Snow, Water Top Average

MALTA, April 6—Both the snow and the water content of the snow are above average for the month on the north fork of Sublette canyon, Power Ranger Bureau staff reported Friday. He and Dale Munk and Jack Walker of the soil conservation service made a survey of the snow Tuesday.

The average snow depth for the month was 37.47 inches. Last year the average depth was 22.7 and the average for the last 10 years is 34.3 inches. The deepest snow ever recorded in April was in 1912 when 50.4 inches were measured. The smallest amount was measured in 1947. At that time the snow was only 1.9 inches deep.

The water content of the snow this year is 12.8 inches compared to 9.84 inches last year and 11.39 inches for the 10-year average. The highest measurement in April was in 1932 when 18.5 inches were recorded and the lowest was in 1947 when only 8.4 inches of water were measured.

Demo Senate Chief Praises Farmer Bills

JOHNSON CITY, Tex., April 6 (AP)—Senate Majority Leader Lyndon B. Johnson, D. Tex., said yesterday that he was confident Congress would act on the farm bill next week and that he hoped President Eisenhower would sign it.

Johnson said the bill was substantially the same one the Democrats tried to pass in the 83rd Congress. But the administration fought it into the ground.

"If the administration had learned two years ago what it appears to have finally learned at this late date, the American farmer would not be in his present difficulty," Johnson said.

"As it is now, help comes two years too late but it does look at least as though there will be better days ahead soon."

Johnson said he has been in daily touch with Senate and House conferees in Washington and said it was "a pretty good farm bill right now."

"I was afraid that the President might follow Mr. Branson's advice and veto it," Johnson said. "But I gather he has been hearing from the people in Minnesota and Wisconsin and has finally learned that the farmer is in dire trouble."

The reports of his press conference yesterday indicate that he may sign the bill. I certainly hope so."

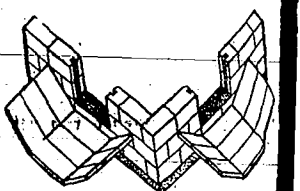

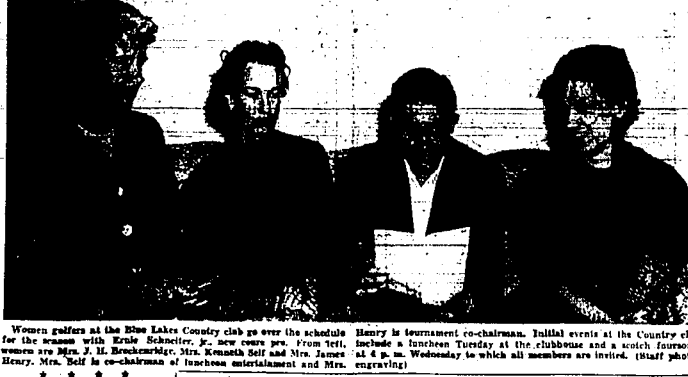

39 Years Ago, April 6, 1917, America Entered World War, Began Long Trip

WASHINGTON, April 6 — This is the 19th anniversary of the day that the American people stepped off smartly in a new direction with an intimate confidence in the path to which a first step leads. It has been a rough road.

There was a time of simpler but busily living. There was no traffic problem to speak of and women were not widows in saloons. There were the days when the fourth of July really sounded like it, there being few, if any, law, law then against juveniles of all ages blowing their hands off with high explosives.

The horse still was king and sparrows swarmed the city streets. Worst watches were for the ladies. If at all, and a man-wore-one-was considered to be pathologically offensive. The United States had been living in a tight and happy little world bounded by Canada, Mexico and three large bodies of water.

That's the way it was on April 6, 1917, when President Wilson and the congress took the United States into World War I. The New York Times had a few days later an exclusive story from Washington speculating that, maybe, some troops would be sent to Europe.

The speculation was based on a reporter's discovery that someone in the war department had ordered 30,000 tin hats. Thirty thousand!

Barring some marines in Central America, the United States in 1917 didn't have a gun pointing at anyone anywhere in the world.

Woodrow Wilson had not been a forerunner nor as soundly in control of congress as was FDR nearly a generation later. Wilson got his first hit six weeks after war began.

foodstuffs for the hungry European later, the United States still is at war which, at this moment, is cold. It is the publicly spoken judgment of responsible American officials that the United States in very recent years and now is in the most perilous position it has known so far.

There have been some pauses, interludes and interludes of more or less peace for the United States since April 6, 1917. The world crisis into which the U. S. stepped that day has been unintermitted, but never-and-never-without-stagnationally significant fighting somewhere.

In those years the American citizen has become accustomed to a high rate of taxation, a high degree of centralized government and a high standard of living which could not have been imagined by the citizen soldiers who went to war in 1917-18.

The highest altitude, however, has been reached by the national debt. The debt is the sum by which the nation has lived beyond its means since April 6, 1917.

It would no longer be possible, however, to bear again the suffering expressed by the late George Harkny, returning in the mid-1920's from his
