Communist-Led Bid Ousts Iceland Force

REYKJAVIK, Iceland, March 29 (AP)—Iceland's parliament has called on U.S. forces to quit this North Atlantic defense post. The move would leave the strategic island—NATO member almost midway between Moscow and New York—without military force. The Communist-supported resolution was adopted 31-19 last night over conservative opposition. It asked that all NATO forces be pulled out "in view of the altered situation" since 1951. At that time the United States and Iceland agreed on the stationing of U.S. troops and air force units under NATO command.

Corn Byproduct Waterproofs Soils, Used to Hardtop Roads

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., March 20.—Some Indiana scientists have figured out how to waterproof the soil.

The chemical they have developed may some day be sprayed on dirt roads to make them shed water as if they were paved.

DDAC, as the chemical is called, can be made from corn and "Coke" Craig of Indiana is giving serious attention to its possibilities. He believes it may help solve one of the Midwest's greatest farm problems—the surplus of corn.

Already, millions of two sections of highway in Indiana are driving over a roadbed treated with the corn product. Researchers are waiting to see how the soil holds up under a full year of freezing and thawing and what and how the corn-hog economy of the Midwest is dead end with the market for hog skins.

Craig is enthusiastic. "I believe the corn-hog economy of the Midwest is dead end with the market for hog skins. I believe it will go a long way toward ending the corn surplus. It will make a big cut in the hog-raising cost and make the hog-raising business more profitable."

Craig heard about DDAC through Earl E. Fisher, president of the United States Refining company of Columbus, Ind. A research team at Columbus with cooperation of the chemical division of Armour and company, developed DDAC as a soil stabilizing agent.

The researchers found DDAC "harder" to harden many different types of soil. It can be used on dirt roads or on the ground that soil beneath paved roads costs about \$200 to treat a mile of subgrade soil as a road is widened.

Craig compares the possibilities of DDAC with the use of science for soybeans.
