WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—Adm. Arthur W. Radford has warned Congress the United States should not continue adding to the Korean armistice while the communists illegally build up their forces in North Korea.

Radford, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, told the House of Representatives in a hearing today that the situation in Korea is very serious, and that one from a military standpoint we will have to take a stand.

Radford said that the communists are building up their forces in North Korea at a rapid rate, and that this is a serious threat to the stability of the Korean peninsula.

Lt. Gen. Samuel Williams made this statement in an exclusive interview on the tenth anniversary of the fall of Dien Bien Phu.

"It is no question that the South Vietnamese government will allow anyone to violate their borders without violent reaction," he said.

WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—The Sperry Gyroscope company has developed an automatic air-to-air control system which will enable the new B-52 bombers to destroy unescorted targets "with unprecedented accuracy."

The company said that night the system combines an improved "automatic pilot" with an electronic bombing system that allows a B-52 to take evasive action in a bombing run instead of following the old "circular-and-level approach" method.

It said the system already is being installed in the big jet intercontinental bombers now being delivered to the Strategic Air Command.



SHOSHONE, May 8.—The Lincoln County Marketing Association, Inc. sold its wool pool Friday night at the courthouse.

The wool was sold to Whittaker and Sons with Fred Uria, Gooding, acting as agent. The firm bid 43 cents a pound with one-third off for black and 41 cents for heavy tags packed separately. Field in advance was \$115,000. There were 4,775 fleeces in the pool.

Under the bid one per cent was allowed for dockage and all wool consigned as of the meeting was well sell at the bid price. If there are others who wish to consign into the pool, they will be subject to bidder's approval at time of shipment.

Then he walked into the hall where a group of lawyers was discussing forthcoming trials with planner-client.

When the lawyers left, Boscchi casually strolled out with them.

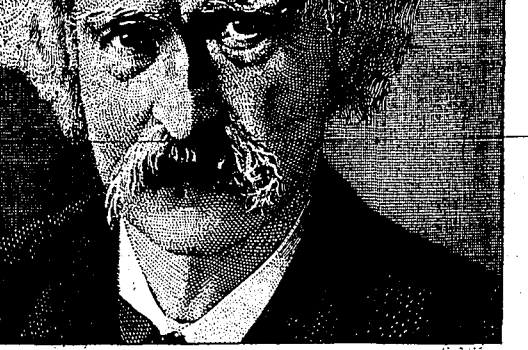
