Truman Pays Honor to GIs Lost in Battle

SUNDEW, Idaho, May 13.—Harry S. Truman paid a solemn tribute to the 500,000 GIs who died while crossing graves of his American comrades who didn't come back from World War I.

It was the first time the former President did on his first trip to Europe since February 1945.

He drove out from Paris over a road to the American military cemetery there and walked among the graves of American soldiers of two generations.

Obviously full of thoughts that make old soldiers shiver in the presence of the fallen, Truman laid two dozen red roses on one grave, it marked the burial place of a young soldier who died in World War I and whose name is unknown.

The gesture was a personal offering to the former President, who chose to make it to the unknown dead of the second war.
