

U.S. Court To Rule on Top Issues

WASHINGTON, April 2 (UPI)—The supreme court meets today to deliver opinions which may deal with important civil rights issues, including President Eisenhower's new federal employment security program. The justices may also decide on a racial segregation case.

The employment security case stems from the appeal of Kenneth M. Cole, an anti-communist food and drug inspector in New York City, who was fired as a security risk by former Welfare Secretary Clegg. Cole's attorney, John J. H. Hobbs, claims Mr. Eisenhower's executive order is unconstitutional. The court also has under advisement a constitutional test of the federal security act, which requires Communist organizations to register with the government and file their books and records.

The court may either accept or reject the government's position on the first case, which has been argued by the government and the American Civil Liberties Union. The government argues that the act is constitutional, while the ACLU argues it is not.

The court is not likely to announce its decision until October, when the president will presumably have signed the act. The case is not a clear-cut one, and the court's decision could have a major impact on the future of the act.


Waco Airplanes 'Ditto Crash' at Burley Airport





Drive Started On Bolstering Help to Israel

WASHINGTON, April 2 (AP)—A group of 50 major Republicans is considering a major campaign to end special aid to the administration's \$4 billion dollar foreign aid bill to bolster Israel in its struggle with the Arab states.

Rep. Kenneth B. Keating, R-N.Y., said the group's minimum goal would be to force a statement of congressional intent in the foreign aid bill to Israel economically. He did not say whether the group would try to add funds to the bill for Israel to buy military weapons.

The group was expected to be joined by a number of Democrats who have been calling for the administration to increase aid for the Jewish nation.

Keating heads a special five-man committee which is expected to be the driving force in efforts to get the administration to grant Israel aid to buy defense arms from the United States.

The committee reported last week that it had secured legislation to "clarify" aid regulations to insure peace in the tense Middle East area.

Meeting called Keating said he will call a meeting soon to arrange for a conference of all 50 GOP congressmen. This strategy would be to build a strong agreement on the amount Congress would be asked to add to the foreign aid bill.

The measure authorizing foreign aid spending for the fiscal year starting July 1 is now undergoing intensive study by the House foreign affairs committee.
