









### Man Reports Red Brutality To Prisoners

TOKYO, April 10 (AP)—A repatriated Japanese held captive for 10 years in Russia and today were told of the following prisoners' reports of the Soviet concentration camp last December.

"The Soviets said the rebellion was the result of 'unbearable' conditions in the Soviet camps," the Japanese said.

Writing in the Shukan Shukan magazine, Shibusawa said the rebels were "unbearable" because they were "not considered men like above and worked for years as faithful slaves, have to return to such strong measures," Shibusawa asked.

"This of course was due to the inhuman conditions of the Soviet Union and the attitude of the Soviet Union toward its prisoners," Shibusawa said.

"We were all subjected to an unbearable agency caused by unbearable imposition of labor, a lack of food, and insufficient ability of doctors, inadequate medical attention and so forth," he said.

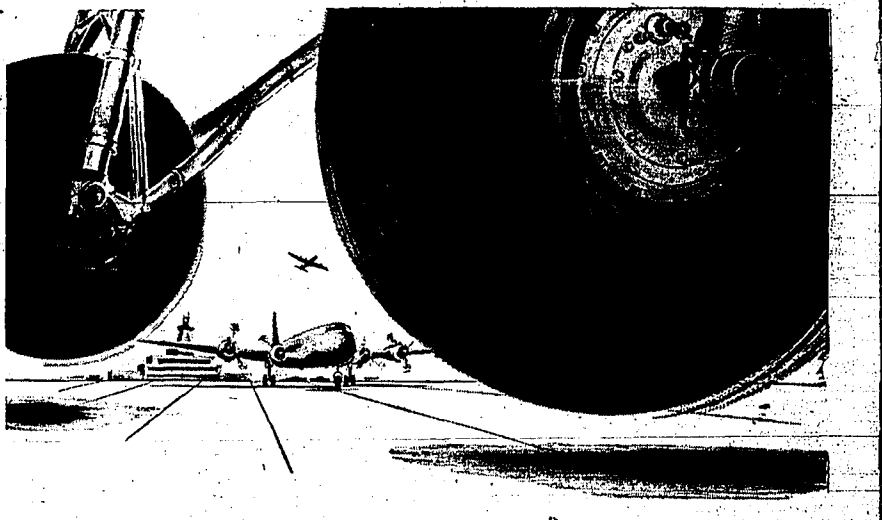

## Debate Starts For Proposed Military Fund

WASHINGTON, April 10 (AP)—The House today began a debate on a proposed \$1 billion dollar military construction program.

The program includes new facilities to work on ballistic missiles and on atomic-powered plants. Actual voting on the measure starts tomorrow.

The bill authorizes \$1 billion dollars for the six form, including \$1.5 million dollars for a giant runway to test an atomic-powered plane. The army would get 304 million dollars including 12 million dollars for an army aviation center at Camp Hunter, Ala.

The navy's share would be 441 million dollars, including a new jet training base at McEntire, Miss., and a new jet operating base at Lemoore, Calif.

The measure includes a \$300,000 combination office, home and communications center for the chairman of the joint chiefs of staff.

The authorization would provide for military facilities for testing and developing guided and ballistic missiles.

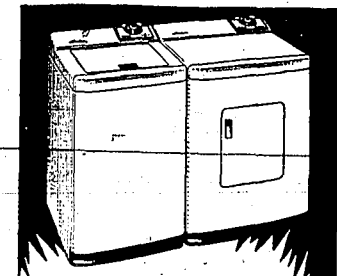

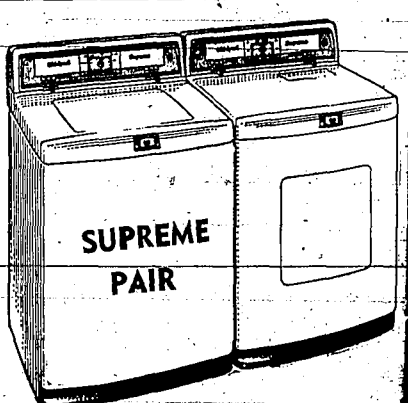
