Drop of H-Bomb Is Answer of U.S. for Red Power Boasts

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—The United States dropped a hydrogen bomb from an airplane for the first time today in a dramatic answer to Russian boasts of thermonuclear supremacy. A B-52, fast and powerful, sent the weapon toward its burning point over the Pacific proving grounds and then sped to safety. 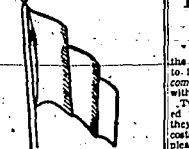

General Meal Given in Test To Six Coeds

WILSON, Wis., May 21 (AP)—How much like a meal made of a combination of mineral salts, vitamins, amino acids and other nutrients is a good meal? This was the question asked by a group of six college women in a test given at the University of Wisconsin.

The girls' answers ranged from "a good meal" to "a very poor meal." The test was conducted since 1953 in order to determine the requirements of amino acids in human nutrition.

Amino acids are the building blocks of proteins. The amino acids are mixed together into a solution which is called "the cocktail." To make one of them lose weight, an amount of them was added to the cocktail. The girls were then given a meal which contained the amino acid cocktail. An apricot, orange and a banana was also added once in a while.

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—Sen. Estes Kefauver joined Adlai E. Stevenson in Florida today for the crucial two-week window of their primary campaign for the Democratic presidential nomination.

Stevenson supporters hoped their candidate would be given a push by his victory over Kefauver in Friday's Oregon primary, the first direct clash between the two rivals since Kefauver's upset victory in Minnesota March 20.

The Oregon contest gave Stevenson 15 more national convention votes.

The Florida primary May 29 provides the only head-on clash in the south. Twenty-eight pledged convention votes will be at stake.

A week later, Kefauver and Stevenson meet in the California primary in which the winner will get 68 votes. The loser will have only the slim chance of winning the California caucus to remain a serious contender at the national convention. But the victor will have no assurance of winning the nomination.

India, Russia Sign Pact on Drilling Rigs

NEW DELHI, India, May 21 (AP)—India and Russia signed a five-year agreement today for the purchase of \$1,500,000 worth of Soviet oil drilling equipment, by this country.

The pact will provide India with two oil drilling rigs, spare equipment, and accessories.

It was signed here by R. K. Ramaswami, secretary of the ministry of natural resources and scientific research, on behalf of India, and E. Olenik and S. G. Sizenko, on behalf of the Soviet machine export trade organization.

The agreement provides for free erection of the drills by Soviet experts. There will be 22 such experts to operate each drill and train Indian personnel in their use for a minimum period of six months.

The Soviet machine export organization also will provide seismic equipment for oil prospecting in the Punjab and Rajasthan.

Studies Made on Radioactive Dust

TRIDENTON, N. J., May 21 (AP)—The U. S. weather bureau here is among several in the nation which have been collecting samples of radioactive dust, in preparation for comparison with the fallout that may result from yesterday's 11-3000 explosion.

One of the methods employed by the bureau in determining the radioactivity in the air is to expose a metal plate covered with gum paper. A sample of the dust that sticks to the paper is then studied for radioactivity content. The speed with which the radioactive fallout reaches the United States from Europe depends on the atmospheric currents which circle the globe, according to weathermen.

'Brainpower' Eyed as Basic Need for U.S.

NEW YORK, May 21 (AP)—A team of scientists has pointed out the future and come to the conclusion that within 50 to 100 years the demand for food, minerals and energy will be so great it will take every ounce of available brainpower to provide it.

By the year 2000 they believe man will be extracting fuel from common rocks and food from distant stars, rocks and plants that today is discarded as worthless. But they are convinced there is almost no limit to the amount of food and minerals obtainable if man has the brains and energy to get it from difficult sources.

Study Made
This conclusion was reached in an exhaustive study by scientists at California Institute of Technology in cooperation with the management of leading American corporations.

The realization that technical progress is the most valuable and replenishable resource illuminates the future with hope, said Dr. R. W. Cairns, director of research for the Hercules Powder company.

H. S. M. Burns, president of the Shell Oil company, said, "I found the report on minerals, metals and men not only intensely interesting but very thought-provoking."

Since there is already a shortage of trained minds, Dr. Cairns believes the United States must take big steps to produce enough scientists and engineers to keep the nation prospering.

3 Steps Recommended
To provide them from unappreciated sources he recommends: 1. Recruiting talent early and training it with a good education. 2. Use of scientific and engineering personnel entirely for research and development. 3. Training women as engineers and scientists.

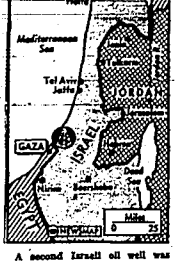

The paper-back editions will range in subject from John Steinbeck's "The Red Pony" to "The Political Writings of John Adams."

They will be sold through foreign counters for 10 to 15 cents each to counter the serious competition of Soviet literature abroad.

This is considered one of the most important bids America has yet made to meet Russia's cultural challenge, according to USIA officials who have just unveiled details of the book barrage.

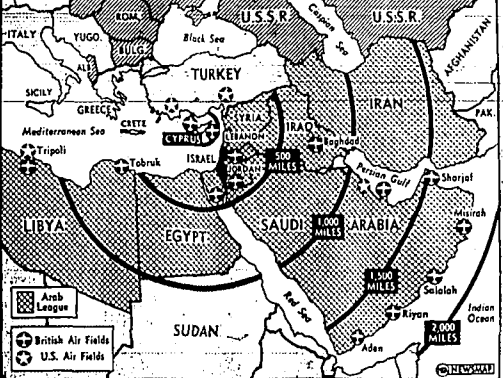

NICOSIA, Cyprus, May 21 (AP)—British troops fired a tear gas barrage today at crowds stirred up by rioting Cypriot schoolgirls.

The schoolgirls broke from their classes and ran screaming through Nicosia's main streets shouting "Enosis" (union with Greece) and praising the underground EOKA organization.

They attacked a patrol of British soldiers and tore a Greek flag from the soldiers' hands. Then the girls ran screaming back into the school waving the flag.

Grenada and British soldiers loosed tear gas over their heads. Troops hastily pulled down their shutters and halted traffic.

Hit-wise Cypriots quickly doused the tear gas grenades with sand as fast as they hit the pavement. There were no casualties.

It was the second day of school-girl demonstrations and the British imposed tighter security precautions to halt a growing wave of violence against their rule of the island.

Wins Scholarship Surplus Crop Bans Ordered On U. S. Land

WASHINGTON, May 21—President Eisenhower today called a halt to the leasing of federally-owned, farm-leased surplus crops.

No existing lease will be ended. But he ordered that new leasing starting 60 days from today will prohibit the cultivation of crops that are in surplus and for which price supports are paid.

The White House said the President's action will affect between one and a half and two million acres. The order was contained in a memorandum to heads of all executive departments and agencies.

Federally-owned property, not used for cultivation of crops supported crops amounts to between one-half and three-fourths of one per cent of all land used in growing such crops.

The White House said leases on existing lands will not be annulled. There also will be no change in crop production on wildlife refuge in such crops.

The threat we face is real and serious. It is not a matter of "if" but of "when" and "where". We cannot rely on perfect answers to problems posed by the atomic age. We must know more about the defensive measures that can be taken to protect our people, industry and other resources from the effects of such forces. We in civil defense are particularly concerned with this aspect and will spend much time carefully studying data which, as in previous tests, will be made available to us by the atomic energy
