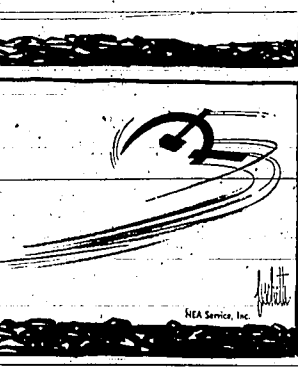

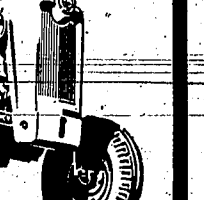

Salvage Eyed For Wreck in Mud of River

BROWNSVILLE, Pa., March 27 (AP)—A salvage operation is under way on the last leg of a training flight, as the wreckage of a biplane is recovered from the mud of the Monaca river. The wreckage was discovered by the pilot to save his crew's lives. The bodies of the pilot, 17-year-old D. Teger, Paoli, Neb., and his two flight companions were believed to be in the mud-crusted wreckage of the plane.

The aircraft, en route from Columbus, O., to Queen Point, Pa., ran into trouble early Monday when one of its two engines failed.

"Piling" Teger, veteran riverman, believed Teger attempted to "pitch" his ship in the winding channel of the river, guided by the glow of the beehive coals lining the banks. At the point, they said, there is a jutting shallow of rocks. Winona said the plane pulled up for another try, but landed "cross river," missing the deep channel.

Reported trapped in the muck plane with Teger were Lieut. (1st) Lawrence F. Ann, Colorado Springs, Colo., and Aviation Machine Mate 2/O Charles W. Resubel, Barton, Pa.

The navy sent a five-man board of inquiry here to investigate the crash. Salvage experts arrived from Queen Point to plan recovery of the plane and the crew.

Full Aboard Water

Only two feet of the jutting tail surface of the ship showed above water. Nearby shore crews attempted to bring the sunken craft to shore, only 50 feet away, but were unsuccessful.

In Columbus, O., the navy checked the possibility of whether fuel contamination could have caused the crash of the plane.

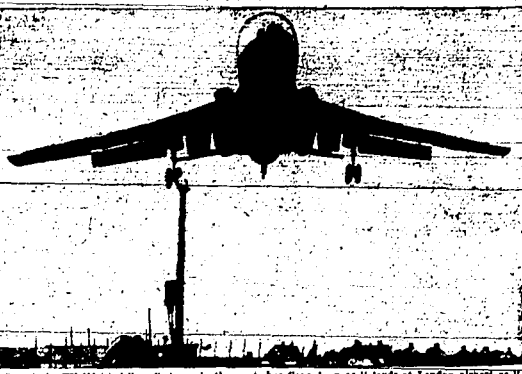
Chinese Discover Fossile Age Fan

Russians Display Interest in Popular Music and Royalties

LONDON, March 27 (AP)—Someday soon you may be dancing to a tune that started its life deep in the heart of Russia under a title like "Collective Farm Number 30, I Love You."

For the Russians are suddenly displaying a shrewd interest in Western popular music, especially the chance of Soviet songwriters collecting royalties just like those capitalists living Berlin, Cole Porter and Rodgers and Hammerstein.

No one knows what caused the about-face. Tin Pan alley is as lively as ever. The new Russian attitude toward its activities as Whitehall is befuddled by the campaign to cut Joseph Stalin down to size.

Until now the Russians have always refused to join the international copyright conventions. Without this protection their music is in the public domain—that is, available to anyone who wants to publish it.

They used to display slavish difference when it was pointed out so many hit songs have been "borrowed" from Russian composers.

Some one once wrote a satire about it called "Everybody Makes Money but Tchaikovsky."

A few years ago Khrushchev's "Sabre Dance" was a hit parade leader. One American firm thought it had an exclusive arrangement to publish it, only to find a competitor publishing the same melody. And so now Ralph Peer, head of the worldwide chain of Southern Music companies, believes the Russian attitude is changing. He is awaiting a visa to discuss with officials in Russia what steps can be taken to protect their music from pirating and to ensure that Russian composers get their just royalties.

Peer was instrumental in arranging the same sort of coverage for Latin American music in the days when it, too, was in the public domain. He said recently he did not feel he ought to discuss his mission to Moscow but he would not be making it if he did not think there was a chance of success.

Russian composers have always been strong on melody and if they do get publication in the West it is quite possible their tunes will be heard on the hit parade.

Yankee Film To Be Given Board Ship

WASHINGTON, March 27 (AP)—The United States plans to show a special stage built on the flight deck of a light aircraft carrier, which was displayed today.

The dramatic presentation, which depicts America and much of American life, would be used to underwrite communist propaganda among the peoples of Africa, Middle East and Far East.

In a year's operations, the carrier is to be taken from the north Atlantic—would present the spectacular 30-camera film to audiences in 10 ports from French Africa to Japan.

The government estimates the cost will be \$8 million dollars—about \$3 for every person who sees the special show.

Theodore C. Struber, director of the U. S. Information Agency, and Robert W. Whann, the agency's deputy director, spelled out details of the plan for a House appropriations subcommittee on Tuesday.

They said that the "theater," on the carrier flight would hold 2,000 persons for each performance, and two performances could be put on at night. They estimated that the carrier could put on performance 275 days a year, the other days going for travel.

Sheik Will Have Wedding No. 40

BERSHEBA, Israel, March 27 (AP)—Sheik Suleiman, a Bedouin chief of the Blue tribe in Israel's Negev grazing land is making plans for his wedding again. It will be his 40th.

The sheik has chosen an 18-year-old German girl named Brigitte. The old German girl and her husband first vows a year ago by mail. Suleiman has since seen Brigitte a gold watch and a Bedouin gown lavishly embroidered by two other wives.

The affair with Brigitte Marogala began when word of the sheik's matrimonial exploits reached Europe. Candidates for the post of wife No. 40 showed him with photographs, their measurements and their portraits.

The sheik's portrait attracted many of them. He is not handsome in the western sense, but he has a powerful and virile gaze, a grizzled white beard and teeth unspiced by age. The sheik says he is about 60, but most of his 75 sons say he must be nearer 65.

Measures Taken To Curb Menace

BOISE, March 27 (AP)—The city of Boise and Ada county are teaming up to help solve a realtor's problem in the area.

The Ada county board of commissioners announced that resolutions have been passed calling for licensing of trash haulers in the county and providing methods by which householders may store refuse until it is picked up.

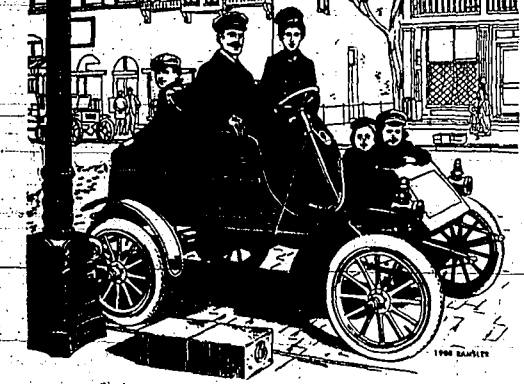
