### Resignation of Politico Opens Cabinet Crisis

PARIS, May 24 (AP)—The resignation of Pierre Mendès-France from the French cabinet MAY 24, 1955. Premier Guy Mollet to ask the national assembly for a vote of confidence on his Algerian policy, informed sources said today.

Mendès-France, leader of the Radical party, resigned yesterday in what amounted to a vote of no confidence in Mollet's Algerian policies. He cushioned the blow to Mollet by permitting 13 other radicals to remain in the cabinet. Informed sources said Mollet would seek the vote of confidence as soon as possible in order to bolster the government. The vote could come during the debates on Tunisia and Morocco scheduled for May 31 and June 1.

Issue Aired  
The sources said Mollet would doubtless prefer to go over the whole Algerian question with the assembly. He told the Socialist party bureau last night he hoped to have a debate on Algeria itself shortly—before that would show him how much support he actually has. Indications were the communists about to withdraw their 150 votes in support of Mollet and that he would have to seek additional support from the right and center. The Mollet-Mendès-France coalition government is left-of-center.

Some political observers believe that the center and right deputies would be likely to vote for Mollet, even though they are his bitter enemies—nobody else wants to take over the responsibility for leadership.

Is 'Lone Wolf'  
The resignation of Mendès-France restored him to his "lone wolf" position that leaves him free to say what he thinks. And he felt no time in doing so. He said in his letter of resignation that Mollet's policy of fighting the Algerian rebels without the Algerian nationalists and instituting a series of political and economic reforms to save the situation.

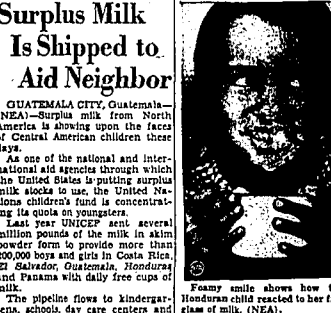

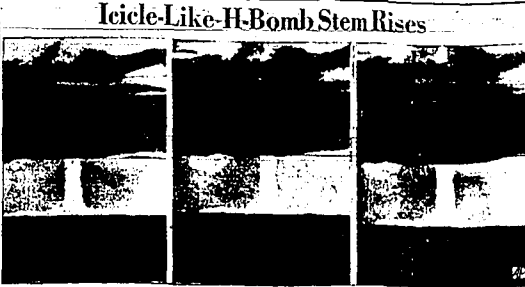

**WASHINGTON, May 24 (AP)—**The cost of living went up in April for the second straight month, the government reported today. The rise meant a penny-an-hour pay increase for about one million auto, truck and farm equipment factory workers.

The bureau of labor statistics' consumer price index rose two-tenths of one per cent between March and April. The new index was 14.9 per cent of average 1947-49 prices. This was six-tenths of one per cent less than a year ago and one-half of one per cent below the record level of October, 1953.

The bureau said a food price rise of one-tenth of one per cent was responsible. It said prices of other items rose slightly, but that was offset by a further decline in car prices at the dealer level.

### Nehru Sticks His Finger in Algerian Pie

Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru of India has added the Algerian situation to the long list of his diplomatic interests. He has offered a detailed proposal to bring France and the Algerian nationalists together to end the increasingly dangerous revolt.

Nehru made the proposal in his role of Asian "neutralist" peace maker. In the same role, he is likely to have something to say soon about the breakdown of Singapore independence talks in London.

Chief Minister David Marshall, who led the Singapore delegation in London, stopped off in New Delhi on his way home to ask Nehru's advice about the next step. That he will act if there can be no doubt, Nehru is an outspoken man with advice on world problems.

He is also a very influential man in parts of Asia and Africa, two continents which are emerging from colonialism.

No one can doubt that Nehru is a man of good will, and that he generally seeks peace and good settlement. One trouble, however, is that the military alliance which he opposes are those the Western allies have formed in defense against communist aggression. Another is that he seems inclined to list Soviet Russia and Communist China as among the "anti-colonial" countries.

For instance, Nehru does not call Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia and Tibet colonies. When Russia and the Chinese wanted those countries, they just moved their armies in and took over.

However, Nehru's proposal on Algeria seems to be a reasonable one at first glance. He called for a ceasefire, and for France to recognize Algeria as a "national entity" and "personality." He asked that Algerians and French settlers in Algeria be made equal, really he called for formal negotiations between France and the rebels.

**Ike Eyes Plan for 'Fireside' Chats**  
WASHINGTON, May 24 (AP)—President Eisenhower disclosed yesterday he has decided to resume the "fireside chats" to explain government problems to the people.

He told his news conference that so far he "just doesn't know" whether they would be helpful. He noted that he already appears nearly once a week before reporters to answer their questions on the discussion government issues.

### Soviet Atomic Work Lauded By Americans

MOSCOW, May 24 (AP)—A group of top American scientists yesterday lauded Soviet progress in the nuclear field and interest in scientific research.

The physicists, the first group of American specialists in this field to venture into communist territory for an international conference, said in a statement:

"A source of particular gratification to us has been the observation of a strong interest in pure science on the part of so many Soviet physicists. This has been reflected in our many discussions concerning basic ideas."

Dr. Robert R. Wilson of Cornell University told newsmen "they (the Russians) are not just making practical things like missiles and atomic bombs but have a big program of research."

Dr. Robert E. Marshak of the University of Rochester and Wilson gave their views at a news conference attended by American scientists in Moscow. Acting as a spokesman for the 14 American scientists attending the talks, they said their meetings with Soviet physicists showed "no reflection of political ideas."

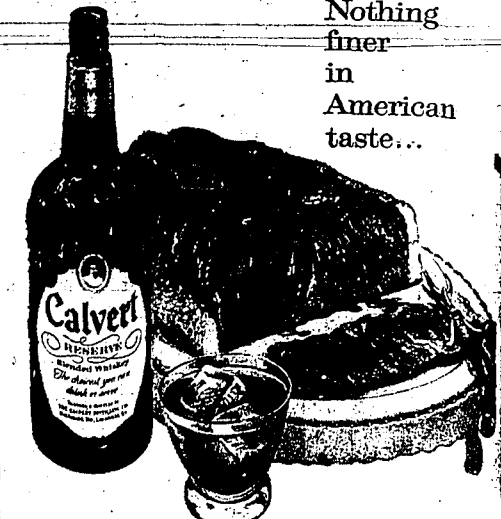

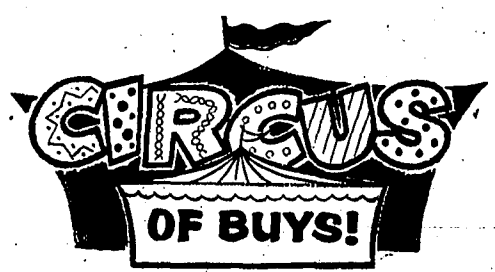

### States' Rights Are Upheld in Attorney Meet

PHOENIX, Ariz., May 24 (AP)—The National Association of Attorneys General yesterday adopted a resolution favoring limitation of the power of the U. S. supreme court to determine whether federal laws supersede state statutes.

The resolution was passed by a vote of 28 to 12 with strong southern support. It endorses proposed congressional legislation that would prevent the supreme court from deciding that a federal law antedates the promulgation of a state law unless the promulgation of the federal statute was specified by congress.

## Series of Fires Razes Countryside as England Is Hit by "Drought" Period

LONDON, May 24 (AP)—A rare dry spell set forest fires raging over wide areas of England's picture-book countryside today.

Villagers fought to save their homes with bucket brigades and back fires in scenes familiar to the American West, but seldom seen in this crowded island of patchwork fields and garden sites.

The army called out 1,000 troops to help fire brigades fight the biggest blazes. A three-week period of sunny weather was headlined as a "drought" in this country which is lashed by 40 inches of rain annually.

Sooty citizens barely saved their homes in the picturesque Burry village of Holmsbury St. Mary last night when flames towering 40 feet gale past.

In the air swept down a brick-red covered hillside and burned to their doom.

A mile-wide belt of fire destroyed hundreds of acres of pine plantations in Somerset and almost engulfed the town of Minehead. Most of the able-bodied men in the town of 7,000 joined fire brigades to beat back the flames.

Three hundred soldiers helped fight a health fire at Warham in Dorsetshire when flames licked down through parched grass and bracken. Fire crept across a post-moor and threatened cottages where 18 persons live near Crowle in Lincolnshire.

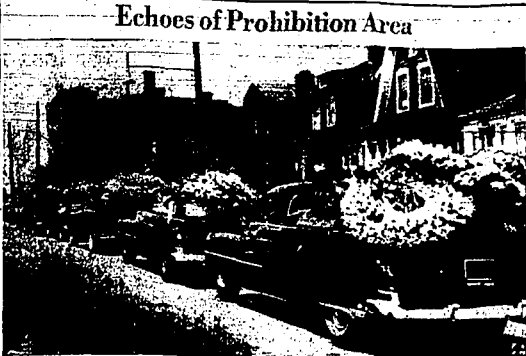

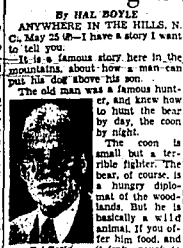

"and during the first full month after the 'crackdown' was ordered, total deaths were greater than in any of the three preceding months," Cole said.

He said that usually such campaigns are most effective in the beginning when they are receiving "the greatest impact of the launching publicity."

The automobile association executive added that presently unmarked rednecks should be marked and named with uniformed officers as warning to motorists that traffic violators will be arrested and prosecuted.
