3,000 Phones Are Ready in Dial Cutover

RUPERT, March 23 — More than 3,000 telephones in the Twin Falls area are ready for the dial cutover which will begin Monday, Mrs. Dickson, president of the Telephone Company, said. The company has managed to get 1,000 more telephones ready for the cutover than in the previous year.

Postal Hints Are Outlined To Gardener

POSTMASTER: We gardeners advise you to get your plants for the safe delivery of their shrubbery and plants during the current spring planting season. We advise you to take certain steps to aid postal authorities.

"We have been informed by the Gardeners' Council of New York that this is the shipping season for nursery stock and plants. It is important that you take certain steps to aid postal authorities and without the cooperation of the purchaser, and delivery of plants and shrubs cannot be expected."

Francis said there were three steps that purchasers of nursery stock should take:

1. If you are on vacation, make arrangements to have a neighbor or friend take care of your plants and to plant them at a proper location until planting time. Otherwise, the plants may be damaged in transit.

Welker Feels Estes Victory Tells of Split

BOISE, March 23 — Senator Herman Welker predicted yesterday that the Minnesota primary vote would lead to a split in the Democratic party and nomination of a new presidential candidate.

A new name and a new face will emerge as the Democratic convention chooses the presidential nominee. Welker predicted that the party will be split between those arriving here from Washington and those from the state.

Welker said Senator Stuart Symington, D. Mo., "might be a Democratic possibility for the presidency." He also mentioned the name of Governor Averil Harriman, New York, as one of those of whom he would like to see in the White House.

Welker also predicted that President Eisenhower might veto the farm bill which cleared the senate recently unless a compromise conference committee cleans up the bill so it will be workable to benefit the American farmer.

He based his view on conversations with Secretary of Agriculture Benson, and a member of the senate agriculture committee.

"I still think that the party and caused by high, fixed parity and caused by the farm bill which I don't want to see the farmer moved under by market prices. I think everyone admits is the cause of our trouble," Welker said.

He predicted working out a plan to get more defense installations built in Idaho.

"It is my hope that we can get our money to go to other states," he said.

Welker will spend the week-end in his native New York and return to Boise Monday. He said he has arranged for several Idaho appearances during the recess. He is a candidate for re-election this year.

Rumors Grow Of Big Split in Dem's Ranks

ATLANTA, Ga., March 23 — Talk of a third political party for farmers in Minnesota yesterday as the state's primary election approached, but little change of heart in South Carolina where a similar party was started in 1948, the way is cleared for the formation of a third party in the coming presidential election.

At Columbia, S. C., the South Carolina Democratic Party passed a resolution that would allow the state delegates to throw their support to a third party in the event the Democratic nominee or the party platform is distasteful to the South.

The South Carolina Democratic Party proposed a south-wide stand at the convention to make easier the southern demand for a policy of continued state's rights.

Most of the supporters of Adlai Stevenson in the South today assume that the Minnesota primary was a "trial run," but some backers of the former Illinois governor admitted that Stevenson now will have to fight hard to win the nomination.

Utah Polygamist Is Ordered to Jail

SALT LAKE CITY, March 23 — Albert Edmund Hartley, 35-year-old Salt Lake county construction worker, was ordered to jail yesterday following his conviction for violating the anti-polygamy law.

Judge Fay Cox, Jr., sentenced Hartley to an indeterminate term of more than five years and postponed his start until April 10, to give Hartley's attorney time to file an appeal.

Hartley was accused of plural marriages involving three women.

Radar Will Be Used to Trace Meteors, Eye Space Secrets

COLUMBUS, O., March 23 (AP)—Fred L. Whipple told the American Astronomical Society today that radar systems will be set up in southern Massachusetts by Harvard Observatory in conjunction with the Lincoln Laboratory of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

It will consist of a powerful radar transmitter and six high receiving antennas to pick up the radar pulses bounced off the meteor and the trail of electrons it leaves in the upper atmosphere.
