Basic Source Of Farm Bills Fight Is Seen

WASHINGTON, April 13 (AP)—What the farm subsidy dispute has been all about is whether farmers shall own the money for the next election year, money to be distributed to Democrats or Republicans or to Democrats.

If President Eisenhower votes "No" on the bill, the money will go to the White House, the farmers' point of view is that the bill will not pass again. If he signs the bill, the money will go to the farm bill, a combination of congressional Democrats and Republican farm groups against the bill. Eisenhower and his cabinet associates.

Martin, Jr., R., Mass., house minority leader, said yesterday a new Mr. Eisenhower would veto the bill in the form in which it now must go to him.

Rep. Charles A. Halleck, R., Ind., said at a news conference yesterday he is backed Martin on that. The two veteran politicians have put themselves in a strange position and cause the President still might sign the farm bill.

Pressure Present

WASHINGTON, April 13 (AP)—The census bureau estimated yesterday that the total U. S. population, including armed forces overseas, was about 167,181,000 on March 1.

This represents an increase of 16,040,000 or 10.2 per cent, since the last census April 1, 1950. It is a rise of 2,814,000, or 1.7 per cent, from March 1, 1955.

The census bureau's population "clock," which registers the estimated net increase in the population from birth and immigration and death and emigration, put the population at 167,417,492 at 10:19 a.m. EST yesterday.

Border Scorched On Reds' Orders

VIENNA, April 13 (AP)—Hungarian border guards have set fire to the iron curtain to clear border areas of trees and underbrush.

Austrian border officials said yesterday "considerable damage" has been caused in several Austrian border villages where a still wind has spread the flames to some estate and houses.

Observers said the Hungarian Communists were clearing up the border to prevent defectors to the West and to strengthen their militarized death zone.

I fall into it about three hours after getting myself a forty-question quiz on "Are You Happy?" which I ran across while thumbing through a magazine.

Twenty-five correct answers were required in order to qualify as being "really happy." Twenty-five incorrect answers were required in order to qualify as being "not really happy." I got a score of 25 out of 50. And if I didn't answer eighteen I might have been "not really happy" and I would have had to start looking for a job to keep myself from going to sleep.

My score was "McLemon four," which certifies that I am in a dark corner and too blue.


I am convinced that to all in a similar spot behind the million and one quizzes that are offered in nearly every periodical you pick up, something is being developed an inferiority complex in people. You give yourself one on history and find out you're an ignorant as an old man. You examine yourself on etiquette and discover that you're lucky even to be asked out for dinner. Quizzes on "How do you know that you are not deaf, and aren't you whether it is Moses or Louis Armstrong who you write 'Moses' or 'Ramble'."

This country possibly is good for the people of a country. Individualism is a sound way to develop a nation, to be around with a back look, and to see all our forefathers in the crowd of strangers. (Those of us who have forefathers, that is, who do not have to depend on their forefathers to be able to reach up and grab a hand full of good, solid history.)

But how to combat the proliferation of the printed quizzes posed a problem of a country. Individualism, then, and it would be possible to keep people from giving their names to them. They fascinate young and old, the dull and the smart. Like peanuts, they're habit-forming. "More quizzes" on "What there's no getting."

About the only way I can see to combat this national "quiz" is to have public-spirited newspapers and mag-

Service Career Is Made Attractive

WASHINGTON, April 13 (AP)—The senate yesterday passed and to the house a bill designed to make the foreign service a more attractive career.

It would increase the present seven classes of foreign service officers classes from 12 to 15. The 2,533 persons affected would get an average pay increase of \$22 a year, or 1.6 per cent.

The measure also would raise the pay of 75 chiefs of mission—\$7,500 a year for 18 chiefs of class 1 missions and \$5,000 for the other three classes.
