prime minister of Cyprus, has advised Governor Anthony Eden it will take at least a year to "weed out terrorism" in that colony, official sources said today.

The sources said once peace has been restored ousted Archbishop Makarios "may have a series of thoughts" about a settlement with the British government and that "the British would be expected to refuse to negotiate with him once more."

But during the coming year security measures will be tightened on Cyprus to cut off "outside help" to extremists and the leaders will emerge with whom Britain can negotiate a constitution on self-rule, the official source said.

Report Made Public

Harding's report to Eden was made public at a labor party of the house of lords led by Earl Aldrich challenged Eden's policies not only on Cyprus but on the whole Middle East.

President Eisenhower's fence-mending in the Middle East has been criticized in Britain.

The London Times suggested that the president is embroiled in the dispute with both parties in the dispute might have made a "discreet" reputation of authority in Greece, praising Greek statement in the Middle East.

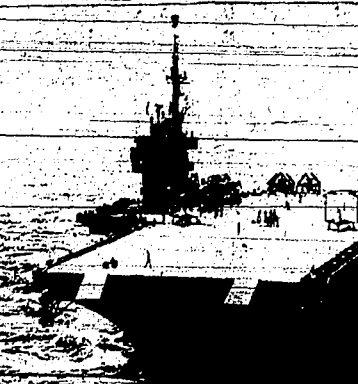

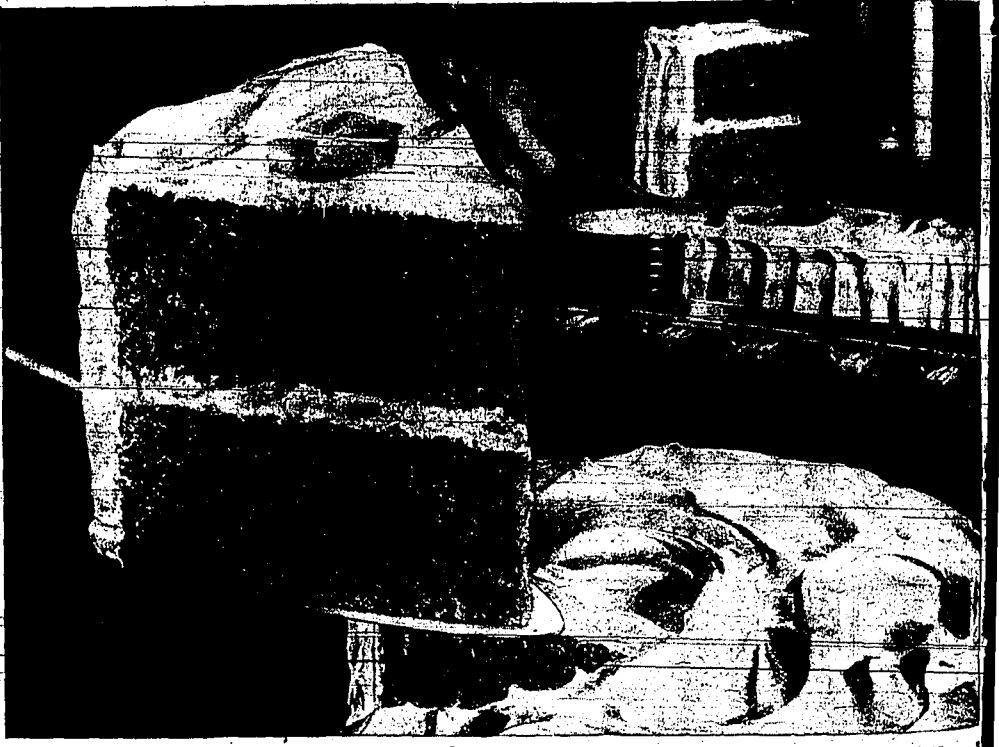

### Solons Given Details Upon Satellite Plan

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—Scientists will send man-made moons whirling around the earth at 100 miles-an-hour he told congress.

That plans now call for 12 of the satellites, each of 20 to 30 inches in diameter. Some may tizzle before they take off, and certainly they will not be circling the earth at once.

That at least one expert, Joseph Kaplan, looks on the international rocket program "as perhaps the greatest new scientific effort we have had since the invention of the telephone."

That the earth, like a congressman, tends to bulge about the middle. The satellites, filled with delicate instruments that will send back data by radio, will give clues on how the earth bulges, as well as supply information on atmospheric mysteries as high as 800 miles up.

For the satellites gave their views last week to a house appropriations subcommittee that will have to pass for the \$13,700,000 project will cost. Their testimony was made yesterday.

**Rancher Asks Congress Soil Money Boosts**

Harvey S. Hale, contact, Nebr., chairman of the public lands committee of the National Association of Soil Conservation Districts, has requested more soil conservation appropriations of the agriculture committee.

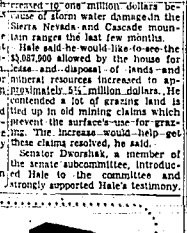
