# Copter Used In Rescue of Injured Pilot

**BOISE, May 16 (AP)—**A coast guard helicopter left here today to rescue the injured pilot of a light plane—amid smoke and flames as it parachuted to his aid—from the primitive area of the Snake river valley, 35 miles north of Boise. The pilot is Capt. Chester Richmond, 33, of the Army Air Corps, who was flying a C-47 transport plane. He was killed in the crash. Flashed by Cmdr. Chester Richmond, the helicopter was equipped with a rescue hoist, a rescue net and a rescue winch. It was to be used in the rescue work if the pilot could not land in a rough terrain.

# The Beating Kefauver In Primary Votes; No Farm Unrest Is Noted

**Pres. Eisenhower easily ousted Sen. Estes Kefauver—**Wednesday as counting continued in separate Nebraska primary elections held Tuesday. The ratio Eisenhower had in 1950 votes. On the Democratic primary, Kefauver had 40,777 or about 36 per cent of the vote to 61 per cent for Eisenhower. Meanwhile, the political news at Kefauver and Stevenson in Eugene, Ore., where both appeared at the same Democratic rally. The two presidential hopefuls covered much the same ground in separate talks, hammering away at the Eisenhower administration, in Tuesday's Nebraska election. Kefauver was opposed on their respective ballots. But Nebraska's living outside the state's 13 largest cities—about 60 per cent of the total population—could vote in either primary.

Any substantial departure from the Republican winning margins in the predominantly GOP state would be interpreted as a signal of rural discontent with administration farm policy. Nebraska normally goes Republican by about two to one. Eisenhower carried the state in 1952 by a 20-30 percentage. Kefauver supporters said beforehand they expected no significant change in the normal Republican ratio.

There was no organized campaign for write-in votes by any group. The preference voting results are being binding on the Republican and 12 Democratic National Convention delegates selected. Virtually all the GOP candidates were Eisenhower supporters and Kefauver was the most popular choice among the Democrats.

# Canadian Jet Hits Convent; Fire and Crash Fatal to 15

**OTTAWA, May 16 (AP)—**A Canadian jet fighter, ordered aloft on an interception mission that proved a false alarm, rocketed from a six-mile altitude into a Roman-Catholic nuns' rest home last night and left 15 persons dead or missing. Fuel from the broken lines on the 17-ton CF100 twin jet craft splashed across the three-story brick structure of the inferno. Most of the victims were nuns and headmistresses. Others were the fighter's two-man crew, a priest and a woman cook employed at the home, operated by the Grey Nuns of the Cross along the Ottawa river seven miles east of Ottawa.

"Suddenly there was a noise like a thunderclap," said Sister Marie Madorsky, one of 12 nuns who escaped. "The plane blew out. The window frames, made of wood, splintered and the next second there was fire everywhere."

Four of the nuns who escaped were injured.

Sister Marie Omond, assistant general of the order, said there were 25 persons in the convent. Eleven nuns ranging in age from 21 to 71 were given up as dead.

The bodies of three nuns and the priest had been recovered from the smoldering debris early today. The Royal Canadian air force delivered 15 men to the crash site today. The airman tackled the job of removing the rubble largely by hand. They were able to recover the wreckage of the plane. The explosion was heard 15 miles away.

The revised death toll for the tragedy was released by the mother superior of the convent, Sister Marie Omond, who said she had identified the dead. She said the dead included 11 nuns, a woman kitchen helper and a nuns' chaplain who also ministered to the nuns. Also killed were the pilot and the other pilot.

The mother superior would not allow anyone to see the survivors "for the time being." She said all were suffering from shock.

Key witnesses of the accident—primarily neighbors—told the terrific explosion was heard 15 miles away. Many of the survivors, unable to identify the plane, said they saw the wreckage of the plane. WASHINGTON—Sensational charges that President Eisenhower has permitted prominent Republicans to profit from their "White House influence" are not supported by certain lawyers appearing before the Washington ethics committee, who can present Murray Choinier, Vice President Nixon's personal secretary, as an example of a "White House insider" who has not profited from his position.

### Care of Your Children

Chewing gum is a national habit and whether it is a good one, or a bad one, or a meaningless one is not for me to say, I wouldn't know. But one thing I do know: It can be a very annoying habit to many who do not have it, schoolteachers for example.

Teachers do not like to see a pupil busily chewing. Somehow, the steady motion of the jaws acts as a sophisticated, and the classroom is no place for it. The teacher sees the offender and the student adds the chewing gum out of his mouth and puts it under his seat, or in his desk, or under the nearest desk, to

be picked up again at dismissal time, maybe.

Some of the gum chewers spit out the wad on the floor of the corridor, where it is trodden down to a dirty black patch. This makes trouble for the cleaning staff. You would think that no young person would go to church chewing gum, but you would be mistaken. Some do. The sexton knows they do, because he has to go around the church removing it from the pew, even from the carpet. Church and Sunday school are not the places for this exercise.

People who chew gum say it relaxes them. Good. But surely they do not need it in church, nor in school, nor at work—where the need is for mental activity if not for physical labor.

There is a time and a place for everything. When gum is chewed at the wrong time and in the wrong place, it is being misused and the user is not adding anything to his personality traits.

It is not a pretty habit, this chewing. A lovely child blows out a great bubble of gum. He is no longer a lovely child, but a paragon. The pretty girl chomping gum rubs herself of the beauty that would bring admiration, and wins instead a surge of disdain.

The privacy of home, one's own room, is the place for the gum chewing. Anybody who wants to chew it has that right. It is the other people's rights that are in question—cleaners, caters, and clergy who must look at the jaws moving rhythmically, the good-mannered people who do not chew in public.

It is the duty of every parent to teach his children the truth about gum. The school should also teach them. The church should have a list of books and pamphlets on this subject. The parents should be told in order to see to it that their children do not chew in public.

### Professor Issues Dictionary Showing How to Cuss Better

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., May 15 (AP)—Professor Clyde Crobaugh of the University of Tennessee has produced a potential best seller. It explains how to cuss more effectively.

Professor Crobaugh's book is a slim dictionary entitled simply "Abusive Words." He claims it is basically a much needed how-to-do-it book.

The professor, a financial lecturer and author when not studying cussing, thinks everyone should select the "exactly right" nasty word for any occasion.

He browses on profanity. "Abusive words," he says, "provide a far more effective method of cursing someone out than profanity.

"The right word can be far more abusive, much more subtle and three times as devastating as profanity," he says. "The right word is a 'randy' or a 'shanty,' which mean the same thing.

Crobaugh has a personal preference for the word "pick" rather than "leech" or "parasite." He says it is safer.

And Crobaugh believes the words snarl, beland, bloway, dab, daggie-

fail, demper, steak, gip, junto, limmer or trull might be just the words needed by someone inclined to bust abuse at a woman.

Crobaugh's favorite cussword begins with the letter "D"—"damn, dern, dens," as he would say in polite company, are euphemisms of a term he considers basic to the whole line art of billingsgate.

His book is divided into two parts. The first part is entitled "forms of abuse" and says that there are 75 different ways of cussing.

"Decide whether you wish to cuss a person or to ridicule him or to revile him," Crobaugh said. "The reader will find guidance in part one. Then look in part two and you'll receive some choice words."

NEW YORK, May 15 (AP)—Consumers are on notice today that this fall they can expect higher prices on autos, shoes and men's boy suits. They bear considerable muttering that other things ought to have higher price tags, too.

These stories are the more convincing to some because they often appear in newspapers that are advertising store price cutting to move stately merchandise or dealers' occasions to move unsold new cars.

"If goods don't move at present prices," some ask, "how can they expect to sell the new ones at higher prices?"

"The honest answer to that might be: 'It isn't so much that they expect to sell them as that they hope to. Some thing consumers have to buy. But there's a growing number of things that they buy only when they feel they can afford them, or when they sense a bargain today on a Mercedes and dealers know this. They know that some customers always buy their clothing at the mark-down sales at the end of the season. They know that the auto factor's list price is only the price at which the selling begins."

### Lagging School Child Offers Proof of Need for Mental Health Clinic Facility

**BOISE, May 18 (AP)**—The bell rings for the start of a Boise grade school and the youngsters scamper onto the playing field. But one lags behind and sits on a step.

The lad seems bright. But he fails to apply himself to his school work. What's wrong? His teachers don't know.

Here, says Dr. Terrell G. Carver, director of Boise's city-county health department, is a job for the mental health clinic.

The department hopes to launch such a clinic within the next six months, providing diagnosis and help for youngsters, and maybe adults, with emotional problems.

The project is in the blueprint stage now, with Jack Steneck, director of the remedial services section of the state board of health, helping with the planning.

Steneck is on loan to the department. Carver will administer the clinic once it is established.

The initial plan, Carver says, is for "some kind of service to this area and possibly to other parts of the state." But Steneck adds that "we're planning in terms of from five to 10 years from now."

"Our plan," says Carver, "calls for the community to be involved. We plan to talk with community leaders and from that group perhaps get organized a board of directors to plan for a clinic. We want to know what people want and what they would be willing to pay for."

Carver and Steneck envisioned a mental health clinic as financed with both state and local money, some if possible from the schools and the courts and some from private donations.

Steneck says a minimum budget for such a clinic would be roughly \$25,000 to pay for a psychiatrist, a clinical psychologist and a social worker. There would also have to be play rooms and equipment.

No state money is available now. That would have to await possible appropriations by future legislatures. The legislature will meet again next January. The 1953 legislature created the state board of health, providing for the state's first mental health setup on a state level.
