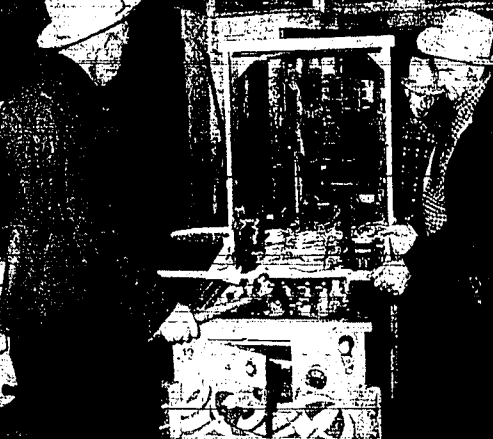

Farmer Plans Leader Flays GOP Policies

DENVER, March 21 (AP)—The president of the National Farmers Union has charged the administration's farm policies have turned agriculture "into an island of depression in a sea of prosperity."

James O. Patton, in an address to the union's biennial convention, said Agriculture Secretary Benson and his administration "have failed American agriculture . . . and failed it miserably."

Patton said, "are in serious trouble" and the only way they can get their "rightful share of goods and national income is to have reorganization and for an administration that will assure them a party income."

The Union president accused the administration of using the phrase "burdenome surplus" to hide and cover up the lack of imagination, "clinging and common sense" that characterize our farming and agricultural policies.

He termed the soil bank program an "unworkable, unproductive, unprofitable" and said farm income must be raised, or "farmers will continue to go broke by the thousands."

Jury Upholds Right to Take Beer Supplies

JACKSON, Miss., March 21 (AP)—The Mississippi supreme court has affirmed the right of the Tupelo police department to take 10,800 cans of beer from a woman who said she bought it for her personal use.

The woman, Bobbie Kintz, was stopped by Tupelo police Sat. May for speeding and they found the 100 cases of beer in the truck she was driving.

In Mississippi, beer is sold on local option and it was up to the court to determine whether they accepted the statement that the 10,800 cans of beer were for her personal consumption.

If so, no action could be taken. On the trial of her suit to recover the lost beer, the woman testified she drank four or five cans daily and that she had purchased the beer in Columbus for her own use.

The court wryly commented that the jury could not have logically decided the beer was for her own consumption unless she was an extremely provident person as anticipating a tremendous drought in the beer market and was protecting her inordinate thirst for the invigorating beverage for six years to come.

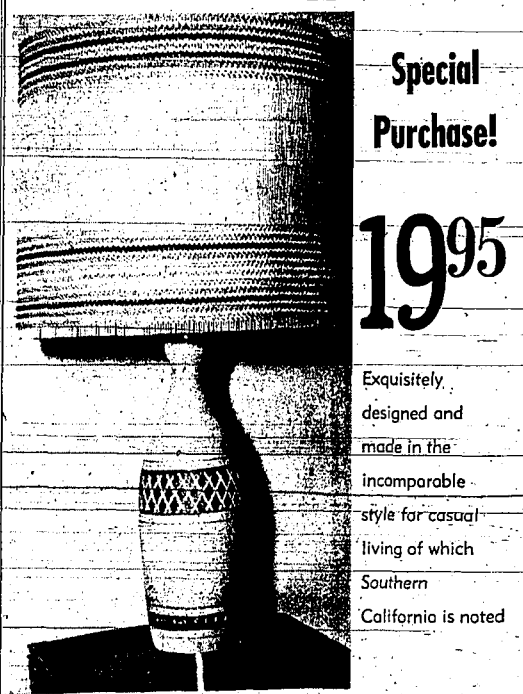

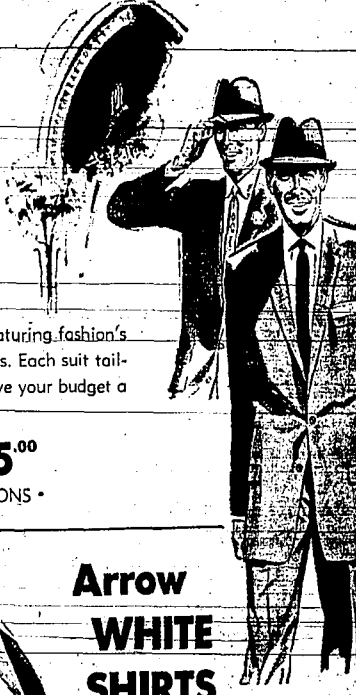

Major Oil Companies Viewing Idaho-Oregon Potential Fields

DAYTON, March 21 (AP)—Several of the nation's major oil companies are looking into a plan to probe the Snake river basin to a depth of possibly 10,000 feet in their quest for oil and gas reserves, oilman H. K. Riddle said today.

Riddle, president of Orco Oil and Gas company, said his firm, working in connection with other companies, has drilled a dozen exploratory wells on a million acres in western Idaho and eastern Oregon.

"They've proved that there's marketable gas here," he said. "It's better than the San Juan basin gas—cleaner and more marketable."

Pacific Northwest Pipeline company currently is laying pipe to bring gas from the San Juan basin of New Mexico to the Northwest.

"The whole industry would like to see a deep test drilled up here," Riddle added. "Actually, nothing is definite about what formations will be encountered below the volcanic belts which we find at about 4,000 feet. One of the greatest oil and gas fields in the world could be under these volcanic flows."

The oilman said such a test would cost "a million dollars or more." It would dip into sediments believed to have been deposited "under the buried lava flows by water of a prehistoric sea. Such sediments are similar to those in which the rich oil deposits of Oklahoma and West Texas were discovered," Riddle said.

Riddle said firms interested include Sinclair Oil company, Pacific Northwest Pipeline, Lin Oil company, a division of Monsanto Chemical company, El Paso Natural Gas company which serves eastern markets, and Los Angeles oilman Edwin W. Pauley.

Riddle said Orco had drilled one well for Pauley and plans others. The company is currently drilling a well for El Paso Natural, which has reached a depth of about 2,000 feet.

"We said El Paso had contracted for the drilling of several more wells and Orco has 'half a dozen

other deals cooking with that many companies."

Orco drills the wells under an arrangement called in the oil industry a "farmout." Orco subsidizes other companies, but retains what Riddle calls a "substantial interest in the area leased."

Riddle said Orco had leases extending from north of Wallace to south of Caldwell and from Emmett, Idaho, to Vale, Ore. Boise Industrialist R. Simpson has a "20 to 25 percent" interest in some of the leases, he added.

Riddle indicated if marketable gas deposits are developed in the area, the gas will be sold to companies such as Pacific Northwest Pipeline.

Riddle indicated the major companies are "chiefly interested in building up reserves against the day when the nation's gas and oil supplies run low. And he added that he does not necessarily expect immediate results from his work in western Idaho."

"I started out in the San Juan basin 10 years ago when it was just about the way this is now," he said.

"And I struggled along for four years before I sold a nickel's worth of gas. Now it's the biggest gas field in the world."

Welker Plays AEC's Offers For Reactors

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—Sen. Herman Welker, R., Ida., yesterday said atomic power reactors are potentially dangerous and should be built in isolated places—like Arco, Ida.

Welker in a senate speech said "there is absolutely no justification for building atomic power reactors at sites like Shippingport, Pa.; 30 miles from Pittsburgh. A private firm has contracted with the atomic energy commission to build a reactor to produce 60,000 kilowatts of electric power.

Welker also said that "anyone but a conscientious idiot knows that if you want atomic power ever to be competitive, the last place in the world to build a reactor would be at Shippingport... sitting on top of a coal field."

Precautions Taken
The atomic energy commission said when it announced the Shippingport location that every reactor precaution would be taken to insure safe operation of the reactor and to avoid any undue hazards to residents in the area.

Welker said the AEC bought 400-acre site of land in big state of Idaho to create a safe experiment station for nuclear reactors. He said power reactors should be built at other remote places, until they are demonstrated safe and until they are economically competitive.

Challenges Barriers
He challenged the AEC's contention that power reactors already are built as safe enough to build in big cities.

Welker quoted a report of a civilian panel on atomic energy which said last January, "no 100 per cent safe reactor has as yet been constructed, and no one is safe as yet."

He said the staff of the joint committee on atomic energy warned last November that "there seems to be an appalling lack of scientific analysis of the question of danger which might be caused by a run-away reactor."

Worries Comment
The AEC declined to comment on Welker's speech. But atomic authorities called attention to a report issued last July by a group of private insurance company experts that "the question of danger in locating a nuclear reactor near population centers.

The insurance experts said that "the possibility of a serious catastrophe" resulting from malfunctioning of an atomic power reactor "seems very remote."

It said elaborate safety controls are built into reactors. In the unlikely event that all of them should fail at once, measures are taken for "containment" of the radioactivity that would result. For example, the Shippingport reactor is being built inside a huge metal "cage."

U.S. Industry Competes for Trained Men

NEW YORK, March 21 (AP)—American industry is sending more talent than ever before to colleges and universities for the most valuable commodity for the most valuable young men.

Companies competing to sign up for the '56 crop are making their offers \$25 a month higher than last year to get the best young men. Some firms are offering \$5,000 a year or more to begin with.

A survey of major industrial corporations shows that each of them has a high-powered executive in charge of getting a share of the limited number of technically trained graduates getting diplomas this year.

In some fields there are three times as many jobs open as there are graduates qualified to fill them.

Company placement bureaus are strained. Representatives of 210 companies have shown up at 100 interviews.

The young man adept with a slide rule is king. With a background in electronics in prospect he is likely to be interviewed by a dozen or more companies and can count on getting work for as much as \$9,000 a month to start if he is picked up by one of the better firms.

The talent search is a long and costly process for industry. Some companies make the scouting process a year-round affair. They may spend well over \$1,000 filling a single job.

New Anti-Stalin Drive of Communists Is Surging Forward Almost Unabated

The communist drive to reduce people to the status of red slaves is surging forward almost unabated. The drive was set off by a speech on the Soviet side by Soviet Party Secretary Nikita Khrushchev, who was not among the disaffected.

However, Georgi Malenkov, chairman of the Politburo, in a question-and-answer period to have scathed the appearance of a Labor Party Stalin legend of old-time rule and lauded in London.

These developments brought an unmistakable lightning of excitement over dispatches from Moscow by western correspondents. But they seemed to have little effect on the family's campaign of the Soviet in its dealings with the West.

Western Area Water Supply Said 'Normal'

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—The outlook for summer water supply for federally irrigated areas in the West is about normal, according to a report issued by the Bureau of Reclamation.

The bureau said this represented an improvement gain over conditions at this time in recent years, as a result of higher precipitation during the winter and greater reservoir storage.

Low Areas Cited
Reclamation Commissioner W. A. Duzend said the principal areas of subnormal snow cover were in the Rio Grande basin in New Mexico, the Salt river drainage area in Arizona, and in southern Nevada, Lake Mead, on the Colorado river between Arizona and Nevada, had only 11,000,000 acre-feet of water stored March 1. This was the lowest level since the lake was first filled beyond that stage, and resulted from two critical drought years. The lake has active storage capacity of 27,200,000 acre-feet.

However, precipitation in the Colorado river basin from October through February was 118 per cent of the 25-year average and the snow cover was reported to be from 125 to 150 per cent of March 1 normal.

New Forecast
Current forecasts for runoff from April through September indicate that the 1951 precipitation may be about that of 1954 and 1955 combined.

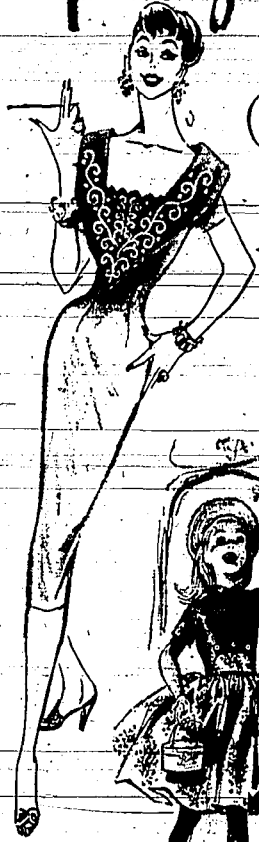

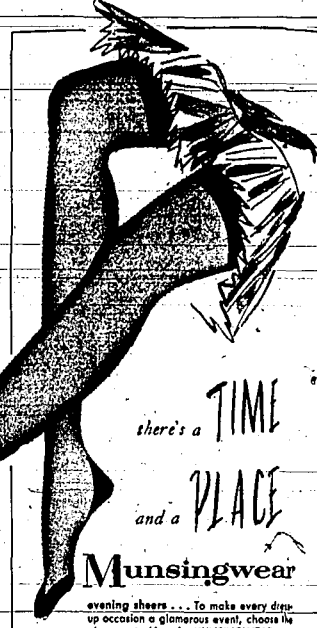

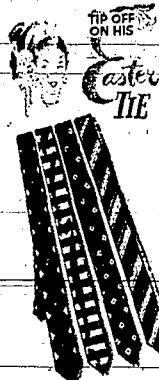
