

Remsberg Names Warehouse Destroyed in Early Morning Hansen Fire; Damage Believed to Pass \$250,000 Mark

Warehouse Flames Light up Hansen

GOODING, March 20—Harold T. Farley, director of Indian education and junior high supervisor in the state department of education, was appointed Tuesday as acting superintendent of the Gooding State School for the Deaf and Blind, John Remsberg, Republican of the state board of education, announced Farley's appointment following the resignation of Dr. Burton W. Driggs as taking an indefinite leave of absence from his post as superintendent because of ill health.

HENSEN, March 20—Flames wiped out the Louis Denton company warehouse here early Tuesday and a loss of damage estimated at between \$250,000 and \$300,000. The blocking warehouse and potato cellar were destroyed completely and a railroad car hauled with beams was damaged extensively. Power and telephone lines were knocked out for a short time by the blaze. By noon, all that was left of the warehouse and cellar were huge piles of black, smoldering, smoking beams. Denton, manager of the warehouse, said he was unable to insure against the loss but insurance agent's who viewed the ruins estimate damage at more than a quarter of a million dollars.

The cause of the fire has not been determined. Denton and four workmen were at the warehouse until sometime between 2 and 3 a. m. loading the railroad car with beams. Firemen estimate the blaze started around 3:30 a. m. The fire was discovered by Patrolman V. Walker. The marshal said that when he arrived at the warehouse, flames seemed to be located in the office.

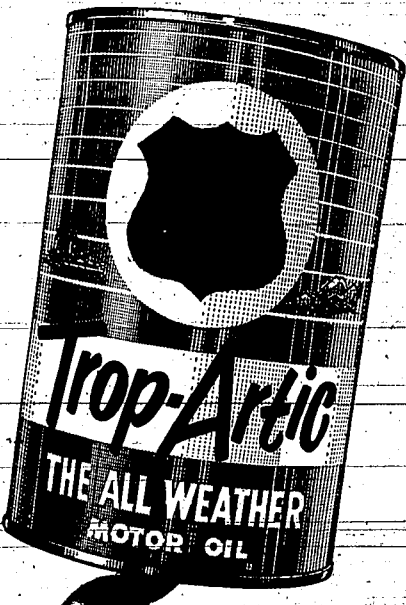

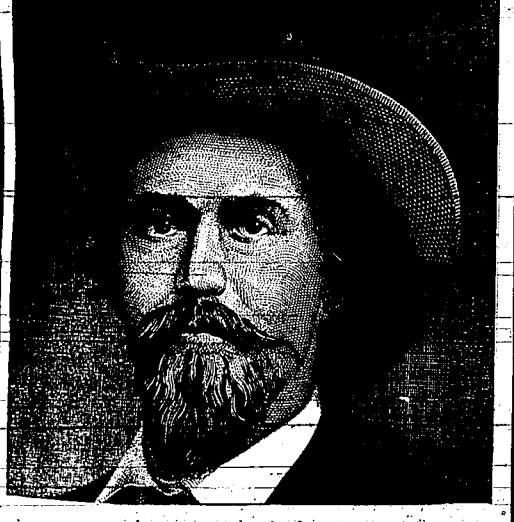

Teen-Age Drivers Cause City's Worst Juvenile Problem, PTA Is Told Here

Teen-age drivers are Twin Falls' biggest juvenile problem, State Rep. Jay Merrill told the Junior High School PTA Monday night in the Washington school auditorium. He reported 1,500 cars are owned outright by teen-agers in Twin Falls county, and 300 more are in the county have uncontrolled access to an additional 1,500 automobiles. Merrill charged that the youth lacks the mature judgment necessary to use these vehicles.

He suggested three remedies: "First, closer parental supervision. He suggested parents know where their children are going when they take the car, with whom they are going, and when they will return.

"More driver training. "Cars equipped with safety devices, such as seat belts, to reduce the chance of injury in serious accidents.

Merrill, a delegate to Governor Shoyler's conference on youth problems, said a car owned by a youth makes him less apt to accept parental discipline or supervision, in that the youth feels he is endangering no other member of the family by driving a car which he owns.

Fifteen per cent of the drivers licensed in Idaho are headed by people under 25, Merrill said. These people cause 28 per cent of the accidents and 40 per cent of the traffic fatalities, he reported.

More than 30 per cent of all the cars on the road now will be involved in wrecks sometime this year, he told his audience.

"In just one of many insurance accidents," Merrill said, "but in my 17 years in Twin Falls I've been called on to adjust or cover an average of 2,000 wrecks a year."

The average cost of repairing a car wrecked by a person over 25 is \$113, he said, while the average for drivers under 25 is \$103.

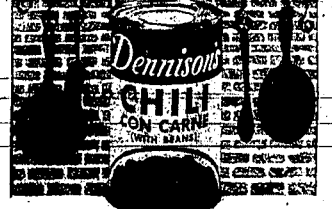

(From Page One) **State** health officials plan to test a new vaccine against typhoid fever in Idaho. The vaccine will be used first on a group of 300 volunteer children in Pocatello March 26-30 and then on a group of similar size in Lewiston the first week of April.

Statewide distribution of the vaccine is planned for April 9 through directors of local health units located in Pocatello, Boise, Twin Falls, Lewiston and Coeur d'Alene.

The state is instituting the "definite" postponement of mass inoculations administered on the state level. Vaccine will be distributed on the local level by county health officers where there is no local health unit.

Children 4 through 7 years of age and expectant mothers will be the first to receive the vaccine under the statewide distribution program, the health department said. No charge is made for the vaccine, which is made available by the U. S. public health service and the National Foundation, but physicians in many charge patients a nominal fee for administering the shot. Department officials said.

NEW YORK, March 20 (AP)—It's a good snow storm, all right, but it's not a blizzard.

The other night—Friday, that first storm—now there is fine blizzard; it looked a little like it. But that was a 40-mile wind. Now you just double that wind and you have an idea of our blizzard. I heard the wind went up over 100 miles an hour in 58.

We lived up on 80th street near Sutton place, where the Queensboro bridge—now, remember, it was under construction and I was coming up Park avenue with a friend of mine. The snow was coming just like flying sand. It hurt your face, and you couldn't see. When we got to 57th street—that's Grand street—

could see how it whirled around there, and said, "This is something of a storm."

Monday morning my mother called me. "We can't get out of the house," she said. I looked out the window and across the street there wasn't any snow at all. But on the north side of the street I had to turn out under seven feet of snow.

Trucks stalled
I went out and rode down to Chatham square. On the Bowery I could see the beer trucks. They were stuck and the drivers went off and left them, all loaded. The Bowery boys were having a great day helping themselves.

From Chatham square to City hall the trucks were uphill and the loose motive couldn't make it. I got out and walked on the catwalk to the City hall station. There was a big, wide stairway, and it looked just like a toboggan. I simply sat down and slid down.

I worked in an office where the municipal building is now. A few of us got into the office, but the boss couldn't come down from the west side. There was no communication. There were a few telephones then, but the lines were all out, and they were all down. We didn't wait around long.

People Had Trouble
People had a lot of trouble. There weren't any supermarkets then. The grocery stores couldn't get through and there wasn't any milk except condensed and there was only one kind of that. And some people were caught without coal.

They didn't have any removal equipment like they do now. But the city hired a lot of people with wagons who swept off part of Fifth avenue and dumped the snow in the East river so they could hold on.
