### Army's Electronic Brain Has 'Memory' Working; Tests Set

DETROIT, March 28 (AP)—The "memory" unit, already, the army's giant new electronic brain, is nearing complete assembly. Crews of workers are on 24-hour duty installing the intricate electronic data processing system at the army ordnance "tank" automotive command. Some time in June the machine will be put to work keeping track of supplies all over the world. It will be able to record data on the more than 200,000 items from nuts and bolts to fuel pumps and tank engines on hand at army depots. It will be able to give a complete inventory when supplies fall below the "safety level." Right now engineers for Radio Corporation of America, which designed the machine, are supervising skilled electricians in the installation job. It's a project that has 16 bosses for 13 workers—16 engineers check every step as the 13 electricians wire each of Bluma's 200 separate units together. ### Scientist Makes General Predictions For Cool and Wet Weather Periods

NEW YORK, March 28 (AP)—You can look for a general change in our weather, bringing cooler and wetter summers, fewer hurricanes, less snow in the East Coast and New England, perhaps fewer tornadoes spilling into Northern states. These long-range predictions come from Prof. Hurd C. Willett, meteorologist of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge. He finds evidence we are at the end of a warming-up period that extended over the last 40 years, from about 1915 to the present. The 40 years before that, from about 1875 to 1915, had been warmer and cooler, making grandpapa right in his declaration that our winters aren't what they used to be. For the next 40 years, Prof. Willett says, we should be going back to cooler, wetter weather, in a slow change. But it probably will not be however, very widely year by year, as cold and wet as the 1875-1915 period. Prof. Willett bases this upon a statistical analysis of weather trends over a large section of the northern hemisphere. Up-and-downs or short cycles can and do occur within a long-term 40-year trend. Recently there has been one such shorter period, warmer weather occurring within the long-term warming up trend. As part of the evidence for the recent general warm-up, Prof. Willett cites: Melted melting of glaciers in same areas from 1900 to 1940. This includes glaciers in the southern borders of Greenland. Average winter temperatures were about six degrees higher in southern Greenland and Iceland and 13 degrees higher in Spitzbergen during 1920-40 than 1910-20. For the last 30 years, icebergs have been fewer and not traveling as far south as they had been. Icebergs, however, may vary widely year by year, and are affected by winds and currents as well as by temperatures. Warm-water marine life has multiplied northward. Clams on the Northeast coast, for example, have been damaged by green crabs which formerly were not found north of the Long Island region. More knowledge of where we are heading weatherwise, and methods of improving weather forecasts, are expected to come from worldwide scientific studies during the International Geophysical Year starting in 1957. Scientists will cooperate in studies of wind circulations, changes in the sun's radiation, glaciation, ocean currents, and other factors that influence weather, climate, and human activities governed by climate and weather.

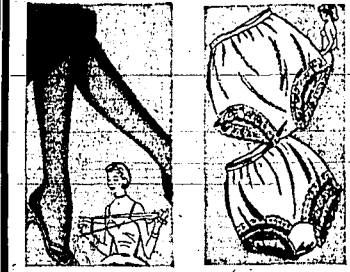

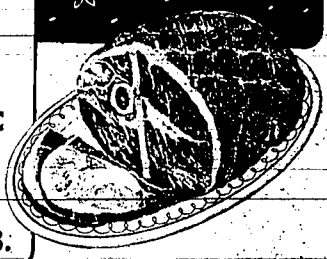

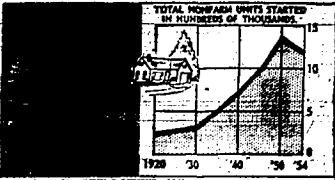

### Indian Claims Are Defended Against Plans

NEW YORK, March 28 — The Association of American-Indian Affairs said yesterday that high justice department officials are trying "behind closed doors" to change the 1946 Indian claims commission act.

"The nation's honor is involved," said association president Oliver La Farge in a statement. "This act sets a new low in the long record of the government's dealings with the American Indians."

La Farge said the 1946 act was passed to settle "the main claims of the Indian tribes against the United States, especially for failure to carry out treaty obligations and for taking of land without adequate compensation."

It was the intention of congress that all these claims should be settled once and for all time," he said. The justice department, La Farge said, has opposed every Indian claim made under the act regardless of its merits.

Now, he said, "Justice officials, headed by Asst. Atty. Gen. Fred Norton, have been lobbying for weeks to frighten members of the congress about the "immense problem" and the vast sum . . . which the Indians might collect."

"If the act is not passed, the Indians will be forced to sue for their claims."

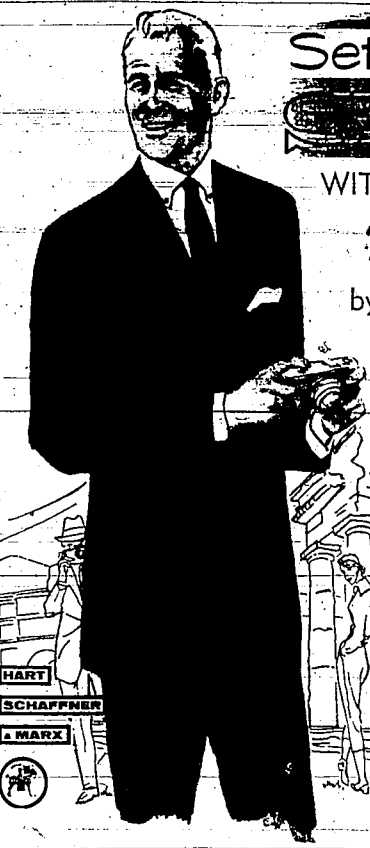

### Union Ousts 2 Leaders on Red Charges

DENVER, March 27—The Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers' union plans to remove from its payroll two officials who have been convicted of falsifying records that they were not communists.

The independent union headquarters announced yesterday that Maurice E. Travis, its former secretary and treasurer, will be paid \$200 a month. And the union said it would discharge Clifton Jenkins, once president of a mine-mill local at Bayard, N. M., as of June 1, with severance pay.

Travis, a burly man who lost an eye during strike violence at Bessemer, Minn., and Smelter Workers' union, was charged two years ago at Denver with filing false anti-Red affidavits to the national labor relations board.

He resigned as mine-mill secretary and treasurer because his trial because the union tried to deny the union its services in labor disputes on an affidavit that Travis was obviously a red sympathizer. The union blocked the NLRB in the courts, but accepted Travis' resignation and made him a business agent in California.

Travis was defended by mine-mill attorneys in federal court on the anti-Red affidavits, and they won an appeal that Travis was Travis is free in bond.

Jenkins convicted

Jenkins was convicted of the same crime in federal court at El Paso, Tex., in 1944, and also in free bond while awaiting appeal.

A mine-mill spokesman said it was decided to retain Travis and fire Jenkins at an executive board meeting during the mine-mill convention at Salt Lake City last week.

The big union, which has more than 70,000 members in the United States and Canada, was expelled by the CIO six years ago for pharisees that it was dominated by reds. It has been reported recently making overtures to be re-admitted.

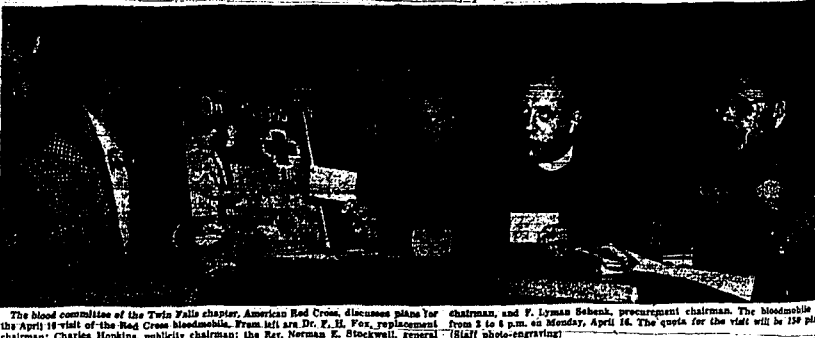

WASHINGTON, March 28—Internal revenue service officials said today their crackdown on Communist party and Daily Worker offices has nothing to do with political rights or freedom of the press.

The officials stressed the seizure are strictly a federal move to collect alleged back taxes.

An internal revenue official here gave this explanation when asked how the seizure compared with last year's treatment of the two major political parties.

The Republican and Democratic national committees made annual reports to congress of their assets, liabilities and expenditures. They keep accurate books and records open to inspection. As "non-ide" non-profit organizations, they are not required to pay taxes on their gifts income.

But the Communist party claimed it had no books or records and did not know what happened to money it handled. It has never filed a financial statement with congress and has not requested a tax-exempt status.

Yandle said he would return to Caldwell Sunday and resume his duties as teacher and baseball coach.

"We are continuing therapy as though it were a thrombosis," the physician said.

He said the spasm probably was caused by Anderson's physical exertion in the game, in which he scored 20 points, and the emotional upset from the loss.

It was possible the spasm would have led to death by causing a thrombosis and heart block, a decrease in nerve impulse to the heart, the doctor said.

Anderson was reported "improved" Monday and Garland said treatment had led to a "brighter picture" for the player.

"I am sure that Anderson's career as a basketball player, Garland said.

"That we can't say. It is possible that he might play again."

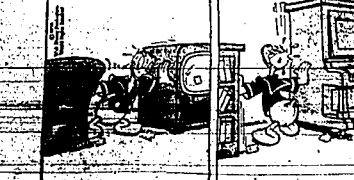

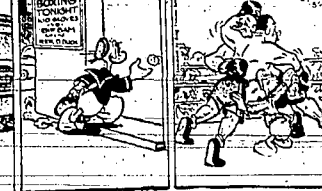

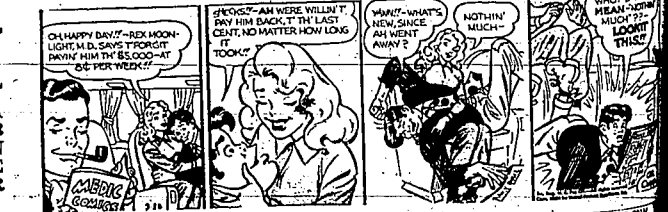

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—An old political pro dropped by the office the other day to swap bits of information for bits of information, and commented the following: "If you think Sam Rayburn and Tom Pendergast are going to give the farmers and Benaca a billion bucks to scatter among farmers right away, quick, you're crazy."

Sam Rayburn, of course, is the distinguished Democratic speaker and Tom Pendergast is the Democratic leader. A pair of Texas. Sam Rayburn is secretary of agriculture and you know who the other is.

The old pro may have been a bit cynical. But the old timer to whom Pendergast was talking has not observed so much political horseplay since 30 years of observing as this year.

Even Pendergast was able to rise above principle when it became obvious that the administration's lower farm subsidy policy had to be rescinded for farmers in an election year. And if the Democrats aren't playing for time on this one, then experts are breaking uncommonly well for them on its own. With the Easter recess coming up, it develops now that congress will not be able to dispose of the farm bill until after April 1.

The word from the agriculture department is that April 15 is the absolute deadline for enactment of the legislation if it is to have its maximum effect this year. By maximum effect means the maximum pay-off of sol bank money. The those farmers who undertake to withdraw crop and from production in an effort to reduce surpluses. 


