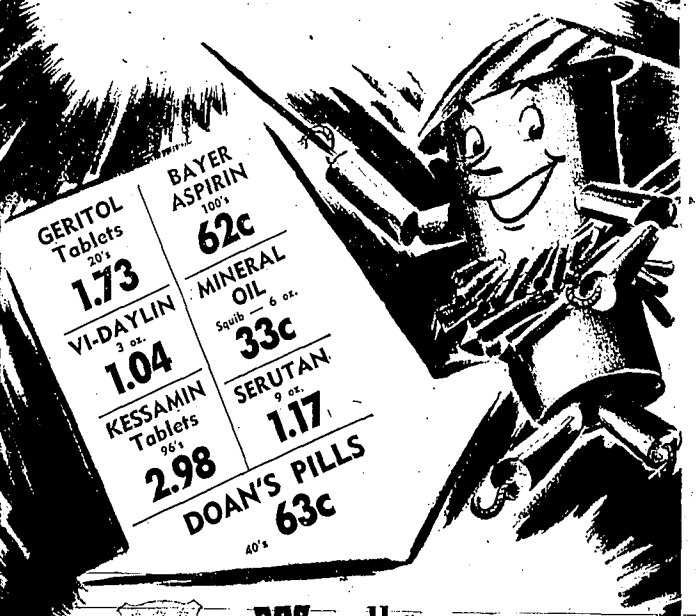

# Church-Sponsored Relief Agencies Want to Send Surplus Food Abroad

WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—Church-sponsored relief agencies plan to double their free shipments of surplus American food to other lands.

The agencies, which include the American Red Cross, the United Methodist Church, the Catholic Relief Service, and the Jewish Relief Service, have received approval from the U. S. Food Administration to increase their shipments of surplus food to other lands.

The agencies are currently shipping about 600 million pounds of surplus food to other lands each year. They plan to increase this to 1.2 billion pounds by the end of the year.

### Japan Nears Decision on Russia Pacts

TOKYO, May 25 (AP)—Japan is moving rapidly toward a decision on the future relations with the Soviet Union.

The Russians have a lever in a 10-year fisheries pact that could force Japan to sign a World War II peace treaty or live under a serious threat to its food supply.

Seriously divided Japan's conservative government is expected to announce a major reshuffling of the cabinet, with ousting of the strongest anti-Soviet element, particularly Foreign Minister Mamoru Shigemitsu; and

Compulsions to give up claims to the Southern Kuriles, occupied by the Soviets since the end of World War II.

Key to this possible chain reaction is a provision of the fisheries agreement signed by Agriculture Minister Ichiro Kono in Moscow, that makes it effective only upon ratification of a peace treaty.

Japan feels it must have access to northeast Pacific waters, which the Soviets have threatened to close to "unlicensed" ships, to bring in an adequate catch of salmon to depend largely upon fish as a source of protein in their diet.

### Five Nations Send Men to Truce Teams

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., May 25 (AP)—Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld announced yesterday that five governments had agreed to send 31 more officers to serve with the United Nations truce supervision organization in Palestine.

Strengthening of the TSO was one of the peace-making points negotiated by Hammarskjöld in his recent mission to the holy land. The truce observers will man a number of observation posts along the 200-mile long side of the demarcation line along the disputed Gaza strip in southern Palestine.

Australia, New Zealand, Norway and Sweden all responded to Hammarskjöld's request for more TSO personnel by assigning four officers each. Canada assigned five.

Several officers already have arrived at TSO headquarters in Jerusalem and the remainder will arrive in the next few weeks.

The appointments bring to 61 men the strength of U. N. observers posted in the area.

Other countries contributing officers come from the following countries: Austria, 4; Belgium, 7; Canada, 10; Denmark, 4; France, 2; Greece, 2; Iceland, 2; Norway, 4; Sweden, 4; and the United States, 8.

### Silence Is Broken On Primate's Fate

VIENNA, Austria, May 25 (AP)—Czechoslovakian Communists finally broke their long silence yesterday on Catholic Archbishop Josef Beran.

Czech Premier Klement Gottwald said at a press conference in Prague that Beran is "neither in jail nor in custody but has only been barred from acting in his position as archbishop of Prague and primate of Czechoslovakia."

His remarks were broadcast by Prague radio.

It said Beran declared that Beran was ousted from his position "because the state has the right to demand that all officials—including priests—have to obey the law."

### Fiery Instructor Resigns His Job

RENO, Nev., May 25 (AP)—Dr. Frank Richardson, a controversial figure in a widely-publicized dispute between the faculty and administration at the University of Nevada in 1953, has resigned to accept a post at the University of Washington. It was disclosed today.

University President Mirard W. Stout said Richardson's resignation would be accepted. Stout made no other comment.

Richardson, a professor of biology, was fired by the board of regents at Nevada in 1953 on grounds he had been insubordinate and not cooperative with the school's administration.

### Woman Asks For 'Loan' of Small Girl, 6

TOKYO, May 25 (AP)—A Swedish woman today asked the Japanese foster parents raising her orphaned Swedish-American granddaughter to "lend" and "not return" the girl to her.

Mrs. Hanna Wilson, grandmother of 6-year-old Marianne Wilson, made the request in an open letter to Mrs. Masakazu Yamaguchi through a Tokyo newspaper.

"This is a tragedy for the child of a foreigner to be raised as a Japanese," Mrs. Wilson wrote.

Mrs. Yamaguchi said her foster daughter since the girl's untimely death shortly after the birth. The child was adopted by her American father. The Swedish legation is trying to get the girl back to Sweden through court action.

Mrs. Yamaguchi testified in the last court session that Marianne's mother was hit by a car on her death bed. She said the grandparents, who lived in Japan at the time, were very kind to her.

But Mrs. Wilson challenged Mrs. Yamaguchi's testimony in the letter, saying she was definite understanding between you and me that sooner or later you must give up Marianne, she wrote.

"When I left Yokohama, how wanted to bring that child with me. But I could not bring myself to take her away from you. I sympathized too much with you."

"For the child's happiness, I beg you to send her to Sweden. I will let you correspond with her and, when she grows up, I will let her go to Japan."

### Group Seeks To Have Red Sent to Home

WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—The senate internal security subcommittee today formally called for the ouster of Soviet U. N. Delegate Arkady A. Sobolev for his part in the defection of five Russian refugees.

The subcommittee also called for ouster of Konstantin Ekimov, first secretary of the Russian U. N. delegation.

In a formal report on its investigation of the sailor incident, the subcommittee called on the state department to demand recall of the two diplomats.

The state department last month expelled two lesser members of the Soviet U. N. delegation—third secretary Nikolai Turkin and attaché Alexander K. Guryanov—for "particularly objectionable" acts in connection with return of the sailors.

The department also indirectly rebuked Sobolev and his staff for intervening to bring about the sailors' departure. But it did not demand Sobolev's recall.

The five Soviet sailors along with four others were granted asylum in the United States after their ship was captured by the Chinese in the Taiwan Strait in 1954. Three of the four former sailors remained in the United States told the subcommittee they believed coercion was used on their first and last trip to redefect. Other witnesses agreed.

Adenauer called the emergency session to lay down a straight government policy line on measures to prevent the business boom from breaking into runaway inflation.

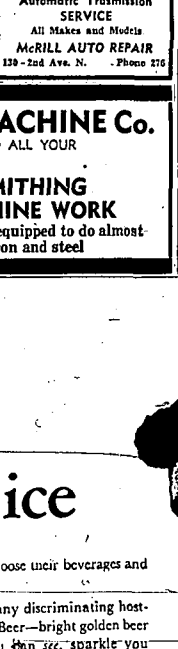
