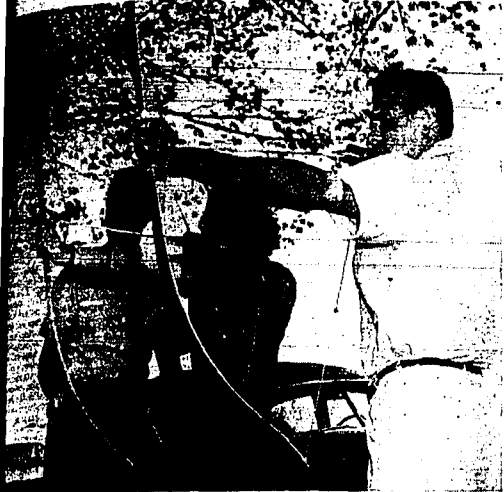

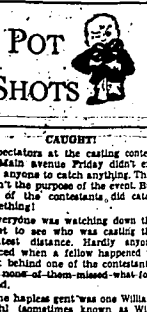

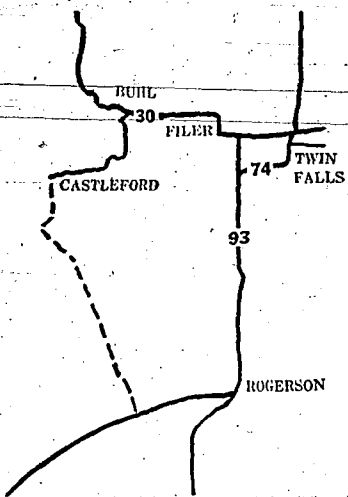

WASHINGTON, May 19 (AP)—A refugee Polish sailor said a Polish embassy official tried to lure him back behind the iron curtain with a "dictated" letter from his wife, senior investigators revealed today.

Another sailor told of a mysterious call who urged him to go home, but left in confusion when he heard of the woman was making good ways.

The two refugees, Poles, who now live in New Britain, Conn., testified in a closed subcommittee hearing last week that they had been lured back to Poland by a Polish official who had been sent by the United States in 1934 after their ships had been seized by the Chinese Nationalist on Formosa.

The testimony of the Poles paralleled that of four Soviet seamen who recently told how Russian officials pressured them and succeeded in changing their minds and returning back to Moscow.

Their report on the President's health was so complete and thorough that it must have been embarrassing to him. We all rejoice that the report was positive and encouraging and that the state of our President's health is very nearly perfect. Now the campaign for the November election can be run on the merit level instead of on the condition of the President's complete health.

After reading the very complete report on his physical condition, I am sure that many of us have felt that we could have some kind of an accurate analysis of the spiritual condition of each candidate for public office. Of course we believe that each candidate should be judged by his personal merit and not by what sectarian church he happens to owe his loyalty.

It would surely be interesting, and

helpful to know the actual attitude of each candidate towards God, unranked, and towards himself as well.

Conspicuous, well said that the most important thing that a prospective candidate should know about a prospective candidate is his view of God and the universe; for, if he really knows this view he can will tell whether or not he is likely to pay his debt to God accurately whether or not the country was living and setting contentedly with his viewpoint.

Roach apparently will continue to serve as assistant to party chairman Paul W. Butler.

Praised
"He was a good man," said Jacob M. Arvey, Illinois national Democratic national committee man. "It's a very bad loss."

As convention manager, Roach was responsible for arranging hotel accommodations for the state delegations, delegates and local affiliates. He also was supposed to organize workrooms for an estimated 4,500 workmen expected to cover the convention.
