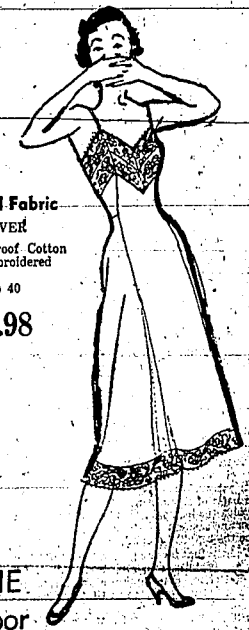

Costs Form of Accounting Is Eyed for U.S.

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—The White House today announced that it will study the cost accounting system used throughout the government. It said the new system would save millions of dollars within a few years.

The new plan for keeping the government's books was designed primarily to keep department heads more up-to-date on what they are spending and more on their toes about the cost of their operations.

The affected firms

The changes were out of recommendations by the second Hoover commission on organization of the executive branch of government. The change-over in accounting ultimately will affect the firms in which an annual budget is submitted to congress.

Meanwhile, Clarence Francis, national chairman of the citizens committee for the Hoover report, reported that 75 per cent of the recommendations of the second Hoover commission have been adopted.

He said the adopted recommendations ultimately will save the government 470 million dollars a year. The second Hoover commission filed its final report with congress last June 20.

Enlargement Seen

The new accounting system, announced in an exchange of correspondence between President Eisenhower and Budget Director Percival Brundage, will involve enlargement of the federal budget. Brundage expects to ask congress for a supplemental appropriation of \$400,000.

Realism of the new program is to get all departments and agencies on a cost accounting system, he said to make possible a budget based on social performance, rather than future obligations. Brundage said it might take as much as five years to put the new system into full effect. He proposed that congress be kept apprised at a time shift to cost-type budgeting.

African Area Soon to Have World Status

ROME, April 22 (AP)—While colonial Africa still rests, the United Nations trust territory of Somalia is moving peacefully and swiftly toward independence.

Italian diplomatic sources, reporting this today, disclosed:

1. Somalia will open its first parliament Monday.
2. Free status set.
3. The territory will have a full government of its own this year.
4. The last Italian regional official now are being replaced. By year's end, all regional and local administrative and governmental functions will be taken over by Somalia, under the U. N. administrator.
5. Progress has been so smooth a possibility exists that Somalia may be ready for complete independence before the 1960 goal set by the United Nations.

Somalia, whose picturesque major industry is providing half the world's incense, is an area of 194,000 square miles extending along the Indian ocean in east Africa. An Italian colony before World War II, it has a population of about 1,300,000.

Others waiting

An independent Somalia is expected to create difficulties for Britain and France in Africa. French and British Somaliland adjoin Somalia. Experts here believe Britain and France will face strong pressure from the local populations of their areas either for independence or union with Somalia, once the trusteeship ends.

Italy, which administers the U. N. Somalia trusteeship, cites the territory as an example of orderly progress toward sovereignty in an Africa torn by nationalist disorders from Kenya to Morocco.

 Suspected herds are obtained at the owner's request of lamb.
 Herd tests of two tests made in June, 1953, less than 20 per cent of the herds in Twin Falls county showed suspicious signs. In other words, more than 80 per cent of the herds tested now are free and no test is made of those that are added.
 Another ring test in Twin Falls county is scheduled in May. Following this ring test, local veterinarians will call on all herd owners whose milk samples are suspicious. Cattle found to have positive tests of brucellosis will be eliminated and the owner will be paid indemnity not to exceed \$25 on grade cattle and \$50 on purebreds.
 In the ring tests at least 20 per cent of the mature animals must be tested in each herd. If reactors are found on this testing, all registered herds must be tested over 8 months old must be tested.
 Officially vaccinated cattle do not have to be tested until they are 30 months of age. This applies to all range and dairy animals. All purebred registered herds must be tested to prevent the spread of the disease by sale or breeding.
 Vaccination and testing of cattle for the disease is a federal and state cooperative program which is supported by federal and legislative appropriations, Dr. Ward says. The most effective age for vaccination of animals is between 6 and 8 months.

Noted General Opposes Race Equality Move

CHARLESTON, S.C., April 28 (AP)—Gen. Mark W. Clark, former supreme commander of United Nations forces in the Far East, says he was opposed to integration of white and Negro troops "from the military point of view" when the government adopted the policy in 1950.

"I did not feel that we should integrate them, and I don't think so now," Clark, now president of The Citadel, South Carolina military college here, told a meeting of Southern Regional Conference of State Governments.

Clark said he based his opinion on his experience in Italy during World War II when he commanded the U. S. fifth army.

"The worst division I had was a Negro division," he said. Clark stated that the troops could not be relied on and said that they bolted from the enemy.

Idaho pheasants may not be as expensive as the famed "Robert's turkey" recipe, but they still cost a tidy sum. For a hunter to line up the rights of his pheasant in the state has led out \$1.50 to provide a target.

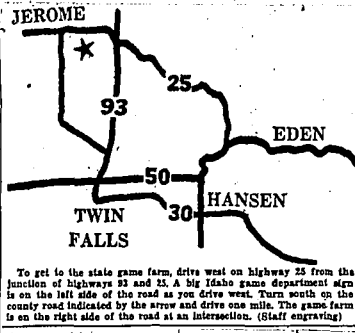
Take a trip to the state game farm near Jerome and watch firsthand the work that goes into providing pheasant targets for hunters. A batch of the little fellows is due to come off today and the work of raising pheasants can be observed in all its stages.

The state does not keep the birds from leaving the ground but the air the one wing held by the bird cannot be extended and the bird does a "half loop" and falls to the ground.

similar to those used on chicken farms. When any of the brood stocks are to be released they are driven through small openings into the fenced over pens and the broods removed. Some birds, released close to the farm, return to the farm rather than try to make their own way in the field.

The greatest numbers of pheasants are released in August with the last flock released in September shortly before the opening of hunting season. Gnomi said some pheasants are banded so the game department may obtain information regarding their habits and migrations.

He said he has banded returned from two birds that were five years old when killed. This will be the last year the farm will raise partridges for release. Gnomi says the stock is adequate at present and the game program does not call for raising any more at this time.



He has been at the game farm since 1939 and has been superintendent since 1943. There are 12 broods of pheasants in display pens. However, the only bird raised in any number is the Chinese. Other broods on display include Blue Mountain, Golden, Monahan, mutant and a cross between a Chinese and a Nepal Kallang. Gnomi says the latter is a hybrid and sterile. Partridges and quail also are on display. No quail are raised at the farm.

\$500,000 Will Be Given to Schools

When the hatch comes off Sunday, Gnomi and his staff will begin caring for 2,000 future targets. The chicks will be taken from the incubator as soon as they break through their shells and will be placed in brooder houses. After five weeks of indoor living they will be moved to fenced-over pens for release.

Partridge eggs are smaller than pheasant eggs and are speckled like turkey eggs. After a young partridge or pheasant is hatched, it is placed in brooder houses with cedar shavings lined floors for five weeks. After that they are kept in screened-over pens for five weeks and then placed in crates and transported to release points.

Gnomi says hatches of pheasants are due May 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14 and 16. He has two "sets" of partridge eggs due May 13 and 15. He says pheasants usually begin to lay eggs around May 1 but he has found eggs in the field as early as March 25. Pheasants will continue to lay eggs until July.

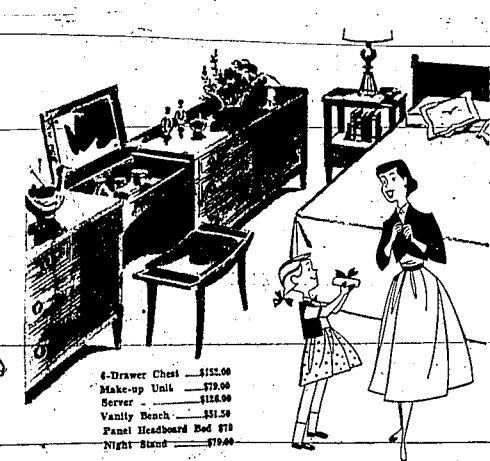

"Just how good was he?"
They ask it about all the great fighters. Even Jack Dempsey and Joe Louis had their doubters in the days they were on top and only time draped the mantle of youthful invincibility around them.
It figures to do the same for the Rock.
Because, while you might ask who did he beat? The answer remains that he beat every man he ever faced. Many didn't like his rushing, relentless, bull-dog style, but 49 guys went up against him and 49 of them went down to defeat.
Five of them—among the best of his era—be demolished and, to all intents and purposes, ended their careers at the top with his crushing flat. An aged and erring Louis was one. The others were highly-regarded fighters: Max Baer, the sly, but muscularly agile Jersey Joe Walcott, hopeful young Roland La Starza and many more.
There can be no doubt but that the Rock was handled very carefully early in his career. His opponents were hand-picked and well spaced. Yet, actually, this is the way it should have been.
The innocent-eyed Rock started in 1947 and had 16 straight knockouts by 1949. They didn't throw him to the tigers. Because it wasn't until 1950, after he had won 25 straight, that he went up against the equally young and spry Roland La Starza. Rocky won it close and, some said, was pitted against rollicking Rolfe for three years.

Magic Valley Hobbies No. 18 Man, Wife Team Uses Most Ancient Art as Hobby, Teaches it to Others



Most hobbyists are expected to produce material objects that can be seen, felt or used. Not so with Mr. and Mrs. F. N. Stowell, Shoshone. When they are absent, they are in their hobby. For 30 years they have made dancing their hobby and for the last 20 years they have been teaching their hobby to others.

That seems like a long time until one realizes the record of every people, from as far back as 50,000 years ago, shows that inhabitants had some form of dancing. In all probability, dancing antedates music; the first music probably being simply a rhythm, a chanting voice or the beat of a drum for dancing.

Called the oldest and sweetest of the arts, dancing is the language of the body. It is the expression of an emotion or feeling and may be social or personal and, like poetry and music, may be in any style or form.

There are many reasons for dancing. Children dance for joy. Primitive people believed dancing had magical powers. Some danced to bring victory, others to celebrate it. Today, there are people who dance for companionship and others who dance to escape the sameness of everyday living.

Mr. and Mrs. Stowell sincerely believe in Plato's statement "that the smile is the dance of the face while the dance is the smile of the body."
The Shoshone couple is of the opinion young people will dance whether elders frown or smile and that the thing to do is to provide the young people with proper facilities for desirable dancing experiences.
Adults and youths dance for different reasons, they contend. For the most part, adults look upon dancing as a passive while, for young people, social dancing combines two drives—romance and adventure. Youths turn to dancing for the romance of rhythm and alpha and movement and safety and for the adventure of seeing new faces and making new friends.
Mr. and Mrs. Stowell claim dancing can give peace and will school the emotions. It is a medium of exercise and provides an opportunity for social contact.
Their hobby has cost them countless hours of sleep but has proved to them over and over again they would rather dance than sleep. They began dancing together in 1913 under the LDS MIA program in Salt Lake City. The following year they moved to Twin Falls and since then have been active in the church's dance program. They have been teaching and have been dance directors until 1933 when they moved to a ranch near Rich-

field. For 13 years they have been directing dancing in the Shoshone ward of the church.
Under their direction have come the Gold and Green balls of the various states in which they have contributed their time and, in 20 years, they estimate they have taught at least 1,000 persons to dance. Frequently they have been called upon to fill vacancies in the dance routines they have worked out and directed.
As true hobbyists, they take their hobby seriously and strive for perfection. Although most of their dance directing has been in connection with the church, they also

have assisted in the direction of dances in school festivals. Even though they never had any professional training, the Stowells have written and directed several original dances.
Mrs. Stowell also wrote the dance routine for the Shoshone high school senior class at the class festival in 1930. She and her husband know more than 150 different dance routines.
In 20 years as dance directors, Mr. and Mrs. Stowell have traveled more than 20,000 miles going to and from dances and dance practice sessions. Often they are at practice sessions every night of the

week for three weeks in a row, driving from 15 to 150 miles each night.
For a couple of grandparents, that's an accomplishment. But despite the loss of sleep, the countless hours of training and the miles covered, both on the dance floor from dance, their enthusiasm for and in automobiles going to and their hobby doesn't wane. They are looking forward to many more years and many more miles of participation.
